Today's first reading from Acts is filled with contradictions. Though it says that people held the Apostles in "great esteem," yet it also says that "no one else dared to join them." Still, the reading goes on to declare: "More and more believers, men and women in great numbers, were continually added to the Lord" (Acts 5:14).

The Apostles were, it seems, admired from a distance, sought for their cures, joined by some and avoided by others. The lot of the committed Christian today is not much different. We are attracted to people who are good. Somewhere deep inside is that desire to find what is good, what is God-like. Those who give themselves in service to the sick and the homeless, those who stand up for justice and peace in spite of personal risk can awaken in us the desire to make a difference. We can, of course, let the urge pass, or rationalize our lack of commitment with cynicism or self-protection.

The invitation is always before us, however, as clearly as it was at Solomon's Portico. "Come, join us; believe." There are cures to be effected, signs and wonders to be accomplished today in our world by us.

### WRITE WHAT YOU SEE

In the reading from Revelation, John shares his vi-

sion. Indeed, he did write it down so that future generations of Christians might learn from it.

Those who witnessed the ministry of the Apostles also wrote down what they had seen; the signs and wonders, the growth of the community, the faith of the believers who followed Jesus.

The Evangelist wrote down his account of the appearance of the Risen Christ so that future Christians might know of Jesus' victory over death and be strengthened, as the Apostles were, to carry on Jesus' work.

"Write on a scroll what you now see," (Revelation 1:11a) the voice told John. Christians today "write down" what they see as well and witness to the Lord's presence in our world.

We write too, about the Lord, about our faith and our convictions. Sometimes we write on paper, but the indelible message we give is written with our lives.



