## A personal reflection on the vocation of parenthood

On the altar as we entered into the sacrament of marriage 11 years ago was a banner which proclaimed the words of Gandhi: "The love of a man and woman truly given and truly received makes up for the hatred of millions." As a manifestation of this love we chose to have children, believing that mother, father, and children are all bound together in love and are thus a living reflection of the Trinity.

Although we are aware of the economics of raising children (we have been purchasing Pampers for ten uninterrupted years!), are both trained in the field of medicine, have worked in clinics in inner-city Chicago, and are concerned about a nuclear nightmare, we as Christians remain people of hope. By entering into this long apprenticeship of parenthood, we have planted the seeds of justice for the next generation. We are raising our four children in a home which attempts to explain both the world as it is and the message of love and justice as contained in the gospel. Most adult Catholics are aware of what John (1 John 3:18) has written: "My children, our love should not be a matter of words or

talk; it must be true love which shows itself in action."

In our home, there are a number of questions that our children ask and that we cannot answer. Why are some people so poor and others rich? Why don't some people like black people? Any why, daddy, is your hospital — Cook County — so old and crowded while others are so new and clean?

With these questions our children are challenging us to live the gospel more faithfully, to love others a little more, and to see Christ in every person. Through our vocation of parenthood, we have planted the seeds of justice for the next generation which in turn nurtures the present generation to continue to hope and believe in the risen Christ.

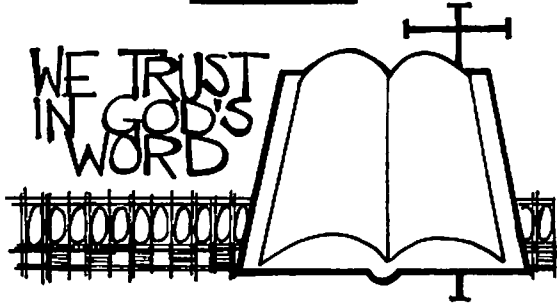

# Blessed is He Who Comes in the Name of the Lord



APRIL 12, 1987 • Passion (Palm) Sunday

The lengthy gospel reading of Lent may have prepared us for this Sunday with the longest gospel of all — 126 verses, as compared to the usual ten to fifteen. How might we focus our attention during the Passion Account?

One possibility is to watch the people in the story, each of them caught up in its relentless drama. Their personal stories float like driftwood within the greater story. By the time we arrive at this moment in the gospel, events have taken on a momentum of their own. A juggernaut is let loose, a steamroller out of control. Each character responds to the march of events in his or her own way. And in their reactions we see ourselves and fragments of ourselves.

Consider some of these reactions. Pilate wishes to wash his hands of the whole affair and maybe somehow emerge unscathed from this troublesome story. The disciples of Jesus do find a way out, vaulting over the garden wall at Gethsemane. Except for Peter, we hear little of them after that moment. And Peter? Doggedly he hung on, only to wish he could have left before he incriminated himself with the searing words of his denial. Judas, who would seem to be the only one managing the flow of events, discovers that he too is caught in their mesh, and he attempts a final way out.

The women, without any delusions of power, faith-

fully remain present, at the edge, as close as they dare get. But they are still there at the end. Simon helps out, but with greatest reluctance. And there are others for us to examine like a broken mirror of our many selves.

## THE EYE OF THE STORM

Jesus himself responds with serenity. He has measured the tide of events and chosen to ride with their flow. And yet this serenity was not achieved without the severest strain.

Furthermore, he precipitated events by his own prophetic action. This Sunday is enriched with two gospel readings, since the palm procession concludes with a reading of the triumphal entry into the city. This was the beginning of the events of that final week. Jesus continued his triumphal march, right into the temple, which he cleansed in a deliberate confrontation with the practices there. Matthew tells us that it was his prophetic action that prompted his enemies to eliminate him. Their response was not arbitrary. He could have avoided it, but his mission did not allow that. His suffering was the price of his work.

Which is to say, today's liturgy is a meditation on the cost of discipleship, not the relentless march of fate.

