



God sent forth the Son, born of a woman

JANUARY 1, 1989 • Mary, Mother of God

When a young couple is expecting a baby, there is usually great discussion about what they will name the child. Sometimes friends and relatives make suggestions, but ultimately it is the prerogative of the parents to name their child.

In today's gospel we read: "the name Jesus was given the child, the name the angel had given him before he was conceived." What an awesome act of faith for Mary and Joseph to affirm the name which God gave to their child! Not only did they accept the name, but they accepted the meaning of the name for their son. "Jesus" means savior, and Mary and Joseph knew from the Scriptures that the Savior would suffer and die. Their affirmation of the name Jesus was an affirmation of his destiny and of their willingness to support and to suffer with him.

ABBA!

Jesus, the Savior, prophetically named by the loving God who sent him, teaches his people a new name for God. Jesus teaches his followers that God's name is *Abba* (the Aramaic word for father). Jesus teaches his followers not simply to call

God *Abba*, but to relate to God as a loving parent.

By the example of his life, Jesus shows us *Abba's* desire to share our lives intimately; Jesus shows us through his own life that *Abba* can be trusted totally.

The proof of Jesus' message is that God confirmed it in the miracles which Jesus performed, and in Jesus' resurrection.

Because of Mary and Joseph's trust in God, we can name Jesus as our brother; because of Jesus, we can confidently call God *Abba* and live securely in a relationship of faithful love.

The comfort we find in calling Jesus brother and God *Abba* has an attendant challenge. God asks that we recognize all who call God *Abba*; Jesus asks that we recognize all people as our brothers and sisters.

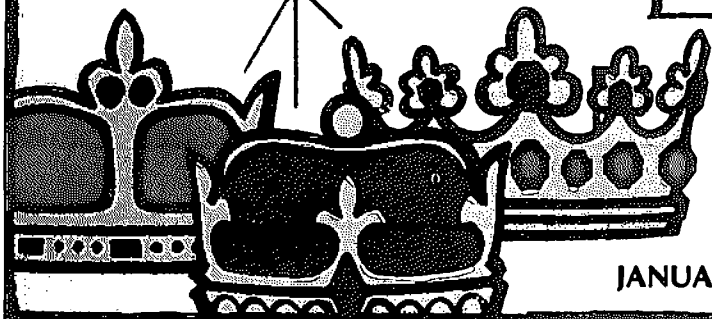

JANUARY 8, 1989 • Epiphany

The Epiphany celebrates the manifestation of God's Son to all nations at his birth. Jesus' whole life was the manifestation of God's love for all people. Jesus accepted those who were rejected: lepers, Samaritans, sinners. Jesus proclaimed in word and action that God loved everyone, wanted to heal everyone, to forgive everyone.

Those who followed Jesus soon found themselves in the company of prostitutes, tax collectors, and outcasts. To follow Jesus is to hear his message: "Love me, love my friends."

In today's second reading, Paul declares that the Gentiles are "members of the same body" in Christ Jesus. Paul, the Apostle to the Gentiles, had a difficult time convincing people of the Gentiles' equality in God's Kingdom. So soon after Jesus' birth and life, his message of a God for all people was forgotten.

Paul ultimately won the struggle and the Gentiles claimed their rightful place among the followers of Jesus.

YOUR LIGHT HAS COME

The light of the Star of Bethlehem led the astrologers

from the east to the Light of the World. Jesus' message of God's love for all people illumined the minds and hearts of those who would try to lay claim to God as their exclusive possession.

"Upon you the Lord shines," Isaiah says in today's first reading. The light of the Epiphany message invites us to examine our own notions of an exclusive "tribal" God.

Paul questioned the exclusion of the Gentiles and reminded the community of Jesus' acceptance of all people. Since Paul's time, our world has tried to exclude other groups from the Kingdom. We have seen the horrors of anti-Semitism, racism, sexism, and discrimination even among those who know of Jesus and his message.

The astrologers "were overjoyed at seeing the star" and we share their joy at the birth of the Messiah who came for all people. Our love and acceptance of others could be the "starlight" which leads them to Jesus.