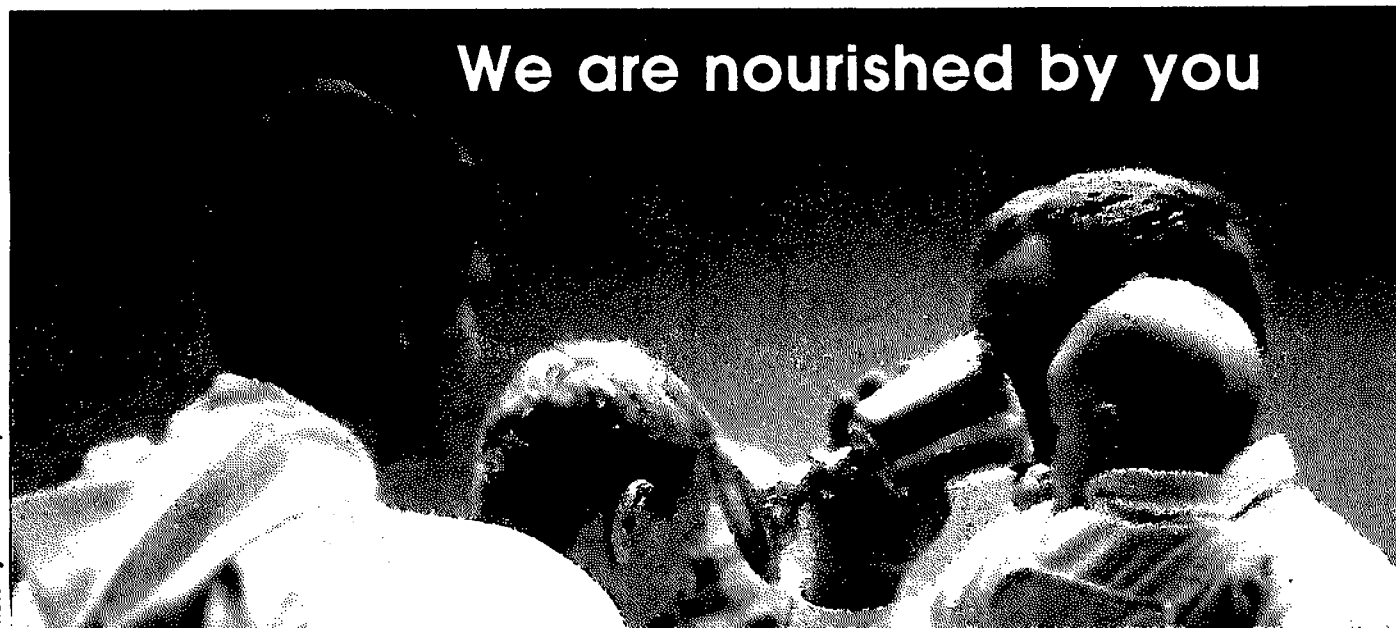

## A reflection on vocation as sacrament

It seems entirely human that the Apostles should return to fishing after the Easter events, as if nothing had happened. Yet, of course, something had, and in a way that would permanently alter their lives. The prediction at the Last Supper of Peter's three-fold denial and the memory of their own desertion of Jesus were still on their minds when they came to share a morning meal with the resurrected Christ.

As in Luke's story of the Emmaus journey, the Easter recognition of Jesus includes the meal. But here there is more. The meal experience issues forth in a Call, a vocation for Peter as "pastor" — Shepherd of the Lord's sheep. It involves repentance as well. Surely Peter is the patron of those called out of their inadequate selves into a world much larger than they could have imagined. God's confidence in us is much greater than our own.

Peter — the "Rock" who walks on the water with the buoyancy of a stone is the one entrusted with the Keys. He escapes unscathed from an unlocked prison in Acts 12, only to find himself locked out of a disciple's house. He denied Christ three times, and yet swims impulsively to shore in today's gospel — only to find his love questioned three times, to his dismay.

We are like Peter, responding to and backing off from God's call. We are eager to believe that we are capable of handling matters of great moment, and deeply disappointed at the first sign that it may not be so easy. And yet, with the proper assurance, we find we can succeed.

Yet we are not the same as Peter. Each of us is called to a different part. The eucharistic liturgy is a celebration of the Body of Christ, with its many members, each of them indispensable. The architecture of the liturgy is such that it displays the mutual relations of the Body. In the liturgy we see the "organism" of the community in action. We take our parts within the eucharistic rite in ways similar to the parts we assume in our networked Christian lives.

In the eucharist we exercise our calling, as part of a larger meaning, a larger call. And in the liturgy we give expression to our conviction that we are called forth by the Risen Christ, to witness to the world that he is alive and well, working his changes through us.

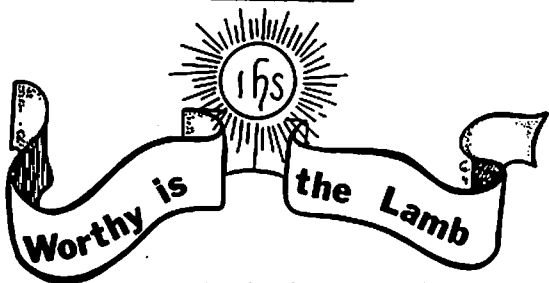

# I am the Good Shepherd



We are so familiar with Jesus' title "the Lamb of God" that we no longer stop to think, perhaps, of the implications of God's Son being a lamb.

A lamb is a young sheep, one of the flock, sharing the same life with the other sheep. A lamb is also the choicest for slaughter, being both the most tender for a meal and the favored sacrificial offering.

Jesus, the Lamb of God, became one of us through his Incarnation. He accepted his role as God's Lamb, willing to be the one chosen for sacrifice so that the other sheep might be spared.

In today's reading from the book of Revelation, the Lamb stands victorious in John's vision. Jesus, the Lamb of God who became one of us to save us, now shares the throne with God; and "the Lamb on the throne will shepherd" (Revelation 7:17a) those who believe in him.

How blessed are we to be "the sheep of his flock!"

## A LIGHT TO THE NATIONS

If Jesus is the Lamb and we are his sheep, what does it mean for us to be a "light to the nations?"

(Acts 13:47)? Our own acceptance of our dependence on the Lamb can be a beacon to those who flounder in their imagined self-sufficiency; our acceptance of our "sheepish" limitations and our struggle to overcome selfishness can shine for those who feign perfection. We can be a "light to the nations" when we spread the good news of Jesus as Paul and Barnabas did.

