Sheep do not impress by their intelligence.

Left to themselves, they tend to huddle together in a rather witless fashion. When they choose to move, they follow the leader mindlessly. If one sheep in the line performs a little leap on a perfectly level surface, those following repeat the leap unquestioningly. Naturalists say it is because they have never forgotten that their sheep ancestors lived among mountains, with narrow paths and sudden ravines and crevasses. You can't be too careful if you are a sheep.

On the great sheep ranches of Australia thousands of sheep can be controlled by a couple of well-trained sheep dogs, who keep them bunched together and moving in the desired direction. From time to time a more enterprising sheep tries to break away, only to be brought back to the flock by a purposeful dog, moving like a bullet and outwitting the sheep at every turn.

WE NEED A LEADER

When Jesus calls us "his sheep," perhaps he is poking gentle fun at us, and before we become righteously indignant and refuse to be identified with sheep, perhaps we ought to question ourselves about our sheeplike attitudes.

We are inclined to huddle mindlessly together in a bunch. There is real comfort in numbers. We often feel and act as if it is better to be wrong with the crowd than to be right and lonely.

When we choose to move, we often do follow the leader, reacting the way others react for no better reason than that others react that way. We often are pushed in directions we would not have chosen, kept in line by the arbiters of public opinion, fashion or good taste. If occasionally we break away and make a run for freedom, we are easily brought back into line by the sheep dogs of public opinion, who seem to know just how to head us off, and with a well-placed nip prevent us from really striking out on our own.

Yes, it is really a mildly insulting image, to call us "sheep." But perhaps that is just what Jesus meant it to be. Perhaps he wanted us to learn to laugh at our silly sheepishness, and follow him out to freedom.







MAY 5, 1985 • Fifth Sunday of Easter

The symbol of the United States is the bald eagle; it stands for a notion which prides itself in terms of majesty, bravery, courage and strength. When the subject of the symbol for our nation came up for debate, Ben Franklin suggested that the wild turkey be adopted, but lost to those members of Congress who opted for the eagle as a symbol of our great nation. The symbol graces not only some of our coins, but is often worked into the facade of many of our buildings in Washington, D.C.

The symbol of the nation of Israel was that of the vine and branches. The emblem was depicted on the coins of

the Maccabees and on the facade of the Holy Place in the temple. Many Jews counted it a great honor to donate gold to the temple so it might be molded into a cluster of grapes or even a single grape in the overall design of the symbol. The symbol of the vine and branches was also part of the religious writing of the Jews. Numerous times in the Old Testament, Israel is symbolized as a vine or a vineyard. "The vineyard of the Lord is the house of Israel" (Is. 5:7). "Israel is a luxuriant vine" (Hos. 10:1).

In today's Gospel reading, which is part of Jesus' farewell discourse at the last supper, Jesus takes the symbol of the vine and branches and works it into his intimate, heart-to-heart talk with his disciples. One should notice that Jesus refers to himself as the true or real vine. There is a reason for this because the prophets, like Jeremiah and Hosea, always spoke in terms of the vineyard of Israel that has run wild, or is weedy and fruitless.

SPIRITUAL GROWTH

Jesus builds on the history of this symbol in Jewish culture when he speaks of the vine and the branches. Vineyards were all over Palestine. The ground for the vineyard had to be clean and the vines pruned every year if the vineyard was to produce any fruit. Jesus adds special religious meaning to the symbol of the vine and branches when he refers to himself as the vine and the disciples as the branches. In other words, Jesus is saying to his disciples that the union between him and his disciples is an intimate one. Just as the vine in the vineyard gives life to the branches, in somewhat the same way, Jesus shares his life with those who are joined to him. Those who are not joined are spiritually dead; they will suffer the fate of being cut off and thrown as withered branches into the fire.

The message of Jesus at the last supper is good not only for the apostles, but for all of us. If we are to grow in the spiritual life, then we have to stay close to Jesus and his teachings, for apart from him nothing can be accomplished. We should look on certain humbling experiences as the vinedresser Jesus at work in our spiritual lives seeking to produce more fruit. The pruning is difficult, but the better the trimming, the greater the harvest.







