

Blessed are those who have not seen and yet believe.

APRIL 6, 1986 • 2nd Sunday of Easter

For those of us who don't know how to read Chinese, Arabic or Russian, these languages are nothing more than marks on a page. We see these marks. They may even be very impressive and decorative. But we don't "see" their meaning. The person who understands these languages sees the same marks that we see but the written symbols have a significance that are hidden from the rest of us.

Many of those who saw and heard Jesus during his earthly life were like the uninstructed who "see" the written characters of a foreign language but can make nothing of them. In a certain sense, these witnesses "saw" the living, breathing Jesus. Yet, in a very real sense, they did not see him at all; they missed the deeper meaning which his words and deeds had.

SEEING JESUS

The Gospel of John was written towards the end of the first century. Those who had actually seen Jesus in the flesh were now either old or dead and were beginning to realize that soon there would be no eyewitnesses left. The gospel writer wanted to reassure his readers, who had learned about Jesus second-hand, that they were in no way inferior to those people who had directly witnessed Christ. Today many of us think that somehow it would be so much easier to believe if we could have directly experienced the marvels that Jesus worked. Yet, so many who witnessed what Jesus said and did saw without seeing. They did not believe in him or his message.

In today's gospel, Jesus says, "Blessed are they who have not seen and have believed." For many people, the Jesus they have never seen physically is more real and important to them than many of the people and things they see and touch in their everyday lives. Through faith, they have a personal relationship with Jesus — a relationship that enraptures, changes and motivates them.

Thomas wanted to see and touch. But he learned to know Jesus in a way that went far beyond seeing and touching. He knew him as "my Lord and my God."

The risen Christ is no longer subject to the limitations of ordinary earthly existence. He is able to come and go at will, to be with his disciples in their fear despite their efforts to isolate themselves by hiding behind closed doors. He is able to penetrate their very hearts by breathing peace into them.

The author of the Book of Revelation experiences that same truth in the persecution which he and the Christian community of his time are encountering. In his vision, John stands among the golden lampstands

which symbolize the local communities to which he is writing. Appearing to John, Christ emphasizes that he (Christ) will live forever.

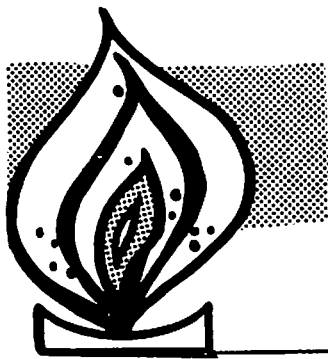

A personal reflection on being a rural missionary

In 1970, I was one of four School Sisters of St. Francis from Milwaukee who answered "yes" to the call we heard from the mountain folk of southeastern Kentucky. This is an area in the Appalachian chain populated by a colony of mountain poor whose homes are scattered throughout its hollows and scarred hills. We arrived in Williamsburg having no home and no jobs. But we held tightly to our dream and remembered St. Francis, who was once called a dreamer, too.

We soon found a tiny, four-room place that we would call home for the first two years, and before long we were involved in teaching adults and children, directing the first Head Start Program in this area of the country, and working with coal miners and their families. For me, a new song wanted to be sung. The refrain was clearly in the gospel word: "When I was hungry, you fed me; thirsty, you gave me drink; naked, you clothed me."

FRIENDSHIP CENTER

I gathered together mountain women and from their talents for sewing, sharing, making music, caring and cooking, emerged the church of the marketplace, Friendship Center. Such centers multiplied to include new places and hundreds of mountain families. As the women became adept at life in the Center, it became my ministry to carry Center life to those in the creeks and hollows, bringing their gifts in turn to the Center's round of celebration. Eventually, the Center expanded to include a craft co-op, home health programs, legal

assistance, and clusters of community action groups.

A Franciscan sister from Tiffin, Ohio, and I are now part of a four-county effort, and feel we are real "pioneers" as we share in the pain and poverty of Owsley County. In five years, we hope to have a Catholic community here. For now, we visit homes, provide food, clothing and furnishings, and cooperate with a Peace and Justice Commission that's introducing employment into the area. But mostly, we are here to *be with* the people, to be a Church presence where there has been no Church.

We believe we are scattering seeds, and already we see small shoots sprouting up that give us hope. There is a richness in the lives of the people that's being unlocked. Our challenge is to incorporate the uniqueness of the mountain people's values, traditions and heritage with the religious traditions we bring.

A year ago, there was no worshipping community on this mountain, and now there is. To us, this is proof enough that the Lord has been working in our midst.

Dear Friends in Christ,

I have been requested by many to clarify the status of Father Robert Patin, who received a leave of absence from the active ministry in the Archdiocese of New Orleans, in August 1984. In the letter granting that leave of absence I wrote, "It is understood you will not wear clerical dress nor celebrate Mass nor perform other priestly functions".

He has violated this agreement and is suspended from exercising priestly orders according to the provisions of Canon 1333 and Canon 1394 of the Code of Church Law. He is not authorized to celebrate the Sacraments. He is not authorized to witness any marriages of Catholics; any marriage of Catholics witnessed by him is invalid in the eyes of God and the Church.

Father Patin has not received a dispensation from his priestly vow of celibacy. Nevertheless he has attempted marriage in a civil ceremony.

Last year Father Patin established a church which he described in an open letter in these confusing words, "The first parish of the United Evangelical Church has been named Holy Innocents Church in honor of my beautiful daughter Elizabeth who was born last December 28, the feast of Holy Innocents". This year his letter bore the heading "Holy Innocents Catholic Church". I wish to emphatically state that "Holy Innocents Catholic Church" is in no way affiliated with the Archdiocese of New Orleans or the Roman Catholic Church.

