Dear Parishioners,

As we celebrate Palm Sunday this weekend, we enter into the most solemn week of the Church Year. Today we hold our palms high and, like those before us, we proclaim Jesus our Messiah and Lord. What a joyful moment of recognition this is for us – to accept that God loves us so much that God's own Son is willing to suffer and die for us. Though treated harshly, though accused unjustly, though punished cruelly, though murdered wrongly, Jesus accepted the pain to lead us to glory. What an awesome and humbling sacrifice we recall in this liturgy and the ones to follow this week. And what grandeur of God we know is coming, for each of the liturgies of Holy Week carries within it the glimpse of Easter glory in the Resurrection of Christ – and our resurrection with him – to new life. There are times in our lives that we will suffer, too. Yes, we might be treated harshly by others, rejected, scorned, abused, laughed at, excluded. Yes, we might be unjustly accused, as others accuse us with deeds we did not do, prejudices we do not have, laying on us a guilt we should not bear. Yes, there may be times we are treated cruelly, rejected by family members we have only tried to help, abandoned in our own need, ignored in our own trials. And, yes, we will die – we will be called to give totally of our own selves for others, genuine sacrificial giving. We will all undergo this journey, and the transitus of Jesus, his passage from suffering and death to life, Resurrection and Ascension remains our hope through it all. The liturgies of Holy Week are food for our journey of faith, instruction for our minds, hope for our spirits, support in and through our common prayer. I cannot strongly enough encourage you to make the time to participate in all of the Holy Week liturgies – they are a gift of encouragement and strength for us; they are our praise to God for the perfect gift of Jesus.

On Holy Thursday, the Solemn Liturgy of the Lord's Last Supper will begin at 7:00 p.m. At this Mass, when we commemorate the institution of the Holy Eucharist, we will have Communion under both kinds at Mass, following carefully the instruction of Jesus to "take and eat . . . take and drink." As we listen to and observe his instruction to serve the needs of all, we will have a collection at Mass for the support of the ministry of our parish St. Vincent de Paul Society.

Quiet prayer before the Blessed Sacrament reserved in the tabernacle will continue from after Mass until 10:00 p.m.

On Good Friday, we celebrate the Liturgy of the Lord's Passion and Death at 3:00 p.m. This three-part service, with the Proclamation of the Passion, the Veneration of the Cross and Holy Communion joins our sufferings with the sufferings of Christ. At this Liturgy, we will have the annual collection for the shrines in the Holy Land.

On Good Friday, we will also pray the Stations of the Cross at 7:00 p.m., and the cross from the liturgy at 3:00 p.m. will remain out in church for veneration until the start of Stations.

On Holy Saturday, at 8:00 p.m., we gather outside of church for the blessing of the new fire and the lighting of the Easter Candle, proclaiming the victory of Jesus over sin and death. We enter church with our own candles, lit from the Easter Candle, and bring new light and new warmth into our home of worship, and we radiate with the joy of the Easter victory. The beautiful and haunting words of the Easter Proclamation, "O happy fault! O necessary sin of Adam, which gained for us so great a Redeemer . . . Heaven is wedded to earth and we are reconciled with God" give us cause to rejoice in the new life of salvation which is ours. Readings from salvation history follow, and we have the magnificent opportunity to welcome new members into our family of faith in the rites of Baptism and Reception into Full Communion with the Church. The church is filled again with joyous music and song as we sing "Glory to God" to the new hope which fills our hearts and fills the earth. The second collection at Mass is our annual Archdiocesan collection for the support of our seminaries, where men are being prepared for service to you and your families in the years ahead, that the sacramental life and the life of service in our Church may continue through the service of these men who seek to be your priests.

Joyous music and festive community prayer will fill our church on Easter Sunday at Masses at 8:00, 9:30, 11:00 a.m. and 12:15 p.m. Again, the second collection at all Masses is for the support of our Archdiocesan seminaries.

Our parish Liturgy Committee, our music ministers and our parish staff have been working carefully in preparation for these liturgies, and I am certain that you will find them prayerful, beautiful and inspiring: genuine reflections of our parish's deep faith and valuable support on our individual and corporate journeys of faith.







Dear Parishioners,

We welcome to the 12:15 p.m. Mass today 50 young people of our school and religious education communities who are sharing in Holy Communion for the first time today. We congratulate them all and assure them of our continuing prayer and support as they take this important step on their journeys of faith. We extend special words of welcome to their parents, families and friends who are with them today. The Easter Season is the most appropriate time to celebrate the Sacraments of Initiation, of which Eucharist is one, and we are very happy that these young members of our parish family give us this cause for joyful celebration today!

