Americans are said to be a people on the move, in a restless search for an elusive dream. From towns to cities, cities to towns — to the south, the north, to the east or west, we move. Rare, today, is the person who lives an entire lifetime in his or her birthplace.

Perhaps then we have a special feeling for the notion of the Church emphasized by the Second Vatican Council: the people of God on pilgrimage, working its way toward the New Jerusalem, leaving home only to come home.

In the liturgical season following Pentecost, the worshiping Church detects a reflection of itself in the Gospel of Luke. We travel with Jesus on journey to Jerusalem. During this time, the gospel readings are selected from Luke's "Road" section—chapters nine through eighteen.

As long as there have been storytellers, story cycles of the travelers on the road — from Homer's "Odyssey" to TV's "Star Trek" — have been popular. Each week a new stop along the way; each week a new episode. And so it is with us and Luke's travelogue.

CAMPAIGN OF THE 72

This week, Jesus is shown sending out an advance team of 72 disciples. The word that comes to mind is "campaign." We have our fundraising campaigns, military campaigns, election campaigns. A sense of this kind of concentrated effort is echoed in the story of the 72.

Who hasn't seen the film of the "commando raid": storming a village, establishing a base, setting up communications, securing supplies. The urgency of the military campaign flavors the account of the nonmilitary 72, preparing the way ahead.

At election time, another kind of campaign enters our lives. In an organized effort, canvassers blanket the neighborhood. They contact the citizens, urging them to vote for their candidate. And here too, the story of the 72 finds a resonance. The delegates of Jesus are promoting a decision-taking.

The urgency, the call to decision — these mark the campaign of the 72. We too are on a mission, a delegation; we are not wandering aimlessly. While it is easy for us to associate the word "mission" with Africa or China, we realize without too much reflection that there is missionwork to be done right where we are. Our efforts at providing consolation for a disconsolate friend, for giving hope where the future seems blank, for offering meaning where meaning seems to have collapsed, in this we are acting as the delegates of Jesus of Nazareth, finding our way down the journey's path.





A reflection on lay ministry

The increase in lay ministry over the last 20 years has met both positive and negative reaction. First the term lay ministry has a variety of meanings. It can refer to any act of service which the Church itself designates as necessary for the fulfillment of its mission.

For example, a senior citizen might be formally commissioned to take communion to shut-ins. Or in a broader sense lay ministry can refer to any act of Christian service. In the latter sense lay ministry can mean the simple befriending of a poor person or stranger in one's community.

There has been a markedly positive response to lay ministry. Lay people welcome and enjoy the opportunities to play significant roles in the Church. Many recognize the wide variety of ways in which the Church can increase the services it offers through the use of lay people. Also lay people frequently bring varying degrees of professional training to their work in ministry. Often this training comprises the disciplines of human relations, counseling and education which is useful in parish work.

IMPROVED TRAINING

The training and preparation of lay ministers is constantly improving. Increasingly parishes, clusters of par-

ishes, and dioceses are offering opportunities wherein the laity can deepen its knowledge of theology and sharpen its ministerial skills. In our own diocese there are currently 16 people who have enrolled in a program of study sponsored jointly by the Office of Education and the Institute of Ministry at Loyola University in New Orleans. This program leads to a master's degree in pastoral ministry or religious education. Programs like these are offered at a number of universities across the nation and graduating skilled pastoral ministers in increasing numbers every year.

There is much to be hopeful about. The Church will have many more skilled helpers to complement the work that the clergy has done so well for many years. The Church can only be the richer for all of this.



Word of God

JULY 20, 1986 • 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time

High in the Pennine Alps, the Grand St. Bernard Pass connects Italy and Switzerland. Long ago St. Bernard of Menthon founded a famous hospice for travelers in the pass, and the Augustinian monks continue the tradition. But perhaps we are more familiar with the dogs they breed for rescue operations. They frequently appear in cartoons with brandy flasks suspended from their necks.

The monks specialize in hospitality, and hospitality is this week's watchword for Christian service. While the seasonal theme of the "journey" continues, our attention shifts from the weary traveler to the welcoming host. For the Church is guesthouse as well as pilgrimage. As a moving caravan, the Church is both traveler and host. We "minister" to each other. "Hospitality" is mutual.

