Dear Parishioners,

The Christmas Season comes to its end today, the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. On Christmas Day, we celebrated the manifestation of the Lord Jesus as the promised Messiah of the nation Israel. On the Feast of the Epiphany, Jesus was manifested as the Savior of all people. With today's feast, Jesus is manifested as the Son of God, sent on mission to redeem all nations and peoples through his sacrificial life. Today we recall that, just as the Baptism of Jesus began his faithful and obedient mission, our Baptism did the same for us. Claimed as God's own, Jesus accepts the course set for his life. Claimed as God's own daughters and sons, we must discern God's life-plan for us and faithfully follow the road set out for us.

We had, I believe, wonderful celebrations for our Christmas Masses. Our annual parish Christmas Caroling and Dinner was well-attended and, as usual, a delightful evening for all who took the time to participate. On your behalf, I thank all those many, many people who helped to make all of this a reality for us. Through their efforts, we all were blessed and had true cause to proclaim our joy in the Lord during this Christmas Season!

Thanks to all who sent words of greetings and gifts to members of our parish Staff. We are truly grateful for your thoughtfulness and generosity!

As I have said before, this is going to be a busy, active year. Archbishop Gregory Aymond has inaugurated here in our Archdiocese the year of Family and Faith and it will continue throughout 2013. Our parish begins a year-long celebration of our 50th Anniversary in June. On January 22, the members of our Pastoral Staff and those who serve on our Pastoral Council, Finance Council and School Board will meet to help move along the implementation of the Master Plan for our parish facilities as we lay the foundation for a capital campaign to fund this vital project. So, take a deep breath, because we'll soon be in high gear!

We extend our congratulations to Ron Drez, Tom Kratochvil and Robert Pendzimaz, who were accepted as Candidates for Holy Orders in a liturgy celebrated by Archbishop Aymond on December 26. Prior to this liturgy, these men, along with twenty others from around the Archdiocese, made known to the Archbishop their desire to continue in formation for the diaconate. In that liturgy, the Archbishop affirmed their request and accepted them into the body of candidates for ordination as deacons.

On Wednesday, January 30, Archbishop Gregory Aymond will be with us for this Sacrament, and will call down the gifts of the Holy Spirit on 42 young people of our parish. Pray that they will be open to these gifts, and eager to use them for service in our Church and, especially, in our parish community!

Dear Parishioners,

Today we honor our patroness, St. Angela Merici, as we celebrate her feast at all of our Masses. As Deacon David preaches, let us be attentive to his message, that we may embrace the good example of St. Angela in our own lives. STEERING COMMITTEE/MASTER PLAN IMPLEMENTATION UPDATE: As I shared with you, in December, we received permission from Archbishop Gregory Aymond to proceed with the implementation of the Master Plan developed for our parish facilities by moving toward a Capital Campaign to raise the funds needed for this important project.

Last Fall, the task of the Steering Committee was to have a Feasibility Study undertaken with our parishioners. The purpose of this study was to determine your understanding of the scope and purpose of this project and to ascertain the level of support we could anticipate from our parishioners if a campaign was pursued.

That study showed that a majority of parishioners understood the project and are willing to support it financially. But it also showed that it would be helpful, before soliciting financial support, for us to continue to explain the plan scope, purpose and need.

The report also provided us with very valuable information about how to begin to structure a campaign and the number of people we would need actually to conduct the campaign properly.

In January of this year, I asked all those who had been serving on this Steering Committee to decide if they were willing to recommit to this service as we enter the next phase of planning. These are the people who have made a commitment to you to continue this service: Marilyn Berni, Eric Broadbridge, Scott Corrente, Robert Coussou, Bart Dornier, Larry DeBlieux, Peggy Lulich, Teresa Miller, Patrick Morris, Debbie and Wayne Pierce, Clay Plaisance, Elaine Ridgley, Glenn Scorsone, and Billy Steen.

Also serving, from our Pastoral Staff, are Colleen Remont, our School Principal, and Jackie Appleton, our parish Business Manager.

This group met on Thursday, January 17 and, at that meeting, we formed two standing committees: an Executive Committee and a Publicity Committee.

The purpose of the Executive Committee will be to meet with me to set the agenda for subsequent meetings, to evaluate meetings after they have been held and to begin to define the time-line for all phases of the Campaign's development and execution. Teresa Miller, Pat Morris, Clay Plaisance and Billy Steen volunteered to serve on this committee.