We pray that Father Patin and his legal spouse will respond to the graces offered them and will return to the observance of the law of God and His Church which will welcome them wholeheartedly in a spirit of charity and love.

4th Sunday of Easter

Have you ever waited in a crowded airport to be reunited with a loved one from whom you have been separated too long? Searching through the crowd, you are afraid that you will not be able to recognize that person. You try to picture his or her features, but they seem blurred. And you don't even try to remember what his or her voice used to sound like.

Yet, when you finally spot that face in the crowd or hear that voice behind you, your memories come flooding back to you. Gone are your fears. How silly it was to think that you could have forgotten someone so precious to you!

THEY HEAR MY VOICE

Discovering Jesus is something like that. It is a process of recognition which we cannot fully explain. Sometimes the task of finding Jesus might seem insurmountable. How will I know it is really he? How should I interpret his Word. Am I living the way he wants?

To the observer, one sheep looks like another. Yet sheep have a remarkable facility for recognizing each other. The mother ewe will be unmoved by dozens of seemingly identical lambs but filled with maternal concern for the one that is her own.

Perhaps it is this ability for sheep to recognize each other that Jesus uses these animals as images for the believer. The believer, too, has an ability to recognize things which go beyond ordinary sight. Among the many gods and messiahs available today (and our modern world probably has as many gods as the world of Jesus' time, though we do not call them gods anymore), the true believer recognizes Jesus as God and Lord.

If at times our faith seems obscured or weakened, we should remember what Jesus said: "I give (my sheep) eternal life and they shall never perish. No one shall snatch them out of my hand."

What a tremendous sense of security Christians should have! They form a flock whose shepherd is Christ.

We constitute, then, a great community. We may look upon the Church as the community of those whose hearts are given up to reverence of Christ as Lord. Unity is a part of community, and unity has its most meaningful beginning in the acknowledgement of Jesus Christ as Savior. That common bond unites men and women of whatever race or tongue in true fellowship.

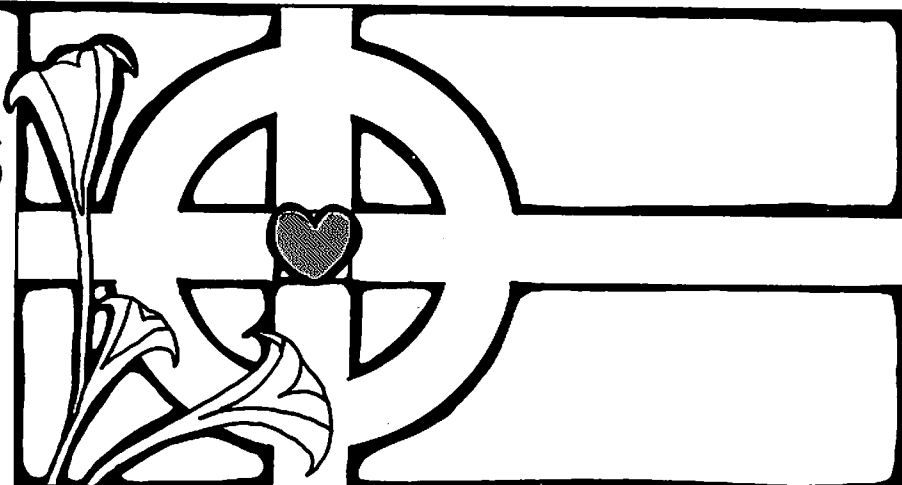

Parting instructions carry a special weight. Scripture depicts a number of famous figures who left final orders to their families or followers. The patriarch Jacob gives to his sons a dying blessing which forshadowes the future of his descendants. The dying David gives practical advice to his son and successor Solomon. Moses, knowing that his end is near, gives to his people detailed information about life in the promised land which they are about to enter.

Today's gospel is taken from Jesus' words to his apostles at the meal he shared with them before his Passion and death. A meal can be a time of special intimacy. We share food with family and friends. But the setting of this meal gives it a very special solemnity.

LOVE ONE ANOTHER

Jesus' parting command is deceptively simple: love one another. Unlike Moses, who left detailed instructions covering every imaginable situation, Jesus makes no attempt to provide prepackaged solutions to all of life's dilemmas. He has confidence that the person who loves will instinctively make the right choices. "Love, and do what you will," says St. Augustine. He was simply repeating the words of Jesus. Or, as Paul said, any com-

mand that God may ever give is a consequence of the command of love.

We spend our lives learning to love. We sometimes love best when we are least aware of our efforts. Love is not necessarily something one learns or achieves by self-consciously putting a set of instructions into practice. In his great hymn of love in the First Letter to the Corinthians, Paul suggests that one can do great deeds, even to the point of delivering oneself over to be burned alive, and still lack love. Love moves us to action. But action without love is in the end empty.

Christian love comes in the form of a person. Again it is Paul who tells us that the love of God is poured out in our hearts by the Holy Spirit who is given to us. We share in the Spirit, who is born of the love of the Creator and the Son.

Love smooths out the rough edges. We accept the difficult demands with joy and begin to appreciate Jesus when he said that his yoke is easy and his burden is light.

