

Dear Parishioners,

Let us all strive to make certain that we nurture the gift of Christ-life entrusted to us as we allow it to grow in our own hearts, in our own homes and then bring it into each others' lives, hearts and homes as well.

We remain mindful that these festive seasons are very challenging for those who have lost loved ones in death, for those whose loved ones live far away and where visiting is not possible. We continue to hold all of these people in our hearts and pray that this New Year of 2004 will find them filled with extra portions of the Lord's own consolation, care and hope.

I offer my sincere thanks to all of you who shared with me Christmas greetings and Christmas goodies. You must bring with you the registration form I mailed to you some weeks ago. All ministers are required by the Archbishop to have attended one of these sessions to continue in this ministry.

Also, a special word to all those who serve in any liturgical ministry here in our parish: If you did not attend one of the sessions I conducted here in the parish, we will have ONE make-up session. This will be on Saturday, January 17, from 9:30 a.m. until 11:30 a.m. in the Conference Room. All readers, special ministers of Holy Communion, ushers, servers and music ministers who missed one of the sessions already conducted should make plans to attend on January 17 in order to continue in parish liturgical ministry.

I thank all those who have already participated in these workshops for their cooperation in learning about the changes in Mass based on the revised General Instruction, and I thank all of them for their faithful and generous ministry to our parish liturgical prayer.



We repeat here the information we provided at Mass last weekend concerning some changes in the Mass called for by the revised "General Instruction on the Roman Missal."

If you recall, on the first Sunday of Advent, all parishes in the Archdiocese were to begin implementation of some changes in the Order of Mass. I had told you at the time that we were delaying that a bit here in our parish because we were still working with our parish liturgical ministers, sharing with them information about these changes. Today, and for the next three weekends, our parish deacons and I will be providing you with information about these changes, which we will begin implementing at Mass today.

These changes come because of a revision in a document called The General Instruction on the Roman Missal, which is the introduction to the book of prayers and readings for Mass. These changes came from Rome and were authorized by the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments and ultimately by the Holy Father himself. So, if you have a problem with what you hear during these next few weeks, don't complain to me; write the Pope! The physical and visible changes are not all that major. What is important about this revised document is that it challenges us over and over again to restore greater reverence to our celebration of the Mass and calls us to deeper awe in the great mystery of the Eucharist that we gather here to celebrate. It is also a call for us to recapture one of the essential elements of the Roman liturgy, that is, that when we pray here at Mass, we pray as one body in Christ. Thus the challenge is for us to let go of our own personal preferences, likes and dislikes, and truly to become one body in all the actions that we take, in all of the prayers that we say, in all of the songs that we sing. We are to live that song we sing rather regularly during the ministry of Communion at Mass: "One bread, one body, one Lord, of all; one cup of blessing which we bless; and we, though many, throughout the earth, we are one body in this one Lord." This Instruction, then, often focuses on attitudes and actions that promote reverence and awe and call us to act in common gestures, postures and actions. We are already familiar with this. During the "I confess," for instance, when we come to the words, "that I have sinned through my own fault," we join in the gesture of beating the chest, as a sign of our contrition. During the Profession of Faith, when we come to the lines, "by the power of the Holy Spirit he was born of the Virgin Mary, and became man," we bow in reverence to this awesome mystery of the incarnation.

Today, we begin to implement some of those common postures and gestures. First, the General Instruction calls for all to STAND after the priest washes his hands and before the priest says, "Pray, brothers and sisters, that this sacrifice of ours may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father." The reason for this is that the part of the Mass called the Preparation of the Gifts ends with the washing of the hands and the Liturgy of the Eucharist begins with this invitation to prayer. All, then, would stand as the priest turns back to the altar after he washes his hands. If we are still singing at that time, of course, we would wait until our song is finished and then stand together. Until we get used to this change, the priest or deacon will assist you by offering a gesture of the hands to remind you to stand at the proper time.

Secondly, the General Instruction states that the common posture for receiving Holy Communion is standing. It also calls for a common gesture of reverence by each individual before he or she receives Holy Communion. The Bishops of the United States have decided that this common gesture is a BOW OF THE HEAD. So, when you come to Communion, as you stand before the priest, deacon or lay minister, you bow your head. If you are coming up in a double line, you bow as the person in the other line receives; if there is only one line for that minister, the minister will wait to say, "The Body of Christ" until you have bowed your head. Please note that this is the only proper and approved gesture for the reception of Holy Communion. We do not genuflect or sign ourselves with the cross. In this Communion, we assume one common posture and gesture, showing that we are one body in the Christ, whose one body we receive from the altar.

