There has been a noticeable increase in the popularity of psychics and other "fortune tellers" in our society. People are looking for hope maybe, or a chance to control their futures. The prophet's role is not in such demand. In contrast to the palm readers who offer promises of "tall, dark, and handsome" or success in our future investments, the prophet calls us to look back. The prophet recalls for us the covenant between God and us; the prophet retells the stories of God's faithfulness to us and leaves us to consider our reciprocal faithfulness, or lack of it.

Poor Ezekiel could hardly have looked forward to his career as a prophet after the Spirit described the audience to whom he was sent. Which of us would choose to speak to "rebels . . . Hard of face and obstinate of heart?" Ezekiel, like Paul, must have realized his powerlessness in the face of such a task. In fact, he credits the Spirit with helping him to even stand up!

ISN'T THIS THE CARPENTER . . . ?

There is a quotation which says, "You know you're a prophet when you're being stoned from both sides." The person who tries to be a peacemaker, a reconciler, a prophet of love and forgiveness, can become the butt of anger from both sides whether at a personal or an international level.

Jesus was "stoned from both sides" as he spoke the good news. He was rejected by the religious leaders, misunderstood and betrayed by his own disciples. He knew what it meant to be "without honor."

Perhaps we shall finally be the ones to give Jesus and all the prophets the honor they deserve by taking their message to heart.

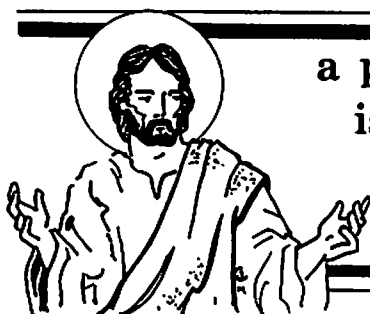

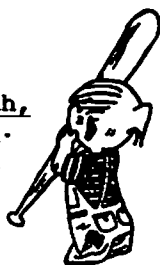

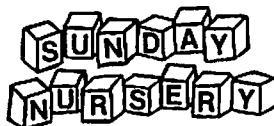

A reflection on vocation as stewardship

Signs of the '80s: Salad bars and bike trails. Flossing. Jogging. Aerobic dancing. "No gain without pain." "Health" has acquired some style, as "Fitness," and "Wellness." Good health is in vogue today.

But why? Is it because the Baby Boomers, that meticulously documented population group, are entering their forties? Is it because the aging flesh is beginning to slump and the rude whisper of mortality is being heard?

In any case, it is all for the better. Isn't it? After all, don't we claim that it is a Christian thing to maintain one's good health? Isn't that stewardship? Isn't there a similarity between the cult of health and those other cults of this decade — those of power and wealth? Such as Rambo. Such as "Lifestyles of the Rich and Famous." Isn't there an undertone of self-absorbed anxiety — a desire to enhance our own personal strength so that we needn't rely on anyone else, so we don't have to trust anyone? No — certainly this must only be our imagination.

For it goes without saying that good health is a Christian value. Or why would Jesus have spent much of his time curing people? Or why would he have sent his disciples out to cure the sick, as in today's gospel?

THE POWER OF HEALING

Maintaining one's health is an act of stewardship of God's creation, certainly. Although stewardship implies our communal nature, it's not simply our own self-worth that is at stake in staying healthy. For others love us. Others depend on us.

That health is a gift can be seen in healing. The power of healing is in sharp contrast to the power of destruction, and the threat of destruction. Jesus showed us this truth in the Garden of his Agony, when he healed the severed ear of the guard who came to destroy him. And yet healing is no less a power, even if it cannot be used forcefully.

Healing is also stewardship, laboring to mend a broken world.

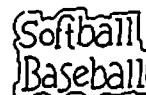

ANNOUNCE THE GOOD NEWS OF PEACE

JULY 17, 1988 • 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time

In today's gospel, Jesus and the apostles attempt to find a well-earned respite from their demanding ministry. Yet in spite of his weariness and his desire to spend some time apart with his friends, Jesus takes pity on the crowd. "They were like sheep without a shepherd" the evangelist writes, and the Good Shepherd unhesitatingly responds to their needs, setting aside his own plans and teaching them.