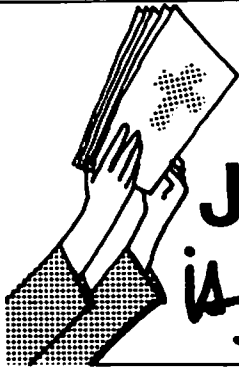

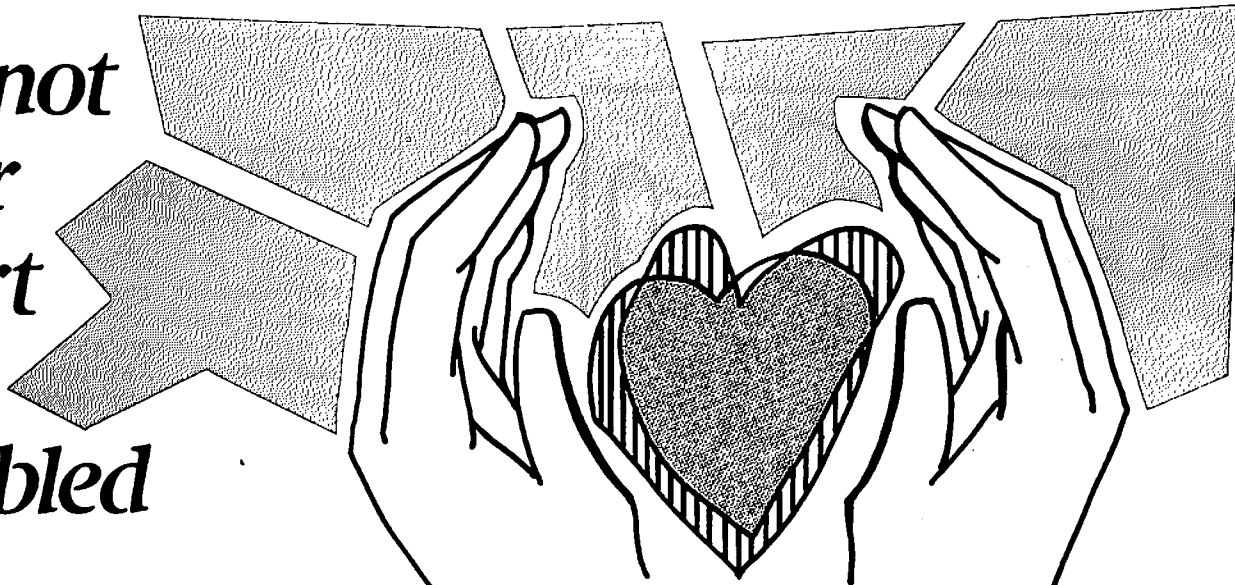

MAY 4, 1986 • 6th Sunday of Easter

"Three gates in the east, Three gates in the west,
Three gates in the north, Three gates in the south,
There's twelve gates to that city, Hallelujah."

In the American song tradition of the black slaves, spirituals like "Follow the Drinking Gourd" kept alive the slaves' sense of self-worth and their hope for freedom. The "drinking gourd" was the constellation of stars which form the Big Dipper, pointing north to freedom up the route of the underground railroad. The twelve-gated city offered a vision of a free society, borrowed from John's Book of Revelation.

Where is God? Everywhere, of course. That news is part of the first religious information we receive as children. And yet, impressive as it is, it's not enough. Or perhaps it's too much. We need focus, something trimmed closer to our size. We need a God we can approach. We need a God we can find.

Israel located God's presence in the Jerusalem Temple. It was God's "dwelling place," a sacred space in which the barren traveler could find rest and reassurance.

NEW "TEMPLE"

The conviction of the New Testament is that Jesus

has become the new temple. In him, God is present in time and space.

When the time arrived for Jesus to return to the Father, he transferred this "function" to his disciples. The community of followers were to be the new "temple," the new sacrament. The location of God's presence on earth shifted from a place to a people.

The new "temple" was mobile. And so it was equipped to carry out Israel's dream of a universal people of God, the enduring hope for the future in Israel's scheme of things. The new temple was mobile; it could move out into the world. This missionary work of Paul realized the beginning of this dream. And as the walls of stone came down, the new freedom emerged. Everyone, Gentile as well as Jew, was welcomed into the new temple.

Not without some resistance, of course. The walls had stood in place too long to be easily dismissed. And even now we cannot entirely forget them. Our welcoming is still imperfect. And yet the promise remains: Twelve gates to that city. Hallelujah.

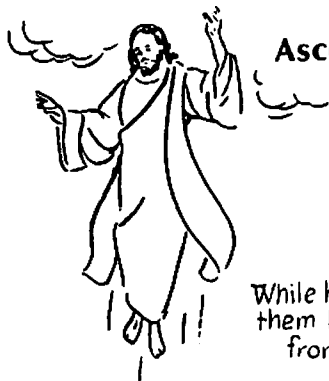

A personal reflection on being a religious brother

"Seeing a need and doing something about it" perhaps best describes how Holy Cross Brother William Geenen became involved in his "second career."

While on a student recruiting trip to Florida some years ago, Brother William had personal experience of the loneliness suffered by the nation's fastest growing segment of the population — the elderly. Not content to commiserate over the plight of those who had given so much to our national heritage, Brother William prevailed upon his superiors to allow him to begin a ministry to the elderly. It was a radical change from the work he had been doing as a teacher and administrator at Gilmore Academy in Gates Mills, Ohio.

From that initiative has developed what is considered by many to be the nation's model nonprofit, nonsectarian, multipurpose, senior service organization: Senior Friendship Centers, Inc. "The early years were difficult," says Brother William "but I was blessed with some wonderful people who volunteered their time."

What that means is that today Brother William, who started with a rundown old house and an old dining room table nine years ago, now oversees an operation that provides much needed services to over 2,000 senior citizens a day from 22 locations on Florida's west coast.

