It is curious to note how few wealthy people perceive themselves as really wealthy. If one admires the opulence of a rich person's home, the response is likely to be: "Oh, you should see the neighbor's place. He has two swimming pools!" If one takes note of the rich woman's cadillac, she'll point to her friend's jaguar. Being wealthy is, by its nature, a relative condition. And, one

might suppose, part of the bane of the rich person's existence is the acute awareness of how much more others have.

The rich man in today's gospel doesn't seem to be a bad person. He dressed nicely and ate well. He was no doubt conscious of the more wealthy people in the town; he simply wasn't aware of the beggar at his gate.

Perhaps that is the insidious evil of wealth. The rich are very aware of those who have better homes; they are just unaware of the homeless. The rich are aware of those who have more expensive vehicles; they are just not aware of those who have no where to go and no way to get there. Those who are wealthy are all too aware of the Joneses with whom they must keep up; they simply fail to see the Lazaruses who beg for a morsel of their food, a moment of their time.

FIGHT THE GOOD FIGHT

Today's first two readings are opposite presentations of the same theme. Amos gives the "woe to you" approach, reminding us that people of faith do not spend their time in "wanton revelry." Paul presents the positive vision of people who "seek after integrity, piety, faith, love, steadfastness and a gentle spirit." Their messages expand the simple theme: Do good and avoid evil.

The message is simple but living it is far more difficult. People have an amazing capability for rationalization and self-justification. To live up to our noble profession of faith is indeed a fight. But the winners take all!


Friday, October 6th, is the first Friday of the month and we will have Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament from 9am to 2:45pm. The day



A reflection of vocation as sacrament

In Dylan Thomas's play, *Under the Milk Wood*, Rev. Eli Jenkins blesses his small Welsh town every morning as it wakes up and every evening as it settles into sleep. His voice is their voice; he is their advocate. His personal psalm over his home town is a song of praise that gives voice to the faith and hope of its citizens. It is a faith that is sometimes joyous, sometimes desperate, a hope that can be as innocent as children and yet grounded in the stony reality of daily work.

In today's second reading, Paul is seen to be giving advice to his friend, Timothy, a bishop of the early Church. Timothy is advised to keep alive the flame of the Spirit. This gift is one of courage, strength, love, and wisdom. He is to guard the "deposit of faith," and take Paul himself as a model for sound teaching.

The call to Holy Orders is a call from God, and a call from the community. It is a summons to be the community's voice in the shaping of its longings toward worship. It is a call to service in sacrament and eucharist to be the community's leader and guide in the things of God.

COURAGE

The community looks to its minister as a person who has heard the Word of God, dwelt upon it, and elected

to take the risk of following it like Timothy.

The courage of Timothy is the courage to take the journey inward where the human spirit meets God, to face oneself in God's love, and return to help others along parallel paths.

The wisdom of Timothy is the knowledge of self and of life itself that comes from listening closely to the Word of God in our experiences, in the community, in the Scriptures. It is a wisdom of the depths, one that grows out of love.

And this love that Timothy knows? It is God's—God's love for all creatures, especially that human family that has stewardship over God's creation. This love suffers with the bereft and rejoices with the exultant. It ministers to God's people.



Your faith has salvation.

28th Sunday in Ordinary Time

In today's first reading, Naaman is cured of his leprosy. Apparently a thoughtful man, he returns to Elisha to express his gratitude by offering a gift. Elisha. crediting God for the cure, refuses the gift and ultimately his refusal turns Naaman's gratitude to the Lord.

Servants of the Lord are like Elisha. No matter how much you thank them for helping you, they give God the credit. Oh, they are entitled to their paycheck, and may even accept a gift given in friendship, but always God gets the credit for helping you.

On the other hand, those of us who have sought guidance or comfort in grief or forgiveness know that the message of the Incarnation continues: God is experienced through the flesh and blood and Spirit of humanity. God has entrusted such powers to each of us! Through people, God loves, heals, forgives, and calls us to conversion and mission.

FAITH

With the abundance of self-help programs and self-esteem materials, the phrase, "Give yourself credit," is a fairly common one. Interestingly, Jesus gives that same message to the leper who returns to give thanks.

Faith, we have long acknowledged, is a gift. But, like any gift which is given, the receiver is free to use the gift or not, to return it unopened or to exchange it for something more appealing.