Hospitality underlines the roles of compassion in Christianity. Abraham is our patron. In welcoming the mysterious strangers, he responds to their needs and asks no prying questions, even though his mind is buzzing with curiosity. Once the guests are comfortable, then there will be plenty of time for questions.

HOSPITALITY IS "BEING PRESENT"

There is more to the art of hospitality than applying slippers to sore feet and giving supper to starving stomachs. The story of Jesus' visit at the home of Martha and Mary brings this out clearly. In addition to a warm meal and a comfortable chair, the "stranger" needs to be

recognized. Personal attention is also an act of welcoming and a gift offered.

Underlying our physical needs lie more personal problems. We are lonely. Or we are misunderstood. Or we are not given the credit we know we deserve. The list goes on. And these spiritual wounds make our concrete problems seem all the more difficult to bear. The Christian who specializes in hospitality recognizes the human being in the travel-worn figure standing in the doorway.

Not only was Jesus on the road, he was on the road with a message of good news. Part of due consideration, Mary knew, was to hear him out. Perhaps her modern counterpart is Dorothy Day, founder of the Catholic Worker "Hospitality Houses." She used to claim she had little to offer her guests but the gift of personal presence. And yet, that may be much more than we realize. Dorothy was clear about something else, too. Hospitality consisted not so much in being Christ to the traveler, but rather in recognizing Christ in the traveler.

The art of hospitality can stand as emblem for the whole of Christian life. It makes personal contact; it ventures beyond simply donating money for the cause. Today's Readings: Gn. 18:1-10; Col. 1:24-28; Lk. 10: 38-42.





LORD, teach us to pray

JULY 27, 1986 • 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Anyone who has traveled to Jerusalem on a Holy Land tour will not easily forget the "Souk" — the marketplace in the Old City, where all business is done by energetic bargaining. For Westerners, it proves "a unique cultural experience," if not a culture shock. The adventurous tourist finds it an exciting novelty to bargain for purchases. But for the less confident, a nagging feeling persists: have I made a bad deal? Of course those who enjoy bargaining are those able to enter into the game without undue worrying about the consequences. Never-

theless, it doesn't strike us as the proper way to handle seri-

ous business.

Today's portrait of Abraham is right out of the Souk, as he bargains over the fate of Sodom and Gomorrah. This is serious business. It is, in fact, a matter of life or death. Abraham's dialogue with God is nothing other than an imaginative picture of prayer — persistent prayer. Even desperate prayer.

But prayer imaged as haggling may not be to our taste. Couldn't the matter be presented in a more dignified manner? And yet

Abraham's bargaining says something about prayer itself. Abraham appears to be bargaining astutely. Actually, he is begging. He has nothing to offer in exchange.

BEGGING

But nobody likes to beg. It requires too much humility, and concedes too much pride. It concedes a lack of bargaining chips. It concedes that I have nothing to exchange for what I desire, or need. And so it requires a humility that the best of us can summon only on occa-

sion. And what does Abraham have to bargain with? Nothing really. Only his skill at argumentation.

Very seldom do we like to accept help freely offered; even less do we like to request it. And the situation doesn't seem to differ greatly when it comes to praying. Prayer comes in, frequently, as the last, desperate resort.

Therefore, much of the time we prefer to bargain. "If you help me out here, God, then I will become a model Christian."

It seems so much more dignified, this bargaining. We

feel more like equal partners. We are involved in an exchange: something for us, something for God. Of course, it's very difficult to find a suitable offer. There's so very little God needs. So, in cases of desperation, we can be tempted to punish God. "If you don't help me out here, God, then I will never darken the church door again." Yet this doesn't have a convincing ring either.


When asked about prayer, Jesus presented what we call the Our Father, or Lord's Prayer. And then he described it as

begging. We are to ask, to seek, to knock. And it will be given us. Not because we deserve it. But because God loves us.

God's love is the final word. It is because of this, and not because of any leverage we might place on God, that we can be confident.





AUGUST 3, 1986 • 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Survey the local bookstore, and you're likely to find an entire aisle devoted to the subject, "How To Succeed." Behind our anxiety lies an old, old question: What is the life worth living? Since each of us is given only one life to live, we'd rather not waste it.