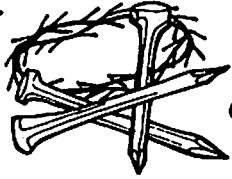

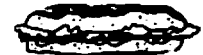

# CHRIST IS RISEN

**APRIL 19, 1987 • Easter Sunday**

"Early in the morning, on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb."

In the faint light she saw the stone had been rolled away from the opening. She ran to inform Peter and the Beloved Disciple. Rushing to the tomb in their turn, they first noticed the wrapping on the ground and then the head cloth bundled up to one side. The Beloved Disciple "saw and believed."

So, in this case, seeing is believing. Two kinds of action dominate the episode — running and seeing. And the "seeing" develops gradually. Beginning in darkness, the followers discern more and more of the truth. In John's account of the empty tomb, the growing daylight is a running metaphor for their dawning awareness. The sun rises on the Son Risen. With increased sight comes deepening insight. Thus, in this Easter story, the Lenten motif of Christ the Light comes to its fullest clarity.

"Reveal" means to "disclose," and the revelation of the empty tomb is a gradual disclosure. Piece by piece, the veils obscuring full vision are cast away. First, the stone is seen to have been removed. Then the wrappings; finally, the head cloth. In John's masterful account we, the listeners, also participate in the progressive recognition experienced by the first disciples. As the sun rises, our eyes too are also opened.

## EYEWITNESSES

It was sometime later that Peter was explaining things to the centurion Cornelius. In today's first reading, his words return again and again to the phrase, "we are witnesses." For, according to the book of Acts, the apostles were the official Easter witnesses. A witness is one who observes, and who is willing to testify to that observation. Such is Peter's testimony.

The disciples were eyewitnesses of the astounding events of that first Easter Sunday. Their subsequent words and actions gave testimony to their perception of the new resurrection life. They came to live in hope rather than despair. And their lives of commitment spoke volumes about that hope. We too are witnesses in our living testimony to the resurrection hope.

Later, John would write: "Blest are those who have not seen and yet believed." You and I were not on the spot when the tomb was discovered to be empty. We were not there to share Mary Magdalene's wonder, consternation, and delight. And yet, by a skillfully written gospel, we share in that moment when blindness is eclipsed by overwhelming vision.

**APRIL 26, 1987 • 2nd Sunday of Easter**

The second Sunday of Easter is Thomas' day. The previous Sunday, Easter itself, belonged to the other disciples. But Thomas was not present then. This day is his. And with him, his famous doubt. "I'll never believe without probing the nailprints in his hands, without putting my hands in the nailmarks and my hand into his side."

Thomas' doubt is our assurance. It signals to us that facile explanations of the resurrection are not a modern-

day monopoly. The early community knew them, too. Thomas' doubt offers the evangelist a chance to affirm the truth in the face of the belittling naysayers.

Thomas was a realist. He called for evidence. He knew Jesus' credentials were the nailmarks; seeing them, he gave his credence: "My Lord and my God."

Scholars tell us that this emphasis on the nailmarks is the gospel's way of establishing a continuity between the crucifixion and Easter. This is the same Jesus of Nazareth now standing before them in the locked room, greeting them with "Peace" — no small concern, considering the enormous distance between the worlds of Calvary and Easter. And Jesus has noticeably changed as well.

#### THE SIGN OF THE NAILMARKS

Consider that vast distance, traversed in a few short days. On what occasion did these followers of his last see Jesus? For most of them that moment occurred in the Garden of the Agony. They were fleeing the scene. Under these circumstances it is most significant that his first Easter words are "Peace be with you." All is forgiven, put away into the past. A new day and new age are given room to begin. The infamous nailmarks link the two moments together, and allow them to move on from there.

Jesus has lived the story through to the end. He returns from the story's end with good news — the struggle will be won. Despite all appearances, the movement he has started will endure and will overcome. The dream that seemed bankrupt just days earlier is now seen to be more alive than ever. On the strength of the revived vision, the early Christian community began living it out, as today's reading from Acts shows us. In the words of Peter Maurin, the early Christians began to "build the new society in the shell of the old."