The leper who gave thanks acknowledges the gift of healing, and by his return shows his gratitude for the gift of faith of Jesus. "Your faith has been vour salvation," Jesus tells him.

Jesus does not commend the man for his obedience, nor does he imply that being healed equals being saved. Jesus does not say: "Your gratitude is your salvation," but "your faith has saved you."

Faith is a relationship in which we continually go to Jesus to ask, and we return to thank him, but, most of all, we believe that Jesus is there for us.



Dear Sisters and Brothers in the Lord,

"Faith can never remain a purely private matter... our faith in Christ opens our eyes to see beyond our own parish community, to the life of the Universal Church and the needs of the world around us." These powerful words were spoken by our Holy Father, Pope John Paul II, last year during his pastoral visit to Southern Africa.

Our Holy Father's message challenges us to put our Christian faith into action by sharing it with others both in our local community and to the "farthest ends of the earth". In so doing we fully realize our baptismal commitment and share in the missionary work of the Church.

In the name of our Holy Father, I invite you to observe World Mission Sunday on October 22nd. It is a special day of Prayer and Sacrifice as we unite ourselves with two-thirds of the world's people who have not heard the Gospel of Christ and over 820 million who follow no religion. Furthermore, many who are Christian experience persecution because of their faith and live in conditions far below human standards. These people in Asia, Africa, Vietnam and parts of Latin America are not faceless; they are our sisters and brothers. We pray and sacrifice for them as we profess our faith in Jesus Christ on Mission Sunday. Jesus reminds us, "as often as you did it for one of these, you did it for me". (Matt 25:40)

In some areas of the world Catholic missionaries are experiencing an increasing number of people requesting baptism, and enthusiastic lay catechists are courageously teaching our Faith. In other corners of the globe, men and women live in danger because they are Christian - some endure trial and imprisonment for the sake of the Gospel. These are God's people who remind us that our faith is never a private matter, but a gift to be shared with others.

It is good to know that the seminarians and novitiates in the Third World are filled with candidates for the priesthood and the religious life. In his 1989 Mission Sunday message, Pope John Paul II reminds us of our responsibility to pray for and support these sisters and brothers of ours in other countries who because of a lack of funds are refused admission to a seminary or novitiate.

Please give your prayerful support to The Society for the Propagation of the Faith on World Mission Sunday. The second collection in all churches is given to our Holy Father for the missionary work of the Church. I urge you to join me in looking beyond our local community and our Archdiocese to share with others our faith in Christ.

All of today's readings point to the necessity of persevering in faith. It is a concept easy to agree with, but far more difficult to live. Yet, the readings do not leave people to fend for themselves. Rather, each reading points to a way in which faith is strengthened for the long haul of life.

In today's passage from Exodus, the Israelites fare well as long as Moses' hands are raised up. Expectably, Moses' hands grow weary. Those who are with him, recognizing his need, "put a rock in place for him to sit on," and Aaron and Hur support his hands.

Everyone grows weary on occasion; everyone needs other people of faith for support and comfort.

Paul's Letter to Timothy names yet another source for persevering in faith: the Scriptures which, Paul reminds us, are "useful for teaching, for reproof, correction, and training in holiness."

In the gospel, Jesus gives us another key to persevering in faith. The parable he tells is about "the necessity of praying always and not losing heart." Prayer is an exercise of faith, and in expressing faith, we are strengthened in our beliefs.

HELP IS FROM THE LORD

Today's psalm response perhaps best sums up the message of today's readings. "Our help is from the Lord," the psalmist writes, and our efforts to persevere in faith are supported by the One in whom we believe. It is the Lord who sends people of faith to share belief and offer mutual encouragement. It is the Lord who gives us the Scriptures to strengthen and affirm our faith. It is the Lord who hears and responds "to his chosen who call out to him day and night."

"When the Son of Man comes, will he find any faith on earth?" Will he find any faith in me? If the resources of community, Scriptures, and prayer are used, the final answer will be a resounding yes!

be merciful to me, a sinner

OCTOBER 29, 1989 • 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time

There are many ways in which, when one exalts oneself, one ends up being humbled. Illness humbles people, and so does the loss of a job. Grief humbles people, whether they grieve over a divorce, a severed friendship, or a death. Those who exalt themselves fancy themselves as powerful, as in control, as better than other folks. The tragedies of life-small or great-equalize us. No one is more or less powerful in the face of illness; no one is more or less in control as we face death. Such experiences empty a person of all illusion; pride and self-righteousness are poured out.

