In the unfolding drama of the Empty Tomb story in John's gospel, the spotlight focuses first on one woman, Mary Magdalene. She comes to the tomb evidently to mourn the death of her Lord. Jesus had already been anointed earlier according to the gospel in the house of Martha and Mary (12:3) and later buried with an abundant mixture of myrrh and aloes (19:39).

Seeing that the stone was removed, though not going into the tomb, Mary runs to tell two of the prominent figures in the fourth gospel, Simon Peter and the "other disciple." Throughout the gospel this "other disciple," also called the Beloved Disciple, is never named explicitly. Traditionally he has been identified as John the Evangelist.

After the footrace to the tomb by these two disciples, Simon Peter goes into the tomb and looks around. Thus he enters into the space of death. To enter a tomb where a burial had only recently taken place is not unlike walking into a hospital room after a family member has died. Silence and stillness accompany feelings of sadness and loss

But the tomb was empty as Mary had already announced. Peter observed the cloth Jesus had been wrapped in. But what to make of this? It is the Beloved Disciple who, upon entering, sees and believes. He is led beyond the ambiguous signs — after all Mary merely

thought someone had removed the Lord — to the deeper level of faith.

The Beloved Disciple becomes a model for Christians today in two ways. First, his "name" itself is significant. The fourth gospel reflects that believers are especially valued not because of any position they hold or do not hold in the structure of the Church, but because they are loved by Jesus. Secondly, to be a disciple of Jesus is to believe in the Risen Lord who is alive today.

BELIEVING AND FORGIVENESS

After the experience of the Risen Lord, the disciples were so filled with joy they had to share their experience. Thus began the first Christian preaching. In the various speeches in acts, Luke presents us with the pattern of this early preaching. One example is given in the words of Peter addressed to Cornelius and his household.

After hearing about the life and ministry, the death and resurrection of Jesus, the first Gentiles are baptized and received into the fellowship of the early Christian community. With faith comes forgiveness: "Everyone who believes in him has forgiveness of sins."



A reflection on vocation as stewardship

Doubting Thomas? Who of us would not have reacted with the same questions on hearing the apostles tell such a wild tale of Jesus risen to life? Especially in a world filled with voices clamoring for our attention and our cash, survival seems to demand weighing everything against sound experience.

Wisdom is born of experience. Our sanity itself may depend on respecting that experience. And yet, this ground rule can be the source of despair as well. Nothing new will happen, if it must fit into our experience. The future will be more of the past, recycled.

Thomas entered the season of hope a week late — but enter it he did. Something burst into his life, something that was outside his previous experience.

God's world is larger than ours. If we are able to design the future, it would likely be a matter of drawing upon the old familiar, exhausted resources — the past recycled. But because there is a God, one who loves us, there are welcome surprises. And new life.

CREATING NEWNESS

We are called to be stewards of the gifts given us. In this there must be room for God's newness. We must do more than manipulate creation in repetitions of the poverty of what we already have known.

2nd Sunday of Easter

Stewardship certainly means intelligent planning, that God's gifts will be cared for and honored, that others may benefit from them as well as ourselves. But it also means "leaving room" — for newness, for the future, for God's work.

We must leave room for newness — for those possibilities beyond our imaginations, jaded by what we know so far, or what we think we know, of how God's world works.

We must leave room for a future that can contain surprises, so that coming generations will not be entirely hamstrung by our present limited vision.

We must leave room for God to work. Not that God doesn't work through us — for certainly that is happening. But God also works beyond us, injecting newness into our human story. Discretion too is stewardship; here we are called to New Life. — Father Robert Beck Father Robert Beck teaches Scripture at Loras College in Dubuque, Iowa. 

It is often said that "hindsight is the best form of insight." Looking back in life, we realize what we could have done differently or better. We might wish we could undo our mistakes, yet that remains impossible.