GO FORTH AND BEAR FRUIT THAT WILL ENDURE!

MAY 12, 1985 • Sixth Sunday of Easter

You need not read far into the New Testament before encountering references to God's love for people. The extent of that love is indicated by the fact that God sent the Son to earth to live and die for us. You know the quotation: "God so loved the world"

Just as clear is the biblical statement of Jesus' love for his disciples, those he calls his friends, his brothers. The sign of that love is Jesus' acceptance of God's will that he die for humankind. There is no greater love than this.

A BIBLICAL PERSPECTIVE

What are the signs of human love from the biblical perspective? We speak here of the love that takes its origin in God. "God is love," John writes, and God is the spur of the highest love of which a man or woman is capable. That love has its own kind of signs; the gospel points out several:

1. The lover is filled with the Spirit; "intoxicated" with the Spirit, as it is sometimes expressed. In the early years after the resurrection this often meant a power to speak in tongues. When St. Peter saw some uncircumcised Gentiles speaking in tongues, he demanded to know how anyone could refuse them the waters of baptism since they showed forth such an evident sign of the Spirit.

- 2. The lover shows no partiality. No doubt there are personality traits that are pleasing and some that grate on the nerves. But the true lover can cut through them to the basic truth about another person: he or she is a child of God.
- 3. The lover obeys the commandments. No, the commandments are not out-of-date, not with lovers of God, anyway. They take them seriously and strive to apply them to the circumstances of life.
- 4. The lover treats people as friends, not servants. Do you treat anyone as an inferior? It's impossible to do that and still be a lover. Really, how could you possibly act superior after Jesus' example of humility in accepting you as his brother or sister?
- 5. The lover bears fruit. This is a tricky sign, for the fruits need not be visible to the eyes. Yet every lover does indeed bring forth the fruits of the Holy Spirit, which traditionally include peace, patience, kindness and modesty.

If you want to be classified as a lover of God you had better check the signs. Do you keep the commandments; do you treat others as friends; do you show no partiality? By all means, keep it up; the signs are good.





St. John's version of the last supper is quite long, occupying several chapters in his gospel; most of it is taken up with a lengthy discourse of Jesus and with questions asked by the disciples. The whole is permeated with Jesus' love for them and the love they ought to have for one another.

Today's Gospel passage comes from Jesus' "high priestly prayer" at the last supper. It is of central importance because it indicates that Jesus' mission to the world is to be carried on, once he has departed, by his disciples; as the Father had sent Jesus, so he now sends them. Though Jesus is soon to depart through his death and resurrection, their behavior and ministry are to conform to his. They possess the Father's word; they do not belong to the world; and they are to be consecrated in truth. These are traits which pertain not simply to the original twelve; they ought to be found in all followers of Jesus throughout the ages.

THE PRAYER OF JESUS


Jesus had given many examples of prayer for the disciples to imitate. Just before his Passion was to begin he had prayed for his disciples. He knew he was soon to leave them to a world that hated them, even as it hated him. And just as he had been sent into the world by his Father, so he was now sending them. But first had come the prayer.

In fact, the entire speech of Jesus at the last supper, included as Chapters 13-17 in John's Gospel, may be viewed as a prayer to the Father. There Jesus prayed that his disciples would be united with him in glory at the Father's side, that they would be protected from evil, and for the unity of all people, both disciples and those who did not yet believe in him.

MOVING IN THE RIGHT DIRECTION

What is the status of your own prayer life? Is it limited only to the most significant moments of your life; to those moments when you must make a difficult decision; when you are anxious about an upcoming event; when you need counsel and there is no one to give it?

Prayer should be a more regular part of your life than that. It should be a state of mind, a way of looking at life in all its complexity. Jesus was truly a man of prayer, and his disciples should be no less.