It is then, in the state of emptiness and true humility that, like Paul, we can discover "the Lord stood by my side and gave me strength."

THE LORD HEARS OUR CRY

When people exalt themselves, they perceive themselves as rich. They have what it takes, be that money or prestige, connections or talents. Their failures to recognize their poverty is the greatest poverty of all.

Indeed, one might have an abundance of materi-

al possessions, an enormous amount of money, a highly respected position and great talents, and yet be very poor. In an effort to deny that inner poverty, such people turn to drugs or alcohol and attempt by living life in the fast lane to avoid the painful truth.

The truth is we are all poor. Sometimes that truth is difficult to admit, and it dawns slowly as our efforts to mask it fails us. But once a person recognizes and admits the poverty and limitations which are our inheritance as humans, there is a tremendous freedom.

Once a person can admit being poor, all the energy once consumed by pretense is restored. No longer needing to exhibit self-sufficiency, one is free to admit what was there all along. One is freed to say he or she needs help and to pray: "O God, be merciful to me, a sinner."

Perhaps Zacchaeus was simply curious about Jesus, but his story in today's gospel is worth reflecting on. Yes, Zacchaeus was small of stature, but even tall people can get lost in a crowd. Zacchaeus knew that he had to find a place from which he could see Jesus more clearly. He had to "rise above the crowd" in order to get the view of Jesus which would otherwise be obscured. Zacchaeus could have chosen to remain lost in the crowd; he could have said: "I'm just a dishonest tax collector; why would Jesus bother with me?" Or he could have said: "Everybody is dishonest; why should I bother with this prophet of truth?"

Jesus came "to search out and save what was lost" and Zacchaeus was lost in dishonesty. But Zacchaeus responded to Jesus' presence by rising above his sinfulness and changing his life.

Perhaps "go climb a tree" is good spiritual advice!

GO OUT ON A LIMB

One might say that the "small of stature" Zacchaeus "went out on a limb" for Jesus. Those who recognize and respond to the presence of

Jesus in their lives are risk-takers. Zacchaeus could have fallen out of the tree. People who go "out on a limb" for Jesus risk being misjudged or rejected as he was. That is the risk of faith.

Jesus says to us, as he said to Zacchaeus: "I mean to stay at your house today."

Zacchaeus could have said: "Gee, I'm sorry, I've got other plans tonight, Jesus." He could have stalled Jesus' coming, had time to put his tax books away, and hidden the ill-gained money he was counting. Instead, Zacchaeus "descended quickly and welcomed him with delight." The unconditional love and acceptance which Jesus gave Zacchaeus called forth the goodness in Zacchaeus. The tax collector offered not only to over-repay those whom he had cheated, but to give half his belongings to the poor!

Go out on a limb; Jesus means to stop at your house today—and every day!



A reflection on vocation as sacrament

For everything there is a time and a season. This is the wisdom of Ecclesiastes, made memorable in Pete Seeger's song, "Turn, Turn, Turn." The times and seasons make their own kind of demand upon us. They call upon us to respond. And the human times and seasons of life are dignified with sacraments that help us to perceive God's call in the changes of life.

We are called beyond ourselves—into the future, into an unknown place—at important turning points of

our lives. Marriage, for instance, calls us into a future of service to family. We are, at such times, full of possibilities—wondering, planning, speculating.

But sickness, old age, and death are a part of life. And each of us comes to a time and a season in which such realities cannot be denied.

CALL OF VULNERABILITY

There comes a time when our human strengths ebb, however. Captains of industry, sports greats, concert pianists, brilliant professors—each of us will have an opportunity to learn to trust God in our new-found vulnerability. Sometimes it arrives out of season, with surprise illnesses, and sometimes it comes with the simple process of aging.

And since faith, in large part, is trust, vulnerability is a gift of faith. It is this moment that the Sacrament of Anointing consecrates. From the strengths that set us

apart, we return to a common humanity.

For the biblical writers, "the widow and the orphan" have come to stand for all the vulnerable persons in society, including the stranger and the poor. Today's readings move within this theme. Those who live their lives in trust are a gift to the rest of us, as a witness to our own fragility and mortality. They call upon us for care, and in so doing help to save us.