After the death of Jesus, as his followers experienced their Lord's risen presence among them, mixed with their joy and wonder at his resurrection, were no doubt also many retrospective reflections. Why had they not fully understood who Jesus was while he still lived? Why had they lost courage, many even deserting him during his final hours? Why had they not protested how Pilate and the religious authorities treated him? Why had they not resisted when the crowd shouted for the release of the murderer Barabbas instead of Jesus? Why, why, why? There were no simple answers.

LOOKING FORWARD

The closest follower of Jesus must have felt a sense of regret, even guilt and remorse, as they thought back on those days before Jesus died. Yet there was nothing they could do to change the past. So, how were they to resolve their feelings as they went forward?

Today's readings from Acts and the Gospel of Luke offer some insight into that question. Peter in Acts points out to the crowd how they had treated Jesus, but then remarks: "Yet I know, my brothers, that you acted out of ignorance, just as your leaders did." Peter does not glibly excuse their ignorance; he simply recognizes it as an explanation for their actions. But then Peter goes on to show that God's plan is never thwarted by human failures but actually makes use of human weakness: "God has brought to fulfillment by this means what he announced long ago through all the prophets: that his Messiah would suffer." Thus in the midst of human ignorance and the failure to do good, God still finds a way to work out his own designs. Peter does not, however, conclude that human weakness is thereby a desirable thing.

What emerges in these readings is a sense, held not only by the Lord's early followers, but also by Christians today, that human failures do not ultimately deter God's plan, but can even be used to work out that plan. Nevertheless those failures remain regrettable in the Lord's eyes and in our own, and God challenges us to rise above our weaknesses. Let us go forward in our lives knowing that God has led us in spite of our mistakes. and that we will renew our determination to overcome our weaknesses.



4th Sunday of Easter **APRIL 24, 1988**

One of the most beloved images of Jesus among American Christians is the Good Shepherd. Stained glass windows and other artistic decorations in many churches reflect our love for this portrayal of Christ. Funeral remembrance cards likewise are very often chosen depicting Jesus as the Good Shepherd and using comforting verses such as the one from Psalm 23: "The Lord is my shepherd."

It is quite understandable why Jesus in his day chose the image of a shepherd to describe himself as we hear in John's gospel today. In the area of the world where Jesus lived and taught, raising sheep and shepherding them was a widespread occupation. But it may strike us as rather puzzling that modern Americans, few of whom hardly ever see sheep much less shepherds, nevertheless find profound meaning in the Lord's metaphor. Is there an explanation for why even we modern technocrats find relevance in comparing our Lord to a shepherd and ourselves to his sheep?

THE LORD OUR PROTECTOR

Perhaps the explanation lies in the simplicity of the image and in our own love for animals, especially when they are endangered and unable to protect themselves. Jesus' comparison of himself to a shepherd taking care of sheep can thus easily transcend the boundaries of his agrarian society and our modern society and touch up our sense of protecting the helpless and threatened. And insofar as we ourselves feel weakened and victimized by evil, suffering, and death, we can easily compare ourselves to the sheep protected by the Lord.

To know we have a protector, a savior, a shepherd is to be able to live with a confidence and trust amidst whatever threatens us. Dangers are not thereby removed, however, nor do evil and death go away. Yet we can live with profound faith - and die, too - knowing that the Lord unceasingly cares for us. As he has promised: "I know my sheep and my sheep know me in the same way that the Father knows me and I know the Father; for these sheep I will give my life."

Let us turn with renewed confidence in grateful prayer to the Good Shepherd who watches over us. In the words of the psalmist, let us "give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; for his kindness endures forever."



MAY 1, 1988

5th Sunday of Easter

A few years after the resurrection of Jesus a persecution of his followers developed in Jerusalem. Paul was an active leader in that persecution. He was so concerned with wiping out those who believed Jesus was truly the Jewish Messiah that he traveled the long distance to Damascus to punish the Lord's followers there. But, on the way, Paul encountered the risen Lord and the most profound of changes took place in his life: the persecutor became a believer, the hunter became one of

At first the believers in Damascus were skeptical about the sincerity of Paul's conversion. Gradually, however, they realized Paul was now truly one of them.