Finally, you will notice that, beginning today, lay ministers of Holy Communion will come to the priest at the altar and, after each has received Holy Communion, will be handed their vessel by the priest before going to their Communion Station to minister Holy Communion to you. This is done to reflect more clearly how Jesus himself fed the multitudes in the story of the multiplication of loaves and fish. Jesus took the bread, blessed it, broke it and gave it to his disciples, who then took these gifts to the people. So, at Mass, the priest, ministering as he does in the person of Christ, takes the bread and wine, blesses them, gives them to the assisting ministers and only then, in turn, do they come to you. This is a visual reminder that we are all fed from the very hands of Christ in our journey on earth, just as we will be served by Christ himself at the heavenly banquet table.

We will continue to publish this information in the bulletin to serve as a reminder to you of what we have taught, and we will continue these instructions again before Mass next weekend.





We repeat here the information we provided at Mass last weekend concerning some changes in the Mass called for by the revised "General Instruction on the Roman Missal."

Today we continue our instructions for you on some changes in the celebration of the Order of Mass, in accord with the revised General Instruction on the Roman Missal. Today I would like to share with you a few more clarifications on posture and gesture that are in this Instruction.

As we were all taught, the proper gesture when passing in front of the tabernacle is a genuflection. The proper gesture when passing in front of the altar, which is a symbol of Christ, is a solemn bow from the waist. So, when entering or leaving our church, because the Blessed Sacrament is reserved in its chapel on the side, we would instead bow to the altar.

During the praying of the Lord's Prayer, the priest extends his hands in the typical prayer gesture called the "orans" position, where the priest, in this gesture, embraces the prayers the people as one and lifts them up to the Lord. Only the priest assumes this gesture. In early religious art, there are depictions of the bishop at the altar with his hands extended this way and the priests, standing around him, with the same gesture. However, lay people at Mass do not assume this gesture. Similarly, during the praying of the Lord's Prayer, it is not our Catholic custom to hold hands. All remain with their hands in the typical gesture of prayer (folded with fingers pointed upward). What is the reason for this? We separate our hands and join them to the hands of others at the Sign of Peace. It is the sense of this revised Introduction to Mass that to join hands during the Our Father diminishes the gesture of reaching out at the Sign of Peace.

I told you last weekend that part of the spirit of this Instruction is to increase a sense of reverence and awe at Mass. To reflect reverence, and to enter into that spirit of wonder, another challenge for us in these revisions is to slow the Mass down a bit, to give everyone the time that we need to be truly reflective about the great mystery of God's love that we celebrate at Mass, as we hear God's Word in the Scriptures and share in the essential food of the Eucharist. That is why the Instruction calls for several periods of silence during the Mass, to give us time to reflect on what God so graciously and so faithfully shares with us to nourish us on our pilgrim way. Every time the priest says, "Let us pray," there is to be a pause so that you can do just what he invited you to do: pray; that is, to lift up your most sincere personal prayers to God, as we gather to support one another.

After each Scripture reading, there is to be a substantial pause, so that you can reflect on the Word of God you have heard proclaimed, so that you can ask yourself: What did the Lord just tell me that will console me or support me or challenge me or guide me as I try to live a faithful life? Similarly, after the homily, there is to be a substantial pause so that we can again reflect on what we heard in the instruction of the homily, and how we can apply it to our own lives.

Finally, after all have received Holy Communion, there is to be time of reflective silence, so that we can meditate on the awesome gift we have just received in the Body and Blood of the Risen Christ. This reflective time may be accompanied by instrumental music or may be done in complete silence, especially during the season of Advent and Lent, where the liturgy is to be more simple in style. This Instruction also reminds us of several things in regard to music at Mass. First, the Opening Song or, as it is more properly called, the Gathering Song. This song has several purposes. It helps us to focus on the spirit of this Mass or the season or feast we have gathered to celebrate. It should lead us better to understand what we are gathering here to celebrate this day. It also unites us in mind, in body and in spirit as we sing it. It unites us in mind, as we think together about the words of the song, the season or feast it tells us about, or the story it tells in its singing. It unites us in spirit, as we join our hearts together in the joy and peace of the Lord who calls us to this great Eucharistic Feast. It unites us in body, as we stand as one in God's presence and join our voices together in one hymn of praise, just as the angels do in heaven – in other words, this liturgy on earth helps us to consider the heavenly liturgy for which we all long to be part of at the end of our earthly lives. This song does not simply accompany the procession up the aisle; it unites us and directs us and helps to focus us. That is why you have noticed that we sing more of it now.

