





I am honored that Archbishop Hughes has chosen me to succeed Msgr. Kern and I renew to him my pledge of fidelity.





Dear Parishioners,

From the Pastor's Desk

I have finally finished unpacking (that took longer than I thought – how did I manage to accumulate so much stuff?!?!), and have been spending time meeting with various parish leaders. By the time you get to read this, I will have met with our parish deacons, our school principal, our DRE, our Director of Music and the President of the Pastoral Council. I am meeting this week with Mr. Leon Mathes, Chief Administrative Officer of the Archdiocese to discuss parish finances (as every new pastor is required to do), and then I will meet with the Chairperson of our parish Finance Council. In August, I will meet with our Pastoral and Finance Councils. I am doing all of this, obviously first of all, to get to know our parish leaders better, and to hear from them their evaluations of parish life, ministries and directions so that I can begin to determine how I can work with all of these ministers, leaders and groups to serve you as your pastor. I have been greatly impressed with how well the parish is organized, how active our ministries and organizations are, how willing all of you are to serve the Lord by serving one another. I am eager to work closely with you in all of these ministries and organizations.

I have very much appreciated the opportunity to preside at the Masses that I have had thus far. The quality

of active, prayerful, musical participation is wonderful!

I will continue to meet with parish leaders and look forward to begin to attend the meetings and activities of the various parish organizations. There are a lot of new names to learn; please be patient with me as I do. I will not be offended if you continue to tell me your names when I meet you in church or around the parish; in fact, that will help me tremendously.

While it is not my "style" to come into a parish and begin making changes, there are two things that I need to


modify and so call to your attention:

First of all, we have a group of people who have agreed to open the church on weekday mornings and set up for Mass. In response to their request, we will open the church each morning at 5:45 a.m. That will allow sufficient time for each person who opens up to get the lights on and things in place before the recitation of the Rosary begins.

Second, I have been accustomed to taking an over-night day off, which I find allows me time to rest up and stay fresh in ministry. We will begin next week to have a Communion Service, led by one of our deacons, at 6:15 on Tuesday mornings. I will leave for my day off after the Monday morning Mass and will return to the parish on Tuesday mornings. If we do, in the future, have a parochial vicar assigned to the parish, we will, of course, reinstate the Mass immediately.

I renew my request to you to pray for me as I get settled into my new life here with you, and be assured that you are in my prayers as well!



Dear Parishioners,

When I was young, Saturday night was "Date Night." That was a long time ago! Now Saturday night is simply "Rest Up for Sunday Morning Night." As much as I love all of the activities of Sunday: celebrating Mass and preaching, seeing



and visiting with parishioners, celebrating Baptisms, Sundays wear me out. So, Saturday night is quiet time for me, amassing all the energy I can to face Sunday morning. Sometimes I read, but most of the time, I simply sit in a comfortable chair in front of the television, since that takes no more energy than pushing a button on the remote control. And most Saturday nights, I end up watching decorators and neighbors remodel (or, oftentimes, pretty much destroy) a room in people's homes on "Trading Spaces." As other viewers of this television series know, this show allows a couple two days for remodeling a room in their neighbors' house, and the first day always ends with the decorator assigning "homework" that will keep the couple up all night as the decorator leaves for a refreshing and renewing evening of quiet.

When I met with Msgr. Kern before my official arrival here at St. Angela, he told me about a few projects that would merit my quick attention, some homework he left for me. In my meetings with our deacons, DRE and Pastoral Council President, I have learned about a few other projects as well!

One of these is that our Pastoral Council is currently considered an "interim Council," called together four years ago to work on the plans and goals of Catholic Life 2000 for our parish and our deanery, and revised as Catholic Life 2003 just during these past few months. My homework, as Msgr. Kern gave it to me: lead the Pastoral Council in writing a Constitution. This, of course, also means study, consultation and reflection on the structure and membership and size of the Council and how members actually are called to serve on the Council. We have a Stewardship Committee with one member: my homework is to help this committee grow and develop. The Pastoral Council has discussed for a long time a marriage enrichment program but has never implemented it: more homework. Our Liturgy Committee has never met and a planned adult education series on the liturgy was left up to me to work with our DRE and deacons to flesh out.

Bottom line: we're going to be busy completing our homework! On September 9, I will be meeting with our Pastoral and Finance Councils together to review with them the goals and priorities of Catholic Life 2003 and, with their consultation, input and leadership begin to discern where to begin. I always did enjoy school and I'm not afraid of homework, so it all looks exciting to me!

Special thanks to all who helped plan, prepare and serve at the reception this past Sunday following my official installation as your pastor by our Dean, Msgr. Frank Giroir. I thank all of you who took the time to join us for the Mass and reception. You have made me feel very welcomed here at St. Angela, and I am truly grateful to you all!