But that old shell, corrugated with the scars of despair, will not suffer the dream gladly. In pursuing the vision, the disciples will encounter resistance and opposition. They too will learn of the nails. That is the price of being an Easter dreamer with God. A mystic might put it this way: Think not that the cross is the road to Easter, but rather that the road to Easter will produce a cross. And even today the struggle continues, with its promise of limitless joy.

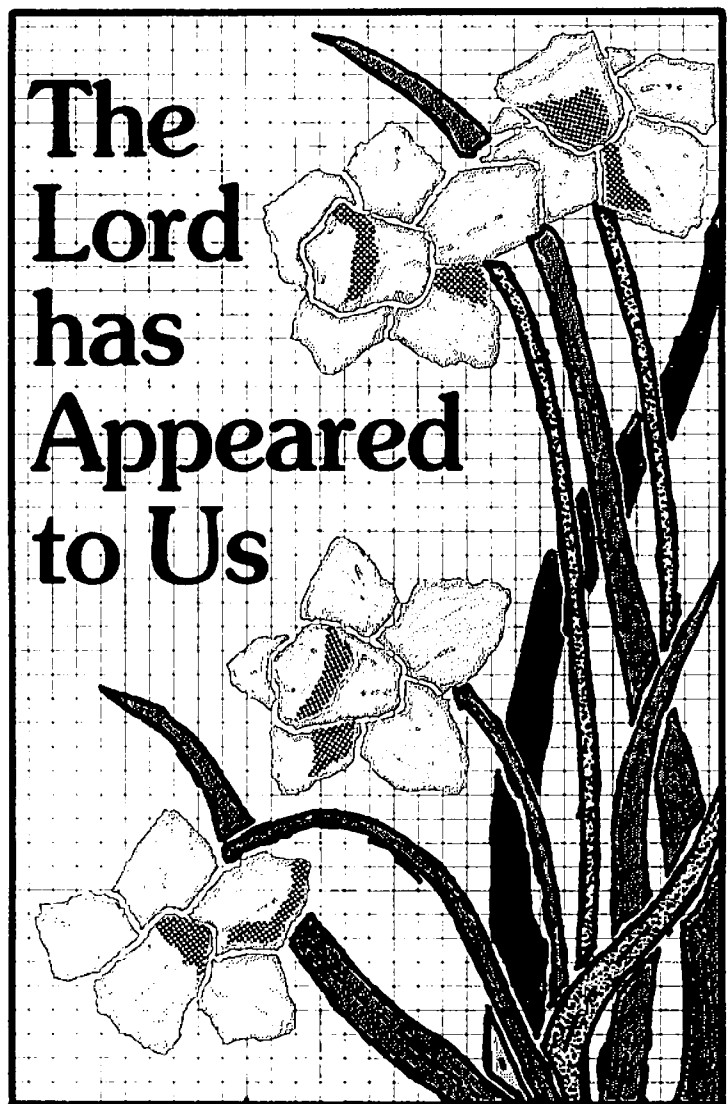
The death of Jesus was followed by a period of confusion for his followers. As the two disciples on the way to Emmaus told the stranger who walked with them: "We were hoping that he was the one who would set Israel free." But their hopes for a political Messiah and political freedom had died with Jesus. To add to their distress, the tomb of Jesus was reported empty. What did it all mean? What had his life and death accomplished after all?

Dejected and skeptical, the disciples walked the seven miles from Jerusalem to Emmaus. The stranger, Jesus, who caught up with them, entered into their discussion but not their mood. He challenged their narrow, preconceived notions of a political Messiah and their distress at his death by asking: "Did not the Messiah have to undergo all this so as to enter into his glory?" Then Jesus interpreted passages of Scripture about himself in ways they had never heard before. Later the disciples said their hearts were burning inside as he spoke. Yet they were still unaware he was the Lord. Only at the end of the day when the stranger shared their meal did they realize who he was as he broke bread. Then they perceived that God had indeed raised him. What joy must have filled their hearts! Later, thinking back on all Jesus had said during the walk, the disciples realized that the Messiah's death was not a hopeless tragedy but a way used by God to reveal power over death. Jesus was not a political Messiah but one who announced that God had given him the far more profound freedom from death.