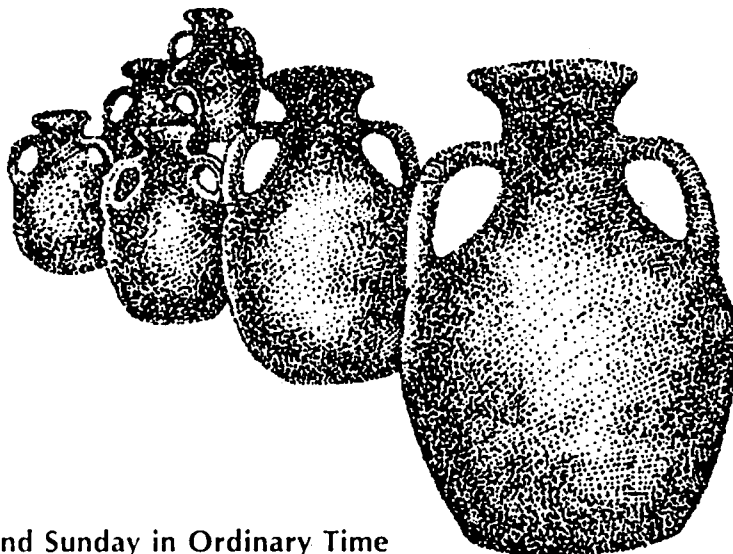

JESUS REVEALED HIS GLORY

JANUARY 15, 1989 • 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time



Mary's words to the servants at the wedding feast at Cana were simple: "Do whatever he tells you." Did the servants have doubts following the instructions of this guest from Nazareth? Did they fear public humiliation if their filling of the six stone jars was to yield only more water? Remember, Jesus had worked no miracles yet and the servants' obedience to him was indeed a risk.

How delighted they must have been when their efforts contributed to bringing forth the choice wine! Did these servants pass on Mary's words to other would-be followers of Jesus: "Do whatever he tells you?" Did they retell the story of how their obedience to Jesus brought about a miracle?

Long before Mary spoke those words: "Do whatever he tells you," Isaiah spoke a similar message to the Israelites. The prophet continually called the people to be faithful to their covenant with God and reminded them that in that faithfulness they would find happiness.

The message of loving obedience to God is constantly reiterated by those who listen attentively to God's invitation. Those who "do whatever God tells

them" are the miracleworkers and the proof of God's promises for those who trust Him.

IT IS ONE AND THE SAME SPIRIT

Those of us who wish to follow Jesus today, to be a part of the miracles of love and peace which he can work through us should listen to Mary's words: "Do whatever he tells you."

In today's second reading, St. Paul reminds us of what Jesus has told his followers to do: use their gifts in service for the good of others.

Jesus asks his followers to imitate the "miracles" of Cana: to be concerned about others' needs as Mary was; to trust God as Jesus did; to use our abilities in obedience to the Spirit of Love.

We may not be able to change water into wine, but we can change our world into the Kingdom of God. What a joy to be part of that miracle!

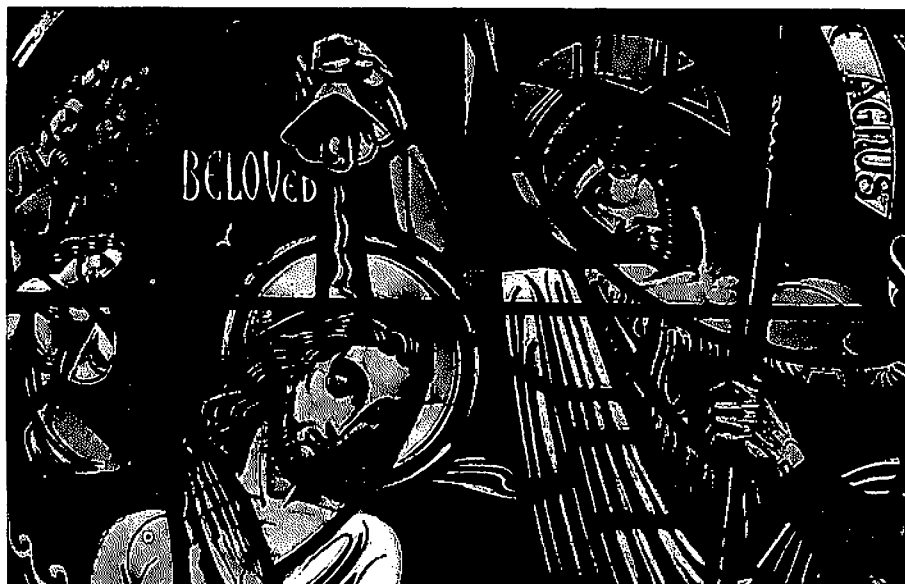

A reflection on vocation as sacrament

Every age has its own way of feeling that God is distant. As we do today. The technology and bureaucracy of the world we live in shape the way we imagine things.

Take the word "call." When we use the word outside of church, it usually had to do with the telephone. In church, when we "call" on God, we may feel that we've been put on hold, while the music plays. Where is God? we wonder. On the other hand, if God calls us, who answers? The answering service? "Sorry, I'm not in right now."

"Vocation" means "call," and the meaning is personal, not bureaucratic. As difficult as it may be for me to imagine, God loves me, and has called me into a community and into a concrete life within that community. God is present to me personally through other persons and through the signs we call sacraments. In these concentrated moments, the God who frequently seems so remote addresses each of us intimately.

