

APRIL 1, 1990 5th Sunday of Lent

In today's first reading from the prophet Ezekiel, the Lord God makes wonderful promises: "I will open your graves and have you rise from them....I will put my Spirit in you that you may live and I will settle you upon the land."

God has promised wonderful things; no wonder

we are disappointed when bad things happen! Or is it that we have forgotten that while God has promised good things, God has not promised bad things from ever happening? Perhaps if we read the words of the promise more carefully, and we reflect prayerfully, we will come to see that God's very words are an acknowledgement of experiences we do not look forward to. To have our graves opened, to rise, presupposes death and burial.

Lent invites us to reflect on the pain in our lives: suffering and loss, little "deaths" and death itself. Jesus wept when Lazarus died; no doubt he was deeply hurt by those who questioned his love for his friend. Yet he meets grief with faith: "Father, I thank you for having heard me. I know that you always hear me."

THE SPIRIT DWELLS IN YOU

In today's second reading, Paul assures us we will be raised to life by God "through his Spirit dwelling in you." Our Lenten sacrifices enable us to become more aware of the Spirit's presence within us bringing us to new life. Even as we grieve our losses, endure our sufferings, and face our deaths, the Spirit calls, as Jesus called Lazarus: "Come out!"

We may still wonder on occasion or ask angrily in the midst of incredible pain why Jesus could not have done something to stop our suffering.

What we have is not answers, but faith; not escape from pain and death, but ultimate victory over them. Today's story of the raising of Lazarus is proof of Jesus' power and affirmation of our faith and hope in God's promises.



APRIL 8, 1990 Passion (Palm) Sunday

Jesus didn't get very far on the "ladder of success" because he attracted the wrong people. Instead of choosing powerful and wealthy people who could have funded his work and advanced his career with their influence, he chose the poor and the weak. One can hardly expect an expensive parade when those who line the route are outcasts and prostitutes, cured lepers, newly-sighted blind people, and resurrected dead ones.

If Jesus had expected a triumphant, more lasting entry, he made some serious mistakes, the worst of which was his choice of closest followers. Hadn't Jesus recognized by now that they were "fair weather friends" at best? One of them betrayed him and Jesus seemed to know he would; the rest "deserted him and fled" and Jesus did not seem surprised.

Those who envisioned Jesus as a king of wealth and power had warned him that he was going about it all wrong! Jesus apparently saw something they did not see: a vision of God's will.

THEY DIVIDED HIS CLOTHES

While we begin today's liturgy commemorating Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem, we are quickly catapulted into the horrors of the passion. The questionable glory of arriving on a donkey's back is, ironically, in the end, the height of the earthly glory, which Jesus would experience.

He who had been acclaimed by the crowd, albeit a motley one, was deserted on his arrival even by his closest followers.

The one who spoke forgiveness was treated with no mercy; the one who reached out to all people was left standing alone; the one who sought peace was condemned to a violent death.

According to the values of society, Jesus did it all wrong. Except, of course, that the Father was pleased—not pleased with Jesus' death, but with Jesus' life and message.

At the end of his life as in the beginning, Jesus wanted only to please God. By that standard, Christ remains the greatest success story ever told.

How would you define your vocation? Many answer by saying they are single, married, ordained, or a brother or a sister in a religious community.

Other people define their vocation in terms of their role such as pastor, housewife, hospice nurse, or community activist.

Our primary vocation, to be Christian, to live as disciples of Jesus, can sometimes get lost in the specifics of who we are and the roles which we fulfill.

The reception of new members into our faith community at the Easter Vigil, or the renewal of our baptismal promises, recalls the simplicity of our Christian vocation to follow Christ. Our response to Jesus' call is lived as we witness to his life, death, and Resurrection in our everyday lives, as we continually affirm the gospel values in our decisions and in our relationships.

There are days when we can feel buried by the demands of family life, the complexities of community living, and the politics of institutional or corporate systems. We are perhaps "entombed" by pressures imposed by a society that does not support our values and gives no voice to the Christian vision toward which we work.

ALLELUIA

Today we sing Alleluia, to show ultimate victory over all deaths, all burials, all tombs. Our voices join with the chant

of Christians everywhere to share our values and our vision. Christians, who reaffirm their pristine moment of response to Jesus, again say: "Yes, I will follow you!"

The first disciples shared the tomb of Jesus, for with him were buried their hopes and dreams, their very discipleship. Jesus' rising was the resurrection of all that they had believed in, all that they had wanted to become.

The gift of new life is ours today, no matter what state of life or what roles we have chosen to express our response

We don't, in fact, define our vocation at all. Jesus does. Alleluia!