Paul and Barnabas, as today's reading from Acts details, did not have an easy time of it. They were met with jealousy by those who wanted sole possession of the good news; they met with "violent abuse" and even persecution and expulsion. Undaunted, Paul and Barnabas went to another town to bring the gospel.

Amazingly, the account of their trials ends with the line: "Their disciples knew only how to be filled with joy and the Holy Spirit" (Acts 13:52). Our nations anxiously await that kind of light!

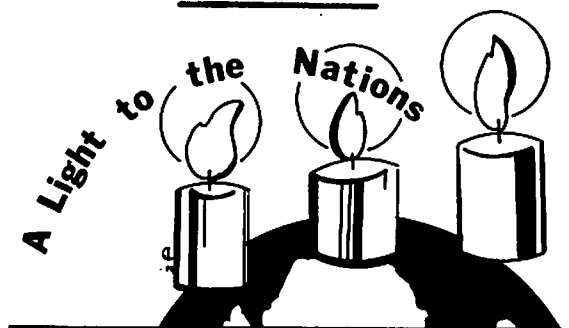

# They Know Us By Our Love

APRIL 23, 1989 • 5th Sunday of Easter

How well Paul and Barnabas must have grasped Jesus' command to "love one another" (John 13:34a) to realize that such love would mean trials.

Their lives as preachers of the good news were far from easy. Anyone whose business calls for frequent travel and relocation knows the loneliness and insecurity of life-on-the-road. Paul and Barnabas were traveling salesmen for Jesus, willing to endure the hardships out of love for Jesus and their fellow human beings. They were willing not just to give the folks one chance at hearing the good news and then leave them on their own. They traveled back again to "give their disciples reassurances, and encouraged them." (Acts 14:22a).

Paul and Barnabas understood that to love as Jesus loved requires commitment and the kind of faithfulness which does not leave people to fend for themselves, but returns to affirm and support.

As Jesus was patient with his disciples, so his disciples were patient with the new believers who heard the good news. "Ah," Jesus must have said, "they got the message."

## I MAKE ALL THINGS NEW

Jesus gave a "new commandment"; John's vision finds the One who sits on the throne saying: "See, I make all

things new!" (Revelation 21:5).

The word new, like the word love, is subject to a variety of interpretations. For some, like those who rejected Jesus, "new" was not good. They preferred the "old ways" of understanding God and of relating to one's neighbor. They favored their old expectations of the Messiah over the new reality of Jesus. There is a comfortableness to "the old."

For other people, newness is desirable; in fact, only what is new is desirable and they therefore reject all that is not new. Frequently they disassociate themselves from all tradition and roots, and their "new ways" are without foundation.

Jesus' "new commandment" was firmly grounded in the history of God and God's people. It stretches us to further understanding of love.

As John's vision looks into the future, it is the same God that his ancestors worshipped who declares: "See, I make all things new!"