BAPTISM AS VOCATION

God calls us into a covenanted community. This community, the Church, is itself a "sacrament," a sign of God's presence among us. When Ezra the priest revitalized the dispirited community of Israel after the Exile, it was by means of a covenant renewal, reminding them that they, as a community, were called.

When Jesus, after the visit of the Spirit in his baptism,

moved into action, he was exercising the call of baptism. The first thing he did, Luke tells us today, was to go to his home community of Nazareth. The American bishops recognized that we are called by baptism into a community when they authorized the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA), a model of sacramental life.

God calls us into a new story. Ezra began a new chapter in the history of Israel. Gathering together the remnant of the exiles, he shaped the Judaic religion that Jesus was born into. Jesus' own story, as gospel, begins with his baptism. His answer to the "Voice" at his baptism is to begin the gospel work.

In our baptisms, we too begin a new story, one that takes us beyond our birth stories, into the gospel where God has called us.

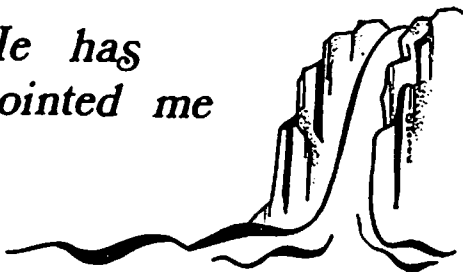

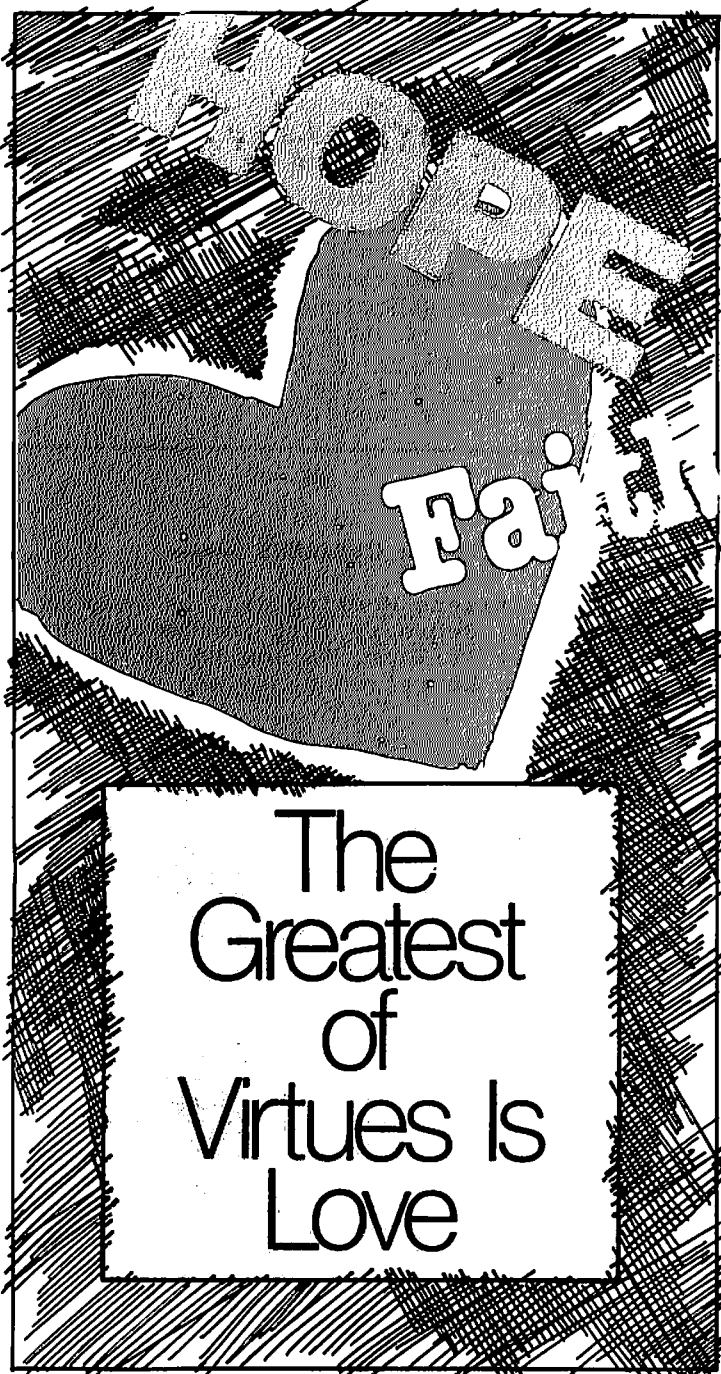

The Greatest of Virtues Is Love

JANUARY 29, 1989 • 4th Sunday in Ordinary Time

What credentials was the audience in the synagogue looking for in their prophets? What qualifications would they have set for their Messiah?

