

Whether one is gifted with spontaneity or cautiousness, the call of Jesus means, as Paul reminds us, "called to live in freedom." Yet, as Paul goes on to say, our freedom is not a reckless irresponsibility, but a freedom of spirit which enables us to respond to our neighbors in need. Christians, unfettered by goals of power, position, and possessions, can be available on a moment's notice to attend to those who hurt.

The Christian is free, too, to be cautious and wise, knowing that Jesus calls us to be faithful to our responsibilities and not to escape our commitments under the guise of "someone else needs me."

I WILL BE YOUR FOLLOWER

Today's gospel calls are interesting ones. The first man, with apparently no verbal invitation from Jesus, says: "I will be your follower wherever you go" (Luke 9:57b). One can imagine such a declaration being made with wholehearted enthusiasm. What prompted the man to want to follow lesus?

lesus' response is a simple statement of his own pilgrim status: "the Son of Man has nowhere to lay his head" (Lk. 9:58a). One can almost hear Jesus' message between the lines: "Are you sure you know what you're in for as my disciple? Are you certain you want to follow me?"

In the second call in today's gospel, Jesus issues a clear unqualified: "Come follow me" (Lk. 9:59a). The man hesitates. "Let me bury my father first" (Lk. 9:59b). Was his father dead? Or was the man saying: "When my father dies, then I'll follow you"?

The third man seems to combine both eagerness and hesitation in his response. "I'll come, but let me say goodbye."

We are all, in our response to Jesus' call, a combination of spontaneity and caution, dedication and fickleness, immediacy and delay.

We are not told if the three men in today's gospel ultimately followed Jesus or not; if upon consideration they dropped everything right then, or if they came later, or never. We only know for sure what our response to Jesus is.

MISSIONARY COOPERATIVE APPEAL

At all the Masses this weekend a priest from the Mill Hill/Missionaries will speak to us to tell about their work in the Diocese of Basankusu, Zaire. Basankusu has a total population of 276,000 people and 45% of them are Catholic. There are 9 native priests who together with a handful of missionaries, cover a 700-mile area bringing the Word of God to their people. There is a Catechetical Center which provides a place for retreats, marriage counseling, recollection and youth counseling and guidance. The people attending are asked to give what they can but what they give is not nearly enough to keep it in operation. Funds are needed to support the Center, keep the youth movement going and to assist our 6 pastoral people who travel through the Diocese giving sessions to the people.

Hello,

As usual a million things are going on here. as much as I get done, there's so much more I just don't have time to do. I guess I have to be satisfied with not being satisfied. When I look at all I've done, it's hard to believe it's been less than two years. I am comfortable with what I've accomplished.

Today was the Marshall Islands (public) high school entrance test. My students thought it was extremely easy. More passed the test for Xavier and public high school this year. I'm sure they did well on the Assumption test too. This has been a great class to teach. They're not perfect, but I enjoyed working (and playing) with them.

This week I got a package of letters from St. Angela students to our kids. Many were responses to letter I had these kids write. They were thrilled to get the letters and pictures.

I guess you're wondering what I decided about the possibility of extending with JIV. I made the difficult decision that two years on Ebeye is enough and it's time to move on. That doesn't mean I'll be home soon. I'm going to be teaching at Assumption High School in Majuro, once again starting a new JIV placement. Half of the Ebeye students there will have been my former students here. It will be interesting to continue watching them grow. So I'll see y'all in the summer of 1990. Love.

a reflection on vocation as sacrament


We communicate with one another in signs and symbols — and in no other way. It is through signs that we understand or misinterpret. It is because we communicate by signs that we can tell the truth or tell a lie.

Our primary symbol-system is language, spoken or written. In addition we manage a vast array of gestures and graphics. The words and visual images of this bulletin are one example. We constantly interpret signs in the weather or symptoms of disease. And in those major moments of human communication which we call art and literature, we deal in large common symbols.

Look at the main figures in today's scripture readings: Isaiah builds his message around the image of a mother's nurturing

milk; Paul takes as his guiding image the Cross of his missionary struggles that have marked his body, which he contrasts to the scars of circumcision. Luke gives us the symbol of the disciple's journey, including the striking image of knocking the dust off one's sandals when rejected from inhospitable towns.

The unashamed "bodiliness." of these images is a clue to appreciating signs. We communicate through signs because we are bodily beings. We make contact. We get in touch with one another.

We are not minds captured in mechanical machines. We are expressive beings from head to foot. Successful liars know; their eyes, hands or posture can give them away.