The purpose of the Publicity Committee will be to determine what information needs to be shared with you and how best to do it, then to create the materials needed for this publicity.

Following the plan proposed for the Campaign by the Institute of School and Parish Development (who conducted the Feasibility Study), we need LOTS of volunteers for the campaign to be a success. At our meeting, we began to surface names of people we thought would be willing and able to assist. We will continue this conversation at our next meeting, because we did not surface anywhere near the number of volunteers we will have to recruit!

Debbie and Wayne Pierce generously offered to host a meeting for Campaign volunteers in their home, and we'll take them up on that offer!

Let me be very honest with you: The success of this project depends not only on the cooperation of all parishioners, but on your spirit of willing sacrifice as well. We will need the sacrifice of your time as you offer special prayer for the campaign's success. We will also need the sacrifice of time from volunteers who step forward to work in the campaign. We will, of course, need your willing sacrifice in making a monetary pledge for the Campaign, contributions in addition to your continuing ordinary church support in the Sunday collection.

I hope that we can rely on that spirit of sacrifice. All that we have today here at St. Angela has been the gift of a previous generation to us. Now it is our time to create our legacy for the next generation. This is a bold undertaking, but it can be a joyful and successful one if each of us do our part!

On Wednesday of this week, Archbishop Aymond will be with us to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation. Please keep all of the Confirmation candidates in your prayers this week that the Holy Spirit will fill their hearts as they make this step in their journey of faith.

Also, this is Catholic Schools Week. We acknowledge and thank all those who serve in our school ministry and thank them for their dedicated service to our youth! 

Dear Parishioners,

Sunday, February 3 is the Memorial of St. Blase, Bishop and Martyr, who lived in Armenia during the fourth century. Legend tells us that an anxious mother scurried to St. Blase with her little boy. A fish-bone had lodged in his throat. The saint called for two candles, lit them, held them in the form of a cross under the boy's chin, recited some prayers and gave his blessing. Almost immediately the fish-bone loosened and was easily removed. Many such cures, obtained through prayer to this saint, give foundation to the hope that the blessing of St. Blase will prevent troubles of the throat.

There are troubles of the throat that are physical, but also spiritual diseases of the throat: the hoarseness of unkind speech, choking curses and gagging lies, etc.

As we seek the intercession of this Saint in the annual blessing, let us pray that we will, indeed, be spared of all "diseases of the throat."

We will give the blessing of the throats after all Masses this Sunday, February 3, for those who would like to receive it.

The day before St. Blase's feast is the feast of the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple. This feast recalls how Joseph and Mary brought Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem, in accord with Jewish law, to dedicate their first-born son to God. This law, the Jewish people believed, was to remind the people how God brought them out of Egypt on the night of Passover, when the angel of death passed over the homes of the Israelites and spared them from the punishment inflicted on all the first-born sons of the Egyptians.

This is also a feast of lights, for the Church honors Jesus as the light who came into the world to enlighten all people. And so, on Saturday, February 2, at the 8:30 a.m. Mass, we will bless candles for home use, a sacramental to serve as a reminder of the light offered us by Christ, the true light.

These blessed candles will be made available to you after each Mass on the weekend of February 2-3. They will be on tables in the sanctuary. We request a nominal offering of \$5 for each box of candles, to help us defray the cost to the parish.

We wish all of you a safe and Happy Mardi Gras!

The SAM School Parade takes place in the school yard on Friday at 11:00 a.m. All are invited to join our school community in their special celebration of Mardi Gras.

In order to secure our parish campus, please note that there will be no Confessions on Saturday, February 9. As soon as all the cars have left the parking lot from 4:00 p.m. Mass, the gates will be closed and locked for the evening.

Please keep in mind that, on the few occasions we do cancel Confessions, Fr. Marlon and I are available to set a time with you for the celebration of this Sacrament during the week, if you feel that you cannot wait until the following weekend.

I sometimes hear people say that they don't want to "bother" us with those kinds of requests. It's not a bother to either of us: this is why we're here, so don't hesitate to call!

It is important that we keep in mind that Mardi Gras is not an end in itself: it is merely the prelude to Lent, a season of penance and sacrifice. While Mardi Gras is frivolity, Lent is serious.

After we have fun with abandon, we focus with intensity on the life to which Christ calls us: a life of prayer and dedicated service, the kind of service that can be offered only when we are willing to give of ourselves sacrificially.