The disciples lost no time in rushing back to Jerusalem to tell all that had happened. Their hopelessness had been turned to joy. They wanted to share with others who would understand!

### ON THE ROAD TO EMMAUS

The story of the disciples going to Emmaus reflects a pattern which many Christians recognize. Have we not all at some time in our lives been "on the road to Emmaus," dejected, hopeless, wondering what the future holds? And can we not affirm that we, too, have heard Jesus challenging us to see things from his perspective? The Lord, often in the unrecognized stranger, reminds us that God uses suffering and death to manifest power. We, too, realize the Lord is truly risen and

that in the midst of death God showed the path to life. God will lead us also and therefore our God is our great hope. Quickly therefore we also must "return to Jerusalem." We must go to those who will listen, and share our renewed hope with them.

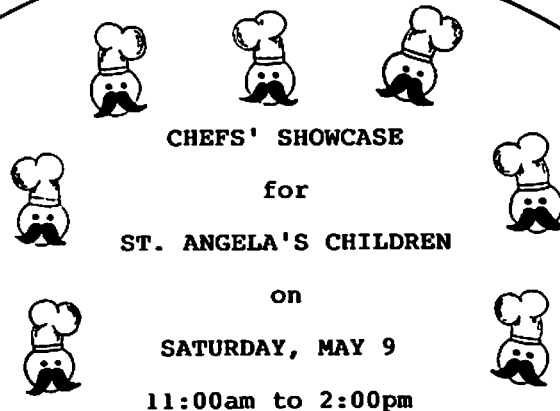

### A personal reflection on being single

Although I didn't consciously choose to be single, at the age of 42 I have worked to understand the nature of the single vocation and can accept that role as a Christian with a kind of joy and contentment.

As a person who lives alone, I face the challenge of taking care of myself and I'm not sure that home or school 20 years ago prepared me for this style of life. Sewing is a mystery to me, cooking one I'm gradually mastering, shopping something I do not like by nature.

My singleness offers me a lot of opportunities and freedoms, however. For example, I have just returned from a study grant which covered five weeks of research in Virginia. To be away from home that long for a married man would cause problems, but I have the freedom for that kind of travel.

On the other hand, there are moments of loneliness and emptiness for me since I live alone. I have no immediate family and no guaranteed contact with people everyday, and I'd be open to marriage if that possibility developed.

Although being single and being Catholic has not always been easy for me, I believe that progress has been made in theologizing about the Christian single and that the Church is better at discerning what the

single vocation means.

### THE ROAD TO GOD

As singles we need to strengthen our ties with our families and friends and not get overly involved in "being free." We need to be active and involved with other people so that the continuity in our lives can be maintained. We need to realize that we can love one another in our own human ways and that we don't have to be self-centered. As valuable members of the Church, we can recognize our gifts and feel comfortable enough simply to be ourselves.

Society will not always understand singles because we are a minority. But there is a road laid out for us that leads back to God. As Christians and as singles, we sometimes walk that road alone, but also with joy, since our God is a God of love.

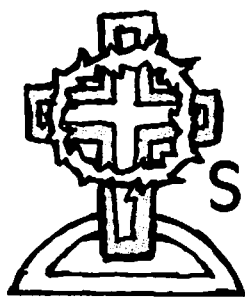

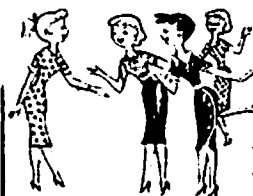

# I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life



MAY 17, 1987 • 5th Sunday of Easter

"Come to the Lord, a living stone, rejected by men but approved nonetheless, and precious in God's eyes. You too are living stones, built as an edifice of spirit...."

Jesus was no stranger to rejection in his life. Many supposedly religious people, political authorities, and even friends turned against him and plotted to have him destroyed. Because they lacked faith, to them he was like "a stone which the builders rejected" — merely an obstacle in their way. Yet in God's eyes he was precious and approved. God made him the cornerstone of all the people he draws together as a consecrated nation.

