Greetings!

I hope you had a good 4th of July weekend. I introduced myself at all weekend Masses and had the pleasure of meeting some of you. Just in case you were not around St. Angela this weekend, I want to share with you a few things about myself.

I was born in Chicago but moved to Puerto Rico at age 6. I lived there through high school and went to college in St. Louis. Upon graduation, I worked for a while in St. Louis in the human resource management field. I decided to look for a job outside St. Louis and was soon offered three human resource management positions, one being at Tulane Hospital & Clinic in New Orleans. I prayed so much, asking the Lord to guide me to the right job, to the right place. And the rest is history. I guess God wanted me in the New Orleans area because if you would have asked me two months before I moved down here if I would ever live in Louisiana, I would I have said that it never crossed my mind.

As soon as I arrived, I settled in Metairie. I immediately felt at home. I joined St. Clement of Rome Church and got involved in that community. My experiences at the hospital, the parish and the volleyball leagues introduced me to a lot of nice people. This led me to quickly fall in love with New Orleans. The fact that this area is so Catholic was a big plus to me. It reminded so much of growing up in Puerto Rico where Catholicism is ingrained in the culture.

After living in Metairie for some years, I finally accepted the fact that God had been calling me to the priesthood since I was a teen. I avoided God's call like the plague, but I got tired of fighting it. I had to look into the possibility of becoming a priest; I owed God that much. I visited the Vocations Office of the Archdiocese, and one thing led to another. I realized that the Lord was calling me to serve him as a priest for this Archdiocese.

I entered Notre Dame Seminary in the fall of 1996 and spent five good years there. I had the opportunity to live and work as a seminarian in various parishes of the Archdiocese--- St. Louise de Marillac in Arabi, St. Catherine of Siena, and Our Lady of Perpetual Help in Belle Chasse as deacon intern. After completion of my formation, I was ordained to the diocesan priesthood on June 2, 2001.

My three years as a priest have been a great blessing to me. If anyone tells you that the life of a priest is boring, please set them straight. There has not been one dull moment! I was first assigned as parochial vicar to Immaculate Conception Church in Marrero for almost two years. I was then transferred to St. Elizabeth Ann Seton in Kenner, where I spent only 13 months. I had a wonderful experience at these parishes.

As I reflect on these last three years, I find it interesting how life has its twists and turns. In 1995 I went to the Vocations Office for some guidance and now I am the Director of that office! But all in all, I am very blessed. I very much look forward to serving you. I have heard so many good things about St. Angela. Fr. Ken and the parish staff have gone out of their way to welcome me. I ask that you please keep me in your prayers as I promise to pray for you each and every day.



Dear Parishioners,

Happy Birthday to Fr. Luis, who celebrates his 39th birthday on Monday, July 19!

Work on the new Conference Room and Pre-K 3 Room continues to progress right on schedule. The contract calls for the rooms to be completed by August 1. We then will add appliances to the Conference Room and school furnishings to the Pre-K 3 Room and all will be in place well before school opens on August 17th.

We will have an Open House so that you can see the new rooms on the weekend of August 7-8. They will both be open so that you can pass through them either before or after any of the Masses that weekend. Immediately following the 12:15 p.m. Mass on Sunday, August 8, we will process from church to the Conference Room and then the pre-K 3 Room and bless them. All parishioners are invited to join us for the prayers of blessing.

We have received a letter from Archbishop Alfred Hughes announcing the beginning of a new formation class for the Diaconate. The discernment sessions for new applicants will begin this Fall. The Archbishop asks that we announce this and invite men interested in seeking information about the Diaconate to come forward before the discernment process begins.

I think that the restoration of the Diaconate is one of the great blessings of the reforms of Vatican II. The order of Deacons, as you know from Scripture, was begun to establish and provide for the Church dedicated ministers of charity. Today, deacons share in some sacramental ministries (Baptisms, Marriage, ministry to the sick and homebound); they preach and lead prayer services and Communion Services; they teach; they lead parish organizations; they assist in sacramental preparation, offer counseling and spiritual direction. Think about how much you see Deacons Nick, Ray and Gil do in the parish, how often you see them at parish gatherings, how much leadership they provide at parish activities and support lay ministers, and how much of this you saw Deacon Sid do in our parish before he retired, and I am certain that you will join with me in support of the significant gift the Diaconate is to us.

Each weekend, we pass from one family to another our parish Vocations Cross and Prayer. Perhaps there are a few men in our parish for whom we have been praying – perhaps there are some the Lord is calling from our parish to serve as Deacons. Perhaps you know a man whose commitment to faith and service, whose leadership and communication skills are suited for the Lord's ministry, whose compassion and care is exemplary. If you know that man, have you ever approached him and suggested he consider ministry as a Deacon? Have you ever wondered if the Diaconate is for you and taken the time to discuss this with Deacon Gil, Deacon Ray or Deacon Nick or Deacon Sid?