The Communion Song similarly binds us together around the Eucharistic table. When we sing with one voice, at the same tempo as others, with the same words as others, we are one body. Signing this song is an outward manifestation of what the Eucharist actually does: it makes us one, one with the Lord and one with each other. This song begins immediately after we say, "Lord, I am not worthy to receive you, but only say the word and I shall be healed," for this is when the ministry of Communion begins. We will begin singing the Communion Song a bit earlier than we have been doing in the past, to make us one at the altar as we begin to come forward in one procession to share in the one bread.

We will continue in our instructions before all the Masses again next weekend.





We repeat here the information we provided at Mass last weekend concerning some changes in the Mass called for by the revised "General Instruction on the Roman Missal."

We have already shared with you that the greatest emphasis in this current revision of the General Instruction on the Roman Missal is its intention to restore a greater sense of reverence at Mass. Another focus is its desire to reflect, in our common posture and gestures and our singing at Mass, that we are truly one body in Christ as we gather around the altar. But, within this body, there are different roles and ministries, and the Instruction seeks to be clear that these different ministries and roles are respected. Last week, we mentioned that the extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion will no longer come to the altar and take the vessels themselves at Communion time, but will be communicated by and then handed vessels by the priest, for this reflects his role as standing at the altar in the person of Christ, and he reflects how Christ ministered to others in Scripture stories that show him serving others at table.

Lay people who minister do not serve in ministries that are part of the service of those in Holy Orders. That is why, when priests and deacons are present, they are the first ministers of Holy Communion. Lay ministers are used only when there are not enough priests and deacons to minister at all the Communion stations that serve the assembly. During Mass, lay people do not stand at the altar in the places where deacons or concelebrating priests would customarily stand. Again, the purpose of this is to show that there are different roles and ministries of service in our Church, ordained and lay ministries, and they are distinct from one another.

But what also must be underscored in this is that ordained ministers do not take over the roles of lay ministers. You notice that the priest does not lead the singing; that is the role of the cantor. Deacons do not take up the collection; that is the ministry of our ushers. Lay people always proclaim the readings from the Old Testament and the New Testament letters. Now what this means, of course, is that we need adequate lay ministers at all Masses so that these services are properly fulfilled. We will be announcing, in the next few weeks, the process for parishioners to come forward in new service as readers, ushers and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion. Please consult the bulletin each week, for that is where this information will be published. We hope that many of you will seriously consider stepping forward in one of these important liturgical ministries.

Along with respecting roles and ministries, the General Instruction also reminds us to respect important liturgical furniture. The altar, the place of sacrifice, is a symbol of Christ, who gave himself in sacrifice for us. The altar is never to be obscured by decorations or be used for anything other than the celebration of the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Nothing is ever placed on the altar other than the bread and wine and the book of prayers the priest needs for the Eucharistic Prayer. The ambo, or pulpit, is reserved at all times for the proclamation of the Liturgy of the Word. Only the Scripture readings, the homily and the General Intercessions, all part of the Liturgy of the Word, are to be done from the pulpit. Any other talks, introductions, announcements or prayers are to be done from another place. When we see the pulpit, we see God's Word, not our own. You will notice that, beginning today, the Cantor for Mass will no longer be behind the screen in back of the sanctuary, but will come out into the sanctuary area. We hope that this will allow the cantor much more to serve as a leader for you in our sung prayer. The cantor will also begin now to sing the Responsorial Psalm from the ambo.

Finally, the revised General Instruction affirms again the musical nature of our liturgical prayer. It reminds us that certain parts of the Mass are always to be sung: the Responsorial Psalm, the Gospel Acclamation, the Holy, Memorial Acclamation, Amen and Lamb of God. These are to be sung at all Masses, weekend and weekday alike. That will be a challenge to implement at our weekday liturgies, but it is a challenge that we will meet over time.



We present here the final in our series of instructions on the revised General Instruction on the Roman Missal.

Postures and gestures at Mass, joining fully in the recited and sung prayers are important because they both reflect inner attitudes and form inner attitudes. They reflect inner attitudes because, if we are truly reverent, our actions of kneeling, genuflecting, bowing all show what we believe. If we truly care about others, reaching out to them for the Sign of Peace and offering a warm and sincere, "Peace be with you," becomes a true symbol of our care. These actions also form attitudes of reverence and care. Because we do them over and over again, in doing them, in allowing our bodies to be taken over by them, we actually learn how we are to feel, not only at that moment, but all the time.