Apparently being Joseph's son was not a criterion. Elsewhere in the Scriptures Jesus is dismissed because he came from Nazareth. Wrong father, wrong town. Or was their objection really "wrong message"?

Jesus was supposed to affirm the Israelites as God's special people. The Messiah was supposed to bring political and economic victory to God's people, and only to them. This son of Joseph did not say what the people wanted to hear. Yes, God loved the Israelites, Jesus would say, but God loved all people.

Jesus' credentials: his love and forgiveness, his faith in God, his acceptance of all people were not good enough. "Set your hearts on the greater gifts," Paul says, telling us to choose faith, hope, and love as the credentials we seek in imitation of the Master.

BEFORE I FORMED YOU I KNEW YOU

Often in society, in business dealings, in educational settings, "proof of identification" is required. Part of Jesus' problem was, of course, he had no proof. He had no driver's license with his photo and with "Son of God" or "Messiah" printed clearly.

Jesus depended on people's belief in him, in his teachings, in his works, and it was these believers' witness which helped to spread the good news.

We begin our journey as Christians, much like Jesus did, with the assurance that we are completely known and loved by God. Each of us is, as Isaiah writes, "a prophet to the nations." We, like the believers of Jesus' day, affirm Jesus' identity as we retell the stories of his faith, hope, and love; we affirm Jesus' message when we live our lives in faith, hope, and love according to Jesus' teaching.

Yes, he is Joseph's son; yes, he came from Nazareth, but our lived belief validates his Messiahship and his message in our world today.

Won't it be wonderful to enter Heaven and hear Jesus say: "Say, I know I know you!"

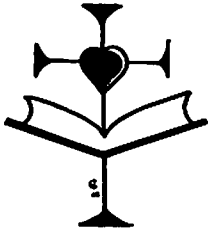

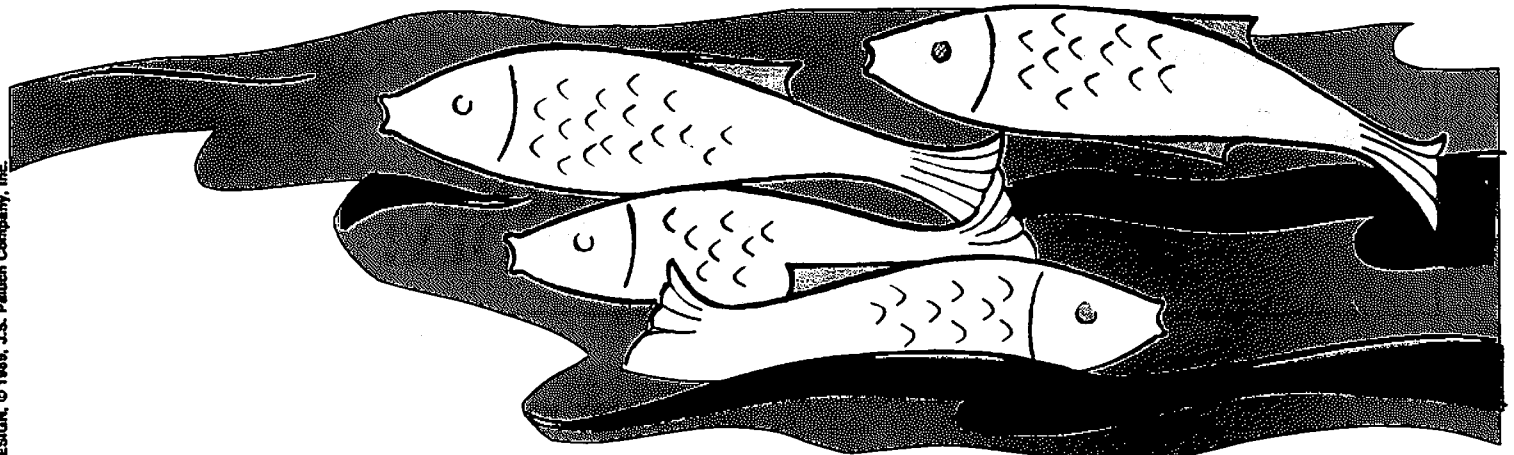

In all of today's readings, there is a recognition of sinfulness. In Isaiah's vision he says of himself: "I am a man of unclean lips, living among a people of unclean lips (Isaiah 6:5). Paul proclaims himself "...the least of the Apostles." He acknowledges: "Because I persecuted the Church of God, I do not even deserve the name" (1 Corinthians 15:9). After Jesus effects the miraculous catch of fish, Peter falls to his knees and declares: "I am a sinful man" (Luke 5:8).