But take heart. Prayer in time of trouble is at least a recognition that God is there, that help is needed. An occasional prayer is a step in the right direction along the pathway that leads into the depths of the love and friendship of God. But imagine how far you could go if you made prayer a regular and normal part of your life!

MAY 26, 1985 • Pentecost

In George Bernard Shaw's play, *Pygmalion*, a speech teacher by the name of Professor Higgins discovers Eliza Doolittle, a Cockney flower girl. By means of coaching in phonetics and training in etiquette, Eliza is transformed into a young woman of charm and grace. The feat, however, is only accomplished with a great deal of patience, endurance and hard work.

With the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, one marvels at the spiritual transformation that takes place in the lives of the apostles. Before the coming of the Holy Spirit, most of the apostles were simple, ordinary, uneducated men whom our Lord met near the Sea of Tiberias. From the way Jesus referred to them, they understood little of the prophets and were slow to comprehend the truths he taught them.

In terms of character, before the coming of the Holy Spirit, the apostles appeared less than courageous. At the same time, some were so presumptuous they thought they could endure any trial that might arise. Even on the evening of his Passion, Jesus told them that they would abandon him and flee, but they all denied this would ever happen. Within a few hours, what Jesus had predicted came true and Jesus was left alone to suffer indignities at the hands of his enemies. Even on

the day of Jesus' resurrection from the dead, the apostles were so intimidated that they hid behind locked doors.

THE PENTECOST EXPERIENCE

Through the Holy Spirit, a complete transformation takes place on the day of Pentecost. These same fearful, weak, intimidated men are transformed into brave, articulate men who are capable of teaching truths of the faith and making themselves understood by others from every region of the civilized world. The apostles preached so convincingly about Christ that many people were immediately converted and baptized.

What happened to the apostles, can take place in our lives, too, if we let the Holy Spirit operate. Whenever we feel an inclination to pray, we should realize that it is the Holy Spirit who prompts us. When we feel an impulse to say a kind word, to help someone in need, to apologize when we have injured someone, to make peace in the home when an argument has taken place, we should realize that the impulse comes from the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit's gentle and quiet promptings are certainly present if we are spiritually sensitive enough to realize it.



JUNE 2, 1985 • Trinity Sunday

"Batter my heart, three-person'd God!" So John Donne begins his "Holy Sonnet." A striking line, and not the least because of its unusual title for God. As a title it's unquestionably true — but it's simply not the way we usually think about the matter. Certainly our God is a Trinity. But that's a fact; it's just there. It's not something we talk about. And, anyway, when we do,

we tend to slip back and forth between the truth of the One God and the truth of the Three Persons. To keep both in mind at the same time is nearly impossible.

The Old Testament insistence on monotheism, the truth of the One God, is a call to discard idolatries. It calls Israel and ourselves away from false values and illusory securities. It diverts us from the dead ends in the journey of life. Baal and Marduk were deifications of the impressive forces of nature and nation. Not only did they fascinate, but it seemed wise to give them their due attention. Nature was the root of economic power; it required placating. Nation was the drive of the people, political power; security demanded some degree of worship.

The New Testament revelation of the Trinity is an opening to new life. It means entry, as adopted sisters and brothers, into God's own divine community. It means coming into the liberty of our true nature as God's sons and daughters.

A LIBERATING GOD

Today's readings speak of freedom. The One God of Deuteronomy shows us "freedom from" — freedom from Egypt, freedom from the fixations that distort our life's direction, freedom not only from missing the mark, but even from getting into the wrong contest. "Freedom from" offers us focus, the opportunity to become centered in our true selves.

But unless this opportunity is taken, "freedom from" is mere drifting. The Trinitarian life of the New Testament offers us "freedom for" — freedom for the satisfactions of sharing God's way of living. It is communal: wishing to belong, we join a family that is part of God's Trinitarian community. It is creative: wishing to be productive, we share in the Creator's creativity. And it is caring: wishing to be loving, we learn to act in the unselfish manner that is God's.

Matthew ends his gospel with a call to baptize the world in the name of the "three-person'd God." This new life is a coming home for every human being.