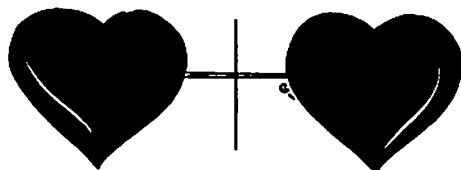

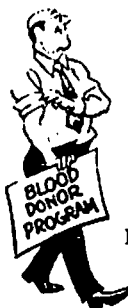

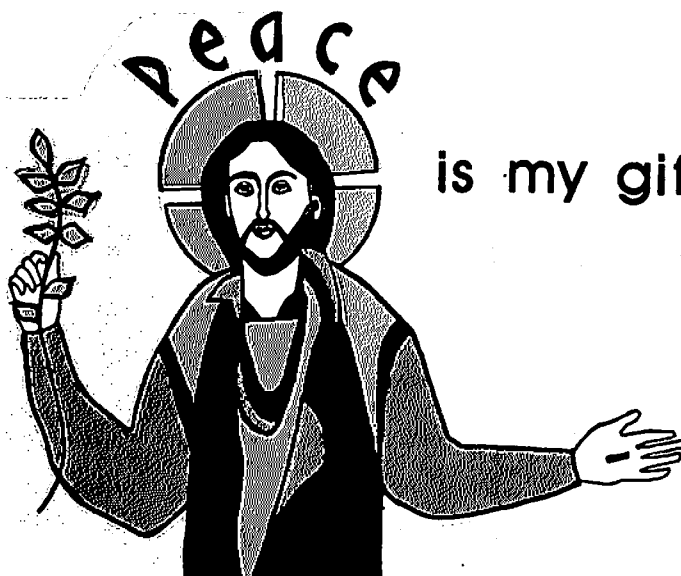

is my gift to you

**APRIL 30, 1989**  
**6th Sunday of Easter**

It was not long after Jesus' farewell in today's gospel reading that the events from the first reading took place. Jesus' example of love, his call to a personal relationship with our loving God, his gift of peace had already been dimmed. There was "dissension and much controversy" (Acts 15:2a) among Jesus' followers. And it revolved around not how to love more effectively but around fine points of Jewish practice.

But Jesus' promise was true, "the Holy Spirit will instruct you in everything and remind you of all that I told you" (John 14:26). "It is the decision of the Holy Spirit" (Acts 15:28a). They proclaim to end the dispute and send a message of acceptance to the Gentiles who wished to become disciples.

We can take comfort in the fact that, so soon after Jesus' death, his followers found it difficult to remember his words. We can take heart because the same Spirit which redirected them is Jesus' gift to us as well.

### THE GLORY OF GOD GAVE IT LIGHT

Jesus was continually inviting people into a personal relationship with God. While he respected

ritual and himself worshipped in the temple, he tried to make the people understand that religion is a heart-trip, not a head-trip, and that external observances alone do not make people good.

John's vision in today's reading from Revelation reiterates what Jesus said all along; it is God who is our temple and when we are finally with God we will no longer need buildings. Such a vision of the future should enable us to keep our priorities straight today.

Ultimately, there will be no rituals, no rules, nor temples, nor churches. There will be, in the Kingdom, only people and God. It will not matter then whether we worshipped in a beautiful basilica or a multi-purpose building with folding chairs. It will matter only that we did, indeed, worship. And that we loved those who worshipped with us.

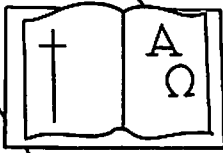



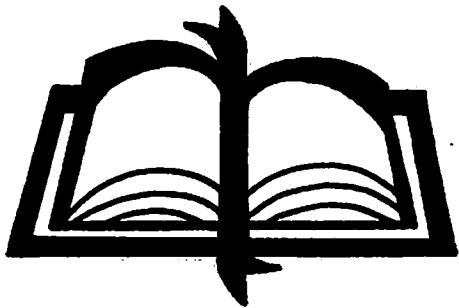

Anyone who has been involved in the ecumenical movement knows the tremendous joy of Christian unity and the pain of division as well. The "complete unity" for which Jesus prayed is far from reality. Beyond doctrinal differences and ritual regulations, person-to-person relationships and community interactions are sometimes scandalous among those who profess the same Lord.

Jesus' prayer in today's gospel says that it is through the unity of his followers that "the world will know that God sent him."

What messages would the world hear more clearly if Christians spoke with one voice? Would "love one another" ring more true if Christians loved each other? Would the mandate of "peace on earth" be better carried out if Christians did not war against each other? Would our neighborhoods and businesses know greater truth and justice if Christians were honest and fair with each other?

Surely our combined words and actions would have greater impact than lone voices preaching what they fail to live. Surely the reign of God would be more real if those who profess "one Lord, one faith, one baptism" stood together, prayed together, and worked for

the Kingdom as a team rather than as rivals.

### COME, LORD JESUS

The unity for which Jesus prayed, the unity for which we long, is only possible because of Jesus. Jesus, Son of God and perfect human being, claimed his unity with each and all of us through his Incarnation.

Jesus taught us how to say "we" in a world divided into "them and us." Uniting himself with sinners, outcasts, lepers, tax collectors, and fishermen, Jesus declared the right of everyone to call God: "Our Father."

"I do not pray for my disciples alone," Jesus began his prayer, "I pray also for those who will believe in me through their word" (John 17:20). The task of today's Christian disciples is clear, and it is equally clear that task can only be accomplished with Jesus' help.