Face to face with God's goodness and glory, we cannot help but become aware of our failure to respond to God with love and gratitude. The recognition of God's unconditional gratuitous love and our human sinfulness could be overwhelming if it weren't for the Incarnation. Jesus, God's word made flesh, was the ultimate proof of God's love, God's desire to forgive, to heal, to bring us to new life.

This is the gospel which Paul boasts of having preached; the gospel which has the power to save us. We are not left buried in our sinfulness, but,

rather, through faith we are convinced of God's mercy and that impels us to proclaim this good news with our own lives.

DO NOT BE AFRAID

It is awesome to realize that the "Holy, Holy, Holy" Lord God not only loves us, but sent the Son to become one of us to convince us of that love and to assure us that we are valuable, forgivable, and redeemed. If we really realized the meaning of God's love, we too would leave everything to follow Jesus. As we grow in faith, our courage to proclaim the gospel in our words and with our lives grows as well. Jesus, patient with us as he was with his first followers, keeps saying: "Do not be afraid." We, too, can "catch" men and women for God by our vibrant faith.

REGULATIONS FOR FAST AND ABSTINENCE

To fast means to keep from eating certain foods. To abstain means to refrain from eating meat. In the United States, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence and all Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence.

The obligation to abstain from meat binds Catholics 14 years of age and older. The obligation to fast, limiting oneself to one full meal and two lighter meals in the course of a day, binds Catholics from the ages of 21 to 59.

Those who are sick (this includes pregnant women) are not obligated to fast. (In doubt about other reasons, consult your confessor.)

Fasting and abstaining are forms of penance. As followers of Christ we are to participate in the suffering of Christ. Other voluntary forms should also be practiced. Prayer can be penitential, both private and liturgical. Charity toward the neighbor calls for surrender of self-love and the sharing of one's possessions.

With regard to the obligatory days listed above, however, there are frequent questions about the degree of seriousness of the matter. The teaching of Pope Paul VI, in an apostolic constitution on penance in the Church, may be simply paraphrased: the obligation to do penance is a serious one; the obligation to observe as a whole or "substantially," the penitential days specified by the Church is also serious. No one should be scrupulous in this regard: failure to observe individual days of penance is not considered serious; rather it is the failure to observe any penitential days at all or a substantial number of such days which must be considered serious.

People should seek to do more rather than less: fast and abstinence on the days prescribed; works of religion and charity on the Fridays outside Lent should be considered a minimal response to the Lord's call to penance and conversion of life.

The human being, more than any other of God's living creatures, requires a long period of training and protected development before it's ready to move out on its own. At the end of this period we usually schedule a ceremony such as graduation to mark the passage from "dependent" to full adult. In the early growing stages, we are dependent in more ways than the tax form knows.

Sacramental life seems to offer a parallel. The newly-baptized person, of whatever age, is a beginner in the community of God's people. In a sense, he or she is carried by the community, which is the bearer of the Christian identity and the Spirit. It is a time of dependency, moving toward interdependency.

The sacrament of confirmation was originally a part of the baptismal liturgy, as is still the case with adult baptism. The separation of the two rites, familiar to anyone who has grown up Catholic, troubles theologians insofar as that separation seems to be an accident of history. They don't know what to make of it and as a result tend to keep silent about the sacrament.

VOCATION AS CONFIRMATION

One way to think about it — as surely this is the way we celebrate it — is as the completion of the initiation period.

The time of apprenticeship is over; it is time to become a full, contributing member.

Liturgists note that one distinctive dimension of confirmation is the presence of the bishop. Bernard Cooke sees here a link with the larger community, the whole Church beyond the local parish. In confirmation we have a sign of the person's commitment to the worldwide mission of the Church.

As a sacrament of vocation, confirmation situates the Christian in the context of adult membership in a world community. We are called beyond parochialism to the care of society and the work of bringing Christ to an often reluctant world. With Jesus, in today's gospel, we move from baptism to the desert of testing, en route to our life work.

2nd Sunday of Lent

The belief that we are from God and ultimately have a home with God is a tremendously freeing concept. We need not search frantically for some final belonging here on earth, nor cling desperately to a certain place for fear we shall have no home in the end.

On the other hand, we aren't in Heaven yet, and like Peter, James, and John we find our heavenly experience brief. Even ecstatic prayer ends with the necessity of going back down the mountain and bringing the good news to the world.

Father Samuel Mazzuchelli, founder of the Sinsinawa Dominican sisters, said: "A Christian's native country is wherever God calls him or her." Some Christians choose to live in very unexpected places: in ghettos and slums, in the midst of violence, with strangers, in foreign countries and cultures. The irony — or perhaps the miracle — is that often the "alien" Christian is the one who creates a home for others: for the poor, the unemployed, the abandoned, the terminally ill, the alcoholic, the unwed mother. The homes thus created are not permanent dwellings, however, for always

they point to Jesus' promise "in my Father's house there are many mansions".