A HUMAN LITURGY

Our sacramental worship is bodily. It is a fully human style of worship. It engages more than merely our minds. The signs of sacrament include healing oil, cleansing and life-sustaining water, food and drink. Each of these has a primary role in maintaining bodily health. In our genuflections, processions, standing and kneeling, we enlist our very posture in the act of worship.

These are among the reasons that the call to worship in sacrament means a call to clarity and honesty in our liturgical signs and symbols. They are simply too important to treat as trivial. At stake is our shared communication, our prayer with God. And with this, our life of faith.


The meeting begins at 9:30am and the Mass at 10:30.



The Incarnation, for all its theological and spiritual definitions, was also the end of all loopholes. Before lesus came, it might have been conceivable that people could be ignorant of God's command; it was certainly true that people were ignorant of who their neighbor was.

Jesus dispelled all doubts about God's commands, and answered clearly with his teachings and his life the question: "Who is my neighbor?"

Was Jesus killed because he closed the loopholes? Did people want so desperately to escape God's command of love that they could not tolerate the clarity of Jesus' message?

Jesus is the unconditional love of God for all people. Jesus names everyone as neighbor: tax collectors. prostitutes, fishermen, outcasts. He excluded no one from his love, his forgiveness, his healing and concern.

To have the definition of neighbor expanded to include those whom one finds difficult to love is not easy. To act on that expanded view of neighbor is even more difficult.

THEN GO AND DO THE SAME

Jesus' story of the Good Samaritan was a shocking example of neighborliness. Not only was the victim passed over by his neighbors, he was tended to by an outright enemy!

Jesus asks the lawyer: "Which of these three, in your opinion, was neighbor to the man who fell in with the robbers" (Luke 10:36)? The lawyer responds: "The one who treated him with compassion" (Lk.

Simply and clearly, Jesus gives the final word: "Then go and do the same" (Lk. 10:37b). Go and treat all people — even your perceived enemies — with compassion. Jesus leaves no room for loopholes, no chance to object with ifs or buts, no opportunity for his hearers to say: "I don't know what you mean. I don't know what I am supposed to do."

The bad news is that no one can claim ignorance any longer, either of God's command of love or how to live out that law.

The good news is that for those who truly want to be disciples of Jesus, the way is clear. And we do not walk alone.



Do not be troubled.

In today's first reading, Abraham and Sarah were a great hospitality committee. Abraham spotted the guests, welcomed them and invited them to clean up, to rest, to have something to eat. It was Abraham's wife, Sarah, who prepared the rolls upon his request.

Can you imagine how the story would have gone if Abraham and Sarah resented each other?

"Abraham," Sarah might have said, "get in here and help me clean this tent. All you do is sit around outside." They could have missed the strangers if it

had happened that way.

"Sarah, I'm sick of being the one to sit out here in the heat. You keep watch," Abraham might have said, and as they bickered over their roles, the strangers passed by unnoticed.

Happily, Abraham and Sarah were at peace in their relationship and so their gifts worked together and the story ends with the promise of their family having a child.

APPRECIATING DIFFERENCES

Paul had a wonderful sense of the interconnectedness of the followers of Jesus. In today's second reading he speaks of how his sufferings are connected to Jesus' suffering and elsewhere he speaks of Christians as one body, each member needing the other.

In today's society independence and competition are much more in vogue than interdependence and cooperation. Our world needs - and our Church needs — Marthas and Marys, Abrahams and Sarahs, young and old, male and female, dreamers and practitioners. We are invited, not to criticize nor to compete with, but to appreciate and to support those whose gifts differ from our

Perhaps it all begins with learning to identify one's own gifts and abilities. Contentment with one's own role is a prerequisite for acceptance of other's roles.

If Jesus seems to side with Mary in today's gospel, it may be, not because of Mary's role, but because of her contentment with that role. Jesus does not criticize Martha for attending to hospitality but for being "anxious and upset."

We each have the better "portion," if only we're content with it.



The conversation between God and Abraham in today's first reading is one which so beautifully reflects the human art of bargaining. It appears as though Abraham, little by little, changes God's mind. The story reveals, not God's indecision, but God's openness to the prayer of a man of faith and the man's firm belief in his God's mercy.

Which of us has not tried to bargain with God? We hope, as Abraham did, not to make God impatient nor angry, but to somehow get our way nevertheless.