And fully as important as becoming a success is being able to tell when we've achieved that elusive goal. One time-honored way to measure which of us is "worth more" is by comparing bank accounts. This is convenient, for money quantifies things. Cash is countable. When everything has a price, we can compare price tags.

The approach, of course, has its problems. Today, Ecclesiastes mentions two of them. The person assembling the fortune rarely has time to enjoy it. On the other hand, another, who doesn't "deserve" it will inherit the lot. So how is this a measure of success? Ecclesiastes worries that if this is the key to success, life threatens to be little more than busywork.

IN WHOSE SIGHT?

Someone in the crowd wanted Jesus to resolve his probate problems for him, but Jesus refused the request. "Friend, who named me as your executor?" It seems Jesus had another conception for success, for he tells of a man summoned to his heavenly reward just as

he was about to consolidate his earthly gains. The farmer in the parable is interrupted by words of reality: This very night your life will be required of you.

Jesus gives a moral to his story: Grow rich in the sight of God. This moves us to the topic of putting forth a good appearance. In his American economic classic, The Theory of the Leisure Class, Thorstein Veblen wrote of "conspicuous consumption." The superior consumer knows how to spend money tastefully and effectively. Beyond the crude comparison of financial worth, there is the more sophisticated comparison of consumption skills.

And here we reach a lesson. We so desperately yearn for evaluation, to be assured that our lives are worth while. At the same time, we dread criticism. Seeking it from those around us, we may find it an alienating experience. But there is only one evaluation which counts. As Colossians tells us today: "Set your hearts on what pertains to higher realms . . . Your life is hidden now with Christ in God. When Christ our life appears, then you shall appear with him in glory."



A reflection on being a missionary priest

What does it mean to be a missionary priest today? As the world is poised between war and peace, between the possibility of total destruction and the chance to build a new world of peace, there has never been a greater need to be a witness to God's love.

The call of the missionary priest is in response to the words of Jesus: "As the Father has sent me, I send you." He is called to meet Jesus in the people of the world. He sees the face of Jesus in the poor, the uneducated, the hungry, the persecuted. He sees Christ's face in that of a Guatemalan child, a persecuted Filipino, an African mother, an old man in Bangladesh. Jesus is there in the refugee camp, the mountain jungle, the village and the city slum.

Jesus showed people that they were loved by teaching, healing, listening, comforting, forgiving. The missionary is called to do the same. He comes to minister and to spread the good news to the people of many lands.

A UNIQUE STORY

Every missionary priest has his own unique story about the way in which God calls him.

"To be a follower of Jesus today, discovering God's presence outside our country in different languages, cul-

tures and nations is an enriching and challenging life," affirms Fr. Ralph Davila, a Maryknoll missioner. "It is also a life where a missionary becomes a sign of hope for peace and justice."

Fr. Davila was born and raised in New York and now calls Galvaston, Texas his home. After ordination, he spent many years teaching candidates for mission, before being assigned to Venezuela.

Maryknoll priest Ed Hayes, who comes from Cambridge, Massachusetts, has lived and worked with the African people for the last 25 years. From this experience he has learned the meaning of dependence — dependence on God and dependence on one another.

"The African culture values life above all things, and Jesus came that we may have the fullness of life," he says. "Looking back over my 25 years as a missionary priest, I wouldn't change them for anything in the world."

This is the eighth in a series of Christian vocation reflections which will appear on the second Sunday of the month throughout 1986.

20th Sunday in Ordinary Time

As with all true love — and discipleship is a love relationship — the path of Christianity does not always go smoothly. The letter to the Hebrews sees a comparison here with a track event: "Let us lay aside every encumbrance of sin which clings to us and persevere in running the race which lies ahead." Struggle and strain is the story.

Jesus' protracted march to Jerusalem may lack the speed of a race, but the journey's very slowness speaks of the struggle. Earlier, John the Baptist had announced "one to come" who would baptize with the Holy Spirit and with fire. Jesus, in today's gospel, accepts this description as applying to himself. But with a difference. He is to submit to the baptism, not simply impose it on others. When Jesus talks about his baptism, he clearly means his cross.

He is ambivalent about this baptism, and not simply because he would avoid pain. He hesitates to bring about the divisions he knows will follow from his action. In taking his stand, in calling others to follow, he comes into conflict with the values of his culture. His disciples know this conflict in issues of life, violence, economics.