STAND FIRM IN THE LORD

Paul points to the core of our security when he reminds us all to "stand firm in the Lord" (Philippians 4:1b). Our God is God of both Heaven and earth and so we, too, are in both worlds. The tension between wanting to sink roots here and knowing we belong to Heaven is an appropriate one. It is only when we become so attached to earth that we forget Heaven, or so desirous of Heaven that we do no good on earth that we fail.

If we "stand firm in the Lord" our security lies in our relationship with God and not in a place. Wherever God is, we are at home.

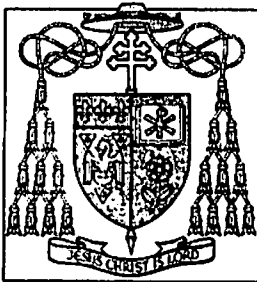

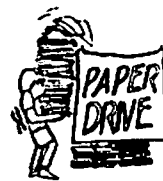

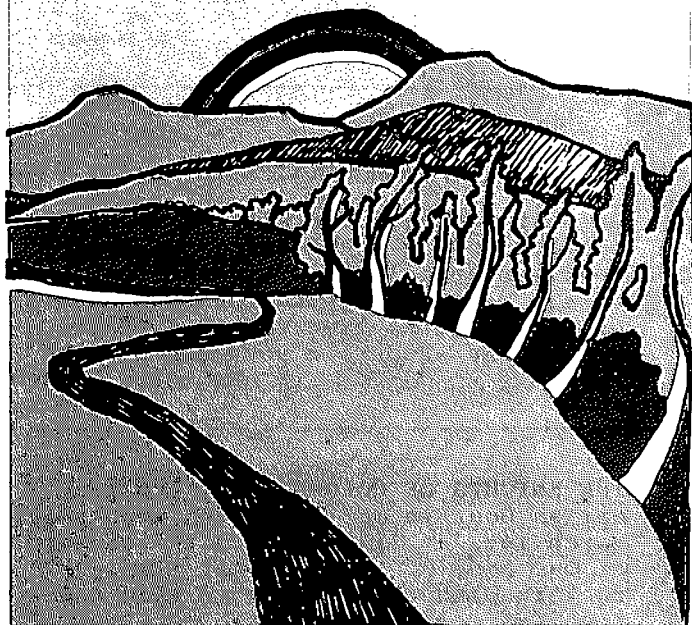

FEBRUARY 26, 1989 • 3rd Sunday of Lent

It is rather humorous that when God addresses Moses in today's first reading, Moses responds: "Here I am," as if God did not know. Sometimes we forget that God is everywhere. Sometimes we feel God has abandoned us; other times we feel that we have left God. "Here I am" Moses declares and we can almost hear God responding: "I know, I know and here I am. Did you forget that we are always together?"

The sin of the Israelites, and our sin, is forgetting that we are in this together with God. "Let anyone who thinks he is standing upright, watch out, lest he fall," Paul warns the Corinthians in today's second reading. There is a vigilance to faith. With our eyes opened, we can perceive God and come to trust God's faithful presence. Self-righteousness, rather than being a sign that we "have it all together," is a sign that perhaps we've lost what is most important.

PERHAPS IT WILL BEAR FRUIT

Jesus' parable in today's gospel is an interesting one. How would you judge the fig tree? Three seasons without fruit is a long time. On the other hand, perhaps it produced well for many seasons; perhaps the weather had effected it adversely or perhaps the vinedressers had not cared for it properly. We are not certain if the vineyard owner's order "Cut it down," was justified or not. We only know the vinedresser's plea was heard and the tree was spared. It would get some extra attention, some additional care, another chance.

The Lenten season is one of self-reflection. Perhaps we may discover that we have not borne much fruit lately. We may fear being judged or even "cut down." We are, however, our own vinedressers, capable of choosing to "hoe around and manure" in order to revitalize our faith. We can choose to make an extra effort to grow this Lent through the disciplines of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

As the commercial says: "You're worth it!" So is God.

Jesus was a master story teller. Today's parable was originally called: "The Prodigal Son." In more recent years it has been presented as: "The Forgiving Father," with a shift in emphasis to the unconditional love and acceptance shown by the father. It was, for Jesus' hearers, a shocking story. But no more shocking, one would suppose, than Jesus himself.

Jesus was the Messiah who would not be a worldly king and so shattered the expectations of political power for his followers. Jesus shocked people by being a person like them. Jesus shocked people by shunning power and position. Jesus shocked people, perhaps most of all, by choosing to befriend tax collectors and sinners as he did in today's gospel.

Did Jesus' hearers catch on to his message? Did they see any similarity between the story of the Prodigal Son and the fact that they had been criticizing Jesus for welcoming sinners?