From the example of Jesus, Christians realize that human disapproval does not necessarily correspond to how God views a person. This is an important point to consider, lest we find ourselves either destroyed by rejection or rejecting others.

Throughout our society there are many people who have been unfairly dealt strong blows of physical, social, and psychological rejection. Society's disapproval is often rooted in prejudice based on economic status, mental abilities, social qualities, or physical conditions. Some have been literally "thrown away" as useless or dismissed by society as troublesome, unimportant or inferior. Such unjustified rejection is a bitter and deeply painful experience. It is the humiliation and devaluation

of some human beings by others. It hurts both those who feel it and those who promote it.

## BUT PRECIOUS TO GOD

Whoever feels rejection must take comfort in the example of Jesus: Even though some seemingly important people had disapproved of him and even had him killed, in the end God vindicated him. Jesus became the very foundation block of the great spiritual edifice God is constructing. Likewise, those who feel the pain of unjust rejection must not forget that they too are living stones, integral members of "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a consecrated nation, a people claimed by God."

On the other hand, whoever supports or encourages the unfair disapproval of others also has the example of Jesus to ponder. Certainly no Christian would want to have been one of those who was contemptuous of Jesus. Dare we, therefore, treat with unfair rejection any person who before God is precious?

We Christians must challenge ourselves to recognize in everyone, both ourselves and others, what God sees. To God each is an invaluable precious living stone. So too must we be to each other.

"Jesus said to his disciples . . . 'He who obeys the commandments he has from me is the man who loves me.'"

In today's reading from the Gospel of John, Jesus speaks to his disciples about the link between love and obedience. He tells his followers that if they truly love him they will keep the commandments he had given them. Their obedience will flow out of their love; their actions will confirm their love.

Jesus never says that obedience to his commandments is a requirement for his love. No, his love, like his Father's is given unconditionally to all who will receive it in faith. What Jesus does stress is that whoever speaks of love for himself and the Father must manifest their sincerity not merely in words but also in deeds. Thus it becomes clear that for Jesus obedience to his commandments is love's real test. But, is this not true in every love relationship?

#### IN WORD AND DEED

We all know of people who declare their love in words, but who bring pain and heartaches to those they claim to love. There are husbands and wives who say they love each other yet by their inconsiderateness, thoughtlessness, and unkindness contradict their own

words. There are also parents and children who speak of loving each other, yet in action express something vastly different.

To Jesus sincere love involves far more than words. Love must be lived out in deeds. And so he emphasizes obedience to his commandments as the mark of his disciples. Jesus also was aware, however, that his followers would need great strength to be faithfully obedient to his commands. For that reason he promised to send a helper, a Paraclete, the Spirit of truth to remain always with them. From the very earliest disciples to the Christians of today, those who love the Lord have recognized the Spirit's presence with them. Indeed, as Jesus promised, he did not leave his followers orphaned. Guided by the Spirit, Christian disciples continue to live lives of loving obedience to the Lord.

Today's gospel reminds us to think about the relationship between love and obedience in each of our lives. When we say we love the Lord, our families, friends and others — even our enemies — are our actions confirming our words?

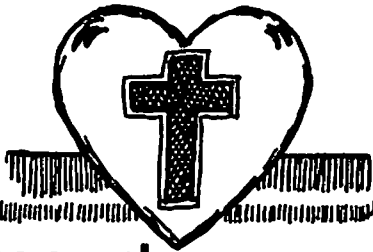

# GOD'S GLORY RESTS ON YOU



**MAY 31, 1987**  
**7th Sunday of Easter**

According to Luke's narrative of the earliest days of the Church in Acts, after Jesus was taken up into the heavens on Mount Olivet his closest followers returned the short distance to Jerusalem and gathered in the upper room. It was probably the same room where they had shared the Last Supper. They had heard Jesus promise before he ascended: "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes down on you; then you are to be my witnesses . . . even to the ends of the earth." And so they had returned to the city to wait for that empowerment.