If you feel the Lord and our community are calling you to service as an ordained deacon, now is the time to come forward. Now is also the time for all of us to pray that some men in our parish might hear and generously respond to this call to service.

For more information or simply to discuss the diaconate, please feel free to contact one of our Deacons, Fr. Luis or me.

As you read this, I am actually on the second part of my vacation, traveling with two priest friends in the Smokey Mountains. I will return to the parish on Tuesday, July 27. Please keep us in your prayers for safety in our travels, and know that you will be in my prayers as well.

Some Tips for Reading, Praying and Studying the Bible

Reading Your Bible

Don't begin at the beginning or end. Begin with the familiar. For Christians the New Testament is a better place to start than the Old Testament. Perhaps begin with Mark, the shortest Gospel, or the letters of Paul. Do not start with the Book of Revelation, a complex and symbolic book.

Read sections rather than sentences. The Bible will make more sense if you pay attention to sections that are grouped together.

Read aloud. Everyone used to do it, especially when the books of the Bible were written. The Bible was meant to be heard – it originated as an oral tradition. Reading aloud involves you more completely than reading silently.

Studying Your Bible

Read the introductions. Most Bibles have introductions added by the editors, and they will prepare you for what comes next. Read the introduction first!

Read the footnotes. The Bible often contains material that is very foreign to our world. Customs, terms, symbolic names, etc., often require explanation. The footnotes are there for everyone, not just for scholars.

Use the cross-references. Most Bibles place these references to other biblical passages in the footnotes or on the side of the page. Often New Testament passages contain quotations or allusions to Old Testament passages. These cross-references will you further understand what you are studying. This takes some time, but your reward will be a richer understanding of the text.

Be flexible in your interpretations. You don't need to be afraid of misinterpreting the Bible if you remember that your interpretation is not necessarily the interpretation. This is especially good in a group setting: Sharing ideas about Bible passages is a wonderful way of studying the Bible, especially when you remain open to further guidance about your views. The ideal group would have a leader with some professional experience, or who has taken time to carefully learn and prepare a historical or scientific perspective.

Praying Your Bible Outside of Mass

Invoke the Holy Spirit. Every time you sit down to pray with the Bible I suggest you begin with a brief prayer to call upon the guidance of the Holy Spirit. Something as simple as "Come, Holy Spirit, be my guide as I try to understand this word" reminds us that we need to surrender to God in order to understand the Word properly.

Choose a passage to reflect on. Working through the whole book of the Bible prayerfully is more effective than random interpretations. Another way of doing this is to pray along with the lectionary selections for the upcoming Sunday Mass. That can help you prepare to hear the Word more fruitfully when it is proclaimed and preached upon the following Sunday. In three years' time, you'll have prayed along with most of the Bible!

Read the passage once through fully. Getting the big picture first helps you understand each section or passage better.

Read each section of the passage slowly. Slow, meditative reading is an ancient Christian practice known as *lectio divina*. Sitting with the text, mulling over its words and phrases and soaking in its images or themes, truly brings one to a prayerful understanding. Let the words sink in, and you will feel yourself in the presence of God.

Use your imagination. Although this approach may not work for every passage, it can be very prayerful for some. Imagine yourself in the text. Where are you? Are there characters with whom you identify? Do you see yourself in any actions?

Reread the entire passage. Once you have spent time reflecting on some sections of a passage, reread it in its entirety. Though some parts may have spoken to you more clearly, this exercise help you remember to keep the section in context.

Conclude with a prayer of thanksgiving. Thank God for the gift of the Word as you conclude your prayer exercise. It is God's Word that give us life.







Dear Parishioners.

We have completed the construction work to provide us with a new parish Conference Room and for our school's new Pre-K3 class. This weekend is the Open House so that you can see the new rooms. Both rooms will be open so that you can pass through them either before or after any of the Masses this weekend. Immediately following the 12:15 p.m. Mass on Sunday, we will process from church to the Conference Room and then to the pre-K 3 Room and bless them. All parishioners are invited to join us for the prayers of blessing.

Remember that we actually renovated three rooms for this project. What was the custodians' storage and work room (the room on the Annex side of the church) became a classroom once again. That class's former room is now the parish Conference Room. In order to make this a very accommodating space for meetings and other activities, we cut an inside entry into the rest rooms that also open onto the school yard and have installed a kitchenette with extensive cabinetry and counter space. New air conditioning/heating units were installed in both of the rooms. New entry doors were made to replace the old ones that were in rather bad condition. The rest rooms facilities were also upgraded, as they will be used by both adults and children at different times.

The former parish Conference Room is now the new space for Pre-K3, which will allow us to enroll thirty or more children in that program. We also up-graded the rest rooms in that area. There was, as is usually the case, a great deal of re-wiring and plumbing that had to be done and, because the health and fire codes for spaces used by such young children are necessarily stringent, we had to do some additional work to complete fire walls, install fire doors and fire retard some existing materials that remained in the Pre-K3 room. A fenced-in, outdoor play area with age-appropriate playthings will also be added.