The Prodigal Son parable has many messages for us this Lent: to recognize our sinfulness and return to God; to be forgiving toward those who return to us; to rejoice, as God rejoices, when sinners come home.

EVERYTHING I HAVE IS YOURS

Some people might identify with the Prodigal Son who walked out on those who loved him. Others might identify

with the forgiving father who accepted lovingly one who had deeply hurt him.

How many people identify with the elder son? How difficult it must have been to see a celebration for his ingrate brother! The father reassures him: "You are with me always and everything I have is yours." But was that enough?

We don't know how the story ended for the elder brother. Did he join the celebration? Did he sulk by himself that evening but later reconcile with his brother? Was he the next to leave, angrily declaring: "If that's how this household is run, I want no part of it!"

Forgiveness is not popular in our society. To "get back" at someone is acceptable; to exchange violence for violence is condoned.

Jesus tells us the story of the father and his two sons and asks that we not only seek forgiveness, but give forgiveness and rejoice when others are forgiven as well.

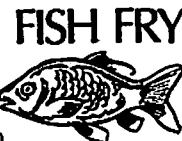

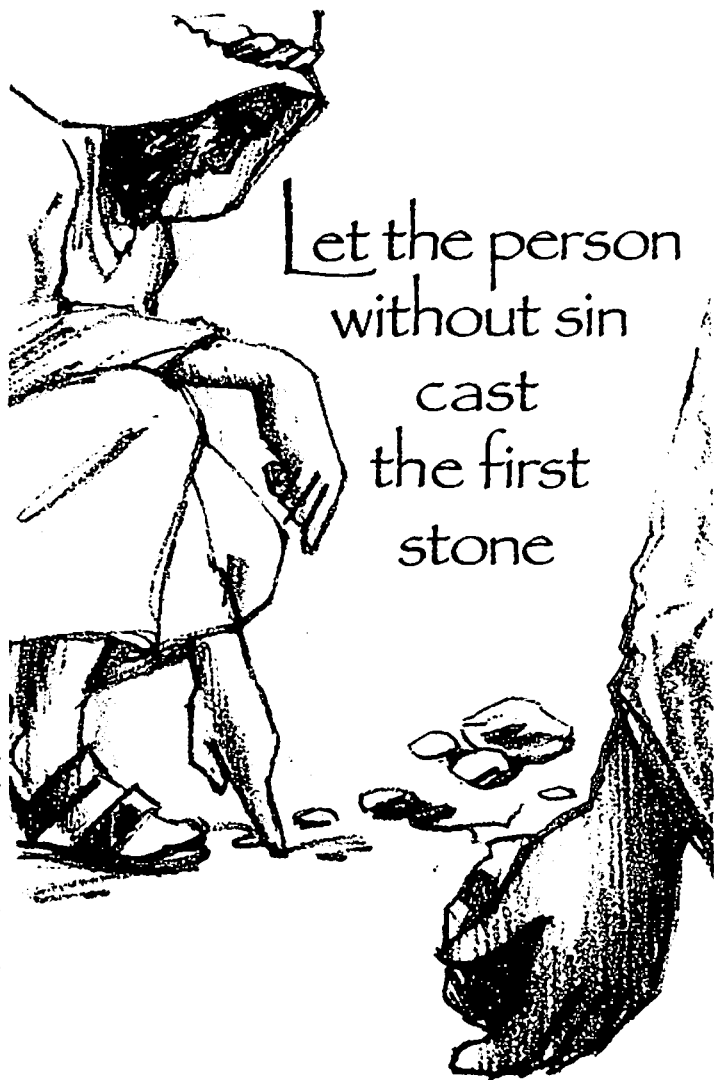

5th Sunday of Lent

It is difficult to imagine anyone publicly accused of serious sin in our world who would escape condemnation. The media is quick to uncover the sins of the famous, and those of us who are less renowned can count on family, friends, and neighbors to proclaim our wrongdoings.

Condemning other people is a popular sport because it takes the focus off of one's own sinfulness.

The Lenten season is a time to focus on our sinfulness, and on our need for repentance and conversion. Like the Scribes and Pharisees, we can get so caught up in judging others that we neglect our own spiritual growth.

Jesus stays with the woman who was caught in adultery. He has no harsh words of condemnation for her, only an invitation to a better life.

The story of the woman caught in adultery is a challenge to our human tendency to judge others. It is also a comfort as we acknowledge our own sinfulness for Jesus meets us with the same loving compassion with which he addressed the woman.

RACING TO GRASP THE PRIZE

In today's second reading, Paul speaks of his spiritual struggle as a race. Paul was well aware of his humanity and the fact that, even as a leader of the early Christian communities, he had not yet reached the finish line."