This current revision of the General Instruction on the Roman Missal completely underscores and reiterates that the goal of our worship is, as Vatican II described it in the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, "the full, conscious and active participation" of all in the celebration of the Mass and the Sacraments, a participation in them that recognizes and is our response to the action of Christ in our lives sharing with us in these sacramental signs the gift of salvation. When we stop to think of how much God loves us, of all the blessings God has showered upon us – both as individuals and as a Church – our response ought to be the burning desire to give God praise and thanks. Liturgy is God's action, in the Church, continuing to bless us and save us. Liturgy is our joyful embracing of and response to that awesome gift. To be fully involved in the liturgy is to allow God to enter into us and gift us. To be fully involved in the liturgy is to express our gratitude to God for that gift.

Over the past three weeks, we have shared with you the main points of the revised General Instruction on the Roman Missal, that was published in Rome, with the approval of the Holy Father, by the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments, and that Archbishop Hughes has now authorized be implemented in our Archdiocese. This Instruction has called for some changes in the way we celebrate Mass, changes that will, in time, become second nature for all of us. These changes, especially like those of bowing before we receive Holy Communion, pausing for reflective time after the readings, homily and Communion, signs of reverence to the altar when we enter and leave church, should all help us to be more reverent at Mass and more in awe of the great mystery of God' love, incarnate in Word and Sacrament, that we celebrate at Mass.

But there are a few local, very real parish concerns that we have that we need you to consider as well, in keeping with the spirit of this document from Rome.

We want to mention today three things:

First, attire for Mass. There was a time, and it wasn't all that long ago, when men who went to sporting events wore suits and ties. Women going shopping on Canal Street would wear hats and gloves. Those times are gone and will never return. But you still receive invitations to parties or other gatherings that call for certain dress, and the purpose of that call is to show the importance of what you are invited to celebrated. The Mass is the most important prayer we offer as Catholics. Our dress ought, in some way, reflect that importance. Taking the extra time and effort it certainly does take to wear nicer clothes to Mass reflects our inner attitude toward Mass and helps to shape our attitude as well. Yes, we do often go right from Mass to another event or to visit friends or to go shopping. We certainly are not saying that every male must wear a coat and tie or that every female should have on the latest fashion, but we should make an effort to be attired in our "Sunday best" for what it is Sunday is all about.

Second, a word about being on time for Mass, and staying for the whole Mass. Again, this is nothing less than an act of reverence for the Lord and the Lord's gift to us that the Mass is. It is not reverent toward the Lord, or toward the rest of the assembly, to come late. Giving an hour to the Lord each week for the prayer of the Mass ought not be too much to ask, and so leaving Mass early is neither respectful or reverent either. God is ready to listen to you whenever you choose to pray. Ought we not be ready to listen to God in the Mass by being here on time? God doesn't shut you out; should we shut God out by walking out of Mass before it is over? Sure, there will be times when something happens, and you're running late. Yes, there may well be another pressing need that might require one to leave early. But, let's be honest, those occasions are few and far between for any one of us. God deserves our time, for God is the author of the time we have been given.

Third, we need to address all of those who regularly stand in the back walkways of the church when there is plenty of places to take in the pews. We realize that sometimes parents will need to take small children back into those areas to quiet them during Mass. This is perfectly acceptable. We realize that some in wheelchairs need to be in that area, since we do not currently have adequate handicapped space in the pew area. We also realize that there may be a very few people who cannot kneel or sit because of physical difficulties. But none of the remainder of us should see standing in those areas of the church as acceptable during Mass. Entering into the pew area, sitting with others is a sign that we want to be Church, we want to be God's assembled people. Standing in the back is a sign that you want God on your terms, and that, quite simply, is not what we are here for. In the liturgy, God acts on us. We must turn ourselves over to the Lord. It is irreverent to the Eucharist; it is disrespectful to the rest of the assembly and it is simply distracting to the priest celebrating Mass to have numbers of people standing in those walkways.

In the spirit of the revised General Instruction on the Roman Missal, let us all take some time this week to review our own attitudes toward Mass, our actions at Mass and our willing participation in all of the Mass. Let us pledge to give the Lord our best, by giving God our all for the time we are here on weekends. Let us come ready and willing to open our minds, our hearts, our spirits to God and to one another in the family of faith, that we may find the presence of God that the liturgy offers us and the support and strength we need every day of the week to be faithful to the Lord's call to love and service.







Dear Parishioners.