Are there sheep without a shepherd in our world, in our communities, in our parishes, perhaps even in our own homes?

Are there children without stable families in search of security? Are there confused teens in search of someone to guide them? Are there unwanted elderly persons in need of belonging? Are there unaccepted handicapped persons who look for a welcome? Are there oppressed minorities who hunger for justice?

If Jesus walked the earth today, surely he would shepherd these flocks. He would teach them, he would heal them, he would be the good news of God's saving and unconditional love. Jesus would welcome the unwelcomed and teach them as he taught the vast crowd in today's gospel.

Surely if Jesus were here today, we would all be cared for, be shepherded, be nourished, be sought out when we are lost.

THERE IS NOTHING I SHALL WANT

Where is Jesus our Good Shepherd today? Where can we find him and the verdant pastures which the psalmist proclaims?

Jesus has assured us that he is, in fact, here today. He taught us that he is not only present to us as our Good Shepherd, but he is also present within us that we might be good shepherds for one another.

We won't find him, however, if we look for a spectacularly dressed, romanticized "shepherd" holding a spotless lamb. He will be found with the grimy flock, pasturing and nourishing those who are in need. Jesus will be found today, as he was two thousand years ago, speaking with sinners and eating with outcasts.

If we are content to share that sort of company, there is, indeed, nothing we shall want. We shall have found the Good Shepherd and that will be enough.

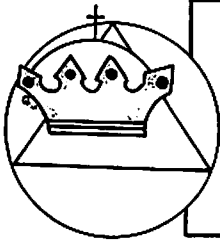

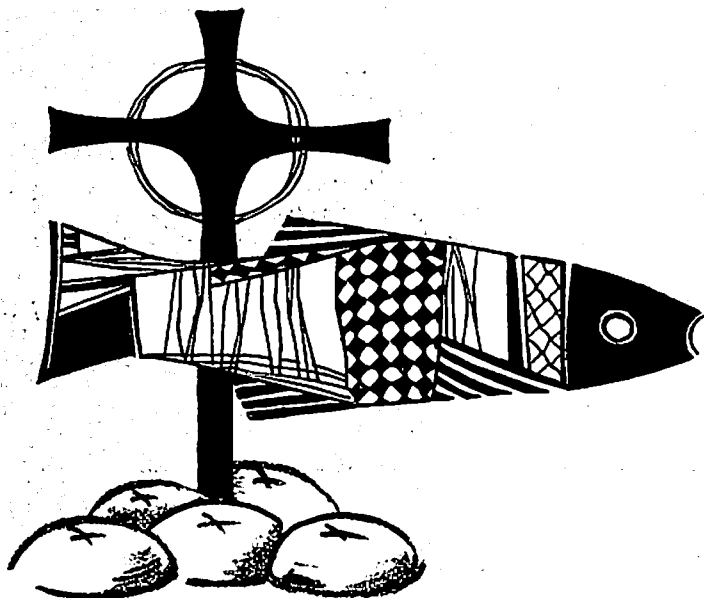

In our weak human condition, "the hand of the Lord feeds us." With all the gentle determination of a caregiver, the Lord offers us nourishment. He feeds us with His word; he feeds us with his Body and Blood in the eucharist; he feeds us with the living concern of a community of good and faithful people. But, as the caregiver has hopes for the patient, the Lord has hopes for us. We are not fed so that we can recline on our couches and feel satisfied. The Lord cries with each morsel of grace and truth and love he gives to us: "I want you to be strong! I want you to live!"

In today's second reading, Paul gives us some idea of how the Lord wants us to live. We are fed by the hand of the Lord so that we might "live a life worthy of the calling . . . with perfect humility, meekness, and patience, bearing with one another lovingly." The Lord feeds us so that we might "make every effort to preserve the unity."