PEOPLE HELP PEOPLE

Senior Friendship Centers provide candlelight dinners,

transportation, health care, adult day care, home chore service, appliance repairs, as well as education and recreation activities in an area where the number of people over 60 years of age comprise nearly 50% of the population.

Senior Friendship Centers are not, however, a continuous series of fun and games. One of the unique services which is provided is health care to those who cannot afford the fee of going to a doctor's office. Brother William has enlisted the services of a cadre of retired physicians, nurses and medical receptionists. These donate their services to the Center, so there is a complete and competent medical staff available five days a week.

Brother William had no previous experience in working with the elderly. He would like to see more religious, both women and men, who feel trapped in their present ministry move into similar non-institutional types of ministry where they are able to use a variety of talents they they may have never used before.

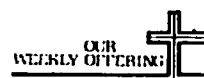



THEY WERE FILLED WITH THE HOLY SPIRIT



MAY 18, 1986 • Pentecost

Jesus promised the Spirit would be sent to dwell among his followers. As the inner life of the Christian community, the Holy Spirit has come to have many meanings. Some of these cluster around the theme of proclamation: wisdom to say the right thing, courage to stand before hostile audiences, inspiration to interpret the Hebrew Scriptures, and the gift of tongues.

Members of the Christian community at Corinth possessed the gift of speaking in tongues. Some of the

divisions this church experienced seem to have been over the status accorded this gift. Paul tries to put things in perspective. The "charisms" are not the possessions of individuals, but gifts given for the full community.

Luke authored Acts long after Paul's struggle with the Corinthians. Luke, too, is familiar with the gift of tongues. But this conception differs distinctly. Instead of a private language, Luke presents us with a proclamation of exceptional clarity. No gift of interpretation is needed, even by those who would need a translator in regular circumstances.

For Luke, the gift of the Spirit is the beginning of the age of the Church. The Book of Acts of the Apostles is its program. The Spirit initiates the adventure of moving out into the world — a world often unreceptive of the message. It begins a movement toward healing divisions.

PRACTICING PENTECOST

So Pentecost is also action.

The gift of the Spirit is one of courage. Better put, this is the gift that gives us the power to carry through the program begun by Jesus. The Spirit enables us to do what Jesus did. The Church, which is delegated to continue Jesus' ministry, can easily be paralyzed by the massiveness of the task. Jesus fed the hungry, healed the sick, eased the suffering. He brought peace and reconciliation. But today it seems hopeless.

And so we tell ourselves: Jesus was divine. He could do things that we cannot.

The gift of the Spirit allows us to do more than we can on our own. Some of this is not so mysterious. For we consistently underestimate our individual capabilities. Here the gift of courage permits us to extend ourselves further. Likewise, we can do more when we cooperate. Your strengths complement my weaknesses. Here Paul's notion of the coordinated gifts of the Spirit has its place.

And some of it remains a mystery. Here is the Spirit of hope beyond hope. It enables us to explore possibilities that the world says do not exist. It refuses to say no. It refuses to accept conditions that the world of common sense has accepted as unfortunate, but beyond help. The gift of the Spirit is God working through us.

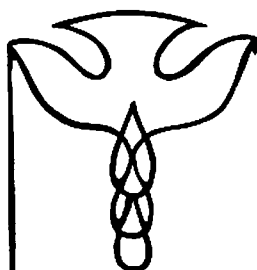

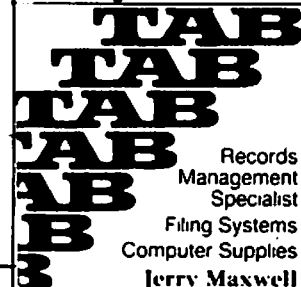

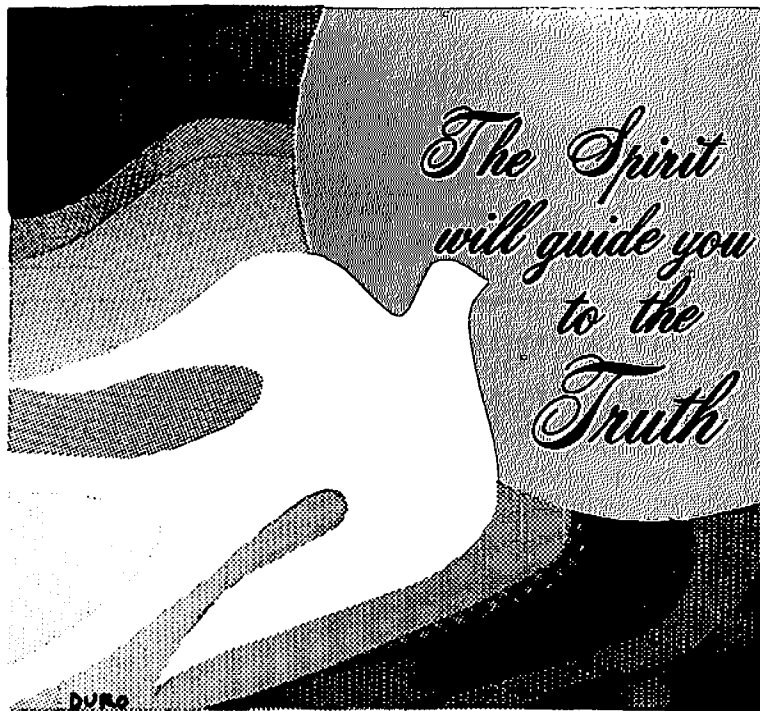

MAY 25, 1986 • Trinity Sunday

Euclid knew all about triangles, but not about the Trinity. In his *Elements* he defined a triangle as "a figure bounded by three straight lines joined at the ends."