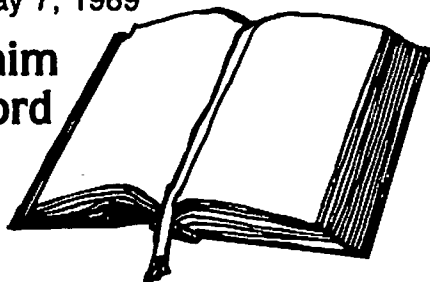

## A reflection on vocation as sacrament

Sacraments are signs.

Signs to whom?

Signs are for seeing, if they are working properly. They tend to be posted in prominent places. Can we call something a sign, if no one is able to see it?

An aspect of sacraments in their nature as signs is their work of witnessing. In the sacraments we say something to each other and to ourselves. And we also give signals to the larger world.

The seven sacraments are grounded in the nature of the Church itself as "sacrament." The Christian community is a living sign to the world around us. "See how these Christians love one another."

We are sacraments. We are living witnesses of the Risen Christ. In other words, we give evidence of something operating in our lives which is mysterious and beyond explaining in ordinary terms.

By baptism we are called into a witnessing community. The gift of the Holy Spirit summons us to being living signs. The Spirit is the life of the Church as a family.

Just as each family, by honoring Mom on Mother's Day, takes a moment to celebrate its unique family spirit, so the Church, in celebrating its "birthday" on Pentecost, reflects upon itself.

## THE SIGN OF PENTECOST

When the Apostles left the upper room after the Pentecost event, it was clear to the people of many nations, gathered for the Jewish feastday, that something was different—even wrong—about this group that suddenly could speak in different languages.

Peter explained that the Apostles belonged to a community that witnessed to the Resurrection of Jesus of Nazareth, the Christ, who said: "You will be my witnesses...to the ends of the earth" (Acts 1:8).

After Pentecost, the Apostles were no longer afraid because God's Holy Spirit was alive among them. It is this gift of the Spirit which inaugurates the Church, impelling the community to begin preaching the Word.

Pentecost brought about a change in the first Christian community which in turn brought about a change in the

world. This community, now empowered to evoke belief in Jesus, became a sign of the Risen Christ.

As Christians, we, too, are called to be signs of Christ to others.

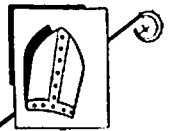

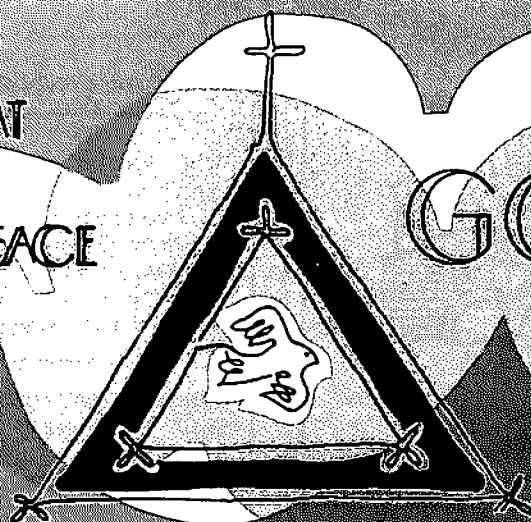

There is a quotation which appears on many posters and cards which says: "Be patient, God isn't finished with me yet." We plead for patience from those who love us as we struggle with our failures and shortcomings. Today's readings call us to be patient with ourselves.

In the first reading from Proverbs, Wisdom claims "I was his delight day by day." We, too, are the Lord's delight "day by day," as, like a parent, he watches us grow, mature, fall and rise again.

Paul's Letter to the Romans likewise affirms our patience with imperfection. "We even boast of our afflictions," Paul writes, and we can boast because our afflictions, our limitations, lead us to trust God.

Jesus' message to his disciples is patient and understanding of human nature. Although he knew his time with them was brief, Jesus did not try to cram all the truth into his followers at once. And yet, while knowing they needed time in order to be ready, Jesus did not give up on them. "I know you are not ready now, but when you are ready for more truth, my Spirit will be with you to guide you." If only Jesus' followers today had the same patience

with one another — and with themselves!