APRIL 22, 1990 2nd Sunday of Easter



The first reading from the Acts of the Apostles tells us how the early community of disciples lived their faith. Their lives were centered on instruction, the "breaking of the bread," and prayer. They "shared all things in common" and everyone was taken care of according to each one's needs. They went to the temple area each day, praised God, won "the approval of all the people," and attracted converts.

Does this description fit our Church today? Our parish? Our own faith lives?

Life was simpler then, we might object, far less busy and economically sophisticated. The early Christians could afford to spend time praying and to share everything in common.

Yet, apparently not everyone who lived in those "simpler times" lived as the Christians did. Their way of life must have stood out or they would not have attracted new members. It was more than singing "Alleluia"; it was the way in which "with exultant and sincere hearts" they lived their belief in Jesus in practical everyday ways.

ACHIEVING FAITH'S GOAL

In today's second reading, the First Letter of

Peter captures the flavor of life lived in the context of the paschal mystery. "There is cause for rejoicing here," the author says in concluding his introductory message of praise and promise.

In the very next sentence we are reminded of the other side of the coin: "You may for a time have to suffer the distress of many trials."

With the glow of Easter's glory still in our hearts, with the Easter season still the focus of our liturgy, we are reminded that suffering and trials are not yet behind us. Perhaps, like Thomas, we doubt and seek proof for our beliefs.

"Peace be with you," Jesus says to his disciples, not just once but twice. "These events have been recorded to help you believe that Jesus is the Messiah, "the Son of God, so that through this faith you may have life in his name." And so that his name might be kept alive through our faith.





The advice in today's second reading could be aptly applied to our life on this earth: "Conduct yourselves reverently during your sojourn in a strange land." Our faith tells us that Heaven is our home. This "strange land" of life on earth is a small portion of our existence and we are, as the disciples going to Emmaus, on the road.

What are the stories we tell, the stories we hear, as we journey? Like the disciples, perhaps our stories retell events that we don't quite understand. We tell stories of what has happened to us in an effort to find meaning.

Such reverence is needed for this storytelling on our sojourn! Storytellers are called to honesty and vulnerability in sharing their tales. Story listeners are called to compassion and incredible gentleness as they hold another's story in their hearts.

Our sojourn, as Peter said, is indeed "in a strange land." There are so many things we do not understand; we need companions on the journey who, by their presence, support, and sharing enable us to see that our faith and hope "are centered on God."

IESUS IS WITH US

Any journey that has a specific destination is most

effectively planned by knowing the best route.

In today's first reading from Acts, the words of David give us a perfect plan for our sojourn: "I have set the Lord ever before me." If we know the Lord through the Scriptures, through the sacraments and prayer, through the wisdom of our faith community, we shall journey well and safely.

The disciples on the road to Emmaus were open to the stranger, willing to share their story, their grief and confusion. They listened to the stranger's wisdom and he spoke of the meaning of the Scriptures. Ultimately they recognized that it was Jesus who was with them all along.

As they told the story of their journey to Emmaus, one could guess they forgot the details of how hot the trip was and how rocky the road was. They knew all that was really important was that Jesus had journeyed with them. And they had "recognized him in the breaking of the bread."





MAY 6, 1990 • 4th Sunday of Easter

The audience in today's first reading got a loud and clear message from Peter: "Let the whole house of Israel know beyond any doubt that God has made both Lord and Messiah this Jesus whom you crucified."

Their response to Peter's message is immediate: "What are we to do, brothers?"

Have you ever been so moved by a speaker that you remained after a presentation and asked the speaker: "What can I do about this?"

Or do you, like so many of our contemporaries, find yourself moved by so many causes that you are overwhelmed and simply don't want to hear anymore?

To hear the Word of God amidst the din of life is to be impelled to respond: "What am I to do?" To hear, and to believe that we are the Lord's sheep is to have awakened a concern for the other sheep: the lost, the wounded, the confused.

It takes discipline to hear the Lord's voice. It requires a willingness to remove our headsets and to turn down the volume of our lives.

RETURN TO THE SHEPHERD

Today's first reading ends with a bittersweet line: "Those who accepted his message were baptized; some 3,000 were added that day." Surely any speaker would envy Peter's ability to reach 3,000 people in his audience. But if the story speaks of "those who accepted his message," surely there must have been those who did not accept it.

Which would we have been? If we had heard Peter's declaration regarding Jesus, would we have been among the acceptors, or would we have left the gathering unchanged?

Which are we? Perhaps a good clue is if we leave this assembly asking: "What am I to do then?"





Show us the way

MAY 13, 1990 5th Sunday of Easter

As spiritual values, the gifts of the Spirit are sometimes ignored and even derided in our society. In particular, the gift of counsel is certainly not valued as it should be.