A BAPTISM IN MUD

Jesus was ambivalent, and so was Jeremiah. He didn't

want to be a prophet. And with good reason, as we can tell from today's reading. His enemies dump him in an empty cistern, where he sinks into the mud. His predicament looks bad. If baptism is an immersion, this is a baptism in mud. And not unlike Jesus' cross.

As a prophet, Jeremiah came into political conflict with the managers of his day. Mud is an obvious and frequently used political metaphor. We talk of mudslinging and smear campaigns. For Jeremiah, political mud became a nightmarish, literal reality. But there was metaphoric mudslinging as well. The princes in charge of the war effort accused the prophet of ignoring the welfare of his people, when nothing was more painfully close to Jeremiah's heart. The princes may have been exasperated with him, but their comments were unfair. It was a black Ethiopian who finally interceded with the king to get Jeremiah out.

Jeremiah, among other prophets, prefigured Jesus. Prophets are not comfortable. Nor do they make other people comfortable. But they are necessary.

Chancery Policy

The following information has been received from the Chancery Office:

. . to clarify any lingering doubts concerning the practice of accepting multiple intentions for the same Mass, we have received Rescript from the Sacred Penitentiary which reads in part: "the permission of the Ordinary of uniting the intentions received from several donors of stipends in the celebration of only one Mass is allowed with the approval of the Ordinary and with full awareness of those making the offerings. They must be informed about this arrangement so that they will not be defrauded in any way" . . .

Therefore, Archbishop Hannan has approved the practice under the following norms:

- That all stipends go to the parish, not to the Priest-Celebrant.
- 2) That no set stipend is demanded for the inclusion of an intention.
- 3) That the donor of the stipend is fully aware that the Mass will be offered for several intentions.

In accordance with these guidelines, we will accept multiple intentions for the Masses to be celebrated here in St. Angela Merici Church beginning January 1, 1987.





AUGUST 24. 1986 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time

As so often happens in Luke's account of the road to Jerusalem, someone puts a question to Jesus. This week: "Are they few in number who are to be saved?" The question was prompted by narrow nationalism: Are the Israelites, the chosen people, to be the very ones saved? Jesus answers: "Try to enter through the narrow door." Although selection is part of the process for salvation, neither nationalism nor any other accident of birth will be the deciding factor. The kingdom is a matter of response, of choosing, of decision.

The letter to the Hebrews puts it in terms of "discipline," which is connected to the word, "disciple." This passage tries to answer the difficult question about why people suffer. It suggests there is a role for suffering - as part of the faith struggle. "At the time it is administered, all discipline seems a cause for grief and not for joy; but later it brings forth the fruit of peace and justice to those who are trained in its school."

THE WIDE WORLD

And yet, all the nations are to be enlisted in the final gathering. For Jesus speaks further: "People will come from the east and the west, from the north and the south, and will take their place at the feast in the kingdom of God." The first reading from Isaiah also takes its

place in this framework. "I come to gather the nations of every language; they shall come and see my glory."

What are we to make of this? How can the wide world enter through the narrow door?

One point that can be made is that some barriers are natural and helpful, some are artificial. For instance, apartheid is artificial. Admission to the kingdom of God is not by birth or nationality. Here is our cue to review all our "isms" - to name a few: nationalism, racism, sexism, colonialism, materialism, capitalism, consumerism, communism, legalism, secularism, chauvinism.

All these labels may be ways of declaring ourselves members of a privileged elite. Whenever we have artificial barriers, they tend to be defined by those who are on the gravy side of the divider. We are the ones who get waved through the waiting line. We are the ones who do not need to carry IDs at all times. We are the ones who get complimentary tickets to important events. Question: Could the narrow door be the "servants" entrance"?



Observing the competition for good seats among the guests at a banquet, Jesus offers a word of advice. If you want a position in the high places, take the lowest places. Your host will surely fetch you, to bring you higher. And in the process, think of all the attention you'll get.

At first glance, this seems a practical bit of advice dictated by self-interest. On second thought, it seems not very practical at all. It's possible, even probable, that the host may decide to let you stay down lower. So,

maybe it's a joke — Jesus' sense of humor, making light of ambition.