The result of our prayers depend upon what God we believe in. If we believe in a wholesale God who can deliver material goods or a business God who ensures raises and promotions, our prayers will disappoint us.

If, on the other hand, we believe in the God whom Jesus came to reveal, our prayer will be a simple act of trust that God will be faithful to us, and we shall never be let down.

ASK! SEEK! KNOCK!

Today's gospel story has three significant messages for us. The first is obvious: pray. Jesus gives us the

example, for often he spent time alone in prayer. It was Jesus' own praying which led his disciples to ask him if he would teach them to pray.

The second message is just as obvious: persist in prayer. Don't give up. Keep asking, keep seeking, keep knocking.

The third message is perhaps less obvious: trust in God. "If you, with all your sins, know how to give your children good things, how much more will the Heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him," Jesus says. Trust that, whatever comes from your prayer, it is good.

If we can learn to pray with trust in God, perhaps we shall come to see, as Jesus did, that our very ability to ask is receiving; that our very being able to seek is itself finding; that in our very knocking, we realize that the door to our God is always opened.



Christians today have a wealth of tradition from Scripture and saints' accounts which attest to God's presence in people's lives. Yet, people sometimes are still mocked for their very real stories of faith and their belief in God's voice speaking to them in dreams, in events, and through other people.

There is a story of a hospital chaplain who, making her appointed rounds, came to the room of a teenage boy who had had knee surgery following a football injury. The teenager had three other guests, all members of his football team. In the presence of four teenage boys, the chaplain found herself reluctant to bring up any "religious stuff" and pursued instead team statistics and other acceptable topics.

When the chaplain was ready to depart, the young

patient asked her to share something special. He took the Bible from his drawer and read from Isaiah: "Make firm the knees that are weak." "God speaks this to me," the teenager said and the chaplain left.

A LAMP SHINING IN DARKNESS

People today experience the Lord's presence just as surely as Daniel saw visions and the Apostles saw Jesus transfigured. Are their stories accepted and welcomed as lamps shining in the darkness of our human confusion? Or are they mocked as the prophets were, crucified as Jesus was, and Peter after him?

What about our own stories of faith? When God speaks to us in prayer, through friends, in moments of grief and times of joy, are we courageous enough to share those stories in order that another's faith might be strengthened, or do we keep the good news to ourselves?



A reflection of vocation as sacrament

One image we have of the liturgy is the priest serving the people. Another image is the members of the community serving one another. In the second image—the image of liturgical prayer that has been revived in the last two decades—the sacramental signs are more clearly seen as signs of our mutual caring, of God's love flowing through us.

We hunger and thirst, and we are fed. Ideally, we hunger to be helpful, and thirst to be of service, and we care for one another. We should not be happy with just receiving. We should not be filled with a false pride that hasn't learned how to say thank you, but we should have an honest pride that knows we are never so fluid, so alive, as when we are as transparent as clear water, our egos invisible with God's care flowing through us without a thought of ourselves.

When we pray we want to forget ourselves and the resentments and jealousies that draw attention to ourselves. We want to be of service.

IN THE WAY OF THE SERVANT

Jesus was the servant and his service was that of easing the pain of the afflicted in his day, unclogging the spirit and dislodging the obstacles that stood in the way of salvation. He delivered people from the burden of themselves to free them to deliver others.

In today's readings we meet faithful servants who look hopefully to the future on the strength of their past record. In our liturgical recollection of these past events, we too poise ourselves for a God-given future.

Today's passage from the Letter to the Hebrews displays the faith of Sarah and Abraham, both of whom obeyed and served God totally.

In Luke's gospel, Peter is told that the faithful servant is one who remains productive while awaiting the master's return

In our liturgies, our sacraments, we see the signs of service. The sacraments are actions that help us through transitions, that nourish our spiritual needs, that ease us through injury, bereavement, and alienation.

We can imagine ourselves nameless, faceless, egoless in plain, white robes as we allow ourselves to be open to the Spirit of God and to surrender to God's will.





Anyone who strives to live the gospel values realizes that, ironic as it seems, love, acceptance, forgiveness, and peace are sources of division. The one who witnesses to those values in everyday decisions is often mocked and rejected. How can you forgive that wayward son of yours; he's made a fool of you! You don't really want those kind of people in our neighborhood, do you? Hey, revenge is sweet! Besides, if you don't strike back, she'll just keep hurting you.