In today's reading from Acts, we hear of Paul's return from Damascus to Jerusalem. The disciples in Jerusalem were unsure of him also. Was he not merely a clever infiltrator trying to break into their ranks? Only after Barnabas vouched for him was Paul accepted. Nevertheless, controversy over Paul continued in the city, especially among Greek-speaking Jews with whom he debated about Jesus. So irate did they become that they plotted to murder Paul. Paul was saved when the disciples took him out of Jerusalem and sent him off to Tarsus, his home city.

INSPIRING PATTERNS

Already in these early events in the life of Paul, patterns emerge which offer us food for thought. It is evident, for example, that Paul as both a persecutor and then as a believer lived an energetically sincere life. If there was something he thought he ought to be doing, there was no stopping him. And Paul obviously was not deterred by the doubts others had about him. Although the disciples in Damascus and Jerusalem questioned his motives, he remained true to his new convictions. At the same time, Paul gratefully accepted the help of his friends. Paul owed much to Barnabas for smoothing his acceptance by the Jerusalem congregation. We can also observe that Paul voiced his strong convictions, even in spite of stirring up controversy.

Paul impresses us as a strong, deeply sincere, energetic, and courageous person. Herein lies one of his challenges to us: Can we likewise have the courage of sincerely acting upon and professing our convictions? Can we likewise put our energy behind our beliefs?





A reflection on vocation as stewardship

Have things changed much?

When I was young, about this time of the year my brothers and sisters and I would ask our mother what she wanted for Mother's Day. And she would invariably respond: "I would love it if you kids would get along together for just one day!" We always thought it would be easier to give her presents instead.

Since then I've decided that God is like Mom. From Genesis to Revelation, from Adam and Eve to the New Jerusalem gathered in glory, the biblical story is about the human family. It tells about God's plan for this family - God's pet project, if you will. Having created this impressive assembly of free wills, God wants us to get along together. Yet so often our worship response has been to offer presents instead.

Putting it another way, growth in Christian discipleship means moving beyond the stage of doing what God tells us to do, to the stage of wanting what God wants.

Today's gospel reading has a word for this: "You are my friends," Jesus tells his followers. "I no longer speak of you as slaves, for a slave does not know what his master is about.

SHARING OUR GIFTS

The call to stewardship is a call to peace and justice.

It is a call to do the difficult work of getting along together. But cooperation means more than avoiding unseemly bickering. God's plan includes our caring.

Today a wide gap separates the needs of the many and the possessions of the few. This is a scandal, but it is not news - there is no need to rehearse the familiar statistics. It is enough to remember that God has given us this creation to cherish and to use for our common needs.

"IF YOU WANT PEACE, WORK FOR JUSTICE." There are not many papal statements that have become popular bumper stickers, but this is one. It is from the encyclical, "On the Development of Peoples," by Pope Paul VI. It condenses the insight that harmony is built on fair sharing. This sharing forms the doctrine of stewardship - God has given us this world for all of us to share. Living that out is truly a vocation. — Father Robert Beck

If we as disciples of Jesus are trying to work out our place in the world, today's gospel text from John leaves us very uneasy. In his farewell discourse Jesus warns that his disciples "do not belong to the world"; in fact "the world has hated them" because Jesus gave them God's word. And a little later Jesus affirms: "they are not of the

This is strong language! Obviously this does not mean we are to pack our bags and go to the next planet, nor does it mean secluding ourselves in some mountain hideaway out of touch with others. It does mean, however, that Christians should not be naive about living in the world, for the world apart from Christ stands under judgment.

The person who lives with God's word begins to sense those things that are opposed to God. The world would tell us that the proliferation of nuclear weapons is the way to peace, that the accumulation of material things is the path to security, and that becoming the "top dog" by running over the "underdogs" is the way to greatness. To this kind of world Christians are not to sell out.

Still, the disciples are to live in the world. Jesus, God's word, was himself "in the world" (Jn. 1:10). For "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son that whoever believes in him may not die but may have eternal life"

7th Sunday of Easter

(Jn. 3:16). In brief, Jesus came not "to condemn the world but to save it" (Jn. 12:47).

