There are certain things in life which require a great deal of care: vineyards, babies, aging parents, friends. Every possession, every person coming into our lives not only brings gifts and joys but responsibilities as well.

Sometimes we find it necessary to delegate some of our responsibilities to another person or institution: a tenant farmer, a child care center, a nursing home.

And sometimes, we just opt out and the vineyard becomes "overgrown with thorns and briers," the children flounder, the elderly age anonymously and alone.

We, of course, are merely "tenant farmers" of all that we "possess" and all the people in our lives. God, the World-Vineyard Owner, has delegated the care of the earth to us. Our responsibility is not to turn over a personal profit but to offer a rich harvest to our God.

If we are to be good tenant farmers of this earth and its people, we have to recognize the real Owner and, of course, respect the Owner's Son.

THE VINEYARD OWNER'S SON

The vineyard owner's son was sent to us, not simply

to check up on the harvest, but to teach us how to turn the soil, to work beside us in the fields of our lives.

Jesus, as Paul reminds us in today's second reading, taught us to "dismiss anxiety"; to pray; to direct our thoughts to truth and all that is honest, pure, admirable, decent, virtuous, or praiseworthy.

It's hard work, tilling this earth-vineyard, trying to plant seeds of justice and peace, of love and reconciliation. The ground is rocky and uneven; there are hecklers along the vineyard rows who laugh at our efforts and taunt us to plant seeds of revenge and greed and prejudice.

It would be an impossible task were it not for the Owner's Son working beside us, affirming our efforts and inspiring our weary spirits with his vision of God's reign.







Dear Fathers and Deacons,

The term ordained ministry somehow just doesn't capture what your vocation has meant to me. Perhaps we have come to identify the term ordained ministry with hierarchical structure or cultic priesthood too much. Ordained ministry for me does not exist as an abstract term, but as I have experienced its meaning incarnate in your lives.

You began to define ordained ministry for me when I was just a child and met you, not only in treasured sacramental moments but in my classroom and on the playground and in my home. Your presence

was integral to my growth in faith, far more through your example of service than the sermons which were sometimes beyond me.

It is no wonder you became heroes to me, living day in and day out the kind of discipleship to which I aspired. In my teenage years of doubts, you strengthened my belonging with God's people by listening to my questions and sharing your answers—but never imposing them. Ordained ministry meant late night discussions on your front porch, and the bond of a shared toboggan-ride. And, while you could have easily swayed our young minds and eager spirits to follow you, always you pointed to the Lord and encouraged us to be his disciples.

We have journeyed now, companions in adulthood, and I know new dimensions of ordained ministry. I am grateful for your vocation as I hunger more deeply for the eucharist, as I know more poignantly the need for forgiveness. We have been fellow pilgrims in strange lands, colleagues in ministry, friends who have shared struggles, overcome misunderstandings, cried, laughed, and celebrated together.

I have come to know you not only in the breaking of bread, but in the discovery of our common humanity. I no longer call you my heroes, I call you my

Because I have known you, ordained ministry has taken on a special meaning for me.





me?"


THANKING GOD

OCTOBER 28, 1990 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time

The commandment to love God and its inseparable corollary of loving our neighbor was not first announced by Jesus. In today's first reading from the book of Exodus, God, as the Hebrews understood God, speaks of God's concern for aliens, for the widow and the orphan, for debtors, for our neighbors. Loving God has always been connected with loving those whom God loves: everyone. God announces: "I am compassionate" which is both a comfort in our neediness and a call to likewise meet our neighbor's neediness with that

same compassion.

There are those, of course, who attempted to divorce love of God from love of neighbor. There are those who claimed to be God's favorites and thus excuse or even defend their injustice toward others.

Jesus, unfortunately, not only spoke of the inseparableness of love of God and love of neighbor, he also lived that way. He made it impossible to claim that one could love God apart from loving neighbor. That was not good news to those who lived otherwise.

IOY AND THE HOLY SPIRIT

In Paul's Letter to the Thessalonians, he speaks of those who "became imitators of the Lord," who "received the word despite great trials." Loving God and neighbor as Jesus did is not easy nor, in fact, even very acceptable sometimes. As Jesus' witness and life of healing and forgiving was an irritant to those who lived differently, so today's Christian is an irritant to others.

If we strive to "imitate the Lord," we can rest assured that there will be "great trials" visited upon us by those who have us buy into society's values. Yet, we can also be assured that the "joy that comes from the Holy Spirit" will be ours as well—a deep lasting joy.