It is not an easy life we are called to live, but our God is one who has shared this life intimately and knows and responds lovingly to our need to be nourished. And with

each meal God provides, we hear God say again, "I want you to be strong! I want you to live!"

THE LEFTOVERS

In both of the miraculous feedings in today's Scripture readings, there are leftovers. The message might well be that when "the hand of the Lord feeds us" he always supplies more than we need.

The other message is clear: when the "hand of the Lord feeds us" there is surplus nourishment for us to share with others. The Lord's gentle touch empowers us to touch others gently; the Lord's active compassion for our weakness and our hunger enables us to be compassionate with each other in our neediness.

Each time "the hand of the Lord feeds us" he whispers, "I want you to be strong! I want you to live!"

"The hand of the Lord feeds us" that our hands might be able to feed each other.

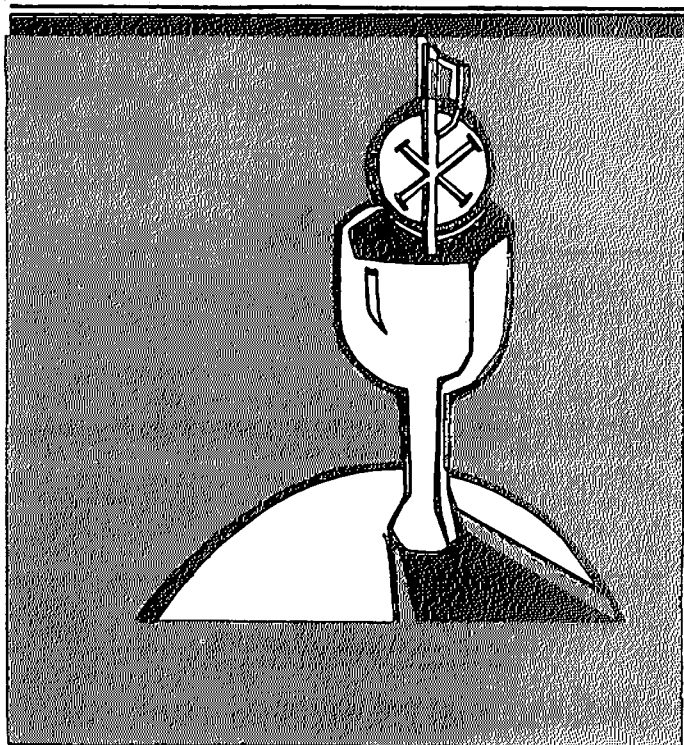

The hunger which the Israelites experienced must have been severe for them to accuse Moses and Aaron of leading them "into this desert to make the whole community die of famine." How many of us have ever felt that depth of hunger? "I'm starving" usually indicates the need for a mid-morning snack before lunch,

or that supper is fifteen minutes late. We are fortunate if we have not known hunger for bread, for having our physical hunger satisfied helps us to concentrate on the deeper hungers of our hearts.

The human hunger for meaning can apparently be satisfied by money or success, by the "good life" or just good times. Feeding our hunger for meaning with such fleeting satisfactions is like satiating our physical hunger with junk food. We may feel filled for a while, but sooner or later the effects of our poor choices, for nutrition or meaning, will show.

In today's Letter to the Ephesians Paul reminds the community to "lay aside your former way of life and the old self which deteriorates through illusion and desire." Paul calls the Ephesians, and us, to feed the hunger for meaning with Christ.

SIR, GIVE US THIS BREAD ALWAYS

Jesus understood the crowd which followed him to Capernaum in today's gospel. He understood their fascination with signs and wonders. He understood their preoccupation with perishable food. He understood their real hungers better than they understood themselves.

Jesus could have, no doubt, worked another miracle and multiplied bread to win their faith. Jesus' miracles, however, were never performed to impress people, but always in response to a need. Instead of giving them bread, Jesus offers himself. No miracle meal for this crowd, just the miraculous relationship with the Messiah.