Euclid's triangle is a common symbol for the divine Trinity. The figure unambiguously represents the Three Persons in One. It is perhaps the simplest of single figures, even while being almost aggressively threefold. Three angles, three sides, and nothing more. Nothing in a triangle detracts from its tripleness.

Triangular constructions are among the most stable. By contrast, the square is given to tilting to one side or the other. But not the triangle. Simple and secure. Perhaps that is why it was chosen as the road sign for slow-moving vehicles.

As a shorthand symbol for the divinity, the triangle works splendidly. It is suitably modest in the face of fathomless mystery. It evokes in our minds the familiar formula: "Three Persons in One God" — a verbal statement almost Euclidian in its schematic simplicity.

But there are personal depths to explore, as well. And the New Testament dares to do so. In the gospels we are shown the individual traits of the divine Persons. John's gospel tells us how Jesus promised to send to his followers the "Spirit of truth," after he returned to his Father. St. Paul writes of Christ, God and Spirit, linking them respectively to the virtues of faith, hope and love — at least in today's second reading. It is a worthwhile reflection to consider how these correlate.

FURNACES AND FIRESTORMS

The New Testament attempts to explore the mystery. Striking iron, the Trinity sends out cascades of sparks. Some may catch fire in our imaginations.

And the New Testament builds its case upon the Old. Strictly speaking, the Trinity is not contained in the Old Testament, for that is a Christian revelation. But hints and surmises appear in the Old, which are seized upon and developed in the New. These allusive passages appear especially in the Wisdom literature of the Old Testament, such as the Book of Proverbs. The personification of God's creative wisdom as a woman, and God's eternal companion, is somewhat startling. We are accustomed to more sedate images of the Godhead.

John's picture of the Spirit of truth borrows some features from Lady Wisdom. The creative Spirit informs the New Creation. Paul, for his part, speaks of the Spirit of love. What is touched on here, but only dimly glimpsed, is the intense inner life of the Trinity. The divine communion is not a rigid triangle. It is not a stiff, formal alliance, like a Victorian family posing for the photogravure. Rather, it is an intensity of love and truth which we can only vaguely comprehend. It is mystery which, if we could but glimpse at it, would dizzy us. Like looking into the door of a blast furnace. It is the firestorm of life that flares out into the prodigal life of creation. And it is the sustaining life of the Church.

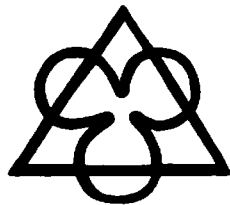

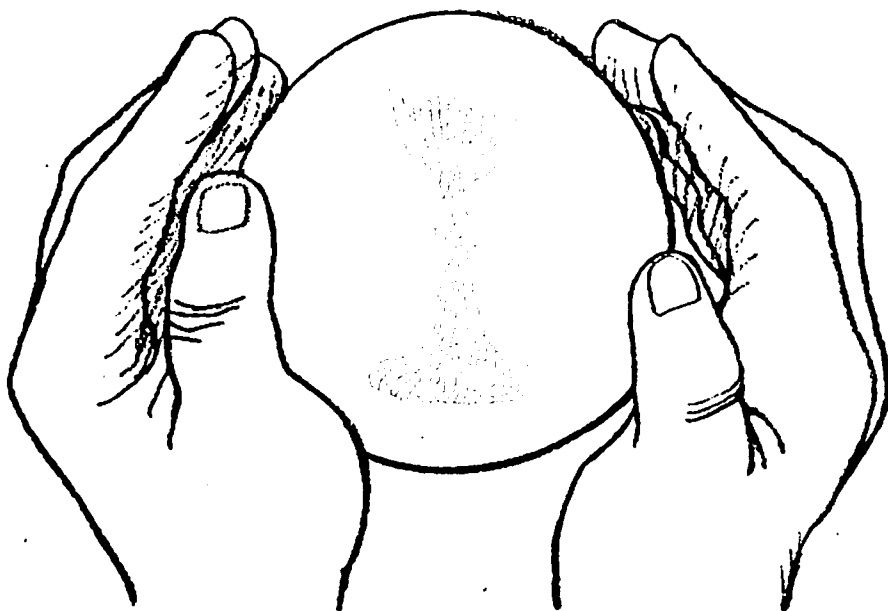

JUNE 1, 1986 • The Body and Blood of Christ

The Body and Blood of Christ—that is the new name of today's solemnity. The name refers to the sacrament of the eucharist—the gift of Christ's body and blood as food. As the minister of communion offers us bread and wine at Mass we hear the words: the body and blood of Christ. When we respond "Amen" and take the host and drink from the chalice, we acknowledge our faith in the eucharistic mystery.

That belief may not come easily. In fact, the whole idea of eating together as a way of expressing unity may have lost much of its appeal. How important is it to anyone in our fragmented, mobile society that our family share a meal together at home? Do children gain a sense of their unity in the family through partaking of food together? The eucharist, remember, is a meal: a breaking of bread together.

The Bible also stresses the use of bread and wine in its rituals and worship. These were the common food of the Near East all through biblical times. How many of our children would consider bread or wine as a staple food? And unless a loaf of bread is used in the eucharist, the host may not be associated with "real bread."

A TESTIMONY AND A PLEDGE

To appreciate better the role of the eucharist in our

lives, we can start with the words of St. Paul in today's second reading: "Every time you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the death of the Lord until he comes!" Our mission in life is somehow to carry on God's redemption of mankind through the cross and resurrection of Jesus. By participating in the eucharistic meal, we proclaim our belief for all to see. Our "Amen" when receiving the eucharist is thus a crucial testimony to our faith.