There are some people who might claim that the "greatest commandment" has changed since Jesus' time. They might attempt to convince us that money or self-aggrandisement should be loved above all.

But if we ask people of faith what is the greatest commandment, their answer remains the same: "love God and neighbor."





There is a poster which proclaims: "After all is said and done, there is much more said than done." The Scribes and Pharisees had the right words, the correct teaching. They just didn't live what they taught.

Among African-American preachers, there is a phrase which says: "You have to walk the talk." We've often heard the injunction: "Practice what you preach." Because we are human, there is often a gap between the ideals and beliefs we articulate

and the way we act. Our ongoing conversion is our effort, with God's help, to narrow the gap.

Children are often the prophets who call us to grow in integrity between our words and our actions. In the midst of a white lie, the adult hears: "But Dad, I thought you said we should tell the truth." Overhearing unkind gossip, it is the child who says: "We're only supposed to say nice things, right, Mom?" If we are serious about our discipleship and our beliefs, we would welcome such prophets—whatever their age.

THE WORD OF GOD

Paul reassures the Thessalonians in today's second reading that "the Word of God is at work with you who believe."

As we struggle to bring our actions into harmony with what we profess to believe, Paul's message can be comforting. The fact that we do believe, that we are conscious of our failures to act on our beliefs, is proof that the Word of God is at work within us.

The trick—the challenge—in today's society is to not let that Word of God be drowned out by the blare of materialism nor the shouts of personal gain.

We hear God's Word in today's liturgy, and if we are attentive, that Word finds an echo of affirmation in our own hearts; we hear God's Word as we speak and as we listen in prayer and find direction for our actions; we hear God's Word from the "prophets" in our lives—children and adults—who support and challenge our efforts to match our deeds to our beliefs.

That Word of God calls us to serve. And service is greatness in God's reign.



understand your truth

NOVEMBER 11, 1990 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

How glibly we use the word knowledge today! Whether we read an article, or hear an interview, or simply have a passing acquaintance with someone at a party, we are prone to declare: "Oh, I know her well!" A cursory glance at a textbook or a one night mini-course finds us "knowing" the subject matter thoroughly.

We have long since lost the power and the passion which characterized the biblical notion of knowing. Perhaps the most revealing scriptural use of "to know" is that it was often equated with sexual union. "To know" a man or a woman implied a depth of relationship and intimacy which was profound and lasting.

So, too, the biblical sense of "knowing God" implied far more than a cursory intellectual grasp. To "know God" was to be in relationship with God, to share God's life intimately.

If we have lost the biblical meaning of knowledge, it is likely that we have also trivialized the Spirit's gift of knowledge. The Spirit, after all, is not in the business of assisting us with multiple choice tests nor standardized final exams. The Spirit's gift of knowledge, with its roots in our scriptural tradition, draws upon all the richness of the ancient understanding of "to know."

KNOWING GOD

The Spirit's gift of knowledge is not simply familiarity with facts about God. It is not just knowing about God, it is knowing God. Facts about a person may be interesting, but to really know a person is to enter into a relationship.

And so the Spirit's gift of knowledge prompts us to continually grow in our intellectual grasp of God and simultaneously, in our loving response to what we know about God. The Spirit leads us to choose that vocation through which we can best proclaim our knowledge of God and best witness to the intimate relationship with God which that knowledge implies.

May our chosen vocations lead us to grow in knowing God, that all who meet us may come to know God through us.





NOVEMBER 18, 1990 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Paul, in today's second reading, reminds the Thessalonians of the gift of light which they have been given: the light of faith in Jesus.

We, too, "are children of the light," gifted with the message and values of Jesus. Thank God our ancestors in faith did not consider themselves piggy banks for the light of Christ, willing to simply keep it safe and return it to the giver. Instead, these people, our distant ancestors, our grandparents and parents, invested the light of Christ in us. And so, each generation reaps the rewards of light-well-spent for

the sake of the Kingdom. No doubt those who have thus gone before us have heard the words of today's gospel: "Come, share your Master's joy!"

The temptation, of course, when we have something of great value is to keep it safe. The trouble with keeping the light of Christ to ourselves is that such hoarding extinguishes the fire.

SHARE MY JOY

While there are certainly material goods which do not increase directly by giving them away, things of spiritual value do. Ask anyone who has tried to give friendship away, or love, or truth, or trust. Those who have those gifts and give them freely find not a depletion of their store but a remarkable increase instead.