The disciple then is to live in the world which is loved by God. The disciple is to be a witness to God's word, which is truth, and thus to be a countersgin to the ways of the world that are not of God.

BE HOLY IN THE TRUTH

The disciples of the Lord are to be consecrated in the truth which is God's word. Living in the truth we gain our true freedom as we hear in John 8:32: "The truth will set you free." Our holiness or consecration comes from Jesus who consecrates himself for our sakes. Jesus' self-consecration suggests his own death. According to the Scripture scholar Raymond Brown, in this passage we may think of Jesus "not only as the incarnation of God's word consecrated by the Father but also as a priest offering himself as a victim for those whom God has given him."

Through Jesus' own death we become holy; in his death we became one with him and with one another.




MAY CROWNING





MAY 22, 1988 • Pentecost

Pentecost has a rich tradition in the Bible and continues to be observed in both Judaism and Christianity. In ancient Israel Pentecost was originally an agricultural feast and was called the "Feast of Weeks" or the "Feast of the Harvest." The Hebrew term is Shavuot. It is a festival when the first fruits of the harvest are offered to God. The instruction is given in Exodus 23:16: "You shall keep the feast of the grain harvest with the first of the crop that you have sown in the field." Thus the Hebrew people were expected to express their gratitude to God for the early harvest.

After the destruction of the Jewish Temple in Jerusalem by the Romans in 70 A.D., Pentecost was given a new significance. It became an observance of the giving of the Torah (the Law) to Moses on Mount Sinai. Pentecost, a Greek word meaning fifty, is so named because in Judaism the interval between Passover and the Sinai event was fifty days. Today the Jews continue to observe Shavuot in thanksgiving for the giving of the Torah. This year it is celebrated on May 22 and 23, the same time Christians celebrate Pentecost.

The first Pentecost in the Christian tradition took place after the death and resurrection of Jesus. It is portrayed in Acts 2:1-42. With the apostles and others gathered in Jerusalem, Luke reports that there was a sudden noise "like a strong, driving wind" followed by "tongues of fire." These signs portray the outpouring of the Spirit. Thus the promise of Jesus made prior to his Ascension in Acts 1:8, "You shall receive power when the Holy Spirit comes down on you," is fulfilled.

A NEW PENTECOST

Today the Church prays again for the outpouring of the Spirit on all believers. Cardinal Suenens, known especially for his leadership in the Charismatic Renewal, has called for a new Pentecost in the Church.

There can be occasions when an over preoccupation with strict enforcement of the law and the rigid maintenance of present structures in the Church stifle the activity of God's Spirit. As Paul reminds us in First Corinthians: "To each person the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good." Every Christian in each parish has received at least one gift from the same Spirit. This gift is to be recognized and its exercise must be allowed for the common good of all in the community. "Come, Holy Spirit, come! O most blessed Light divine, shine with these hearts of yours, and our inmost being fill!"



Trinity Sunday

For centuries the Church has handed on the teaching of the Trinity with the brief formula: three divine persons in one God. An expanded form of this doctrine is recited each Sunday in the creed when we confess as a community what we believe about God the Creator, Jesus our Savior, and the Spirit, the Giver of Life.

The mystery of the Trinity grows out of the Church's reflection on the fascinating story about God and humankind as it unfolds in the Bible. This story is about a God who is intimately involved in the lives of people—the Jewish people, the Christian people, indeed all people.

We can look back to the first chapters of Genesis, to the creation story. Out of chaos God fashioned an earth of rich soil to nourish the vegetation, of waters teeming with fish, of a sky reaching to the heavens. Last of all, as the pinnacle of all creation, God fashioned us in the very image and likeness of the Creator. As the author of Deuteronomy ponders: "Did anything so great ever happen before? Was it ever heard of?"

God's lot has been cast in with ours. Through a covenant God has pledged to be with us always, never to leave us orphaned. This pledge is guaranteed by the gift of the Spirit who "gives witness with our spirit that we

are children of God." This pledge is renewed in the words of Jesus at the end of Matthew's gospel: "And know that I am with you always until the end of the world!"