In this Year of Family and Faith in our Archdiocese, Archbishop Gregory Aymond challenges us to sacrifice time to consider carefully, to dedicate ourselves to, and to celebrate in a special way family life (no matter what the shape or size our family might be!).

During Lent, the Archbishop is asking families to read and reflect on a pamphlet on family life that will be distributed through the parish for four of the six weeks of Lent. We will, of course, be making those pamphlets available to you each week.

Then, as we did last year when we reflected on the Mass during the Year of Renewal, the Archbishop asks that we join together in homes in the parish with our families to share thoughts on these booklets' articles.

We are asking all those who serve in leadership roles in parish organizations to host such a session for families in their neighborhoods and to invite neighboring families to participate. As we did last year, we will also host some groups here in our parish meeting rooms, which members of the Pastoral Staff will host and lead.

Sign-up sheets for these groups will be in church on the First and Second Sundays of Lent and the sessions will begin during the Second Week of Lent.

If you would like to host a group in your home, please contact Sr. Paula (835-0324) so that we can provide you with the Leaders' materials.







Dear Parishioners,

Now, let's get serious! Mardi Gras is over and Lent is here.

We remove the masks and costumes that hide our true identity and put on, at least figuratively, sackcloth and ashes. We put aside frivolity and make-believe and confront ourselves as we truly are: people in need of on-going renewal of life.

Lent began as the time of final and intense preparation by catechumens for entry into the Church through the Sacraments of Initiation. Just as Jesus went into the desert for forty days to prepare for his final journey to Jerusalem and the cross of our salvation, so too, in the early Church, catechumens made that forty-day journey to the saving Sacraments and the new life of active membership in the Church.

Over time, those already Baptized realized that they, too, could use renewal and so entered into that same journey through prayer, fasting and acts of charity. In this, they united in spirit with those coming into the Church and grace example to them that the Sacraments they were to receive BEGAN a life, not brought it to conclusion.

Every Lent each of us is challenged to reflect carefully on how we need to grow to be closer with the Lord in the new life of Easter. We undertake both personal and communal acts of prayer, fasting and good deeds as a means to pursue that life.

Please take home and use each day of Lent the reflection booklets, "Turning Our Hearts to God," that we made available to you last weekend, for use beginning on Ash Wednesday.

This year, Archbishop Gregory Aymond has asked all of us to incorporate this Year of Family and Faith into our Lenten lives. For adults, he asks that we come together in small discussion groups to reflect and to share thoughts on creating in our homes an increasingly healthy and happy family life.



Dear Parishioners,

Last Sunday afternoon at St. Louis Cathedral, Henry Bonck and Christopher Roques of our community were welcomed by Archbishop Gregory Aymond. These two men, along with many others from throughout the Archdiocese, entered the final steps of their preparation for Reception into the Full Communion of the Catholic Church this Easter. Both Henry and Christopher, presently are members of other Christian Churches, are nearing their journey to our Catholic Church. I ask you to keep them in your prayers during the remainder of this Lenten Season, that they may continue to open their hearts to the guidance of the Holy Spirit on their journeys of faith.

During this Lent, we journey, too. We seek renewal of life through our prayer, fasting and good works. Our willingness to sacrifice for others and our prayers for them also bring us closer to the Lord, as we seek to be renewed in mind and heart.

Please consider seriously Archbishop Aymond's invitation, during this Year of Family and Faith, to participate in one of the discussion groups on family life. Your sacrifice of time for these four sessions, which begin this week, can be an aid to the renewal of family life, not only in your home, but in the homes of others with whom you will be able to share thoughts, insights and reflections. As I said in my homily last weekend, we travel this journey of faith *together* and so we need to be willing both to give and to receive support from each other for this journey to be successful for all. The sign-up sheets are on the tables in church through this weekend.

For the first session, please read in advance pages 2 and 3 of the booklet, both the Archbishop's introductory letter and the article entitled, "What Kind of Family Do You Want?"

I know that not everyone is able to participate in these sessions and, if you cannot, please keep in your prayers those who will be participating: pray for their openness in sharing and in hearing the insights of others in their groups; pray for their families, that they may grow in love. I believe in the power of intercessory prayer, and hope you do too!

With their catechists and their parents, they have been preparing more intensely for the past several weeks for this Sacrament. May they truly experience the compassionate heart of Christ in this celebration.

Our Archdiocese will be privileged to host, at the New Orleans Museum of Art, an exhibit on the life and ministry of Blessed John Paul II. The exhibit's title is "Portrait of Faith: John Paul II in Life and Art." The exhibit will include memorabilia from the Vatican, from his hometown in Poland, from the John Paul II Center in Washington, and from the Papal Visit here in New Orleans in 1987. The exhibit runs from March 8 through June 16.