Finally, the message sinks in. Jesus has in mind an entirely different way of living. "Humility as the best policy" doesn't quite work. This kind of "humility" actually aims at gathering praise. It is only a ploy. Real humility deals in truth.

A WORD TO THE HOST

After speaking to the guests, Jesus directs some advice to the host of the banquet. Here we might anticipate a corresponding message. Maybe he will tell the host to ask those sitting lower down to come up higher. That would make us feel better about taking those lower places.

Instead, he takes things to extremes: "Whenever you give a lunch or dinner, do not invite your friends or brothers or relatives or wealthy neighbors. They might invite you in turn and thus repay you. No, when you have a reception, invite beggars and the crippled, the lame and the blind."

This too looks like a joke. The beggars are not merely seated farther down the table, they are out of the house, sitting outside by the gate, begging. These are surely the lowest seats of all. If Jesus expects the guests to join the beggars in the street, he's gone too far.

But once more we recognize that he is speaking of an alternative reality, a different life-style. True generosity doesn't calculate. Just as the guests found that true humility doesn't surreptitiously angle for flattery, so the host learns about true generosity. It is unconditional. It isn't a ploy for registering later gains.

It turns out Jesus is not offering a course on "how to" get ahead. He is not advising on table manners, or how to be the complete host. He is simply teaching us not to push our claims. Self-interest is not an adequate life project.





Its brief length is not the only remarkable thing about Paul's letter to Philemon. It is also the only Pauline letter named for an individual Christian rather than a church. Philemon was a prominent citizen of the city of Colossae in Asia Minor. As befitted his position, he headed a large household of slaves. One of these slaves was Onesimus, whose name means "useful," and who is the subject of Paul's letter today.

Philemon was also a prominent Christian in the city. It was in his house, for instance, that the Christian community of Colossae gathered to meet and to pray. It was probably at one of these gatherings that Onesimus met Paul. Some time later, Onesimus escaped his bondage. He went to Paul, who at the time was in prison, probably in Ephesus. There he proved "useful" to Paul by serving his needs. Eventually, however, the time came for Paul to send Onesimus back home with this letter in hand.

PHILEMON'S PROBLEM

With this action Paul helped Philemon discover that there was a fundamental contradiction between his position as Christian and his status as slaveowner. Father James Burtchaell has written a notable little essay called "Philemon's Problem," which details the slaveowner's dilemma. If Philemon treats Onesimus as a brother in Christ, freeing Onesimus from bondage, Philemon effectively ends any control over his household of slaves. For proper maintenance of slaves required harsh, public punishment for any breach of conduct. Paul brought Philemon to a sharp and painful decision: custom or Christianity.

Difficult decision making is a part of Christian love. Jesus says as much in the two parables reported by Luke. Christ's message is one of warning: be prepared to do some difficult sorting out, if you would join his group of followers. Jesus' advice: calculate the cost before you embark on a project. Whether you are a contractor building a tower or a king at war, facing a powerful adversary — better not to start something you cannot finish. So it is with discipleship.







A personal reflection on the decision to be a religious brother

I made the decision to become a Brother of the Sacred Heart during my senior year of high school. I had known and respected the brothers who taught me throughout high school; I admired the obvious influence for good they had on me and on young men like me. But I probably did not give as much prayer and thought to my decision as I now know should be given to such an important decision. Nevertheless, I made the choice: I too would become a brother.

As I began my studies for the brotherhood after high school graduation, I gradually grew in the awareness that the Lord had truly invited me to follow him.

Why have I stayed? Why have I chosen to live a life without the love of a wife and children; a life that at times calls me to uproot myself from a job and a city and where I am happy to move on to another job and another city; a life that challenges me to live simply, without accumulating personal wealth? The answer to these questions is basically simple: I chose to become a brother and I choose to remain a brother for the same reasons that all Christians - married, single, ordained, or religious - try to live out their Christianity: to serve God by serving God's people.

SERVICE AND BENEFITS

There are no jobs or careers that are specifically for religious brothers (or sisters). The kinds of professions

in which we religious are involved are the same as those of other lay persons: teaching, nursing, social work, counseling, and so forth. During the past 30 years, I have tried to serve God's people - particularly young people — as a teacher, counselor, and principal.