Next Sunday:

We ask you to pick up, as you leave church today, information on the seven candidates running for at-large representatives on the Pastoral Council. Please read through the information carefully. We will have elections at all Masses next weekend. You will vote for three of these seven candidates and the three with the highest number of votes will sit on the Pastoral Council that will begin service this August.

The two candidates receiving the highest number of votes will serve a two-year term. The other will serve a four-year term.

The Pastoral Council, the Finance Council and the School Board are the three major consultative bodies in our parish. I rely very much on their reflections and their input in determining direction for our parish, in setting, monitoring and evaluating parish goals and the life of parish organizations and ministries. These elections are important for all of us and I ask you to invest time in considering which candidates you feel will serve our parish best on the Pastoral Council.

In addition, our major parish organizations are nominating at-large members to serve on the Council as well. Finally, I will appoint three additional members of the Council. Altogether, there will be fifteen Pastoral Council members, all serving as at-large parish representatives. Eight of these will have two-year terms this time around, and the remainder will serve four year terms, thus allowing us to stagger the turn-over of Council members. Beginning with the elections of 2006, all Council members will have four-year terms.

Remember that our Spring Soiree will be on Saturday, May 15, from 8:00 p.m. to 12 Midnight. This will be a special fund-raiser for our parish to help to defray the cost of preparing a room for our new Pre-K 3 program which will begin next school year. To provide this new space, we will be moving one classroom and will move the Parish Conference Room to the classroom on the first floor of the Melody Dr. side of the church. It promises to be an enjoyable evening, with food, drink and entertainment and the opportunity to go home with some wonderful prizes and perhaps even \$10,000.00! Plan to be there! Information on tickets will be available at tables outside of church after all Masses next weekend, or you may telephone or stop by the rectory to reserve your ticket.

While we have decided to keep our celebration low-key, this is nonetheless a significant day for us, and is worthy of commemoration. I invite all of you to join together in the Msgr. Kern Center that evening for a Prayer Service and Pot Luck Dinner. The Prayer Service will begin at 6:00 p.m. and dinner will follow immediately. Bring your favorite covered dish to share with others. We will provide a carving station with pork, turkey and ham. Of course, a 40th Anniversary cake will also be served. Many of our parishioners are founding members of the parish and remember our humble beginnings with Masses at Leon's Restaurant. Over the years, they and all of those who joined them in time, helped to fund and saw the construction of our buildings and the growth of this caring community of faith. Now 2,500 families strong, we continue to be a people of faith dedicated to building the reign of Christ among us and sharing Christ's care and our Church's wisdom and ministries with others. Let us gather as one to give thanks to the Lord for forty blessed years, to celebrate our friendship in the Lord and to rededicate ourselves to being Christ's messengers of peace and hope in our corner of the world.

REPORT ON THE SPRING SOIREE: For the Soiree, 262 tickets were sold, making the income from that \$26,200. Total income from the auction items was \$13,590 and from the 50/50, \$519.00. TOTAL INCOME: \$40,309.00

Expenses: paid to winners: \$10,400.00; Food and Drink expenses, \$8,391.13; prizes: \$242.66; miscellaneous (includes security and decorations): \$1,275.16. TOTAL EXPENSES: \$20,308.95.

PROCEEDS FROM THE SOIREE: \$20,000.05

As announced, all of the proceeds will be used to help defray the expenses of creating our new Pre-K 3 classroom.

As for the work on the rooms for our new Pre-K 3, all material in the former workroom on the Annex side of the church has been moved to other storage and work areas and the renovated classroom is already in use. The only remaining item for that room will be the installation of new exterior doors. On Wednesday of last week, bids were opened for the remainder of the work (the preparation of the former classroom on the Melody side of church as our new Conference Room and the conversion of the present Conference Room into the Pre-K 3 room) and a contractor was selected. We will meet with him this week to sign the contract and discuss the scope of the work and the schedule for the work to be completed. Both rooms will be worked on at the same time, thus speeding the process along a bit. The new Conference Room will have an attached kitchenette area and new interior access to the rest rooms off the school yard. Some work will have to be done in the rest rooms in the Annex for use by three-year olds and, while we are doing this, we will replace other fixtures and screens as well. We anticipate that all of the work will be completed by August 1, giving us sufficient time to furnish the rooms for the beginning of school and parish meetings that will begin again in August.