We are all capable of bending and twisting the words and example of Jesus in an effort to excuse ourselves from true discipleship. Those who support our sinful ways seem to number legion compared to those who challenge us to grow in virtue and holiness. It takes tremendous self-honesty to assess whether we stand with Jesus and live the values of the Kingdom, or whether in our heart we dismiss him as too idealistic for our real world.

Do we, as Paul invites us, "keep our eyes fixed on Jesus" through prayer and sharing with people of faith, or do we allow ourselves to be guided by the more popular moral standard, everybody's doing it?

I HAVE COME TO LIGHT A FIRE

Fire is a symbol used in Scripture many times. Moses encountered Yahweh in the burning bush; the Spirit was manifested in tongues of fire on Pentecost; today Jesus speaks of coming "to light a fire on the earth."

Fire is light and warmth. By firelight we can see clearly though darkness; around the hearth we can be warmed though surrounded by coldness.


Fire is fearsome too: it burns, spreads, and destroys.

The flame which Jesus brings is God's love and compassion, sometimes gently warming with forgiveness, sometimes raging to destroy injustice.

Our choice is clear: we can douse the flames or we can follow Jesus and "add fuel to the fire."

The Scriptures are meant to be both a comfort and a challenge to those who believe that they are God's Word. If we find Scripture merely a comfort, we become self-satisfied and righteous. God is on my side; I am saved.

If the Scriptures are only a challenge, constantly reminding us that we are not quite measuring up, with no word of God's love and forgiveness, we can despair. What's the use. I'll never be good enough.

Paul speaks of both the comfort and the chal-

lenge of following Jesus. Yes, we will be disciplined, but from the trials we endure can come the fruit of peace and justice. When we act with peace and justice, there will come further trials. From the trials will come greater depth of peacefulness and justice.

THE NARROW DOOR

At the Church of the Nativity in Bethlehem, revered as the site of the birth of Jesus, there is a narrow door, which is also very low. The tour guides explain that the historical reason for the peculiar construction of this doorway was to discourage infidels from riding their horses into the sacred space and desecrating it. But perhaps the narrow door of this church has some meaning for those who seek the spiritual narrow door of which Jesus speaks.

For the pilgrim who visits Bethlehem, the narrow door of the church can be difficult to find. He may need to ask directions, to inquire of other people of faith where the door can be found.

When a crowd approaches the door, and in their over-eagerness, each person wishes to be the first to enter, no one gets in. Jockeying for position, the crowd blocks the doorway and no one can enter.

Finally, as one stoops over to walk through the narrow, low doorway, there is sometimes a need to reach for the hand of a fellow-pilgrim in order to steady one's steps.

The narrow door of Bethlehem and the narrow door of which Jesus speaks invite us to ask direction and guidance, to work together that all might enter, and to reach out when we are unsteady.

Then we shall enter the Kingdom and know that the challenges of faith end in final comfort. We are saved!





The situation recounted by Jesus in his parable is not very likely to happen in today's society. Any bride and groom can relate the painstaking process of determining the seating arrangement for the wedding reception. The tables are numbered and the guests are directed to their proper places. The places of honor could hardly be claimed by one who did not belong. Actually, our society has become adept at arranging seating for a great variety of functions: luncheons, banquets, concerts, athletic events. And we, consequently, have been well trained to lay claim only to the proper seat.

We are good at keeping people in their place: socially, economically, educationally. Humans seem bound to determine a pecking order.

Jesus' parable turns out neat categories upside-down: the exalted will be humbled; the humble will be exalted.

I HAVE A PLACE FOR YOU

Jesus addressed today's parable to the people who were at a wedding feast with him, "noticing how they were trying to get the places of honor." One can picture these wedding guests, like chil-

dren playing musical chairs, trying to bump each other out of the way in order to secure the desired seat.

When we are focused on getting a place for ourselves at a party, on a bus, in church, we are unaware of people around us. We do not see the elderly woman, the crippled man, the handicapped teenager, who need our assistance. In seeking honor for ourselves, we miss those who should be equally honored for they, like us, are sons and daughters of God.

If we include in our celebrations only those who can repay or help us, then our invitations are selfish and our celebration hollow.

Jesus will host the final wedding feast, and if our lives have been spent finding places of honor for others, there is no doubt Jesus will say: "I have a place for you!"





A reflection of vocation as sacrament

The runaway slave in today's second reading was a great help to Paul, who was in prison. His name was Onesimus ("Useful"), and he converted to Christianity. But the situation was an awkward one. For Onesimus' owner, Philemon, was also a convert of Paul's and a friend. Philemon was a prominent citizen of Colossae and the local church met in his house. What should Paul do?