Each year, in the Fall, we begin the annual process known as "RCIA" -


the Rites of Christian Initiation of Adults. Based on practices that go all the way back to the late second or early third centuries, we welcome new members into our Church through a time of instruction, spiritual formation and liturgical rituals. While the process is called the Rites of Christian Initiation, there is much more then merely a series of rituals. Prayer and study, particularly the prayer of Sunday Mass and study based on the Scripture form the real core of this process. We are grateful that Deacon Gil Schmidt has been leading the RCIA process in our parish and continues to do so. RCIA will begin soon, and it is time for us to extend an invitation to those who wish to become members of the Catholic Church to come and join us for this year's sessions.

While the RCIA is primarily intended for those adults who have never been baptized into any Church or who have been baptized in another Christian religion but who now wish to become Catholic, we also welcome adults who were baptized Catholic and who, for any reason, might not have shared yet in the sacrament of Confirmation and thus are seeking to complete the Catholic sacraments of initiation.

If anyone is interested in beginning this process or if you have any questions at all about the process, please feel free to contact us at the parish office. We will have Deacon Gil contact you.

But this is also a time for those of us who are already active, practicing Catholics to reach out to others we know whom we think might be interested in the RCIA process and extend to them a personal invitation to consider whether their journey of faith is leading them to life with us in the Catholic community.

I have always been involved in the RCIA process in other parishes in which I have served, and I look forward to offering my services to Deacon Gil and those who will be in our RCIA process this year, that we will all journey together, supporting one another as we seek the wisdom of the Lord and his life in the Catholic Church.


Dear Parishioners.

That final mandate from the Risen Christ was clear, simple and direct. It was also a most awesome challenge. "Go out to all the world and spread the Good News." It's challenging enough to do this even in our own homes, in our neighborhoods and workplaces, in our civic community, let alone "to all the world." Besides, the responsibilities of family, home, career are themselves a bit limiting on our ability to follow this call individually. That is why we are "Church," a community of believers with varying time, interests, abilities, gifts. While we cannot go to "all the world," missionaries can and they do. Our support of them, prayerfully and financially, are part and parcel of their ability to bring Christ to others. That is why I believe that the annual Mission Appeal, sponsored by our Archdiocese, is such a significant part of our Church ministry. By enabling missionaries, we do indeed respond to that mandate of Christ.

This weekend, we welcome Reverend Jacob Kudilumgal, of the Vicentian Congregation, who will be with us to make an appeal for our support of this mission work of his community in Mother of God Province in India. St. Vincent de Paul said, rightly enough, "Love, for a Christian, is not magnanimity, but an obligation." He cared for orphaned babies, illiterate children, poor villagers, abandoned slaves, oppressive social structures and sinful life situations that harmed the poor and the vulnerable. Those who follow him in mission do the same all over the world. This weekend, Fr. Jacob will share us the work of his confreres in India and will ask us to lend generous support. Please be attentive to his words and the need of the Vincentian missionaries, and please be ready to respond sacrificially to this most important work of our Church. We may not ever meet those we will help to come closer to the heart of Christ on this earth, but we will one day share with them the great rewards of heaven, where we will see and savor the fulfillment of what we have done for those in need in the name of Christ.

Those of you who come to weekday Mass have seen it best, but I'm certain that almost all of you have noticed it. First, there was wood on the face of the sanctuary steps. Then part of the wood on the top step disappeared. Three weeks later, it came back – loosely and temporarily fitted, then a big chunk of it was gone again. By the time you read this (hopefully!), it is all back again. We had termites. Live termites. Those mean little things that eat away where you can't see them and, after they've moved on, you find the horrible results, though fortunately, we did catch them in the act this time around. We treated the space they were in and, though we really favor non-violence as a Church, I hope we killed them all. Since we have seen no additional activity, we were advised that we could go ahead and replace the wood. I dealt with termites for all seven of my years at the Cathedral and thought I had left them behind as a special little gift for Msgr. Kern. He swears he didn't know they were here before he left, but I wonder...

Let's hope that this is the last we see of them for a very long time!

Dear Parishioners,


I want to thank you for your warm reception of Reverend Jacob
Kudilumgal, of the Vincentian Congregation, who was with us this past
weekend and made an appeal for our support of this mission work of his community in Mother of God Province in India. As I said in last week's bulletin, I think that this annual appeal is one of the most important special collections that we have, as it allows us to participate in the great mission work of the Church. Fr. Jacob shared with us in his homily the significant work his community does with the poor of his province of India and he promised us in that homily that all of our contributions would be designated for that ministry to those most in need. Our parish collection for the support of the work of Fr. Jacob and his community was \$5,551.07. In addition, a number of our parishioners signed up to provide monthly support to seminarians for this religious community, and I thank you for that extra commitment. Now that Fr. Jacob has left us, let us not forget him, his Vincentian community and all the missionaries in our Church. They continue to need our prayerful support, so let us pledge to keep them regularly and faithfully in our prayers.

Though organizations do not meet in July, I found out that this does not mean that our parish is completely quiet and restful. During that month, there was a bustle of activity in the school and the Annex, as classrooms and offices were moved, painted, cleaned, re-modeled and spiffed-up. As I'm certain some of you noticed, four new basketballs goals were installed for our school children (and those of you who customarily park for Mass and activities on that side of the yard are asked to be careful not to bump into them!). Our Director of Religious Education, Claudette Craven, now has her office on the Veterans' Highway end of the Annex, making space for a classroom for our new half-day Pre-K program.