There is a risk involved in investing such gifts, of course. Love can be unrequited; trust betrayed; truth doubted; friendship refused. Yet, the investor is none the poorer for having risked the treasure, and the manifold returns of those risks which paid off far exceed the pain of other disappointments.

Ultimately, our ability to invest depends upon our belief in our own gifts, and our trust of the Master who has gifted us. He, who was willing to risk his best on tax collectors and prostitutes, bids us to risk investing too-"Come, share my iov!"





NOVEMBER 25, 1990 • Christ the King

Today's readings have an interesting rhythm: God is our shepherd; the risen Christ will triumph; we shall face judgment. We are comforted by the shepherd image; our hope is assured by Christ's triumph; then comes the gospel. Our share in glory has its price! lesus challenges us beyond the theology of "the unseen guest at every meal." Jesus identifies, not with the void left by the empty place but rather with the people who occupy the other seats. We needn't set an extra place for Jesus. Jesus is already present in the mother and father, brother and sister, grandparents, neighbors, and friends who dine with us, work with us, play with us.

Jesus' identification the "the least ones" was a surprise—and an affront—to many people in his day. There is something comfortable about a distant God, one who can be kept in the temple and acknowledge when it is convenient.

But a God who identifies with all people, even no, especially—"the least ones," cannot be so easily relegated to one location and selected times. Such a God permeates every place, every person, every circumstance of our lives. It pretty much depends on how we treat other people whether we consider that the presence of God is a joy or an annoyance.

INHERIT THE KINGDOM

When people write their wills, they sometimes put stipulations on how the heirs are to use their inheritance. Sometimes bequests are held in trust until a person becomes an adult. Jesus places one logical condition on inheriting the heavenly Kingdom: that we have endeavored to build it while we are on earth.

There is no doubt that we, given our human limitations, will forget, now and then, that Jesus identifies with the person who turns to us for a drink, or a welcome, or for comfort.

We have really chosen, though, to be sheep, to be placed at God's right hand on judgment day. Christ is our King, and we celebrate his presence not with an empty place, but in the people who gather around our table.





"Be on guard," Jesus says to his disciples, and it could sound like an ominous warning. The image which Jesus uses, however, is of servants awaiting their master's return. They are not on guard against robbers nor enemies. They are on guard for the one who feeds them and gives them shelter. Jesus has already come, and while we expect his final coming, we know that he dwells among us now. If we look around, we see Jesus among us: in our families, in our co-workers, in the poor and the alienated.

If we are awake and on guard, expectantly awaiting Jesus this Advent season, the wait will be short. For those whose faith falters and whose hope has grown dim, Jesus' presence is not so clear. Unless, of course, we are willing to be heralds of Jesusamong-us. Our faith and our hope are unwrappable, but they are the greatest gifts we can give to those on our Christmas list.

GOD IS FAITHFUL

Today's first reading moves through many emotions. Isaiah's words speak of people wandering

from God, and of the desire for God to "rend the heavens and come down." Isaiah speaks guilt and a sense of abandonment, but ends with words of trust

God did, long after Israel's request, "rend the heavens and come down." God sent Emmanuel, God-with-us.

In today's second reading, Paul declares that "God is faithful." We have God's word and Jesus' life to testify that God-with-us has not left town. But our world needs heralds—to declare God's presence, to discern the Spirit of Jesus at work, to assure us of God's faithfulness. Perhaps we do not need to be "constantly on guard" for Jesus among us, as we need to be constantly aware of those who need to hear about and to feel Jesus' presence through us.

Today's Readings: Is. 63:16-17, 19; 64:2-7; 1 Cor. 1:3-9; Mk. 13:33-37.



"Comfort, give comfort to my people," God says through the prophet Isaiah.

Many of our Christmas preparations are intended to comfort people. The rich traditions comfort families with a sense of rootedness; gifts comfort those who are remembered; celebrations comfort those who seek companionship.

For those without families and friends, comfort at Christmas, as on any other day, is a rare commodity. Those who have no home are hardly comforted by colored lights; those who have no food find little need for other gifts; those who live in alienation or despair find no one with whom to celebrate.

"Comfort, comfort my people," God says and if our Christmas preparations heed God's request, then the homeless, the hungry, the rejected will have a place on our Christmas list and comfort shall be the gift we give.

A NEW HEAVEN AND A NEW EARTH

In today's second reading, Peter addresses a challenge to those who believe in Jesus.

Interestingly, Peter begins his admonishments with "what sort of people must you not be." It is interesting to reflect upon the sort of people we shouldn't be in today's quickly changing world.