We completed last week our series of instructions on the revised General Instruction on the Roman Missal. (Is that a sigh of relief I hear?) I'do hope that you found this brief series helpful, not only in knowing the changes that we have been asked to make in our celebration of the Mass by this Instruction but also, and even more importantly, why we have been asked to do so. One thing I hope that you realized is that celebrating the Roman liturgy well is something of a challenge to us. We are asked at Mass, as we said over and over again, to give ourselves over to the liturgy and to allow ourselves to be shaped by it, shaped into one body in Christ. We face the challenge to put aside our personal likes and dislikes, our personal picties and preferences, and to enter into the liturgy, fully and actively, striving to become one with each other and with the Lord in this profound prayer. We bow, sit, stand and kneel together; we sing together; we process together. We bow in reverence to the altar; we bow in reverence during some of our prayers. We kneel in adoration and humility. We stand in acceptance and ready witness. We work to become one in action, thought and feeling with one another. I invite you to respond fully to this challenge and to try to continue to reflect on the power of the liturgy to mold us into the living Body of Christ in the Church.

Did you find this series of explanations piquing your interest about the Mass, to wish for more information about why we do at Mass what we do; about the history of the Mass; about the books we use (Lectionary and Sacramentary), about the reasons for the vesture we wear and the postures we take; about the way the Mass is structured and the meaning of its parts? I am happy to announce that, during Lent, we will have a four-part series on the Mass, to study it more in depth and answer these and other questions you might have. These sessions will be held on the following dates: Wednesday, March 10, 17, 24 and 31, from 7:00-8:30 p.m. and repeated on Thursdays, March 11, 17, 25 and April 1, from 1:00-2:30 p.m., all sessions in the parish Conference Room in the Annex. I will be conducting those sessions. No pre-registration is necessary, just come with your open and curious mind!

This will be just one of our parish activities for Lent. Of course, we will once again have our Parish Lenten Mission, beginning on the weekend of Feb. 28-29, and continuing on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday evenings of that week; we will pray the Stations of the Cross on Friday evenings of Lent at 7:00 p.m.; our Senior Citizens Club will sponsor their Day of Recollection on the morning of Thursday, April 1; our school community leads us in the Living Stations on Friday, April 2. We will provide reminders and more information about all of these as the dates get closer.

We also mentioned to you in our instructions about Mass that it is time for us to invite more people to consider service as liturgical ministers: as readers, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion, ushers/greeters and choir members. As we have heard in the second reading at recent Sunday Masses, from St. Paul's Letter to the Corinthians, in this body of Christ that we as Church, we each have a role to play for the benefit of all. We accept these roles as part of our response to the call of our Baptism, the universal call to holiness of life and to service of one another. We discern our special role by reflecting carefully on the interests and talents God has given us and the needs of those we serve. What we have received as a gift, we in turn give as a gift to others and, in that self-sacrifice, we join in the holiness of Christ and live in unity with the Holy Spirit.

Does this mean that everyone is called to liturgical ministry? Of course not. Some are called to service as catechists, some as leaders of prayer, others as ministers of intercessory prayer for others (participating in a prayer group), some as ministers of charity (as in participation in our St. Vincent de Paul Society), some as leaders in parish organizations or as active members of organizations. But, if you do feel that you are called to a special role in our liturgical prayer as a choir member, reader, usher or minister of Holy Communion, now is the time to step forward. We will have a meeting for all those interested in any liturgical ministry on Thursday, March 18, from 7:00-9:00 p.m. in the Annex Conference Room. At that meeting, we will describe the abilities required for each ministry, the responsibilities of them and the training required for them. We will also have a process to help those present discern in which ministry each person ought to serve. If you have any questions about this, please speak with one of our parish deacons or with me.

On Wednesday of this week, 61 young people of our parish will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation, completing their Sacraments of Initiation into the Church. Please keep them in your prayers, that they will truly be open to the gifts of the Holy Spirit in their lives.

Dear Parishioners,

Here we are in the midst of another Mardi Gras season. Most of the year, I work hard; during Mardi Gras, I play hard. With a group of friends, we ride in the Krewe of Pontchartrain. during the first week of parades, my sisters, some friends and I run from the New Orleans parades out here for the Metairie parades. For the final weekend of the season, a group of us join at our customary place on the parade route for Mardi Gras weekend, where we catch parade after parade after parade. You may have noticed that I try to be at every Mass on weekends, to greet you and visit with you and to make certain that all is going well. For these two weekends, you'll notice that I'm a bit more scarce, as I celebrate a Mass and hit the parades. We welcome and I extend thanks to Fr. Bernie, who is preaching at all the Masses this weekend, inviting you to consider subscribing to Ligourian magazine. I extend special thanks to Frs. Meridier and Schott, who have agreed to alter their normal weekend schedules to accommodate my playfulness.