We might question, however, what their expectations were. While later Christians know the story of the Pentecost event, those who waited in the upper room could hardly have pictured what was coming. They knew simply that the Lord's Spirit would somehow confirm them in their mission as his witnesses. They must have wondered how the Spirit would actually touch their lives. What is significant is that in the meantime they continued with their activities as a believing community and devoted themselves to prayer.

## WAITING UPON THE SPIRIT

This period of waiting upon the Spirit in the upper room between the Ascension and Pentecost can be seen by Christians today as symbolic of an aspect of our spiritual experience. As we, too, look for empowerment and guidance from the Spirit in our own lives as witnesses to Christ, there are sometimes periods of waiting and wondering how the Lord will lead us. What are we to do next? What direction is our Christian witness supposed to be taking? In the midst of our questions we may live with the assurance that the Spirit will guide us, despite our uncertainty as to when or how that guidance will come. Like the earliest Christians we must quietly continue to devote ourselves to the community of believers and to prayer. The Spirit we await blows where and when it wills. The Lord's promise will ever and again be fulfilled. Come Holy Spirit!

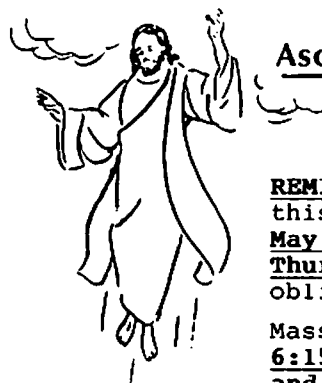

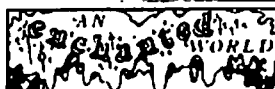

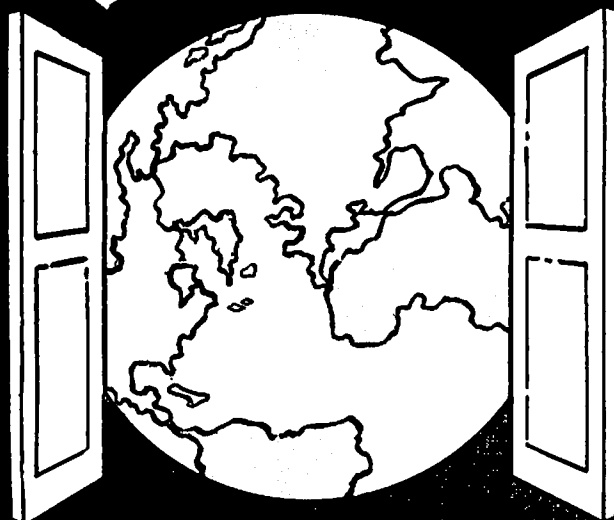

**JUNE 7, 1987 • Pentecost Sunday**

At the very beginning of creation the Spirit was active. Genesis says that "a mighty wind swept over the waters" (Gen. 1:2). In Hebrew the words mean literally "a spirit of God," indicating the presence of God's Spirit at the unfolding of life.

The New Testament tells of the Spirit being poured out in life-giving fullness on all the followers of Jesus

gathered together on the first Christian Pentecost. Acts portrays this overwhelming experience with rich symbols: The Spirit came in power as a "noise like a strong, driving wind." The Spirit also came in "tongues as of fire."

Confirmed in the Spirit, we continue today to know the Spirit's presence in our lives. Like a wind blowing flowers and bending trees in its flow, the Spirit moves us into action according to God's ways. We, too, receive the flame of wisdom, enlightening our minds with knowledge of God and enflaming our hearts with love. And, when we feel tossed about by the confusion around us or troubled by doubts within, the Spirit of God gives us courage to find our way.

## GUIDED BY THE SPIRIT

Beginning with the Pentecost event, often considered to be the birthday of the Church, the Spirit of God has been guiding the Church in its life and growth. As the story of Acts unfolds, the Spirit directs Peter to receive Cornelius, a Gentile, into the faith (Acts 10-11). And it was the Spirit who set apart Barnabas and Saul (Paul) and then sent them out on mission (Acts 13). This same Spirit guides each of us today to continue the mission of the Church.