### HOPE

Trinity Sunday is a triple celebration of the hope which our faith brings: we can hope because we were created by a loving God; we can hope because God's own son came to share our humanity, to show us how to live, to make real the promise of eternal life; we can hope because God's Spirit dwells with us and within us, continually guiding us that we might know greater love and more lasting happiness.

God does not expect us to be able to bear "all the truth" at once nor to be without affliction. Our humanity is holy because God is God-with-us and we hope, not in ourselves, but in God who is always there for us.

## MAY 28, 1989 • The Body and Blood of Christ

Today's readings all echo a theme of giving thanks to God. In the first reading, Melchizedek blesses Abram and offers thanks to God. In Paul's Letter to the Corinthians, he writes about the Last Supper and how Jesus gave thanks before giving the disciples his body and blood. In the gospel account of the feeding of the crowd, Jesus "raised his eyes to heaven, pronounced a blessing" and then fed the people. God is acknowledged as integral to the relationships and the miracles which occur.

We celebrate the solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. We are aware of the gift of Jesus' life, death and Resurrection; aware of the gift of Jesus' presence in the eucharist to nourish and sustain us in faith and loving service; aware of the gift of our belonging to the Body of Christ, the Church, and the support which we receive from all its members.

Like Melchizedek and like Jesus, Christians today lift their eyes to heaven and, first of all, give thanks for we are indeed well-nourished and richly blessed.

## DO THIS IN REMEMBRANCE OF ME

As Jesus offered his body and blood to his disciples at the Last Supper, he said: "Do this in remembrance of me." Some people look upon those words and apply them only to the celebration of the Mass.

If Christians gather and celebrate the eucharist in remembrance of Jesus, the power of his memory necessarily extends beyond the ritual. In today's gospel, Jesus "spoke to the crowds of the reign of God, and he healed all who were in need of healing" (Luke 9:11). Then he fed their hunger. The Jesus who is remembered at the eucharist is one who responded to people's needs, who cared about them, who forgave them, who laid down his life that they might live. "Do this in memory of me, for you are the Body of Christ."