Ultimately, Jesus is the primary counselor for each Christian. We seek the wisdom of the Lord when we face decisions in our lives. But, except for those extremely adept at meditative or contemplative prayer, most of us probably do not get clear instructions directly from Jesus. For most of us, the voice of the Lord is mediated through people and in the collective insights of our faith com-

munity, which calls us to growth.

In a society that prizes independence, seeking counsel from others is frowned upon. In a society that thrives on defense mechanisms and impenetrable facades, the vulnerable admission of the need for counsel is berated. It is acceptable to have a mentor in the business world, one who will facilitate growth in competency and income, but if one claims to have a spiritual companion, he or she might well be suspect.

WITNESS

Today's first reading from the Acts of the Apostles is a wonderful model for how the gift of counsel works in community, and is indeed essential in the living out of our Christian vocation and our specific vocations as well.

Having witnessed a need, the Greek disciples approached the community. Having heard the need, the Twelve assembled the community and counseled them as to how the need might be addressed. The community listens to counsel and calls certain members to ministry.

The interplay of giving counsel and receiving counsel is a powerful witness to those of us who tend to keep quiet and ask for no advice.

Vocation means call. Do not be afraid to ask what that call means; do not hesitate to speak the Lord's call to one another.



Jesus could promise his disciples he would not leave them orphaned: first, because he would remain with them in a new way; secondly, because he would ask the Father to send "another paraclete" to be with them always.

Today's readings confirm how the disciples knew their "unorphanedness." In the first reading, the disciples go to the new converts in Jerusalem and "imposed hands on them and they received the Holy Spirit." The disciples' experience of the presence of the Spirit was very real.

In today's second reading, Peter exhorts his readers to "venerate the Lord, that is Christ, in your hearts." Peter does not say: "Venerate Christ in the temple," nor "in the rituals we perform," but "in your hearts." How very aware those first disciples must have been of their intimate union with Jesus! They did not need to chase around trying to find the Lord who had risen and no longer dwelt with them in human form. The disciples had come to understand that Jesus did not leave them orphans, nor could they ever be orphaned, for Jesus and the Spirit resided within their own beings.

CHRIST, OUR HOPE

Our power to witness to "the reason for this hope" which we Christians have is sometimes vitiated by our reluctance to speak about our faith.

People of other beliefs: beliefs in money, in power, in violence are all too ready to share "the reason for their hope." As empty and fleeting as such "hopes" are, sometimes they are the only voices to be heard.

How can we expect the next generation to have strong Christian faith if they do not hear "the reason for this hope" of ours? Indeed, how can we expect our own generation to continue believing in Jesus if we do not share "the reason for this hope" with each other.

We are not orphans. We have Jesus and the Spirit. They would expect us not to leave each other orphaned.







The farewell prayer of Jesus in the gospel is filled with "glory": Jesus glorifies the Father, asks the Father to glorify him, and claims, as he sits in the midst of those who are about to abandon him, that "it is in them that I have been glorified."

Perhaps, as we prepare to celebrate Pentecost, we might examine our images of glory. Do we envision a movie star carrying an Oscar, or do we see a person who willingly accepts the cross as part of discipleship?

Will Jesus one day say of us: "It is in them that I have been glorified."

The only award that will be won by faithful disciples of Jesus is a share in God's reign.

WHEN HIS GLORY IS REVEALED

Today's readings give us some powerful directions for living out our roles as those who continue the mission of lesus.

In the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles, we are told that the Apostles and Mary and "some women" "devoted themselves to constant prayer." To carry on Jesus' mission means to be in touch with Jesus, to, like Jesus, give glory to God. They took seriously, it seems, Jesus' injunction to "pray always."

With communal prayer as their foundation, the disciples spread the good news through their preaching, teaching, and healing.

Peter's message in today's second reading reminds us that speaking and being the good news is not without its hardships. Besides praying, preaching, teaching, and healing, the disciples did something else: they suffered.

"Rejoice", Peter writes, "insofar as you share Christ's sufferings." Peter knew from experience what suffering was; he apparently also knew that sharing the suffering of Christ was cause for joy.

Our share in the glory of Christ awaits us.



In today's second reading, Paul tells us that we are all gifted. The gifts, which each person has, are an indication of the particular mission that she or he is sent to accomplish. As the child, who is sent to buy a gallon of milk, is given the money, so too we are given unique abilities, which contribute to the reign of God.

But how do we discover our gifts? The parent who sends a child to the store often gives reassurances: "I know you can do this. You are smart and you are careful." The parental trust expressed in giving money and entrusting the child to fulfill a family need affirms the child's ability. We, too, find our giftedness in the affirmation of other people's trust in us, their willingness to give us responsibilities. We find our giftedness as we mull over the words of lesus.

COME, HOLY SPIRIT

"Peace be with you," Jesus says. Just as a child repeats parental messages, so, too, do we find reassurance in Jesus' message to us while we are on our way.