One aspect of that mission which Paul writes about in first Corinthians is the individual's use of his or her gifts for the community. Paul states: "To each person the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good." Thus, every person has a role in the upbuilding of the community. An important task is clearly to call forth the Spirit's gifts in ourselves and in one another, especially dormant gifts not yet recognized in the community. Let us pray to the Spirit to help us discern all we have to give each other. From the time of the Pentecost event up until today, seeking the guiding light of the Spirit has always been the Christian way.

## A personal reflection on the priesthood

When I was 12 years old, I decided to be a priest. It happened at Mass when I was impressed with the devotion and attention our pastor showed while proclaiming the Lord present in our midst.

Now in those almost 30 years since that event a lot of things have changed. My understanding of what the eucharist and priesthood mean has changed, developed, and I hope is still developing.

In my own life I have been constantly challenged by Scripture to not just believe the right doctrine, but to try to put it into practice. That's what counts.

Now this is certainly the job of all the baptized, but for me I have chosen to make it real through priesthood.

Or maybe priesthood has chosen me. All my life there have been persons and events that keep calling me to ministry.

As a seminarian I was chaplain to a Christian Family Movement group which met for more than four years to help participants better understand their marriages, families, and roles in Church and society.

I have served as priest in many different kinds of communities. There have been Cursillo and Marriage Encounter groups that have helped to make me more

human.

Sometimes the effort is grand and glorious, other times quite simple. But the best times are when I am brought to the realization that God overpowers me with a presence and mystery that goes far beyond whatever gifts and talents I might have.

There are all kinds of meetings that are part of my priesthood; assorted and sometimes burdensome church gatherings for this purpose or that — meetings that help the larger community deal with issues that won't go away but need the good will and work of people of faith.

When people are beginning a ministry I often write to them, "May you be good for God's people and may God's people be good for you." That's the dream and hope I cherish for myself. — Father Daniel Montalbano

### URGENT LEGISLATIVE ALERT!

Senators Johnston and Breaux will vote soon on "A Sex Discrimination" Bill which would force many hospitals to provide abortions.

The U. S. Senate is expected to vote soon - perhaps before the end of June - on a bill which would permit lawsuits to be filed against hospitals which do not provide abortions - including Catholic hospitals. The bill is called the "Civil Rights Restoration Act" (Bill number S. 557) The La. Catholic Conference, the Catholic Health Association, the La. Right to Life Federation, and the La. Pro-Life Council are pushing for adoption of an amendment which would nullify the pro-abortion aspects of the bill. The pro-life amendment is called the "Danforth Amendment".

Despite urgent requests from the La. Catholic bishops and the administrators of all eight Catholic hospitals in La., neither Senator J. Bennett Johnston nor Senator John Breaux has yet committed himself to support the Danforth Amendment. It is essential that both senators immediately receive an outpouring of public concern on this issue. Here's what you can do:

(1) First, send short letters to Senators Johnston and Breaux. The letters should be in your own words, but along these lines:

"I strongly urge you to oppose S. 557 unless the Danforth pro-life amendment is adopted. According to the Catholic Conference and the Catholic Health Association, under S. 557 hospitals and colleges - including Catholic institutions - could be sued for "sex discrimination" if they refuse to provide abortions and/or refuse to provide medical insurance for abortions."

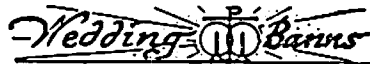

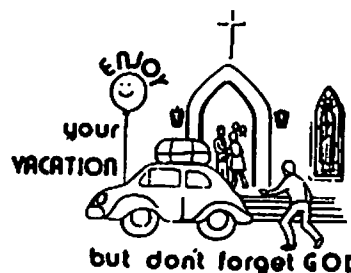

# I AM THE LIVING BREAD

**JUNE 21, 1987**

**The Body and Blood of Christ**

"With the best of wheat God fills you" affirms the psalmist about the Lord's care for the people. The Israelites, discouraged by their desert experience of serpents and scorpions, of hunger and thirst, were fed daily by the Lord. To quench their thirst, God brought forth water; to satisfy their hunger, they were given manna in ample supply. The manna becomes a symbol in John's gospel for the eucharist, the feast of table fellowship with Jesus in the Christian community.