"Corpus Christi" means Body of Christ. But this year the readings speak of the "blood of the covenant." We contemplate the cup rather than the loaf. We reflect upon the shared life of the community rather than the members of the one body.

"Since the life of a living body is in its blood, I have made you put it on the altar . . ." (Lev. 17:11a). For the Hebrews, blood was sacred. It was the seat of life. This is not a particularly scientific truth, though it was probably based on observation. Rather, it was a symbolic truth. We speak in a similar way when we use expressions like "blood, sweat and tears." Blood is life, and the dynamism of life.

When Moses came down the mountain of that first covenant, he took the terms of the compact to the people. They voted: Yes. Moses was the negotiator, but the covenant agreement was between God and Israel. The ceremony of blood sprinkled on the altar and on the people symbolized this. It was a pledge of shared life.

Part of the meaning of the eucharist is communion. Communion is a sharing of divine life and a pledge to sharing in communal life. The body of Christ has many members and the one life of the Spirit enlivens it. The diminishment of one diminishes all. New vigor of health for one invigorates all. In the one life we are joined and unified.

AND SACRIFICE

"... It is the blood, as the seat of life, that makes atonement" (Lev. 17:11b). The symbolism of blood as life is carried further in the practice of sacrificial offerings. Just as the one life originally unified God and people in the covenant ceremony, so the sacrifice repaired breaches of the covenant. Rents and tears in the one fabric. Atonement was at-onement—bringing together that which was separated.

Yom Kippur, the Day of Atonement, was the day of the scapegoat and the great fasting, as shown in Leviticus 16. It was the one day the high priest entered the holiest of places, the inner sanctuary of the temple, with an offering of atoning blood.

The frequently-broken covenant required renewal. Israel needed forgiveness. In the letter to the Hebrews this covenant renewal is merely prefigurement for the new covenant in which Christ is both victim and priest.

At the passover meal, Jesus said, "This is my blood; the blood of the covenant to be poured out on behalf of many." In it we find empowerment and emblem for our common life — sharing and mutual forgiveness. A shared cup against greed; shed blood of forgiveness against violence.





Perhaps the tiny group of disciples was getting discouraged. How could so few — and such an unlikely lot at that — be expected to shift the world on its axis? And given the grand vision that seemed to motivate Jesus, they were scarcely capable of running a branch office, let alone the main concern. So Jesus, as was his wont, told them some stories to encourage them. God is working behind the scenes, he said, on their behalf.

His mustard seed parable was a new version, but an old story. Ezekiel and Daniel had told it before him. In their hands it was a tale about world empires. Egypt, Babylon, even the longed-for messianic kingdom, were imagined as a vast cedar tree. The great cedars of Lebanon were indeed like kingdoms unto themselves. Birds and wildlife populated the different levels. Ezekiel longed for a day when God would take a twig, a slip of a cutting, and nurse it into the greatest cedar of all—the messianic kingdom of God. It would tower over all the trees and birds would find shelter in its branches.

Well, now it had arrived, this kingdom, and it was discouraged. So Jesus talked of mustard seeds — a mustard plant had replaced the hoped-for noble cedar.

A HIDDEN KINGDOM

Jesus did not promise a mighty sequoia in which birds could find shade and rest. He did promise a mustard plant, where birds could still find shade and nesting places. Giving shelter is the important point. We will have to do without imposing size and overwhelming appearances for some time to come. The reign of God has arrived, but the expectations need revising. This kingdom is not in the image of the imperial giants.

A display of potential force has a definite effect. Whether it's a junkyard Doberman baring its fangs or a May Day parade of Soviet military might, it is intended to reassure those on one side of the fence and alarm those on the other. As such, it seems to work.

But this kind of power is not that of the Holy One, nor of his kingdom. God is at work in the movement Jesus brings, but this movement uses patient caring, not threats. It is a work for those schooled in the mutual regard that we call love; a work for those schooled in the discipleship of the Messiah and storyteller from Nazareth.