It is this faith, which the eucharist helps to sustain, that carries us through the many difficult times in our lives. Holy communion enables us to become one with Christ. He nourishes us, gives us strength. Through the eucharist, we can transform worship into concern, prayer into action. To eat and drink with Jesus allows us to share in the presence of Jesus and his union with the believing community.

Belief, then, starts with this life and is fulfilled in the next. The eucharist, in fact, is the pledge of our eternal life. Those who eat and drink will live forever. That's a promise made by the Lord.

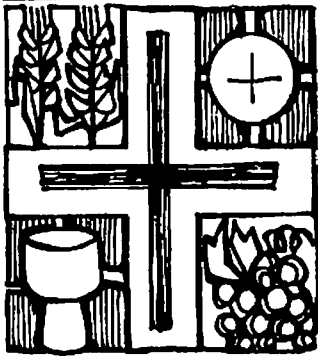

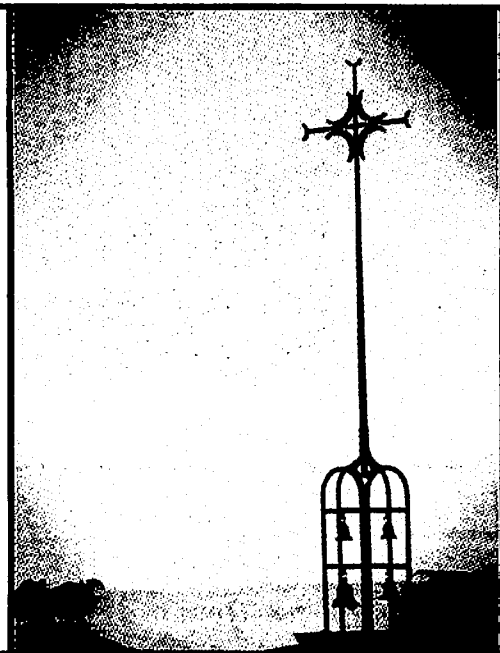

A reflection on being a permanent deacon

There is a tendency to refer to the permanent diaconate as a "part-time" ministry but deacons are increasingly recognizing the fallacy of such a statement.

Ken is a deacon who travels in his business. In the years since his ordination he has discovered an informal but significant ministry among other traveling sales representatives he regularly comes in contact with.

Bill worked for a large government agency before retirement. When it became known that he had been ordained to the diaconate his fellow employees began seeking him out for consolation and spiritual support.

In my own experience I have discovered those in need of ministry through my writing. I recall a few years ago I wrote a piece on reconciliation. A reader wrote to me with bitterness in her heart because she had married out of the Church and felt alienated and rejected. Upon making contact with her I discovered that her husband had been married previously as a teen-ager and that the marriage lasted a very short time. We instituted a marriage case through the tribunal and obtained a decree of nullity for the husband. I had the great satisfaction of assisting at his baptism and their marriage.

SHARING PROBLEMS

There have been other opportunities for me to minister to those who have corresponded with me as a result of an article that I have written. Some have turned out well, others have been in situations not so easily corrected, but at least I was able to share their problems.

In the revision of the national guidelines for the permanent diaconate proposed to the American bishops this fall, the idea that "ministry is where you find it" is incorporated.

"Although most deacons will give only part of their time to formal diaconal ministries, they should not neglect the opportunities they have to exercise their ministry in the world or in the market place."

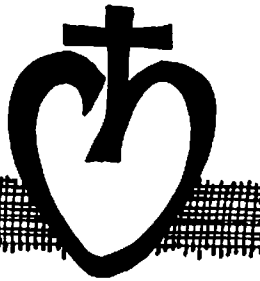

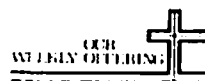

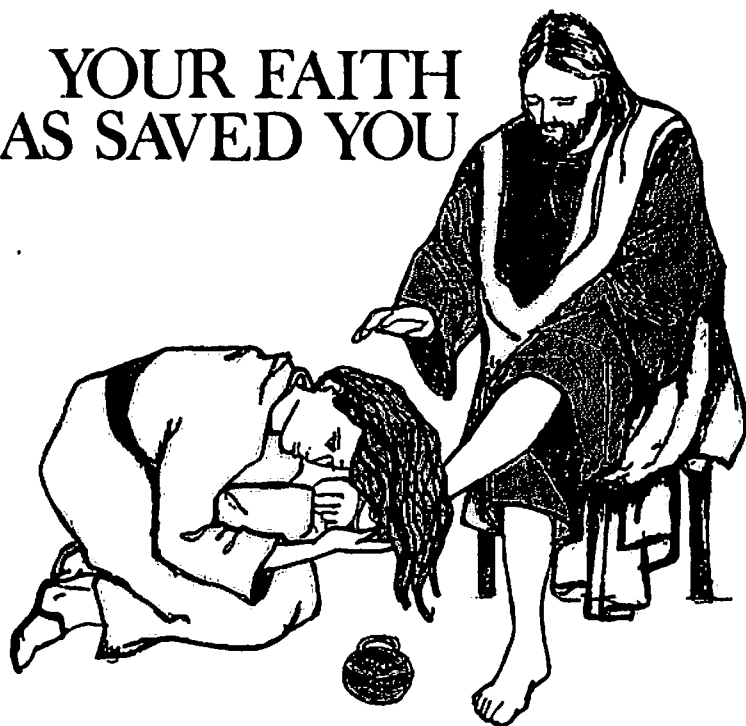

11th Sunday in Ordinary Time

The Bible is filled with examples of God's forgiveness to sinners.