I will keep you up-dated on our progress.



Dear Parishioners,

I wasn't going to announce this until I received the official letter from Archbishop Alfred Hughes, but since I heard it last Thursday when I visited a parishioner in the hospital, I suppose it's becoming common knowledge. It is VERY GOOD news, and well worth not keeping a secret: the Archbishop will be assigning a parochial vicar to our parish, effective July 1.

Fr. Luis Rodriguez, currently the parochial vicar at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish in Kenner, is becoming Director of Vocations for our Archdiocese. This will be a part time position (requiring basically three days a week of service in the Vocations Office), and Fr. Rodriguez has asked the Archbishop to allow him to serve as a parochial vicar in a parish the other days. With the Archbishop's approval, Father contacted me and asked if I might be open to having him serve here. After a very good conversation with him one afternoon, and after discussing this also with the members of our Pastoral Team and our Finance Committee (since we will be responsible for half of Father's salary and benefits and, of course, additional rectory expenses), we are ready to welcome Fr. Rodriguez on July 1. Father will introduce himself to you at all the Masses on the weekend of July 3-4. Knowing that you will welcome him as warmly as you welcomed me, I am confident that he will find a very happy home with us here at St. Angela!

This is also pretty interesting timing, for Father Luis will be greeted with a bit of a "trial by fire." When he moves in, I will be away! From June 24-28, I will be participating in the annual meeting of the Southeastern Lieutenancy of the Knights of the Holy Sepulchre in Birmingham, Alabama. I serve as one of the Ecclesiastical Masters of Ceremonies for this organization that is dedicated to raise funds for the shrines and schools in the Holy Land. I had also already scheduled some vacation time following the meeting.

During that time, we welcome back to our parish Fr. Bernie Carlin, C. Ss.R., who will be assisting with Masses and who will be available for funerals and other ministerial needs.



Dear Parishioners.

THANKS to all who helped to prepare for and those who served at our prayer service and dinner for our parish's 40th Anniversary. THANKS to all who participated in the evening. What a magnificent turn-out and tremendous parish spirit! This is a magnificent parish, and an evening like that one makes me more and more proud to be part of it with you!

Recently, the house directly across the street from the rectory was put on the market for sale. Our original parishioners will remember this as the first rectory for the parish. Some of you have heard me say, as I have at some of our parish meetings, that we really need to look to the future to think about expanding, and, when the "For Sale" signs went up, a few parishioners telephoned to make sure that I was aware of the sale, that we might look into this acquisition for the parish. I thank those parishioners for their alert and attentive thoughts, and, yes, I did notice this right away. A few other parishioners talked to me about it at the parish 40th Anniversary

We are, as you know, a very active parish. We have a broad range and varied schedule of activities, meetings and ministries that use our facilities day and night, four seasons a year, seven days a week. We have a school that is once again growing with the addition of our Pre-K 3 program this coming school year. We are welcoming a new parochial vicar next month. We have a large staff to serve you. We are seeing our parish ministries and activities continue to grow and expand. This kind or vibrant life does make its demands on facilities. Our facilities are in good condition and we need to keep them that way through preventative maintenance and up-dating and improvements, not simply to repair things when they break.

There have been a number of times in the months that I have been here that we were moving meetings from pillar to post, trying to stretch our limited number of available rooms to accommodate all that was going on at the time. With three active deacons, a parish business officer, and a DRE, we lack adequate office space. With the development of activities in our school, we are aware of the need for a music room and an art room and actually have the potential enrollment for an additional Pre-K 4 program, were we to have another classroom. Our new Adult Faith Formation Committee is anxious to begin expanded offerings for adults of our parish to grow in faith. It was pointed out at our last Pastoral Council meeting that we really need to consider expanded services in youth ministry. There have been a number of times that our single Parish Conference Room was not available to meet a group's needs. Yes, we certainly could use that building for parish offices and activities.

BUT, and this is a rather substantial application of that preposition, our finances do not put us in the position of acquiring that or any other property. Some months ago, I shared with you in the bulletin the total income we need to average each week in order to meet projected expenses. As you can see from the accounting each week in the bulletin, we seldom hit that mark. A logical question, of course, is: If we're not taking in what we need to, how do we stay open? We do it by not retiring our debt to the Archdiocese. While we have been making some payments along the way, they are neither consistent nor adequate to our debt. True, the Archdiocese will not shut us down because of this, but not paying our debt in a timely manner simply adds to the expense of the interest on the loan from the Archdiocese and makes any future planning nearly impossible.