The crowd knew the Scriptures. They remembered that their ancestors had been fed with manna in the desert. Jesus was offering them fare more than manna, but we are not certain that they understood.

Do we understand what Jesus offers as he says to us, "I am the bread of life?" The bread which is Jesus would only be palatable to the "new person created in God's image" of whom Paul writes. That new person understands that the Bread of Life will not fill our stomachs, yet we shall be deeply satisfied.

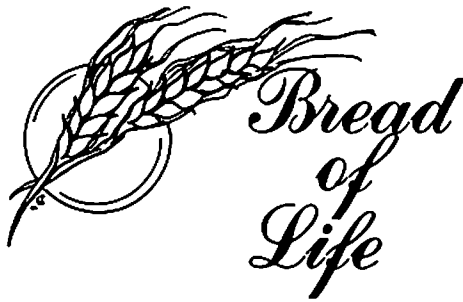

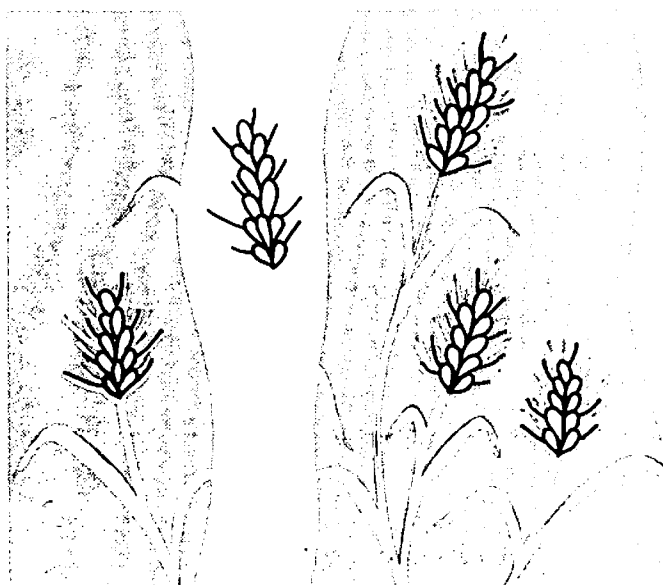

Whoever eats This bread shall live forever

AUGUST 7, 1988 • 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jesus' announcement that he is "the bread that came down from heaven" draws responses of disbelief from the argumentative crowd. "We know who you are and where you came from," they respond, "you can't fool us!"

Jesus rebukes them, "Stop your murmuring!" How frustrated and wearied he must have been by their reaction to his good news. But Jesus presses on in his explanation, offering the people what they truly hungered for but could not believe in. Jesus offered — and continues to offer — himself, and the promise of immortality.

One would give anything, we might suppose, for God and eternal life, but the crowd was not willing to give up their pre-conceived notions and cynicism. If they could not accept Jesus as having come from heaven, it is little wonder that when he proclaimed, "the bread I will give is my flesh," they walked away entirely.

Elijah was touched and fed by an angel. Jesus offered his flesh as bread for the life of the world. These facts are neither easily believed nor easily dismissed. While they challenge our human reasoning, still we are attracted because our hunger is so deep, our thirst so intense.

"Taste and see how good the Lord is," the psalmist exclaims. To reach the banquet table requires a leap of faith.

AFTER DINNER...

The angel who came to Elijah gave him food and drink. After he ate, "he lay down again." The angel roused him a second time, "Get up and eat, else the journey will be too long for you!" God apparently did not send the angel so that Elijah might be satisfied and sleep well. The prophet was nourished precisely for his journey.

Jesus says, "the bread I will give is my flesh, for the life of the world." Jesus does not come to us in order that we be well-fed, but in order that we, in turn, might give ourselves for the life of the world.

Paul tells us why Jesus nourishes us; so that we will have the strength to be kind, compassionate, forgiving imitators of God."

So eat, drink and be God-like!