Whenever Christians break bread together and drink from the cup of wine, they look beyond this ordinary food and drink to the saving action of Jesus touching them ever anew. The body of Jesus was broken on the cross and his blood poured out so that in him we might become one, united with God and with our brothers and sisters.

To partake of the finest wheat is to share in the very life of Christ and thus to have eternal life, even now. In the gospel reading Jesus declares that whoever "feeds on my flesh and drinks of my blood, has life eternal . . . ." What a privilege to become one with our God, to taste life without end in the eucharist.

Just before communion, the celebrant prays: "Lord Jesus Christ, with faith in your love and mercy, I eat your body and drink your blood. Let it not bring me condemnation, but health in mind and body." Received with

a living faith, the eucharist becomes for us a holy, personal encounter with the Lord. And this brings spiritual health to the whole person.

## ONE BREAD AND ONE BODY

The Israelites were sustained as a united people by the manna in the desert. The Corinthians, notorious for the rival factions among them, must have felt challenged when Paul wrote that "we, many though we are, are one body for we all partake of the one loaf." By participation in the Lord's Supper each member of the community becomes bonded with every other member so that the body becomes one.

To experience genuinely the unity symbolized by the eucharist, we are called to work for harmony where it is lacking. Wherever strife drives wedges of discord in the community, we are called to be instruments of reconciliation. Many though we are, we are all one body. We must truly become brothers and sisters dwelling together in the Lord.

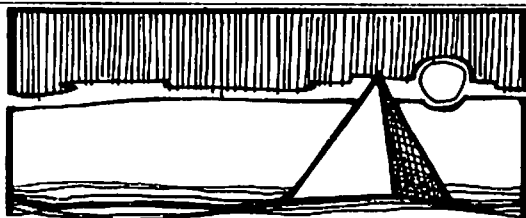

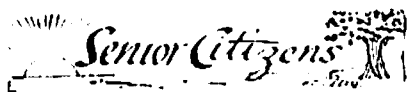

The story about Elisha and the Shunemite woman and her husband in second Kings is so warmly personable we can almost hear the wife say to God's prophet: "Come in and make yourself at home. Sit down and relax, you are welcome in our home." Elisha was given such a warm reception that he came back to stay many times. The woman's name is not mentioned but the story does say that she was a person of influence in the community. And she recognized Elisha as "a holy man of God," indicating he was a messenger sent to proclaim the Word of God.

In the Church today God continues to call men and women to be prophets, to bring the dynamic Word of God to bear on many human situations. The prophet may be one who defends the rights of the handicapped, the elderly, the unborn or the homeless poor. Or God's prophet may be a conscientious pastor of a Christian community or a devoted advocate for the powerless of our society. To use a phrase from Matthew's gospel, the prophet may be "one of the little ones," someone without title or status, but an exemplary disciple nonetheless. Called by God, a prophet remains a person who needs to be refreshed by hospitality and supported by prayer and friendship.

To welcome a prophet is a profoundly Christian act as

Jesus explains: "The one who welcomes you welcomes me, and the one who welcomes me welcomes the one who sent me." To receive a prophet is to encounter Christ himself.

#### A PROPHET'S REWARD

After the Shunemite woman and her husband opened their hearts to Elisha, God's favor came upon them through the promise of a child. Such a return for hospitality is directly affirmed in the gospel: "The one who welcomes a prophet because he bears the name of prophet receives a prophet's reward." Of course the spirit of this saying leaves no room for anyone to be hospitable with a self-serving attitude of giving only in order to get a reward. An earlier saying cautions us about that: "the one who seeks only himself, brings himself to ruin." Rather, the return for hospitality or the "reward" may be better understood as the gift of being blessed in God's eyes. The smallest kindness, such as giving a cup of cold water "to one of these lowly ones" because he or she is a disciple, will be remembered by God.

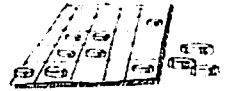