After we've all played hard for these ten days of the parade season, I hope you will join me in praying hard as we gather for our liturgies on Ash Wednesday, entering into the spirit of penance that is the Lenten Season. then, on the weekend of the First Sunday of Lent, we welcome Fathers Vic Karls and William Broker as they will initiate our annual Parish Mission, which will continue on the evenings of March 1, 2, 3 (with the service beginning at 7:00 p.m. each night and a parish reception following the service on March 3).

Lent will afford another opportunity, one to help you understand better the Mass, as we begin our series of adult education sessions on the Mass on Wednesday, March 10 at 7:00 p.m., repeated on Thursday afternoon, March 11, at 1:00 p.m. There will be four presentations in this series. We will look at the history of the Mass, look at the history and developments of the liturgical books we use and how the Lectionary (book of readings for Mass) is structured today, and look at liturgical vesture and roles in the liturgy. There will be plenty of time for questions and discussion.

Add to that our regular schedule of weekday Masses, time on First Friday for prayer at Exposition and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament, our Tuesday night novena and Benediction, and Stations of the Cross on the Fridays of Lent at 2:45 for our school community and again at 7:00 p.m. for our parish, and we will have ample opportunities to use this Lent to grow in prayer, study and fellowship.

So, enjoy Mardi Gras. But remember that this is only the prelude to the much more important season of Lent, a time of spiritual renewal and growth for us as individuals and as a parish community.







Dear Parishioners,

William Broker speaking at all the Masses on the First Sunday of Lent, and with the Mission liturgies and homilies continuing on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday nights, March 1,2,3 at 7:00 p.m.

Dear Parishioners,

"This is the kind of fasting I desire: release those bound unjustly... set free the oppressed ... share your bread with the hungry..."
"bestow your bread on the hungry... satisfy the afflicted ..." "You give us a spirit of loving reverence for you, our Father, and of willing service to our neighbor." We have heard these words in the readings and the prayers of the first days of Lent. Lent is not about "me" and "my salvation." It is about "us" and "our salvation." Jesus did not come to save himself; he came to save others. Lent is not turning inward to see how I can be holier; it is about looking around to see how I can help bring Christ's gift of salvation more effectively to others. We do not fast during Lent to trim down from over-indulgence in King Cakes in order bring new sveltness to summer-wear. We fast to share food with the hungry; we fast to feel the pain of those who hunger for justice, acceptance, hope. We give alms to fill the void in others' lives. We do acts of charity, not to better our chances of getting into heaven, but to bring joy and life to others around us right now.

Hopefully, our Parish Mission provided you with much to continue to contemplate this Lenten Season, encouraged you to deeper and more fervent prayer during these days. Hopefully, too, it helped you to name those to whom you need to offer forgiveness, identified those you must release from your prejudice or anger, challenged you to acts of kindness to others that you may not have considered before.

The goal of Lent is to allow the Lord to transform our lives, to be better people come Easter than we are today, and to develop a new life of caring that will make us better people every day of our lives until the Lord calls us to the next life.

Be resolute in your Lenten practices, that you and others may live! Pray for each other in our parish community, that we may, all through Lent, grow in the love of God and the life we can live with Christ, a life for others.

During this week, you received a special mailing from me that included information about our Pastoral Council and that we are now open for nominees to serve on the Council, from whom will be selected a slate of candidates for our elections in April. Please remember that nominations for consideration must be submitted no later than 4:00 p.m. on Tuesday, March 16.

I do hope that you took the time to read through all of the information I sent you – information about the Pastoral Council, about our goals for Catholic Life 2003, and about funeral planning. If you did not receive this mailing, please contact the rectory.

I want to remind all parishioners who might be interested in serving in any liturgical ministry (Reader, Usher, Choir, Special Minister of Holy Communion), that there will be a meeting for you on Thursday, March 18, from 7:00-9:00 p.m. At this meeting, we will discuss the skills and attitudes needed for each ministry, what those who come forward in service are committing themselves to do in our liturgy and for our parish, both in preparation for ministry as well as for regular service, and provide help and guidance to those who might not know which ministry they might want to select at this time for participation. If you have any questions about this, please feel free to see me or one of our parish deacons.

On Tuesday, March 23, there will be a meeting of all those who currently serve as ushers/greeters at Mass. The meeting will be at 7:00 p.m. in the Center. Dear Parishioners,

If you are interested in serving in any liturgical ministry (choir, reader, extraordinary minister of Holy Communion, usher/greeter) or might be interested in serving in the ministry of Holy Communion to the homebound, there will be a special meeting Thursday, March 18, from 7:00-9:00 p.m. in the Conference Room. The purpose of this meeting is to help you understand the responsibilities of each ministry and the formation required for it. It will also help you decide which ministry you might be more suited to participate in. If you do plan to attend this meeting, please call the rectory beforehand (835-0324) so that we can prepare adequate material for all those who will be with us.