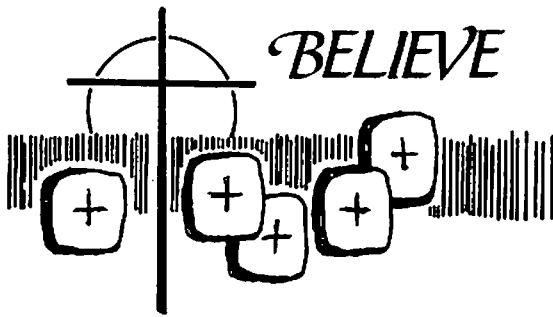

willed peace that generates life. Reconciliation is the bridge and also the crossing over the bridge.

MENDING BRIDGES

The call to stewardship is a summons to bridge-making. It is a call to heal the breach and reknit the fragmented world. In this regard, it is a call beyond our private selves, beyond our preoccupation with self-importance. It's a call to make concessions.

Every successful negotiation requires concessions. In practice this means letting go of claims, even in some of those cases in which I'm convinced my way is better. This is the humility that recognizes that my viewpoint is one among many. My view is a partial one, unlike God's. I, too, am a member of the faltering human family. Such humility in practice is more difficult than humility in books.

This is the humility of forgiveness, too. With forgiveness, the world can be made new. In so many ways, the new earth, the new creation that the New Testament yearns for, is built on the work of healing personal divisions.

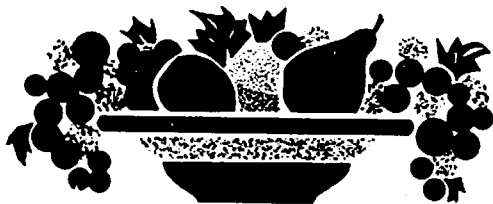

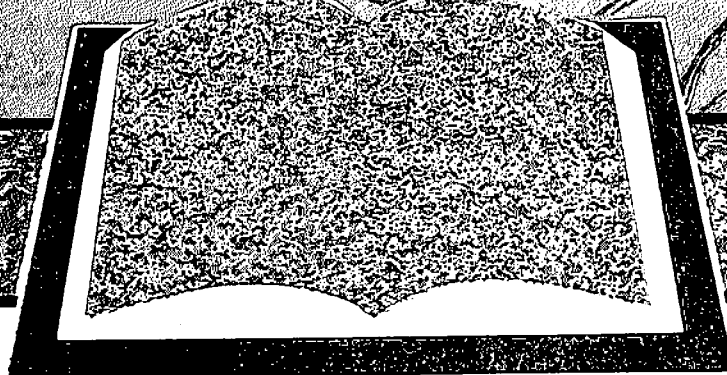

You Have the Words of Eternal Life



AUGUST 21, 1988

21st Sunday in Ordinary Time

As the others walk away from him, Jesus asks the Twelve: "Do you want to leave me too?" Impetuous Peter gives their response, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life." It could not have been an easily spoken declaration for Peter. Those who stayed with Jesus were no doubt as criticized and as ostracized as Jesus himself.

The tribes of Israel, the disciples of Jesus, and all of us have our moments of fervor and faith, and our times of doubt and despair. Our faith fluctuates with our feelings and our fortunes. The condition is chronic: it is human nature.

Yet Jesus assures us that our human nature need not be terminal to our faith. He tells us in today's gospel that, "It is the Spirit that gives life." It is in clinging to the Spirit of Jesus that we are able to hold on to our beliefs and to serve the Lord.

DEFER TO ONE ANOTHER

The really difficult part of serving the Lord is the fact that the service involves other people. If the doctrines of our faith are not a stumbling block for us, the folks around us sometimes are!

Our religion is a relational one with God. The heart of the Scriptures is the message of loving relationships among all people and with God.

In his Letter to the Ephesians, Paul writes of one type of relationship, that between husband and wife, and sets forth some ideals. Though today we may find some of Paul's thoughts archaic, those same thoughts were revolutionary in the culture of his time.