The beautiful expressions of Paul's desires "to know Christ and the power flowing from his resurrection...to know how to share in his sufferings" (Philippians 3:10) might reflect our own desires as we live this Lenten season.

Paul, like the woman caught in adultery, was a public sinner. He had a reputation for effectively persecuting the Christians before he saw the light on the road to Damascus and experienced conversion.

Human beings share the same lot in life: imperfection. No one has yet reached "the finish line" and so the struggle to grow, to be better, continues. Sometimes we fall and it is a temptation to give up the race, to count our failures as unforgivable, to limit the mercy of our loving God.

"I give no thought to what lies behind," Paul says, "but push on to what is ahead" (Philippians 3:13b.) The hopefulness of this Lent lies in our ability to do the same: to accept God's forgiveness and get on with the race toward Heaven.

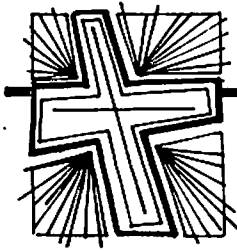

MARCH 19, 1989 • Passion (Palm) Sunday

Christians who follow Jesus know that his triumphal entry into Jerusalem was fleeting glory. The memory of the "Hosannas" ringing through the streets was soon replaced by the taunts of the crowd as Jesus made his way to Calvary.

The Christian's allegiance to Jesus can sometimes be fickle too. It is easier to follow the triumphant Jesus of Palm Sunday than to make our way to Calvary with him.

Christians, like Jesus, are those "who come in the name of the Lord." Sometimes he who comes in the name of the Lord is welcomed and honored. Sometimes the one who comes in the name of the Lord is mocked, betrayed, and rejected.

Following Jesus and trying to live as he lived will bring its Palm Sunday moments and its Good Fridays as well. To be faithful to Jesus means accepting both and in that acceptance of both joy and pain we know that ultimately the victory of Easter will be ours. The joy of Palm Sunday is only a shadow of the joy of Resurrection and eternal life.

WHAT WRONG IS THIS MAN GUILTY OF?

Today's gospel is Luke's account of the Passion. One cannot help but be struck by the weakness of Pilate who finds no guilt in Jesus, yet succumbs to the

crowd's desire for his death.

Christians all over the world and through the centuries have been persecuted and put to death though they were not guilty of any crime. Jesus' message of God's love for all people, his message of forgiveness, of peace, justice, and equality has yet to obtain global acceptance — or even consistent, fruitful acceptance in the hearts of his followers.

Jesus' message of God's love and forgiveness is more readily accepted than its corollary: that we are to love and forgive one another. People sometimes find Jesus guilty of challenging them too much.

Which of the crowd who shared in Jesus' glorious entry into Jerusalem still stood by him when he was condemned? Was the moment of shared glory enough to keep them faithful through the horrors of Calvary?

And is our knowledge of Palm Sunday and Easter enough to keep us engaged in the struggle to be faithful disciples? That is something only we can answer.

On the third day he shall arise!

MARCH 26, 1989 • Easter Sunday

Early in the morning of the day after the Sabbath, the realization dawns — the tomb of Jesus is open, and he is no longer to be found there. In an Easter story in which understanding brightens along with the morning light, we hear about Mary Magdalene's report of the stone at the door of the tomb having been rolled back. This strange, very unsettling item of news is confirmed by Peter and the Beloved Disciple, who actually enter

into the tomb.

But where is the Christ? As we hear in Peter's sermon to Cornelius' household, he is risen. They will find him, it turns out, in the upper room among the gathered disciples.

In the upper room they will discover that the new, risen body of Christ displays unprecedented freedom, as if it were under the complete control of the mind and the spirit of Jesus.

But the old solid, stolid body had its uses, too. It could be depended upon not to move about too quickly. Where his body was, so was Jesus' spirit. And where Jesus was, so was God, who comes to us with an offer of healing renewal.

For them, God's love was here, like the "you are here" of the maps in the mall, the museum, and the metro.

But now the Christ is risen, and we, the community of the faithful, are the bodily sign of his presence. The Christ is here. We, the Church, are the sacrament of the Risen Christ. We are, says Paul, the Body of Christ. The Church is sacramental in its deepest nature, and that nature is given concentrated expression in those seven formal moments of the particular sacraments.

But the seven signs do not exhaust the sacramental reality of the Body of Christ. It is always sacramental. As members of his Body, each of us has a sacramental vocation. We are called to be sacraments of the Risen Christ, to witness to that resurrection presence as did Peter himself, by our words, by our generous and compassionate actions, by our very life of faith.

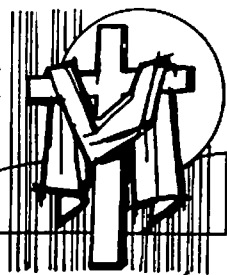