Several months ago, we decided that we will, with the 2004-2005 school year, begin a new program, a Pre-K class for three-year-olds. The need for this program is growing in our area and several neighboring parishes have already initiated a class. We are happy that we will be offering this new service to our parishioners with young children.

When we made this decision, I appointed an ad hoc committee of the School Board to study the facility needs of this program. Their task was to consider all possibilities, to get rough estimates on the cost of preparing a space for this class, and to make a recommendation to me and our school Principal, Mrs. Colleen Remont. This committee did their work and made their proposal. After careful reflection and consultation with both the Finance Committee of the parish and the Building Office of the Archdiocese, and with the concurrence of the Pastoral Council, we have decided to remodel the parish Conference Room to accommodate this new PreK 3 class.

In order to continue to have adequate and attractive space for parish meetings and other gatherings, we will remodel the classroom on the first floor on the Melody Street side of the church/school building into our new Conference Room. This room will have a kitchen facility with it and indoor access to the restrooms nearby. The work room on the other side of the building is now being renovated to become once again a classroom, and the work room storage has been moved to other areas in the Msgr. Kern Center. The new classroom will serve up to thirty new PreK 3 students. Our new Conference Room will actually have more storage than our current one, have better kitchen facilities for refreshments at meetings and will be directly linked to parking in the school yard – all things considered, a good trade-off for both the school and our parish meeting facilities.

Of course, preparing these rooms will take money. The Archdiocesan Finance Office has agreed to loan us the funds we will need for this three-phase project (first, renovate the workroom into a classroom, then move that class and create the new Conference Room, then renovate the Conference Room for PreK 3), and add it to our current parish debt. Now, no one likes increasing our debt, and so to give us a good kick-start on raising needed funds, we will have a \$10,000.00 Gala and Dance in the Center on Saturday, May 15, from 8:00 p.m.-12 Midnight. Our major parish organizations (SALA, SAMA, School Co-op and Senior Citizens) have all agreed to work together on this fund-raiser, and we have already had one meeting to get plans under way. You'll be hearing more about this in the coming weeks, but please mark your calendar, and plan on joining us in support of this important new project for our parish!

On Tuesday, March 23, there will be a meeting of all those who currently serve as ushers/greeters at Mass. The meeting will be at 7:00 p.m. in the Center. This is a very important meeting, for we will be discussing plans for the liturgies of Holy Week and Easter, and asking all these ministers to sign up for service at these most important liturgies. A light dinner will be served.





We rejoice that the fulfillment of Lent is in sight, for Holy Week, the Paschal Triduum and Easter Sunday are rapidly approaching. We rejoice that the prayers and actions we have undertaken during this Lenten Season, as we seek to embrace the new life of Christ, will find their end in Easter transformation, Easter life, Easter joy. This is NOT a time to slacken our efforts, to coast to the end of the line, but to intensify them, to see how we have improved during these first three weeks of Lent and to re-double our efforts, so that a genuinely new life will be ours, in Christ, at Easter.

This might, then, also be a good time to begin to look ahead at our liturgical celebrations of Holy Week, the Paschal Triduum and Easter, for Lent and all our Lenten efforts make no sense without that vision. There are no liturgies more important. more beautiful or more moving than the liturgies of the Paschal Triduum: Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil. Together, they form one continuous liturgy and, through them, we journey with Christ, passing over with him to the new life of Resurrection.

On Holy Thursday, April 8, we will celebrate the Mass of the Lord's Supper at 7:00 p.m. In this liturgy, we remember the Lord's Last Supper with his apostles, and commemorate the institution of the Holy Eucharist. The liturgy begins with great solemnity and joy. We sign the Glory to God with great accompaniment, then retire all instruments, for we quietly, somberly and reflectively enter with the Lord into the early hours of his trial and Passion. At this Mass, we recall that great act of service that Jesus performed in the washing of the feet, and realize that this is but a shadow of the greater service the Lord gives in sacrificing his very life for us on the cross. The Mass ends in silence and we continue in reflective adoration and prayer before the Eucharistic Lord. This year, adoration will continue in church until 10:00 p.m. "Can you not watch and pray with me for just an hour?" That is the question Jesus asked his disciples that night. He asks us the very same question and invites us into prayer on Holy Thursday night.