Paul speaks of another relationship in his letter: that of Christ and his Church. The image Paul uses is that we are members of Christ's body and, therefore, to be united with Christ is to be connected with each other.

Perhaps the wisest statement Paul writes in today's second reading is the opening line: "Defer to one another out of reverence for Christ." What a contrast to the voice of the "me-first" society! If we could—in one small way—defer to someone else out of reverence for Christ we would be expressing our living relationship with God and people. We would, in fact, be deciding today—with the help of the Spirit—to serve the Lord.

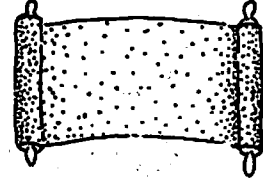

DO NOT FORGET GOD'S COMMANDMENTS



AUGUST 28, 1988 • 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Judging by appearances comes naturally in our society, humility does not. "Humbly welcome the word that has taken root in you," James writes in today's second reading, but humility comes from within.

We, as a Church, have grown in our understanding of the virtue of humility. No longer do we see humility as self-effacement, but rather, to be humble is to be honest about both our strengths and our weaknesses, our gifts and our needs.

"Every worthwhile gift, every genuine benefit comes from above," James reminds us, and to humbly welcome the word of God is to acknowledge our indebtedness to God for all that we are. It is from that humble and honest posture that we are able to view every other person as our equal, to treat them with compassion and certainly to deny ourselves the temptation to judge those whose external "religiousness" differs from our own.

If we have learned to "heed what we hear" as we listen to God in the Scriptures, in prayer and in the wisdom of people of faith; if we have "humbly welcomed the word," then our rituals will be shot through with the glory of Jesus and our hearts will be close to him.

Like Jesus, James is speaking about the deeper meaning of our ritual actions which necessarily bears fruit in service to our neighbors.

"Looking after orphans and widows in their distress" should be the consequence of our discipleship and the offering we bring to our worship.

James' suggestion is a far cry from the voices of those who say of orphans, widows, and the poor: "They could get jobs if they wanted to! They just enjoy being on welfare!"

Jesus asks more of us than "lip service"; he looks inside of us to see if we have put our hearts—and our lives—where our words are. Perhaps the only proof of the sincerity of our prayers is in how we look after those who are "in distress."

And perhaps it is precisely because we have looked after those who are in distress that we will be able to find Jesus when we are the ones who are distressed.

Today's Readings: Dt. 4:1-2, 6-8; Jas. 1:17-18, 21-22, 27; Mk. 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23.

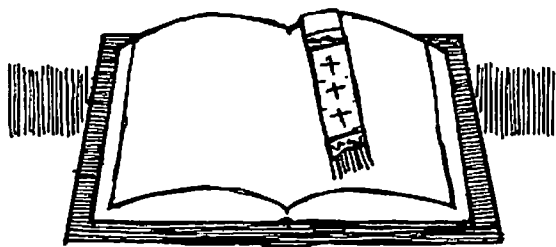

He has done everything well

Jesus had the crowd in the palm of his hand after today's miracle. "He has done everything well," they acclaimed. "He makes the deaf hear and the mute speak!" Jesus could have kept them in his palm if only he had continued to be simply a miracle worker. But Jesus had come, not to do the will of the crowd, and gain popularity; Jesus came to do the will of God and establish God's reign.

It was acceptable for Jesus to open the ears of the deaf, if only he had not pointed out how we are all deaf to God's Word. It was agreeable that Jesus would loose the tongues of those whose speech was faulty, if only he had not accused us of misusing our voices against our brothers and sisters. It was wonderful that Jesus cured blindness, if only he had not also made us see our own sinfulness. It was enough for Jesus to heal physical ills, if only he had not invited us to bring our spiritual ills for healing as well.

The same crowd which today proclaims, "He has done everything well," perhaps modified their statement as the message of Jesus touched their own lives: "He has done almost everything well." When Jesus finally opened their ears and his love called for interior conversion, perhaps they were among those who said: "He has done nothing well. Crucify him!"