Although God had bestowed numerous blessings on King David, David still sinned against God. Instead of condemning the king of Israel, God forgave David when he expressed repentance for his actions.

Paul, one of the most dedicated followers of Christ, was a sinner himself. Before his conversion, Paul was a notorious persecutor of the early Christian community. Because of his miraculous encounter with Christ, however, he radically changed his life by accepting Christ and doing everything possible to spread the gospel.

During his earthly life, Jesus frequently associated with sinners. He did not turn away anyone who wanted to learn about his teaching or who asked for his forgiveness. Mary

Magdalene, the Good Thief, Peter the Apostle are some of the examples of sinners who sought Jesus' mercy.

Reconciliation is a recurring theme in the Bible. And it is this reconciliation that gives us hope. There is no sin too big, no action too terrible that cannot be forgiven by God.

Even Judas could have been shown forgiveness if only he had not despaired. His final sin was not that he had betrayed Jesus but that he had given up on God's saving mercy.

WE FORGIVE

In fact, God's forgiveness knows no limits—a reality that is both reassuring and frightening. For in forgiving us, God in turn calls us to forgive ourselves and others. Frequently we are our own worst enemies. We admonish ourselves for our weaknesses. We may become disgusted when we promise to change and then fall back to our old ways. Jesus told us that we had to strive toward perfection. But as humans, we frequently will fail. All God expects of us is to pick ourselves up and try again.

Likewise, God expects us to forgive others as we ourselves have been forgiven. A wife who forgives her repentant husband is exhibiting God's mercy. Friends who forgive each other of their faults demonstrate God's forgiving nature. Confessors who show kindness and compassion in dealing with penitents manifest God's willingness to have sinners experience reconciliation.

We are a sinful people. We are filled with imperfections and weaknesses. But we are assured salvation through Jesus' death and resurrection. By admitting our sinfulness, by expressing sorrow for our wrongdoings, by sincerely trying to change our lives, we are once again united with God. Divine forgiveness knows no limits.

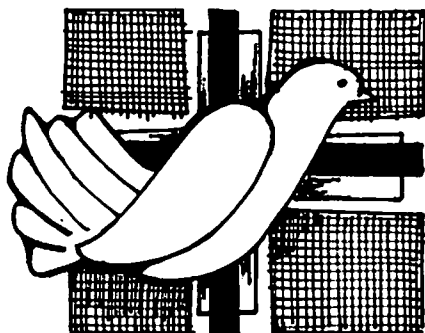

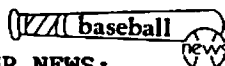

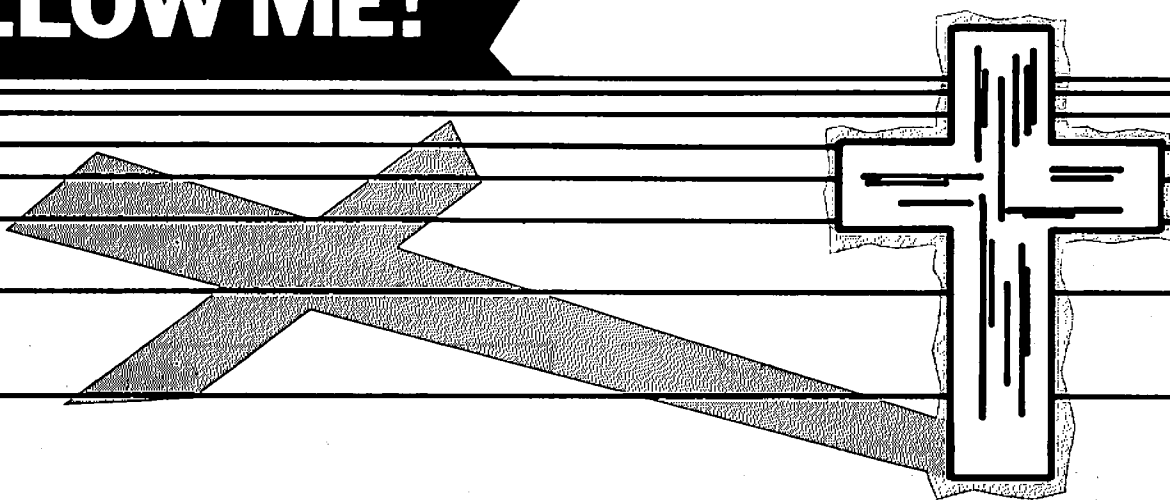

JUNE 22, 1986 • 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time

If you look on a world map for the place called Galatia, you won't find it. The Galatians at the time of Christ were residents of an area in the middle of what we now call Turkey. The Galatians are familiar to us only because the apostle Paul wrote one of his epistles to them. This letter includes one of Paul's best known passages: "All of you who have been baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with him. There does not exist among you Jew or Greek, slave or freeman, male or female. All are one in Christ Jesus."

The three examples used by Paul are pertinent to our society today. We still divide the world into those like us and those who are different because of their looks, background or style of life. For the Jews at the time of Paul, the "other" could be symbolized by the Greeks. The Greeks did not have the revelation of the one God nor the promises made to Abraham.

FORMS OF DISCRIMINATION

Paul also speaks of the end of the distinction based on wealth or position: neither slave nor free. We know there is still plenty of that kind of separation today. Sometimes we divide people by their income; sometimes by level of education; often by the class with

which a person conducts himself or herself in society.

And, of course, there is the male-female distinction. Certainly we have a tradition that women perform the tedious tasks, and have little to say on the "bigger" questions. Although the role of women is changing in today's society, discrimination still exists. If there is such sexual discrimination in your life, tradition doesn't make it right — but it does make it more difficult to overcome.