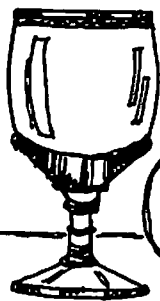



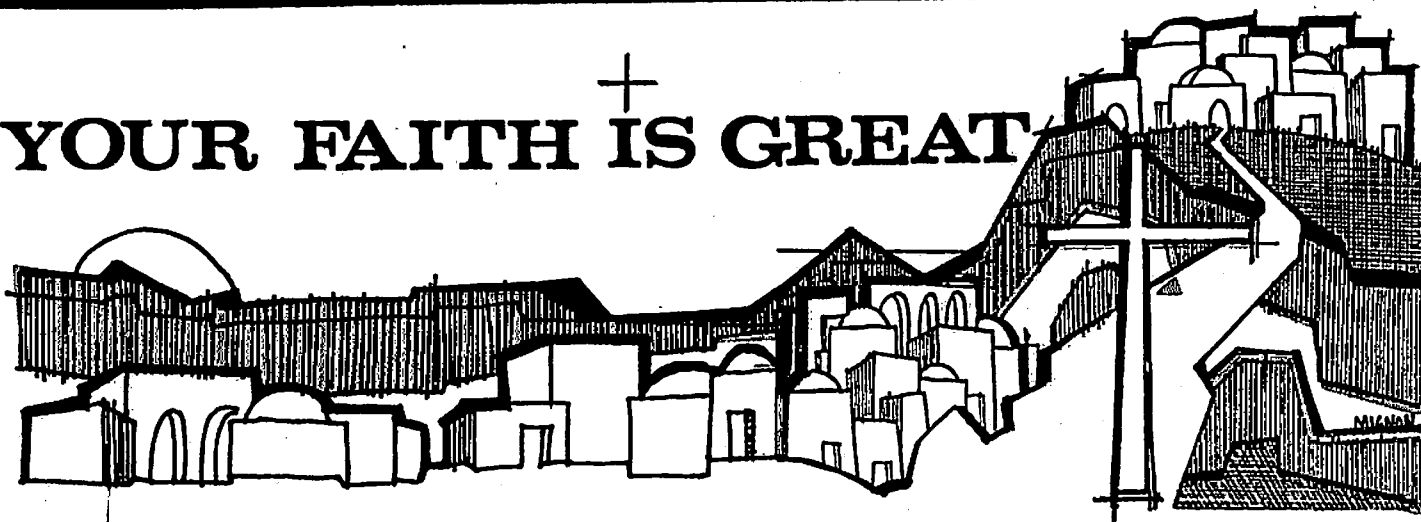

# YOUR FAITH IS GREAT



**JUNE 4, 1989 • 9th Sunday in Ordinary Time**

In spite of the fact that Jesus was a good and faithful Jew, he did have a most unacceptable view of non-Jews. He loved them and he proclaimed them equal in God's sight.

The centurion in today's gospel was apparently a "good guy," as centurions go. It was the Jewish elders who first approached Jesus and asked that he help the centurion, saying: "He deserves this favor from you because he loves our people" (Luke 7:5a). Besides being kind to the Jewish people under his guard, he was a man concerned about a servant who was ill.

The interaction between the centurion and Jesus — or rather the lack of it — is a lesson for us. Unlike those, who seek a favor from the Lord and attempt to "earn it" by saying the right prayers in the right places the right number of times, the centurion simply sends others to Jesus. Their message is simple: "My servant is ill. I believe you can cure him."

There is no need for the centurion to speak to Jesus himself or for Jesus to go to the centurion's house and lay hands on the servant and say prescribed prayers.

Jesus was amazed by the faith of the foreigner.

And because of this faith the foreigner's servant is cured.

## LOVE YOUR ENEMIES

How many people would be willing to ask the question which Paul asks of the Galatians: "Whom would you say that I am trying to please?"

Peer pressure exists for people no matter what their age, and there is always the temptation to do what is popular and acceptable. The gospel is difficult to live by, especially when it comes to its message about foreigners (there are none) and its message about enemies (Pray for them; love them; forgive them).

Solomon prayed for the foreigner; Jesus cured the foreigner's servant. "If anyone preaches a gospel to you other than the one you received, let a curse be upon him" (Galatians 1:9).

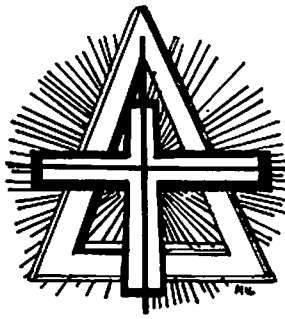

# Joined in love

June. The month of brides and weddings. Can this bride be the little girl we watched growing up? And can this groom be the responsible adult he appears to be? Surely it was just yesterday she was a school girl with braces on her teeth. And wasn't he delivering our newspaper? Did they ever suspect that they would be bonded together in this way?

Weddings are social events of the first order. And they connect old families just as certainly as they create new ones, as monarchies have known for eons. In this alliance of two families, multiplied by the number of weddings that take place, we have an image of the ties that knot together our social fabric, since marriages take place in a world of mutual carings and reciprocal exchanges. Matrimony is a vocation to shaping a place in that world. It is a call to the creation of a new home, a new center within the constellation of centers that make up a human community.

## A MINIATURE SOCIETY

It is true that we commonly speak of careers as vocations, and this is frequently accurate enough. We often meet people whose work is a life calling. And yet marriage has traditionally held a special name as a vocation for good reasons. As a microcosm of society, it is both broader and deeper than our work.

Consider the competitive character of the job market. All too often it sets the terms of working life.

In contrast, families in good working order offer a security and place that does not calculate, that accepts and honors its own without question. We call it home, and we can only name its foundation as love.

Home is the celebration of human worth and supporting relationships which is the unspoken rejoicing at the heart of weddings. We find here a Christian model for all of society, which is perhaps one reason matrimony is a sacrament.

The widows in today's scripture readings make their own testimony to this matter. Bereft of husbands, and therefore of the usual family supports, they belong to the widespread biblical theme of "the widow and orphan," first sounded at Exodus 22:20-26. Here we see how God expects the larger Israelite society to act as "family" for its more vulnerable members.