FAITH NOT FAVORITISM

Today's readings from the Letter of James is another "eye opener." James, like Jesus, sees people through God's eyes, and recognizes that those whom the world calls "poor" are to be the most honored for they have been chosen to be heirs of the Kingdom.

If we really believed that the poor are Jesus' beloved,

would we not give our choicest food to the food pantry rather than the leftovers or sale items? Would we not buy a new coat for the clothing drive and use the old one ourselves?

We are impressed with Jesus' ability to cure deafness and blindness, but we will be far more convinced of his love and power as we allow him to open our ears and our eyes so that we might live by faith.

"Ephphatha," Jesus says to each of us, "Be opened!"

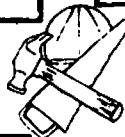

A reflection on vocation as stewardship

Care? Today many have become allergic to the word. Depending upon its current packaging, it seems too smothering, too cuddly, or too sweet. The word needs help — does anyone know CPR?

Milton Mayeroff does. In an elegant little book with a growing reputation, entitled (naturally) *On Caring*, he quietly explores the meaning of this popular word. His gentle probing reveals not only an important virtue, but an essential aspect of what it means to be a human adult.

When we think about caring, we usually have in mind another person — a child, a spouse, an elderly parent. This is as it should be; but the "other" need not be a person. It may be a community or an idea, a pet or a pet project.

In caring, I respect the integrity of the other; I wish it to grow in its own right. I do not necessarily impose my own direction, but let the direction of the other's growth dictate what I do in caring. This is true whether the other is person or thing: my child has her own integrity; the music I write has its own form.

Caring is always specific and concrete. It is this child I care for, not children in the abstract. And caring is active. It is a way of doing something. Caring for my garden means planning, weeding, pruning, and in general, getting dirt under my nails. Caring involves feelings — in fact, some of the deepest, most enriching feelings — but it moves on to action, or it is not caring.

Compare what St. James says in today's second reading: Faith is not faith if it doesn't result in specific, concrete acts of caring.

SERVING OTHERS

Mayeroff devotes the second part of his book to the benefits that return to the one giving care. He concludes it gives a basic stability in one's life; it allows me to find my place in the world. "Through caring for certain others, by serving them through caring, a man lives the meaning of his own life."

Compare this with Jesus' words in today's gospel: "Whoever would preserve his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and the gospel's will preserve it" (Mark 8:35).

And stewardship? Is it part of this picture? On the contrary, can it be anything else? For on the one hand, the work of stewardship must be the work of devotion, given in specific actions to concrete "others." On the other hand, any such work of devotion is, in fact, stewardship.

You Must Remain A Servant

Jesus stood a child in the midst of the rank-conscious disciples, and identified himself with the child. "Whoever welcomes a child such as this for my sake welcomes me," he says. Jesus measures importance according to who is content being last, who is willing to serve everyone, who is like a child. Surely these were not the measuring sticks which the disciples had been using.

Children find it natural to be last, usually choosing to follow someone wiser; children love to serve, for in serving they sense their own gifts and their dignity as givers. How do we lose our childlike ways as we mature and become position-conscious?

In an article in the *Chicago Sun-Times* in 1980, Ellen Goodman wrote of this issue:

"Kids. They save pennies to fight pollution, take walkathons against war, bake bread for brotherhood, are told to be charitable and generous and trusting. And then to grow out of it, as if caring were a pair of jeans.

"We raise our children with ethical time bombs, built-in disillusionment alarms. We allow them their ideals until they are 14 or 18 or 22. But if they don't let go, we worry about whether they will be able to function in the real world...We regard toughness as adult. We regard cynicism as grown-up."

Perhaps as parents, as teachers, we echo the words from

wisdom and demand that good people prove themselves and not be an affront to our own way of living.