I live with a group of men who share my ideals and who support and strengthen me through our living, working, and praying together.

My vow of poverty has freed me from the worries about "making that first million before I'm thirty." My vow of obedience has freed me to go wherever I am called to be of service, without having to ask a wife and family to pick up and move with me. My vow of celibacy (not to marry) has challenged me to develop love which is non-restrictive, which is open to all persons I meet

What are the benefits? I'm happy; I'm fulfilled; I believe I am where the Lord wants me to be; I believe my life has meaning. I believe religious life has enabled me to become the person I now am.

Amos, the hard-hitting whistle-blower sometimes known as the prophet of social justice, sets the tone for this Sunday and next. Amos was a hired farm worker with a well-developed sense of grievance. However, it is important to realize that his concern is not simply to monitor unfair practices. His bottom line is religion, and

God's will. Amos' point is not simply that social injustice is oppressive, but that it is sinful. It offends God.

Amos has a "word" for many segments of Israelite society. Today he takes on the merchants. Two problems beset him. This first has to do with quality of worship. In his eyes, the merchants' prayer is colored with an overriding question: "When will the new moon be over, that we may sell the grain? And the sabbath, that we may display the wheat?" When will church be over, so we can get back to the real business of life?

Perhaps it is only coincidental that Amos picked the grain merchants of the day for his example. Perhaps it is purely fortuitous that our liturgy centers on the Sacrament of the Wheat.

AND FIXING THE BOOKS

Amos' second charge has to do with the practice of using the poor person's very poverty to squeeze out an extra buck. "Even the refuse of the wheat we will sell"—unloaded at discount prices, of course. For some people are not in a financial position to purchase standard quality goods. It seems clear that Amos would not appreciate the argument that this practice simply represents a wise business decision, in which everyone gains—the merchant sells an otherwise unsaleable item, the poor receive "goods" they could not otherwise afford.

No doubt it is here that we should place Jesus' parable about the manager who fixed the books. In order to secure a future position for himself, since he was being fired for dipping into the till, he made friends with current customers by discounting their debts. The manager displayed enterprise. Jesus' moral to the story: "The worldly take more initiative than the otherworldly when it comes to dealing with their own kind." But followers of Christ must show the same kind of initiative in spreading the Christian message as the manager did in promoting his own self-interest.







Noblesse oblige. Rank, or noble birth, has its obligations. The phrase may be uncommon today, but the idea still holds. The prophet Amos knew what it meant. Speaking to the leaders of Israelite society, he pointed out that they were enjoying the benefits of their position, while ignoring its responsibilities. They were not going to get by with it — not, at least, while Amos was around.

Israel was not like other nations — a fact continually affirmed throughout its history. Israel's king was to be a servant of his people, not a lord. "He shall defend the afflicted among the people, save the children of the poor, and crush the oppressor," in the words of Psalm 72. In Amos' day, Israel was at the height of its prosperity, and its complacent leaders had forgotten their true purpose. At least, so it seemed to the prophet. They were squandering the wealth of the nations upon themselves.

As Amos puts it in the startling poem which is today's first reading, they were stuffing themselves to excess without somehow getting sick.

AND THE COMPLACENT

Centuries later, speaking out of the same tradition, Jesus would echo these sentiments: "You know now those who exercise authority among the Gentiles lord it over them; . . . It cannot be like that with you" (Mat-

thew 20:25-26). Leadership is a charism, a form of service. It is not a gold mine to be exploited for what its worth.

As Amos knew, the difficulty in delivering this message, is that it is addressed to those not listening: "Woe to the complacent in Zion!" Like the rest of us, those accustomed to dictating the course of events to suit themselves do not easily learn new ways.

The problem is well illustrated by the parable told by Jesus. After their respective deaths, the rich man and the beggar, Lazarus, discovered their fortunes were reversed. Lazarus went to the comforts of Abraham's bosom, while the rich man ended up in a place of torment. In all his anguish, the formerly wealthy man still failed to understand the changed conditions. He still thought it possible to issue crisp orders to Lazarus: "Send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water to refresh my tongue." But Lazarus is our brother, no longer subject to human commands.

And the rich man has become a nonentity. His former wealth is useless. Material goods cannot buy God's favor.