GOD'S STORY IN OUR STORY

Each of us, young or old also has a story to tell and in our own story there is the hand of God. When we were being formed in the womb, God was there watching over us as we grew from that first tenuous cell of mysterious new life to a squirming newborn baby in our parents' arms.

In baptism we were claimed as a member of God's own family. We were welcomed into the Christian community. From then on, each life unfolds through childhood, adolescence, and into adulthood.

Over the course of our lives we can focus on both the times of well-being as well as the times of darkness. Through our faith we know that God walks with us in our darkest hours just as surely as God rejoices with us in times of joy. In our story, God's story continues to unfold.







JUNE 5, 1988 • The Body and Blood of Christ

We have all made agreements with, signed contracts with, or given our word to another person. By doing so, we bind ourselves to do what we say we will do. In turn, the other party pledges to abide by the terms that have been mutually agreed upon. I keep my word, you keep your word.

The readings from today's solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ relate to us the most solemn agreement or covenant between ourselves and God.

This holy pact between God and the Chosen People is sealed in blood. Hence it is called the "blood of the covenant." Already in the story of Israel's Exodus from Egypt, blood was used as a saving sign. Then the blood of the passover lamb was put on the doorposts of Hebrew houses in Egypt. Thus they were saved from death (Exodus 12:1-20).

In today's Exodus text, the blood is divided in half and this represents a twofold aspect of the covenant. The half of the blood "splashed on the altar" probably represents God's merciful forgiveness in accepting this as an offering. The blood which Moses sprinkled on the people binds them in a blood oath to "keep and do" all that "the Lord has said."

THE CUP OF SALVATION

The Letter to the Hebrews tells us that Christ is our

high priest and that "with his own blood" our consciences have been cleansed "from dead works to worship the living God." Through the blood of Christ our sins are forgiven and we are found worthy to praise God.

This saving effect of Christ's death is solemnly celebrated in the Last Supper presented in Mark's gospel. Jesus declares that his blood, "the blood of the covenant," is "to be poured out on behalf of many." The phrase "of many" (a semitism meaning "all") recalls Jesus' words earlier in the gospel: "The Son of Man has not come to be served but to serve — to give his life in ransom for the many" (10:45).

Each time we receive the eucharist God renews with us and we renew with God in an intimate way the covenant that binds us together. Through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus, God pledges to save us from death and to lead us to everlasting life. Through our participation in the cup of salvation we pledge to God that we will pour out ourselves in service of one another, especially those who cry out for justice.





A reflection on vocation as stewardship

The book of Genesis is clear about it: the first human couple was created "to fill the earth and subdue it." This call to stewardship was part of the original human design. God's creation was a common heritage of air, water, and earth, to be cherished and used, to be shared for the benefit of all. It was the Promised Land; it was the Garden.

But soon enough a worm visited the fruit; the tree of life withered; the garden was left behind. The mandate to stewardship of creation continued, but under the penalty of pain and toil. Distorted by sin, the human domination of creation spoiled what it cultivated. The trees that were part of our original heritage, whether we looked to Genesis or Darwin, could not survive the acid rain. The soil died, too, and washed away.

For the worm was in the fruit of our caretaking — we shared sin and its fruits as we shared the original gift. We shared the toxins, as we shared the common air. We could not help but share them, for we are united in one family, with a common bond we celebrate in our family trees.

But this is not the kind of sharing we were called to, when it does not give life.

CALLED TO NURTURE LIFE

The vocation to stewardship is a call to further life, to use wisely our common gift. We are to become a family tree — a tree of life.

Following ancient tradition, Ezekiel pictures the entire family of Israel as a cedar tree, in today's first reading. Playing upon the same tradition, Jesus relates a parable about a mustard seed, growing up to shelter the birds of the air. It symbolizes the new family, the Kingdom of God. But this family is entered into by conversion, not birth. It is a choice that is dedicated to enhance life, not jeopardize it.

Our call is not a call to share our lives with one another, for we cannot help but do that. Rather, it is a call to share our lives in ways that give life.