Among the options open to him, Paul chose a surprising one. Despite the fact that first century runaway slaves could expect no mercy if caught, Paul sent him

back to Philemon — but with a cover letter explaining that Onesimus was now a fellow Christian and should be treated like one. That letter provides today's second

In a thought-provoking little book called Philemon's Problem, Fr. James Burtchaell has explored the dilemma in which Philemon now found himself. Should he punish the slave severely, as custom and discipline required — and forget about Paul? Or should he free Onesimus, and see his other slaves run off to be baptized and freed? In effect, Paul gave Philemon a stark choice: Be a Christian or be a slaveowner, but don't be both.

In one risky, brilliant move, Paul overturned Philemon's world and called him to a dimension of faith he may have never suspected to exist until now. The reconciliation between Onesimus and Philemon must have been a dramatic one.

CEREMONY OF RETURN

Unexpected at first, Paul's tactic turns out to be the only choice for reconciliation. And in Philemon's problem we see ourselves, called by God to reconcile with one another. And with God.

And we recognize the lessons it contains. Every broken relationship calls out for healing. There is no authentic reconciliation without some cost to ourselves. And that cost is a change in how we relate, how we live in our world, how, in fact, we know ourselves. We learn that after any reconciliation a relationship is never as it was at first, for traveling difficult transitions together forms closely knitted bonds.

There is no homecoming without ceremony, and the sacrament of reconciliation is our ceremony of return.



The message in today's readings is that God loves sinners. In the first reading, the Lord is angry with the Israelites, but as soon as Moses intervenes, "the Lord relented in the punishment he had threatened to inflict on the people." The unfaithfulness of the Israelites did not destroy God's love.

In the second reading, Paul admits his own sinfulness: "I was once a blasphemer, a persecutor, a man filled with arrogance." Jesus, Paul can attest by his own experience, "came into the world to save sinners."

Jesus' "lost and found" parables reiterate the good news of God's forgiveness, of God's searching us out when we have strayed or are lost or have run away.

A sheep which is no longer with the flock can hardly claim: "It's the other 99 that are lost." The one silver piece which is not with the others can't declare: "I'm not lost."

But people can deny being lost. The child in the shopping center who has been separated from parents declares: "My Mom and Dad are lost!" We have an incredible ability to shift the focus from our own being lost to someone else's. The problem with that is, unless we admit we're lost, we can't really be found.

I HAVE BEEN TREATED MERCIFULLY

Clearly, those who hear today's readings have a choice to make. One can stand in judgment and self-righteousness and declare the Israelites unfaithful, Paul arrogant, and the prodigal son presumptuous. These may well be fair assessments.

Or one can stand humbly and admit: "I have been unfaithful as the Israelites were; I have been arrogant as Paul was; I have prodigal child, selfish been presumptuous."

The paradox is this: If one does not admit being lost, one stays lost. If one admits being lost, one can be found and become the source of "joy in Heaven."





Whether or not money is the root of all evil is difficult to prove. It is, however, certainly at the heart of some injustice and exploitation. It has undergirded slavery and oppression and has been a cause of division and alienation between spouses, parents and

children, business partners. Money makes bribery possible and leads to political corruption.

Paul wishes that we should "offer prayers with blameless hands held aloft and be free from anger and dissension." So much anger and dissension in our world stems from the fact that people have proclaimed the dollar almighty rather than God.

When we pray honestly, we are able to recognize our other master, be it money or power or alcohol or sex or drugs.

SERVING GOD

Today's first reading from the prophet Amos exposes the greed and injustice of those who "trample upon the needy and destroy the poor of the land." They cleverly plot to alter their weights, to change the value of the currency, and to sell inferior goods. The same could be said today of some merchants and some corporations.

The manager in Jesus' story plotted in much the same dishonest way. Having already cheated his boss, he goes on to further cheat him by lessening the debts owed to him. The clever manager planned this cheating so that "people will take me into their homes when I am let go."

lesus points out another simple fact: "the worldly take more initiative than the otherworldly." It is clear that those whose master is money or power spend time plotting and planning, making the right connections, negotiating deals.

Where are those whose values are otherworldly? Do they gather around the kitchen table or in the corporate board room and plot to be honest and just in their dealings? Do the otherworldly concoct ways to be more forgiving, more compassionate, more peaceful and loving?

Or are the worldly the only ones whose master seems worth the effort?