Dear Parishioners,

I am hopeful that you are using this Lenten Season to deepen and broaden your life of prayer. More people are joining us for our weekday morning Masses, and that is a great way to begin the day with Mass. Of course I realize that this is not possible for everyone, and so the Lenten reflection booklets that we distributed to you provide a reflection on the Mass readings of the day, so that the Word of God can guide your thoughts and actions for the day (I have been using this every day and really like it). We have seen an increased attendance at Stations of the Cross on Friday evenings, as we consider in a quiet, devotional prayer the great sacrifice of Christ.

Stations of the Cross is a popular Lenten devotional prayer. Please remember that we pray the Stations each Friday of Lent beginning now at 5:30 p.m.

I have asked you to unite in special intercessory prayer: for Henry Bonck and Christopher Roques of our community, who are in their final weeks of preparation for Reception into the Full Communion of the Catholic Church this Easter. In addition, I have asked you to pray for the young people of our parish preparing who had been preparing for and now have celebrated First Penance, and for whom you can now continue to pray as their begin their preparation for First Holy Communion during the Easter Season.

Lent is also about action: doing good deeds to increase in ourselves that sacrificial spirit of Christ -like service and to bring new life to others. Even though the discussion groups on Family life have already begun, it's not too late to join one. Feel free to contact Sr. Paula at the parish office to see which group might meet your schedule. Bringing new life to our families would be a wonderful goal for this Lenten Season, embedded as it is in our Archdiocesan Year of Family and Faith.

If you are not able to participate in one of these groups, I invite you to take one of the booklets that are available now at the doors of church and to read them and reflect on them – or perhaps discuss them as a couple or with older children as a family in your own home.

If you are a member of a group, for this week's discussion, please read the article on pages 4 and 5 of the booklet, "Discipline Isn't a Four-Letter Word," before you attend your group's gathering.



Dear Parishioners.

Congratulations (I think!) to Father Philip Landry, who has been named by Archbishop Gregory Aymond as the next Rector of St. Louis Cathedral. The announcement was made this past weekend, though the assignment will not become effective until the first weekend in July. I have known Father Landry since he was a student at Notre Dame Seminary (I was teaching there at the time) and know him to be a dedicated priest and a very good administrator. 



As I heard the sound of lawnmowers and edgers this past week, as I walked over to the residence one day for lunch and saw the azalea bushes around the church in near-full bloom, as the daylight shone until after 7:00 p.m., I realized that Spring is indeed here. It is time to leave the darkness, the cold, the dead behind us and celebrate life.

That is what this special week of the Church Year tells us: come to life. Come to life in and with Christ!

Today, as we lift our palm branches high, we acclaim that, through our Lenten acts of penance, self-discipline, prayer and charity, we have learned that Jesus is new life. We can leave, we have left (!) behind us the darkness of sin and selfishness, the darkness of inversion, and have stepped out into the brightness of hope and care and freedom. We acclaim Jesus our Messiah, as did those crowds who welcomed him that first Palm Sunday into Jerusalem.

This Holy Week is our journey with Christ into that act of dying and rising and the embrace of all that God has to offer us. We, like Christ, enter this week with sincerity of heart, with abiding trust in God, with renewed hope. We celebrate this week our confidence that God will raise us up and make of us a new creation, that God will fill our hearts and our Church with new life.

Please keep in your prayers this week in a most special way our new Holy Father, Francis I, that he will be a well-spring of life and hope in our Church through his ministry as Vicar of Christ. Pray for all of those preparing for the Sacraments of Initiation, especially Henry Bonck and Christopher Roques of our community and the children of our parish preparing for their First Holy Communion. We pray that all of them may bring new enthusiasm, new joy and new commitment to our parish life and to our Church.

On Good Friday, March 29, we pray the Solemn Liturgy of the Passion of the Lord at 3:00 p.m.

There is what I find to be a peculiarly-growing practice of crawfish boils on Good Friday afternoon, even among Catholics, *replacing* participation in this inspiring liturgy. Now, I have nothing against joining family and friends for a crawfish boil, but it seems to me that could be done before or after this liturgy, not in place of! WE, as Catholics, show our abiding gratitude for the suffering and death of Jesus, we take time to contemplate this wondrous love, and we unite our sufferings with his as we come together for this liturgy.