One reason that the Sacrament of Anointing is frequently celebrated communally today is that it calls those of us in the bloom of our strengths into the common humanity of the vulnerable. And here we discover Christian community. Through Christ and his Church we gain strength to deal with sickness, suffering, and death.





Today's gospel is a terrifying account of horrible future events. Jesus' listeners ask: "When will this occur? And what will be the sign it is going to happen?"

Paluch Company,

There is something in people which wants to believe that if we know something bad is going to happen, it can be easily handled. The truth is, no one is ever prepared for the death of a loved one, no matter how long the person has been ill; warnings of a natural disaster may save lives, but the victims who lose homes and businesses are never fully prepared for the devastating emotions which result.

Jesus' message is not about signs to look for nor specific dates on which there will be earthquakes or other disasters. Jesus' message is about trusting him, and enduring in our faith no matter what hardships befall us.

PATIENCE

Paul lived Jesus' message of patient endurance with every fiber of his being. Undaunted by

jailings and beatings and shipwrecks, Paul patiently endured in his faith and his mission to spread the good news of Jesus.

In his Second Letter to the Thessalonians, Paul could rightly say to the Christians: "You know how you ought to imitate us." Paul lived the message he preached, and his life was proof of his faith in that message.

Who among Christians today can claim with Paul that his or her life is lived "as an example for you to imitate?" Rather, is it not common to witness people who say: "Do as I say and not as I do?"

Jesus asks for patient endurance and gives us his own life as example; Paul patiently endures and invites us to imitate him. We can rest assured that our patient endurance will put us in good company.



NOVEMBER 26, 1989 • Christ the King

There is no other earthly ruler who has lived as Jesus did, who died as Jesus did, and who has asked his subjects to do what Jesus asked of his followers.

Jesus' idea of kingship was to serve his people. His days were spent teaching, healing, forgiving, dining with public sinners, and journeying from town to town speaking God's love for all people.

Temporal rulers might be able to promise wealth or power to those who support their reign, but the rewards which Jesus promised were the intangible treasures of love and forgiveness, peace and integrity.

In an instant-gratification society, delayed rewards are not very motivating. Given a choice between instant wealth and ultimate joy, many people would opt for the so-called sure thing. Jesus asked his subjects to give of themselves. His offer was no more popular in his own day than it is today.

People today have been well trained in asking the culturally important question: "What's in it for me?" All Jesus has to offer is what he offered the good thief in today's gospel: "I assure you one day you will be with me in paradise."

RESCUED FROM DARKNESS

Christians may not be able to boast of a king, who bestows riches and position, but today's readings are clear in what Jesus does promise.

Jesus' followers will be freed from the power of darkness and will one day share paradise with him.

"Give thanks to the Father for having made you worthy to share the lot of the saints in light," Paul writes to the Colossians in today's second reading. It is, in fact, a good reminder to all Jesus' followers. Today's solemnity of Christ the King is a celebration of a very different sort of kingship, one which we have been invited to accept and, in accepting, are blest.

Jesus offers his followers all that our humanity most deeply hungers for: love, acceptance, forgiveness, peace, and eternal joy. Whatever price we pay for those treasures, it's still a bargain!

DECEMBER 3, 1989 1st Sunday of Advent

Today's readings suggest the sort of Christmas preparations which are essential for the Christian. Isaiah's message is one of peacefulness. "They shall beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks." Does Isaiah suggest that preparing for the Lord means peacemaking? Peace is in vogue as Christmas approaches. The message of "peace on earth" is heard in carols, embossed on greeting cards, and engraved on ornaments. How and where do Christians stand out as Advent peacemakers? Christian peacemakers can be seen settling family arguments; they can be observed giving the closest-to-the-store parking place to an elderly person; they can be seen giving a harried mother and her children a cut in the check-out line.

Christian peacemakers have learned, through prayer and reflection, how to beat the sword of selfishness into generosity and the spear of apathy into compassion.

PUT ON THE ARMOR OF LIGHT

Isaiah's image for peace is the transformation of weapons for war into tools for peace. Disarmed by our faith in the Lord's coming, Paul tells us to "put on the armor of light" if we are to prepare well for Christmas.