Who Can This Be That The Wind



JUNE 19, 1988

12th Sunday in Ordinary Time

The relationship between Jesus and the disciples in the Gospel of Mark certainly has its ups and downs. Jesus calls them by name and forms them into a community of followers. He instructs them, at times explaining things privately. Often, however, the disciples fail to understand. And when Jesus talks about his suffering Peter objects (8:32), while James and John are looking after their own glory (10:37). In many ways, like the blind man at Bethsaida who only gradually is able to see (8:22-26), the disciples are slow to grasp who lesus really is.

In Mark's gospel the disciples at one point are alone with Jesus out in a boat. Mark portrays a very vivid scene. While waves hurl into the boat, Jesus is asleep on a cushion in the stern. Fear overcomes the disciples as they cry out, "Teacher, doesn't it matter to you . . . ?"

Who among us today does not experience trying times when our faith is shaken, when there are family troubles or problems at work, when we feel like saying: "Jesus, doesn't it matter that I can hardly go on, that my life seems to be falling apart?"

WHO CAN THIS BE?

In response to the disciples' insecurity, Jesus manifests

the power of his presence by commanding the wind to be quiet. "Be still!" This same expression was also used earlier in the gospel when Jesus rebuked a demon (1:25). Thus it is clear that Jesus has the power to bring order out of chaos and to subdue the forces of evil that touch us.

This gospel passage recalls the power manifest in the reading from Job, where we hear the Lord speak of his power over the sea, controlling its waves and setting its limits. This passage is a response to the probing question of the book: "Why does the just person suffer?" It is the author's way of saying that God's purpose and God's wisdom surpass human understanding.

After Jesus rebukes the sea and it calms down, he recognizes the disciples' fear with the question: "Why are you so terrified?" Fear is the obstacle to their faith. How easily it is that our own fears swell up in waves of worry and anxiety. Who can this be who calms our terror, who quiets our inner storms? It is the Lord. We are invited to put all our trust in God's power. To God all things matter.





JUNE 26, 1988 • 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time

In the brief selection of verses from Second Corinthians, Paul has much to say about riches and poverty. Paul speaks first on a more spiritual level and then on a more material level.

Spiritually the Corinthians are very gifted. They are rich "in faith and discourse, in knowledge, in total con-

cern." The Corinthians certainly had faith in Christ (1:24), a faith shared by every Christian, but they also had a special gift of faith which empowered them to heal and to work miracles (1 Corinthians 12:9, 10). Their gift of religious discourse refers to speaking in tongues and prophecy (1 Corinthians 12:10, 28), and the gift of knowledge probably means special spiritual insight. This text about the spiritual riches of the Corinthians invites us to reflect: What are the spiritual gifts that have been given to our parish members?

Paul goes on to talk about the Lord Jesus Christ becoming poor so that the community might become rich. This does not refer to the material poverty of Jesus but to the surrender of the outward signs of his deity as he assumed human form. This reminds us of Philippians 2:7: Jesus "emptied himself and took the form of a slave." Because of Jesus' poverty, believers become rich. The riches we receive come to us as the good news of salvation.

The gospel gives us a vivid picture of these riches. Jesus responded to the human distress of Jairus whose little daughter was reported as dead, and to the woman who suffered for many years. In response to their faith, Jesus offered healing, peace, and new life.

SHARING OUR WEALTH

Returning to Second Corinthians, we note that next Paul speaks about sharing on a material level. He urges the mainly Gentile Christians in Corinth to share their plenty with the Jewish Christians in Jerusalem. Such relief, Paul says, "ought not to impoverish you; there should be a certain equality." This reminds us of the Christian partnership presented in Acts 2:44-45 where possessions were sold whenever money was needed to support the poor.

Today in the Church many wealthier parishes are sharing their economic resources with poorer parishes in the inner city. Others have adopted and are helping to support "sister parishes" in third world countries.

Reflecting on the ever widening gap between the rich and those impoverished, we become acutely aware how far we have to go to realize Paul's words: "there should be a certain equality."