We know today that tornadoes sound like approaching freight trains, but what did the ancients think? For Job, the sound from the whirlwind was the voice of God. It was a theophany, a manifestation of God's presence. Designed to humble, to strike awe into the core of Job's being, it also convinced him that God controlled the universe and accomplished the divine purpose. Even the terrifying chaotic deep, the abode of the monster Leviathan, spirit of chaos, lost some of its horror.

The ancients imagined the inhabited world as a fragile island, floating in a vast alien ocean. Its terrors were personified in the monster of the depths, the god of uncreation. The poet Tennyson captured some of their feeling, calling the beast by its Scandinavian name, the Kraken: "Below the thunders of the upper deer, Far, far beneath in the abysmal sea, His ancient, dreamless, uninvaded sleep, The Kraken sleepeth." God assures Job that "the Kraken" was penned up. The universe was under control.

When Jesus stilled the storm, the disciples were preparing to meet the monster of the deep. But the word of command went forth in time. And now it is the stillness after the storm that inspires awe. Who is this Nazarene?

THE BOAT ON THE SURFACE

In the boat, tossed like a chip on the waves, the early church fathers saw an image of the Church rocking through history. Jesus is present. But he seems to be asleep. How will we be saved from the perilous depths?

And hidden depths still haunt us. We may laugh at primitive pictures of the cosmos, but we know about the deep. We have learned that we live on a blue planet that floats like an island through immensities of space. We have discovered that beneath the apparent solidarity of matter lies a world of whirling atoms, where unimaginable forces lie leashed. We live our relatively successful lives, aware that everything can collapse for us, like a house of cards. We moderns have our own sense of life's precariousness.

Jesus' kingdom moves through history like the boat on the lake. But the creator God, who holds the universe in balance, is with it. The dangers we fear are real, but they will not prevail.





Trust in the Lord

JUNE 30, 1985 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jairus' daughter was dying. Jesus met the frantic father and agreed to see what he could do. On the way to Jairus' house a woman touched Jesus' cloak and was cured. Two cures; two women. Unknown to each other, they are forever together in our minds, with their uncanny symmetry. One had suffered for twelve years; the other was only twelve years old, born at the onset of the other's disease. Both, on the same day, discovered the life force that is in Jesus.

Mark has shaped his gospel as a drama between the forces of life and death. To name these two powers, he borrowed the language of Leviticus - holy and unclean. Jesus is the focus of the power that is holy. When the woman touched his cloak, power flowed out of him and cured her unclean condition. When he touched the little girl, life came flooding back.

While we, from our distance in time and faith, may have come to expect such marvels of the Messiah, at the time, it created a considerable stir. Twelve years of consulting doctors had not helped the woman. And the little girl, according to the experienced judgment of the professional mourners, was unquestion-

ably beyond hope. For both of them, hope for a brighter future went clearly against the evidence.

AGAINST THE EVIDENCE

Faith frequently, perhaps usually, pushes against the evidence. Thus the book of Wisdom says, "God did not make death." God is for life. But it is not difficult to collect evidence that points the other way. Pogroms and

genocide mark the procession of history. The question looms: if God is indeed God, with all the mightiness this implies, why do we suffer? This mystery remains. We receive partial clues. And faith urges us to hold on.

The book of Wisdom adds: "... by the envy of the devil, death entered the world." That is part of the answer, and it points to something more. We imagine the world as neutral; the Bible does not. It sees the

world as fallen, separated from God and under the sway of alien powers. Upon reflection, we recognize this fits our experience.

The world will be regained, but not without a struggle. The victory of the kingdom of God will not be blindingly swift. Why this should be remains a mystery — but perhaps it is because love conquers only by love. Jesus' methods are personal, direct, gentle. He leads; we follow. And today a suffering child has been returned to life.

Jesus is clearly a force for good, for health, for life. Since the time of the Fall, the goodness of creation has been distorted and obscured under the influence of alien powers. But a countermovement is afoot. Emerging from Galilee and spread-

ing out into the entire world, it expresses God's lifegiving concern as love and care.