To be prepared in today's society often has negative connotations. To be prepared frequently means stockpiling weapons, installing alarm systems, and securing sufficient insurance in the event that disaster befalls us.

How different is the message of today's Advent Scriptures. Paul spells out the way in which we "put on light", and his call to conversion from "deeds of darkness" is certainly an essential preparation for the Lord's coming.

Perhaps a good Advent beginning would be to compare one's list of Christmas preparations with the preparations indicated in today's Scriptures. Indeed, unless one's list includes the essentials given by Isaiah, Paul, and Jesus, the rest of the list really won't matter at all.

Paul presents both the comfort and the challenge of the Advent season—and the Christian life—very succinctly in today's second reading. "Accept one another, then, as Christ accepted you." The comfort in Paul's words comes when we are the recipients of acceptance. Christ has accepted us, we are assured, and the Christian community is exhorted to accept us as well. In a society replete with isolation and alienation, how blest are those who find a community in which they find acceptance and belonging!

The challenge of Paul's words is clear when we see ourselves as the acceptors. As the Christian community is called to accept each individual, so each individual is called to accept the community and every individual who belongs to it. We all seek patience, encouragement, and harmony from others, but Paul reminds us that these qualities are also our responsibility to others. Perhaps this "accepting one another" is what John the Baptist had in mind when he said: "Reform your lives!"

THE SPIRIT OF THE LORD

The one for whose coming we prepare is the one of whom Isaiah wrote: "The Spirit of the Lord shall rest upon him: a spirit of wisdom...of understanding...of counsel...of strength...of knowledge and of fear of the Lord." But as we wait and as we struggle to reform our lives and to accept one another, we know we are not alone. The Spirit of theLord which rested upon Jesus,

rests upon his followers. The Spirit who came to us in baptism and to whom we re-committed ourselves in confirmation brings to us the same gifts which enabled Jesus to fulfill his mission.

"Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths," John the Baptist entreats us. We have all the construction equipment we need to repave, to blaze a trail, to create a superhighway, for we have the Spirit on our road crew!







Are You the One Who is to Come?



DECEMBER 17, 1989 • 3rd Sunday of Advent

"Are you he who is to come?"

The question that John the Baptist asks Jesus in to-

day's gospel reading is a good one.

It was a simpler age when Jesus lived on earth, and sheaves of documentation to prove one's identity did not exist. The only means that people had to measure would-be Messiahs by was the words of the prophets. In today's first reading, Isaiah tells us how to recognize the one "who is to come." "Then will the eyes of the blind be opened, the ears of the deaf will be cleared; then will the lame leap like a stag; then the tongue of the dumb will sing."

When John's disciples question Jesus about his identity, Jesus' reply is: "Go and report to John what you hear and see." The presumption is, of course, that John's disciples had heard and seen Jesus. Jesus, in effect, was asking them to answer their own question. If they knew the Scriptures, had listened to Jesus, and witnessed his actions, there is no doubt they would know him as the promised Messiah:

The Advent season gives us the same opportunity to affirm Jesus' identity as we reflect on the Scrip-

tures, listen to Jesus, and witness his actions in the gospel—and in our own lives.

JESUS' PRESENCE

The question which Jesus addresses to the crowds is an interesting one: "What did you go out to see?" So often what, or whom, we find is conditioned by our expectations. What did you expect to find this Advent? For whom are you looking?

If we seek Jesus, we know the signs of his presence: "The blind recover their sights, cripples walk, lepers are cured, the deaf hear, dead people are raised to life, and the poor have the good news preached to them." Where those activities take place, the Lord is present. And when we participate in those activities, others can find the presence of lesus in us.

Excerpts from letter from Archbishop Francis B. Schulte:

... During the preparation for the 1987 Symod, Holy Days were discussed at length. After serious consideration, the Symod included a recommendation that, when a Holy Day is to be celebrated on a Saturday or a Monday, a dispensation from the obligation to participate in the celebration of Mass should be granted.

You are to name him Jesus

DECEMBER 24, 1989 4th Sunday of Advent

It is always there: the pause and resulting anticipation between the final preparations and the beginning of the action. You can feel this pause when the runners line up to await the starting gun, when the play director says "Places everyone," when the orchestra finishes its preliminary tuning, when the last place setting has been set for the dinner party.