On Good Friday, April 9, we celebrate the Solemn Service of the Lord's Passion and death at 3:00 p.m. In this three-part liturgy, we proclaim the Gospel of the Passion of the Lord from St. John's Gospel – different from the account in the synoptic gospels as it shows Jesus much more "in charge" of this day of his death, in his free and full acceptance of this sacrificial death. Then, we unveil and reverence the cross of our salvation. "Behold the wood of the cross, on which hung the Savior of the world," we sing as we unveil the cross and come forward to reverence that bare wood, not only remembering the cross of Jesus but embracing the crosses of our own lives as well, confident that God will not abandon us in our trials, for God did not abandon Jesus in his.

At the majestic Easter Vigil, Saturday, April 10 at 8:00 p.m., we begin outside church for the blessing of the new fire and the lighting of the Easter Candle – the sign of Jesus, the unextinguishable Light of the world, the Light who will lead us, through trials, suffering and death, to glory, light and life. We carry candles as we enter the darkened church, filling it with new light, new warmth and everlasting victory. We listen carefully to readings from the Scriptures that trace the history of salvation and welcome the return of beautiful instrument and song as we welcome back to our voices the Glory to God and the Lenten-silenced Alleluia. We welcome new members into our family of faith in Easter Baptism and the Reception into Full Communion with the Church those who have journeyed through the RCIA process this past year.

I cannot strongly enough encourage you to plan to participate in these liturgies. I will share additional thoughts with you about them in the bulletin in the coming weeks.

On Tuesday, March 23, there will be a meeting of all those who currently serve as ushers/greeters at Mass. The meeting will be at 7:00 p.m. in the Center. This is a very important meeting, for we will be discussing plans for the liturgies of Holy Week and Easter, and asking all these ministers to sign up for service at these most important liturgies. A light dinner will be served.



Dear Parishioners.

Last week I shared with you some reflections on the liturgies of the Easter Triduum, the special celebrations of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil. I renew my encouragement for you to make the time in your schedule to participate in these moving and beautiful liturgies. These liturgies are the very heart of our liturgical life; they are our entryway into the fulfillment of all of our Lenten works of prayer, fasting and charity. I have found that these liturgies touch me in a new way each year I celebrate them; they challenge me to reflect carefully on the great gift of Christ's sacrifice; they help me to pray fervently; they unite me with others and bring about a very special bond of unity in faith.

Today, I would like to remind you of some other special opportunities as we conclude our Lenten Season and enter into Holy Week. With this reminder, I also offer an invitation to you to take advantage of these experiences and expressions of our faith.

On Friday, April 2, our school children will once again offer the Living Stations. The students offer a visual depiction of the stations of the Lord's Passion and Death, not in the form of a play, but as a living depiction of the art-work that adorns the walls of our church. We have modified the format a bit, to allow for more participation by the assembly in this traditional Lenten prayer. There will be singing and prayer by the assembly, as we are accustomed to participating in on all of the other Fridays of the Lenten Season. The Living Stations will be prayed on April 2 both at 2:45 p.m. with our school community and at 7:00pm with our larger parish family.

On Monday and Tuesday, April 5 and 6, we have scheduled extra time for the Sacrament of Penance. Fr. Schott and Fr. Meridier will be available in the confessionals in church on Monday, April 5; Frs. Schott, Meridier and I will all be available in church on Tuesday, April 6. Confessions will be heard those evenings from 7:00-8:00 p.m. Please note that these are the final scheduled times for the Sacrament of Penance before Easter.

In making your plans for Easter Sunday, please note that we will celebrate the Easter Vigil Mass on Holy Saturday, April 10 at 8:00 p.m. Remember that there is no anticipated Mass at 4:00 p.m. that day. The Easter Vigil is the only Mass that may be celebrated on Holy Saturday evening. It begins outside of church, as we gather around the new fire and light the Easter Candle, entering church with that new light of God's victory and shattering the darkness of the empty church. There are additional readings during the Liturgy of the Word, as we retrace and remember the history of salvation and we welcome new members into the life of Christ in this community of faith in the Sacrament of Baptism and the reception of other adults, from other Christian religions, into full communion with us in the Catholic Church through the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist. This liturgy lasts a bit longer because it is rich with experiences of God's Word, the Church's Sacramental life and moving ritual.

On Easter Sunday, Masses with be at 8:00, 9:30 and 11:00 a.m. and 12:15 p.m. – our customary Sunday morning schedule. Please note, though, that there will not be an evening Mass on Easter Sunday.

I will share some final reflections with you about the Triduum liturgies in the bulletin next weekend.