In our marriages, in our family lives, we are called to keep alive these possibilities of more human ways of being together.



# Because of your Love you are forgiven

In the gospel, Simon observes Jesus accepting the attention of the sinful woman. He questions whether Jesus can be a prophet since Jesus apparently does not know "what sort of woman this is." Jesus, however, knows far more than what Simon observes about the woman. Jesus knows not only her sinfulness but her great love as well. And Jesus responds, not to Simon's verbal objections, but to his unspoken criticism. Here, indeed, is a prophet who knows our thoughts and sinfulness, but knows our goodness, too.

People frequently judge each other by externals, just as Simon did. They categorize each other, and, having been categorized, they can do little to escape. The woman in the gospel was "known in the town to be a sinner." Her gestures to Jesus of love and humility were, therefore, overlooked by Simon. A sinner can, apparently, do no good.

Jesus sees things differently. He points out the goodness of the woman and appreciates her love in spite of her failures. Likewise, Jesus knows we are all sinners, but he loves us anyway.

## GOD'S GRACIOUS GIFT

Paul gives tribute to "the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me" (Galatians 2:20). Paul, who once persecuted Christians, boasts of his faith in Jesus. How grateful he must have been for the gift of forgiveness! The God who called Paul saw beyond his sinfulness, saw one who loved God passionately, if misguidedly, and redirected his efforts.

For humans, forgiveness is as difficult today as it was in the time of the story of David; it is as hard as it was in the time of Simon. Humans cannot see beyond externals and it is so easy to become the judge of others.

Jesus' example calls us to look beyond externals, to find the goodness in each person, to forgive. Then "God's gracious gift" of the Son will not have been, as Paul says, pointless.

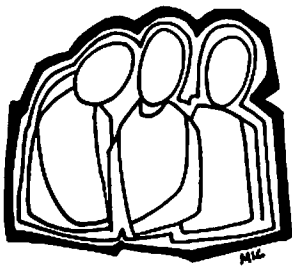

Jesus' revelation to his disciples in today's gospel was shocking. Little by little this promised Messiah was undoing the image which they had of him. The Israelites hoped for a political leader, a military hero, one who would lead them to victory over those who had vanquished them in the past.

Gradually, Jesus remade their image of Messiah: he gently but firmly dashed their false hopes in order to fulfill their deepest needs. And they followed him.

Today's words from Jesus were difficult to accept on many levels. First, not only was the Messiah not an earthly conqueror, but it sounded as if he would be conquered.

Secondly, Jesus was their friend and it had to be painful to hear this friend speak of having to suffer and die.

Thirdly, Jesus changed their image of themselves as disciples. They would have to deny themselves, carry their cross, and lose their lives. Yet they followed him.

## WHOEVER LOSES LIFE WILL SAVE IT

Perhaps the disciples should have better prepared for Jesus' words in today's gospel. There were hints of

the suffering Messiah in the Hebrew Scriptures. Today's first reading speaks of "him whom they would thrust through"; there are the Suffering Servant Songs of Isaiah, too.

The lives of the prophets often ended badly; why would they expect better for Jesus, especially with his radical message of God's love and forgiveness for all people?

Certainly, the disciples could be excused for not quite understanding what their following of Jesus would mean. There was no precedent for being a disciple of God Incarnate. Slowly, Jesus had to spell it out through words and example. Self-denial, taking up one's cross, losing one's life are difficult commands to follow. Yet, Jesus' disciples followed him.

We know who the Messiah is; we have heard what it means to be a disciple. We are, as Paul says: "one in Christ Jesus" and that is not always easy.

Will it someday be written of us: "And they followed him?"

Simon (Peter) the poor fisherman, and Saul (Paul), the learned Pharisee and Roman citizen, are interesting studies in contrast but together they formulated the fundamental meaning of the gospel and supplied guidance and direction to the early Church. There is an ancient tradition that they were both martyred sometime during the reign of Nero (54-68 A.D.).

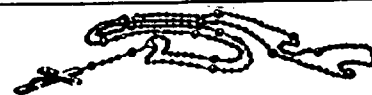