Society gives us some clear answers about what we shouldn't be: unsuccessful, poor, powerless, unpopular. But the Advent season asks us to consider other answers to the questions: "What sort of people should we be?" Peter supplies a few of them: "be holy in your conduct and your devotion, looking for the coming of the day of God and trying to hasten it; be found without stain or defilement, and at peace in God's sight.

What sort of people are we trying to be this Advent? Peter speaks of the new heavens and the new earth which we await and where "the justice of God will reside." Jesus, whose birth we will celebrate, said: "Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for justice." Perhaps being people who are just—at home, at work, in our communities—is a good way to prepare for Christmas. And a good start for a new earth!

With each Advent, with each Christmas, a "new year of favor from the Lord" is begun. And the year to come will be favorable insofar as we carry the mission of Jesus.


DO NOT STIFLE THE SPIRIT

The "year of favor from the Lord," mentioned in today's first reading is both a gift and a task. We are beloved of God, recipients of God's Spirit, and valued members of our faith community. We are indeed favored, but we are called to announce—in word and deed—the same favor to all God's people.

All those who celebrate Christmas do not necessarily celebrate Jesus and his mission. The lowly, the brokenhearted, captives and prisoners are no more popular in our society than they were in Jesus' day.

The Spirit of Jesus can be easily stifled by those whose values, power, and position harden their hearts to those in need. The Spirit of Jesus can be stifled by those who water down his mission and try to rationalize their prejudices and their apathy toward justice and equality.

The Spirit of Jesus is alive and active in those who follow Paul's advice: "Rejoice always, never cease praying, render constant thanks." If joy, prayer, and thanksgiving are hallmarks of

A Dominican Mother General was visiting her order's homesick postulants one Christmas eve. The young women, far from their families and friends. were hungry for a word of comfort. The Mother General delivered the comfort they sought, but it was laced with challenge as well. She shared with the postulants the eager expectancy of the season, and commiserated with their lonesomeness. The Mother General ended with a simple, wise statement: "If Jesus did not leave his home, there wouldn't be a Christmas.'

The Mother General's words are a reminder aptly addressed to all who pursue discipleship, and who know and feel the cost of following Jesus. There is, not just for religious sisters, but for all who live their Christian vocation something to be left behind.

Those who are vowed religious or priests leave behind the joy of having their own spouse and children, in order to give more to their community. Those who are called to marriage leave behind some individual hopes and dreams that they might give themselves the common dream of a Christian family; those who choose a single Christian life style may sacrifice the intimacy of a shared life in order to make their contribution to society; missionaries leave their homeland, and some followers of lesus leave their very lives behind as they promote justice and equality.

FOLLOW ME

lesus left his home to walk with us; those who answer Jesus' call "Come, follow me," leave behind at least some of what home means. Following Jesus involves some loss of security and comfort, some loss of popularity as we stand firm for gospel values, some loss even of family and friends when our discipleship is misunderstood or our vocation is questioned.

If lesus did not leave his home, there wouldn't be a Christmas. If we, his disciples, are willing to leave some things behind, his mission of love and justice will go on. And our home will one day be with Jesus.



DECEMBER 30, 1990 Holy Family

In many ways we do not choose our families. Though husband and wife choose each other, the children born to them are not selected; children do not choose their parents, nor do parents have the option of picking out siblings. But all of us -individually and collectively as our own families—are chosen by God, and in that chosenness lies the foundation of our being holy persons and holy families.

In today's second reading, Paul gives us some

advice about how we can grow in that holiness. "Clothe yourselves with heartfelt mercy, with kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. Bear with one another...forgive whatever grievances... put on love."

There are few families which could claim having perfectly followed Paul's directives. Rather than bemoaning our failures to be merciful and kind, forebearing and forgiving, we might celebrate this feast by reflecting on our successes. How have we lived together in holiness? How have we been the presence of Christ to one another?

GIVE THANKS TO GOD

Comparisons are not always helpful. It certainly would not affirm our holiness as family to compare ourselves with the virgin mother conceived without original sin and the Messiah-son. Neither is it always helpful to compare our family with families of the past if we claim that holiness dwells only in the specific make-up and traditions of those families. In fact, such unfair comparisons hold two dangers: one is that we fail to recognize our own family's holiness; the other is that we excuse ourselves from striving for that holiness which we perceive as beyond our grasp.

The call to be holy is universally extended to all those who share the name family. We express our holiness, as Jesus' family did, in ways which are unique to our time and our gifts yet faithful to gospel values.

Today's feast invites us to celebrate the Holy Family, and the holiness of the families of which we are members.