WISDOM IS INNOCENT

Innocence is not a highly regarded quality in our society, yet James' letter declares it a part of wisdom. The other qualities which James ascribes to wisdom are equally less popular; "It is also peaceful, lenient, docile, rich in sympathy and the kindly deeds that are its fruit, impartial and sincere." A person with such qualities today would hardly be named "most likely to climb the corporate ladder" or "most likely to outrank all colleagues."

But then, Jesus would never have been named to either of those, would he? It seems that the way to follow Jesus is clear: to serve others, to hold to the kingdom values of peace and love and trust and forgiveness.

Today is a good day to ask ourselves, "Whom do I consider the most important? How do I measure a person's importance?" Then we can see how our own lived answers compare with Jesus' answers.

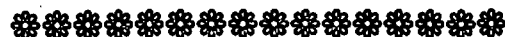

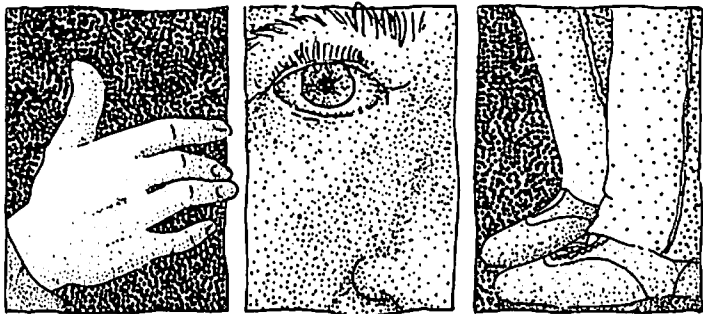

The world has always been suspicious of prophets. It is the prophet's task to remind people of God and to recall our purpose on earth. Such a message often involves mention of people's failures and consequently a call to conversion and a change of life. No wonder prophets were reluctant to ac-

cept their role; no wonder so many were ostracized or deemed "crazy" or killed. Upsetting the status quo is no way to endear yourself to the masses!

Moses was eager to share the Spirit given to him and to share the privilege — and burden — of prophesying. "Would that all the people of the Lord were prophets!" he exclaims. "Would that the Lord might bestow his Spirit on them all!"

Those who truly possess God's spirit are always eager to share it. Those who work with Jesus are anxious to recognize others who share the work. The minute when we attempt to lay sole claim to God's spirit and his work in the world is a denial of our own calling. We cannot possess God's spirit nor control how his spirit will work.

SEE WHAT YOU HAVE STORED UP

The second reading from the Letter of James is a stern warning about possessions. James makes it abundantly clear that the "treasures" of this life: wealth, fine clothes, gold and silver are perishable.

The paradox is that it is those things which we cannot possess which will be ours eternally. We cannot "possess" justice, but if we act justly, it is of eternal value. We cannot "possess" God's spirit, but if we act as his spirit directs, the Spirit is ours forever. We cannot "possess" God's work, but if we do God's work, it will be of everlasting significance.

If we have stored up instead, possessions of wealth or titles of power, they will ultimately be lost. If we have gained our wealth or authority at the expense of others, they will corrode, and as Jesus says: "their corrosion shall be a testimony against you."

Our lives are meant to be lived in the footsteps of Moses, in the footsteps of Jesus. Their willingness — even eagerness — to share God's spirit and God's work stands as our example for accepting truth wherever and by whomever it is spoken. Their example calls us to recognize and to affirm the ministry of all who build the Kingdom, for their service is proof of God's spirit, whether they are "credentialed" or not.

Then, when we are open to God's spirit, we can pray with Moses, "Would that all the people of the Lord were prophets," for we, too, shall be eager to share the work.

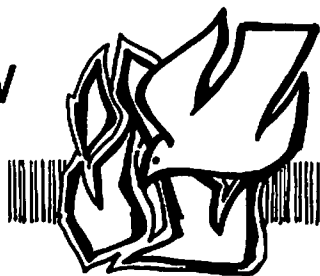

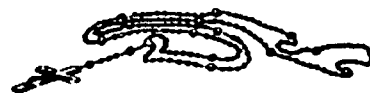