A child who is going to the store might forget the way. "Oh, oh, did Mom say turn left or right?" A child might forget the purpose of the journey: "Did she say milk or bread?"

We who have been sent by Jesus do not travel alone, however. The Holy Spirit, who descended upon the Apostles on the first Pentecost, journeys with each of us; and, so, if we forget which way to turn, we need only listen prayerfully for directions. If we lose sight of our Christian goals, the Spirit will remind us of

The miracle of the first Pentecost is repeated each time we recognize our gifts, and we use those gifts "for the common good."







We belong to God's family

JUNE 10, 1990 • Trinity Sunday

We define family, not by checking with the dictionary, but according to our own experiences and memories. Jesus defined family very broadly when he pronounced God as our Father, and his inclusion of all people within the love of God was not acceptable to those who defined family in the narrow terms of their own sect or tribe.

For Christians, vocation and family are intimately connected at many levels. The first level of their interconnectedness lies in the fact that we are called into being by a God who is family—Father, Son, and Spirit.

Our family of origin is extremely important in our hearing and our answering a specific vocational call. Through their affirmation of our gifts, our families begin to whisper what vocation may suit us. Through marriage, religious life, single life, and priesthood, our family prepares us for future life-choices. By setting decisions within the context of prayer, families enable us to choose our vocation prayerfully, attending to God's plan.

A FAMILY CALL

Our "extended family"—the parish, religious community, and friends—calls us to vocation, too, as it names our gifts and invites us to use those gifts in service.

Family—genesis of vocations, fulfillment of vocations. As we celebrate Trinity Sunday today, we might reflect on how well we support the vocations of our spouses, children, brothers, and sisters. And we might pray, as Moses did: "O Lord, do come along in our company"—in our family.





Moses twice admonishes the people to "remember" in today's reading from Deuteronomy. We are a forgetful folk. When meals come quickly and easily, we forget the joy of eating; when we are well-fed, it is easy to take for granted the necessity of proper nutrition. When our prayer: "Give us this day our daily bread" is answered with seeming effortlessness, we may forget to be grateful. We may even forget to continue to pray.

The Israelites tended to forget. They forgot the purpose of their journey, they forgot the miracles of feeding and protection, they forgot even their covenant with God.

Perhaps there are miracles which we need to remember as well.

Manna in the desert and a meal on the table are both miracles. Jesus comes to us in the simple appearance of bread and wine; he comes to us just as surely in the simple miracles of each day: food, clothing, a smile, an unexpected hug. And, if we remember, the stuff of everyday life is a renewal of our covenant.

PARTAKE OF ONE LOAF

It would be unthinkable for anyone at this eucharist to consume all of the hosts and wine, which are Jesus' body and blood. While our practice of using individual hosts has lost the powerful symbolism of the "one loaf," still the very meaning of the eucharist is sharing.

On certain occasions, it would insult our values of friendship and hospitality for any one member to take a portion which would deprive others.

Dare we imagine that all the food in the world is but "one loaf" of which we are all meant to partake? Dare we look upon the poor, the homeless, the hungry of the world as our dinner guests? Have we, the family of Jesus, the courage to remember others in our consumeristic, instant gratification society? As Christians, we must help our fellow humans.

As his parents broke with tradition concerning his name, John made some breaks with tradition and expectations, too. His manner of dress, his eating habits and lifestyle were noteworthy enough to be included in Scripture. John is often portrayed in art as a wild-eyed prophet. And, as his personal lifestyle was no doubt unacceptable to many people, so too his message was unpopu-

lar and misunderstood by many.

"Was not the hand of the Lord upon him?" those who heard the accounts of his birth had said. And what did they say when John preached his message of repentance and reform? Did they perceive the Lord's hand yet upon him; or, upset by his message, did they dismiss him as one who had broken with tradition, as his parents did in naming him?

John's words, like those of the prophets before him and of Jesus after him, were indeed "a sharpedged sword."

MAKE WAY FOR THE MESSIAH

In spite of the power of his message, or perhaps because of it, John had his followers. We don't know what sort they were, except they were willing to hear the truth John spoke, to join his community, and to be baptized. Maybe John's followers, like those of Jesus, had little to lose. Perhaps they were the untitled, the powerless, the sick, the needy. Perhaps they were those downtrodden by the values and traditions that John stood against and, for once, found belonging in the company of the locust-eater.

How wonderful it must have been for John to be with people who believed in his message and sought to live better lives! Could it have been a temptation for John to become the hero-the messiah for this group?

True to his mission, John declined any semblance of "being the one who is to come." Always pointing to Jesus, John gave his followers the real answer to their searching. And that is one tradition we should keep!