Here is the weekly breakdown of our expenses:

Salaries/benefits	\$5,300
Utilities/Service Contracts/Repairs	\$2,000
Debt Retirement	\$2,800
Household/Office/Supplies	\$1,500
Assessments	\$3,700
Education	\$2,825

That brings our total weekly expenses to \$18,125.

In order to continue to provide you the services to which you are accustomed in our parish, in order to retire our debt in a timely manner, in order to continue to provide you the services to which you are accustomed in our parish, in order to retire our deat in a timely manner, in order to provide a fair wage to our employees, and in order to continue to help our ministries to grow, all parishioners must contribute faithfully, conscientiously and perhaps even sacrificially to our Church. I have been and continue to be greatly impressed with your generosity to special collections, and I urge you not to slacken in that generous support of these Archdiocesan and world-wide appeals. But I also urge you to review your regular support of your own parish -- in time, in talents and in financial support -- so that we can continue in all ways to grow and develop our parish life, ministries, organizations and services.

I have invited these parishioners, and all have accepted the challenge, to serve on our parish Finance Council: continuing on for a final two-year term are Billy Douglass and Sam Criscione. Beginning four-year terms are Vernon Kliebert, Pat Mackey and Michael Prat. I thank them for their willingness to serve. The Finance Council will begin meeting again in August.

Dear Parishioners,

I want to give you an update on the work we are doing to prepare for our new Pre-K 3 Program, assuring you that serious progress is being made. If you park in the school yard and enter church from that area, you probably already noticed that new doors have been hung on the storage room on the Melody Street side of the building and, on the Annex side, on the storage room and classroom on that side. The old doors were in rather bad condition and, since they were a laminate, could not be refinished. They have been replaced (as will the doors for the new Conference Room) with solid wood doors, stained to match the doors of the church and with all new hardware.

All demolition work for the project was completed rather quickly and now the new walls for the Conference Room are being formed. This week was spent cutting a new interior corridor from the new Conference Room and doing the plumbing and electrical work. Studs have been put into place for the new walls and closet areas. In the Annex, plumbing work is underway to install a sink for the Pre-K 3 room. We are upgrading the restrooms in the Annex, which will be used by all the children in our Early Childhood Program, which will be entirely housed in the Annex classrooms. Our goal is not simply to make improvements that are utilitarian, but to make these rooms inviting and attractive, and, recognizing the importance of these rooms in our parish ministries, to make improvements that are worthy and lasting.

There is a rapid pace to all of this work, as the contract calls for the entire project to be completed by August 1. That will give us time to move in the furnishings and to decorate the Pre-K 3 room for the opening of school on August 17. My hope is that we will be able to have an "Open House" and blessing of these new rooms the weekend before the new school year begins.

I will be attending the annual meeting of the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre in Birmingham this week and will be leaving the parish on Thursday, June 24. The meeting ends the night of June 27, and I will then take some vacation time. This week, we welcome back to St. Angela, Fr. Bernie Carlin, C.SS.R., who will be filling in for me while I am away.

Our new Parochial Vicar, Fr. Luis Rodriguez, will be moving into the rectory next week and will begin his new ministry with us on Thursday, July 1. He will be speaking at all of the Masses on the weekend of July 3-4 to introduce himself to you. I will be returning to the parish on Tuesday, July 6.

We who get settled into a certain pattern tend to resist change. However, change is sometimes necessary in order to correct and/or improve particular situations. With this in mind, St. Angela Merici Parish is making a change in one of its devotions/liturgies; the Tuesday night "Our Lady of Perpetual Help" Novena will now be moved from Tuesday evening to Tuesday morning after the 8:30am Mass.

The correction made by this change is that the Novena, which is a devotion, should not precede and be an integral part of a liturgical action of the Church, which is the Benediction that now follows the Novena.

An improvement which is hoped to be made is that of participation on Tuesday evenings the service is drawing about twenty to twenty-five participants. Hopefully, with the Novena following Tuesday morning Mass, there will be many more parishioners who stay in order to pray the separate Novena.

One other change is being made and that is in the prayer leadership of the Novena. Instead of having a member of the clergy lead the Novena Prayers, one of the members of St. Angela's parish will lead the devotion.

The date that this change is to be effective is August 3, 2004. This means that the Novena and Benediction will continue through the month of July.

Change may call us to alter our lives, but with the cooperation and prayers of our parish community, it is hoped that this change will better serve our parish in its growth in prayer and in its following of Jesus the Christ.