I want to thank all those, both members of our parish staff and volunteers from SAMA and the School Co-Op Club who invested their time and talent this Summer to prepare this space.

By the time you receive this bulletin, school will be back in full swing, and I ask you to keep in your prayers all those who are part of our school community: our administrators, faculty and staff, our students and their parents and families. Education is not a cheap commodity in our society today; parents make real and sometimes great sacrifices to send their children to a Catholic school. We thank them for the love they show their children in making this effort, and we pledge to do all we can to work with them and their children to make this and every school year an opportunity for their children to come closer to the mind and heart of Christ in this caring community of faith.

For those parents who choose not to send their children to our parochial school, we do seek to provide for them quality religious education in our parish CCD program. We make the same pledge to them to care for their children as they grow in faith, its understanding and practice. I'll have more to say about our CCD program next week.





Dear Parishioners,

In the Scriptures, following the episode of Jesus being found by his parents in the Temple conversing with the elders, we are told that Jesus went home with Mary and Joseph where h was obedient to them and "grew in wisdom, age and grace before God and others." Well, some of us can well attest that growing in age is something we don't really control ourselves; we get on that bus and it simply continues to move on. 


On the weekend of September 20-21, there will be a second collection at all Masses for the support of the Catholic Communications Campaign. This is an annual national collection to support the efforts of our bishops to use the vehicle of contemporary media to spread the message of Christ. You will read more about that in next week's bulletin. But, along with that collection, as part of the Communications Campaign, our bishops have asked us to participate in a project called, "Renewing the mind of the Media." The bishops ask us to join with them to use whatever means we can to encourage the media to portray what is truthful and good and to discourage them from uses that are harmful.

These are some of the suggestions that the bishops propose:

- discuss news coverage with family and/or friends, trying to discern if the media is objectively providing the information you need;
- contact local broadcast outlets to submit comments for their license-renewal
- comment to the outlets where you find their news is balanced or whether it sensationalizes violence;
- contact at least one advertiser that sponsors a program which contributes to or does not contribute to the building of responsible moral values and as them to continue to or to withdraw their support, respectively
- trade one hour a week using media for an hour in prayer for peace.

If you would be interested in taking part in this element of the Campaign, we will have a copy of the pledge for you to sign and drop in the collection basket, along with your financial support to the Catholic Communications Campaign. We will have a bit more information again in next week's bulletin.



Dear Parishioners,

Today is Catechetical Sunday, a day for us to focus on how we continue to respond to the command of Christ to "teach all nations" in and through our parish religious education programs, especially those we sponsor for the youth of our parish. Religious instruction is built into the day's curriculum in our parish elementary school, and it is scheduled into our parish life for young people attending public or private schools where religion is not taught. Those classes begin Monday night, and I trust that parents have registered their children for these classes.

Today, at the 12:15 p.m. Mass, we will commission the catechists who will be involved in religious instructions for youth this year and recognize those teachers who, this year, have completed their certification as catechists by the Archdiocese. On your behalf, I thank all or our religion teachers, in our school and our CCD program, for their faithful and dedicated service, as we seek to lead our young people closer to the mind and the heart of the Christ, who is our Light and our salvation.

They're ba-a-a-a-ack! The termites. The bad news: we found another batch of termites eating away the floor in Mary's shrine in church You probably have noticed that we have had to remove the carpet and all the wooden flooring underneath. We, of course, had the area treated and will repair the damage and replace all of this as quickly as possible. The worse news: none of this is covered by insurance, so this amounts to a rather serious unanticipated expenditure.

Since we have had to deal with termites twice, and so quickly together, we have checked with the Building Office of the Archdiocese and with their agreement, will be investing in the bait traps that are now very common in our area. This should help us with earlier detection of any further termite activity and assist us, should we find them again, with more effective and earlier treatment. These bait traps were installed in our area first in the French Quarter and, within the Quarter, first around the Cathedral. While they certainly don't solve the problem, the do seem to have helped there, and I anticipate this will help us as well.

With the size of our parish plant, this will not come cheap! We have received two estimates thus far, and it looks as though this could cost about \$10,000.00 or more. Does this help you realize the importance of your faithful contributions to the Sunday collection? Your regular, faithful and generous offering helps to support parish ministries and activities, pays the salaries of the staff that serve you every day, covers our utility expenses and our diocesan taxes and ordinary maintenance and repairs, helps to retire our debt to the Archdiocese for the work done in church a few years ago. The more conscientiously you support your parish, the more we can offer in services and the better we can maintain these wonderful buildings that your past contributions have built and that are so well-used in and for our parish life.

THANKS to all the liturgical ministers who took the time to sign up this past weekend. This will help us considerably in our effort to update our rosters. I would also like to acknowledge and thank Billy Robinson who has accepted my invitation to serve as coordinator of Ushers/Greeters at all of our weekend liturgies. I will be introducing Billy and describing his responsibilities at our meetings for liturgical ministers in November.