After the last gift is placed under the tree and everything is ready for Christmas, we stand back for an appraisal before

the next day's festivities begin. We pause, and catch our

The pause is the time of waiting. It is the moment ripe with anticipation. The pause of Christmas Eve is the spirit of Advent waiting, condensed into a few timeless hoursendless hours for the smallest children.

In the waiting we feel the call. It is a call dimly perceived, yet deep and strong—a call impossible to put proper words around, and yet felt in our bones. It is the call of the future, a call to blessing, to better times.

In the silence of midnight on Christmas Eve we sense the wordless call that pulled the Magi across desert wastes to the stable in Bethlehem. We hear the Gloria Song ringing in the minds of the shepherd in the hills, summoning them to pay homage to the new-born king. In the silent night, in the longing of our human race, we sense the call of our Creator, to come home.

THE SIGNS OF CHRISTMAS

We are called to the sign; and the sign is the child in the manger. Emmanuel, "God with us." This is the original sacrament of God's presence among us. And the child was named Jesus, "Yahweh saves." In the sacraments of the Church, God is present to us in a saving way. Yet these are but facets and moments of the one sacrament who is Jesus Emmanuel.

We are called to be signs. The vocation to sacrament is also a call to become sacraments. In this birthday party we celebrate our own becoming, as signs of God's presence to each other and to the world about us. Since Christmas is also a merchandising event, we have more than enough signs that say "Buy!" We ourselves will be the signs of the season that say "Giving" and "Blessing" and "Joy to the World."

In the stillness between the shopping and the Gift, we have a moment in which, if we listen, we can hear the call to be sacraments of the Incarnation, the Word enfleshed.

CHRISTMAS PASTORAL - 1989

My Dear Sisters and Brothers in the Lord, In one of the prefaces for Christmas we pray: "Today you fill our hearts with joy As we recognize in Christ the revelation of your love.

No eye can see His glory as our God, Yet now He is seen as one like us."

At the close of Midnight Mass, when I raise my hand in bestowing the solemn blessing, the Christmas blessing in our Cathedral, I will pray that blessing not only on those present but also on all of you, my beloved sisters and brothers. "When He came to us as man,

The Son of God scattered the darkness of this world, And filled this holy night with His glory. May the God of Infinite Goodness Scatter the darkness of sin And brighten your hearts with holiness.

"God sent His angels to shepherds To herald the great joy of our Savior's birth. May He fill you with joy And make you heralds of His gospel.

"When the Word became man Earth was joined to Heaven. May He give you His peace and good will, And fellowship with all the Heavenly Hosts.

"May Almighty God bless you, The Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit."

May the glimmers of hope seen in so many places during the last few months break into a new day of peace for all the human family. And may those other places of pain, violence and injustice be changed into places of peace. This is our prayer and this is our task for 1990 and the decade that lies ahead.

May you have a very happy Christmas and a blessed and peaceful new year.





Today's first reading from Sirach has some beautiful thoughts regarding family relationships: children honoring father, revering mother, bringing comfort and not grief. The rewards which Sirach writes about are equally beautiful: such behavior toward parents brings atonement for sins, answered prayers, and a long life. While Sirach does not spell out how loving parents act toward their children, one can hardly disagree that the ideal for children's behavior he sets is good.

People have taken exception to some of Paul's words from today's second reading. "You who are wives, be submissive to your husbands" is not a popular line. Submission to anyone is not an acceptable stance to people who know their God-given dignity. In fairness to Paul, he was conditioned by his historical and cultural milieu in regard to women. Secondly, to take that line out of context is to miss the wholeness of Paul's message. Paul addresses not only wives, but husbands and children. He says, in effect, that all members of the family have responsibilities to each other. It might be well to re-read Paul's words together, as a family, not pointing to the others' faults, but listening to the message for ourselves.

PUT ON LOVE

Today's readings give us some guidelines for becoming a holy family. Sirach points to the respect and honor with which the Lord asks us to treat our families; Paul spells out the attitudes we need to develop if our relationships are to be life-giving and Christian; the gospel shows how Jesus, Mary, and Joseph protected each other and faced a crisis by listening to God's plan.

If the advice and example contained in today's Scriptures seem overwhelming, a simple focus is Paul's powerful line: "Over all these virtues put on love, which binds the rest together and makes them

No matter what our roles or backgrounds, we are all called to love.