Despite the varying degrees of intelligence, physical beauty, wealth, and talents that we have, union with Christ gives us all an inherent worth. God created us as human beings and, therefore, we are special.

The Christians in Galatia were told that they, through their faith in Christ, had the power to overcome the downgrading of people. They now had the power to see each other as individuals on an equal basis, and to live with each other as equals.

That is the power provided by Christ. Dare to use it?

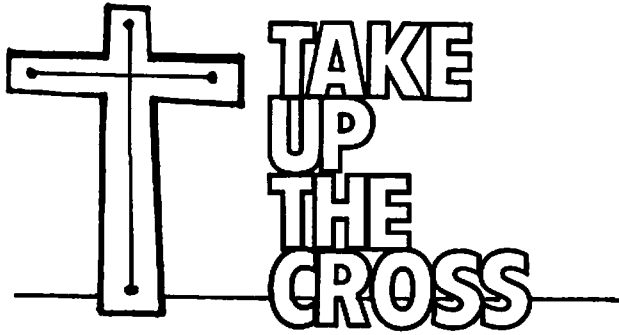

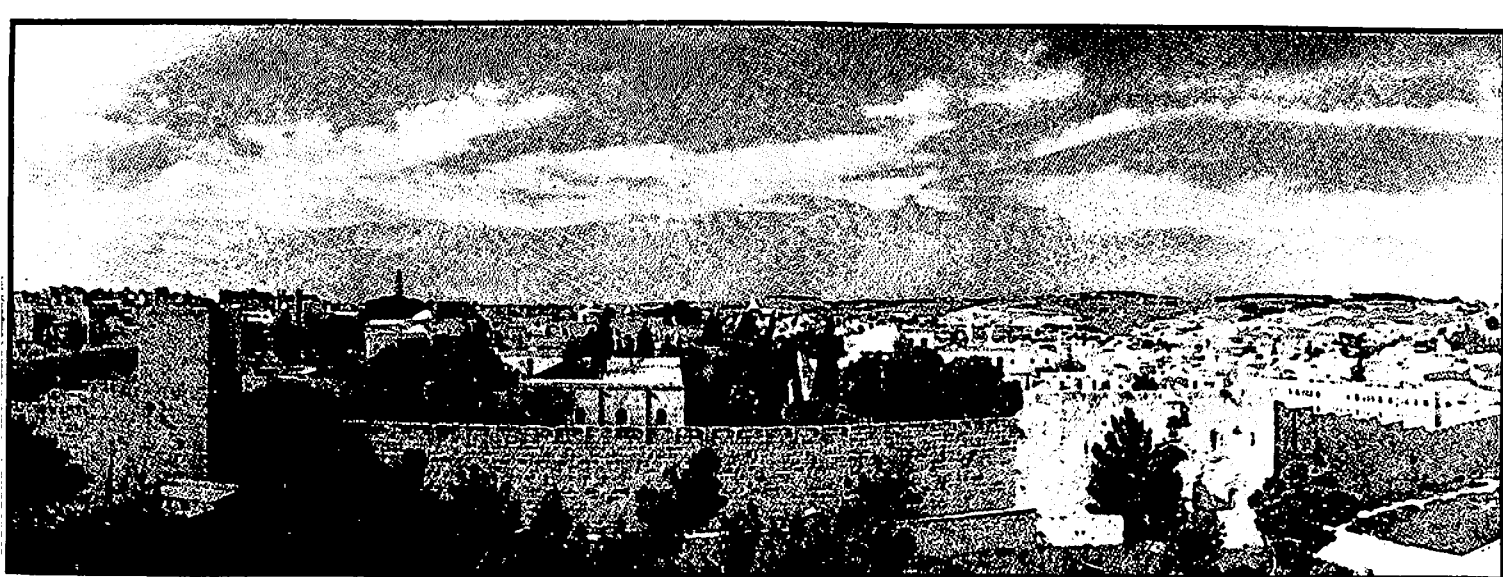

Spirit of God, guide us

JUNE 29, 1986 • Peter and Paul, Apostles

Today's readings include two of the most often quoted passages in the New Testament. First we hear Paul's words as he reviews his life for the younger man, Timothy: "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith." Paul adds that his time of struggle and competition with the forces of evil in the world is about over. He is ready to receive the crown of glory that has been promised by the Lord.

In today's gospel, Jesus reveals to Peter the role he (Peter) is to play in the Church. "I for my part declare to you, you are 'Rock,' and on this rock I will build my Church, and the jaws of death shall not prevail against it. I will entrust to you the keys of the kingdom of heaven. Whatever you declare bound on earth shall be bound in heaven; whatever you declare loosed on earth shall be loosed in heaven."

EXAMPLES FOR US

Paul's words came at the end of a lifetime of missionary work in Europe and Asia. He tells us that he counted everything as loss unless it somehow advanced his goal of bringing Christ to the world. What

motivated him was the assurance, based on the promise of Christ, that after his time on earth there would be a deliverance to the heavenly kingdom. A "crown" would be given him if he remained faithful.

That mission is ours today, and that assurance of glory based on keeping the faith is also ours.

The mission we have and the glory we will receive must be seen and lived in terms of the Christian community. Peter was the leader of the Church built by Christ. Because of his awareness of who Jesus was, Peter had a unique position in the community of believers.

Although we may never possess the greatness of Peter and Paul, we are still called to live and spread the gospel message. Peter and Paul are examples for us. Their faith and leadership still speak to us. Christ is a much alive today as he was in Peter and Paul's time. All we have to do is listen to his word and follow him.