I extend our parish gratitude to Mr. Leon Mathes, Jr., Chief Administrative Officer of the Archdiocese for his support of this project and his assistance in helping us to procure an extension of our loan with the Archdiocese to complete this project. Thanks, too, to Mr. Greg Mascari of the Archdiocesan Building Office for his work as architect for these spaces and his oversight of the project. Core Construction Company was the major contractor for the work, and this company and especially their sight superintendent, Nick Lamandre, were magnificent to work with. The doors were done by David McCrary of A&E Construction Co.; the stained glass in the Conference Room doors by Ruth Goliwas, who has done much excellent art work for us; Jason Crumb provided skilled mechanical and electrical engineering design and, of course, the floor coverings were done by Gil's Flooring (who else would we ever consider?). Floor and counter-top colors in Pre-K3 were selected by our school Principal, Colleen Remont. I chose colors and furnishings for the Conference Room, and I am certain you will agree on how lovely it all is! Outdoor play equipment has been provided by the School Co-op. Finally, careful oversight of all of this was given by Jackie Appleton, our Business Manager. Thanks to ALL who did such great work!

Altogether, the total project cost was \$201,000.00 This makes our total debt to the Archdiocese \$1,007,370.00. As I told you in my "State of the Parish" report at Mass two weekends ago, we need to work aggressively at retiring this debt and, as we do, to begin looking to the future and plan for additional office and meeting space to keep up with the needs of our very active and vibrant parish.

Each year, we have two significant opportunities to support the world-wide mission activities of our Church. In October of each year, we have Mission Sunday, joining in a world-wide effort to provide funds to the Society for the Propagation of the Faith. During the Summer months, we welcome to our parish a missionary for an appeal for a specific religious community or mission diocese. This weekend we have the latter opportunity. We welcome today Sr. Paula Marie Derise, O. Carm., who will speak to us of the ministry of her community in the Philippines. Sister Paula Marie is currently serving as one of the Councilors of her community, but knows well the work her Sisters faithfully and generously do in their missions. She will speak at all of the Masses this weekend to share with us information about their ministry and their needs to continue to minister effectively.

I consider this one of the most important special appeals we have each year, and so one of the most important second collections. I hope that you do too. To help to bring the message of Christ, the very mind and heart of our God to others is one of the greatest opportunities we have. To help the Church to reach out to new minds and new hearts is an awesome gift and challenge. Supporting the missionaries of our Church is one way we can respond to call to bring the gospel to all people and to every land. Please come prepared to be attentive to Sr. Paula and to be generous in support of the mission work of the Sisters of Mount Carmel.





Dear Parishioners.

"What is a parochial vicar?" That question was posed to me after one of the Masses last weekend. That's a good question, because it is a bit of new terminology for our Church. When I was ordained, I became an "associate pastor." However, the Code of Canon Law of 1983, revised in 1989 does not use that term. Instead, each parish has a pastor and, if need warrants, other priests can be assigned to that parish as "parochial vicars." According to the dictionary, a "vicar" is a deputy, one who assists another, who shares in administrative responsibility, who acts as a substitute for a person in a position of authority. "Parochial" means "parish." In the Code of Canon Law, parochial vicars are described this way: "As co-workers with the pastor and sharers in his solicitude, they are to offer service in the pastoral ministry by common counsel and effort with the pastor and under his authority." (Canon 545, 1) The Code goes on to say that "a parochial vicar is obliged to assist the pastor in the entire parochial ministry ... is to report to the pastor regularly concerning proposed and existing pastoral endeavors in such a way that the pastor and the vicar or vicars, through common efforts, are able to provide for the pastoral care of the parish for which they are together responsible."

I appreciate in this description the challenge and need for the pastor and his vicar to work collaboratively together, that, while the pastor is the one ultimately responsible for the parish, he and the vicar share the ministries of pastoral care and are to see themselves as responsible together, for this implies open and honest dialogue, mutual respect and shared vision. In talking about both "existing endeavors" and "proposed" ones, the Code supports good and careful pastoral evaluation and planning, not with each person doing his own thing, but talking, working and ministering together. The image is not that this priest does one thing and the other priest another; they work together on all things for their people's spiritual growth. It is not that the pastor bosses the associate around; they are "together responsible."

I am happy that Fr. Luis, our Parochial Vicar, and I, along with all the other members of our pastoral team, have begun to flesh out that collaborative, shared ministry. I thank you for welcoming him so warmly to our parish family and pray that, with him and his new leadership among us and in collaboration with us, we will continue to grow in the mind and heart of the Christ we love and serve.

Dear Parishioners,

We received a letter last week from Archbishop Alfred Hughes asking all pastors to consider taking up a special collection for the support of victims of Hurricane Charley in Florida. We will join in this outreach and immediate support. We will have a second collection at all Masses this weekend (August 28-29), and ask you to be generous to those thousands of our Eastern neighbors who have lost homes and property, and some who have even lost family members, in that storm. Of course, many of us have lived through the ravages of hurricanes in the past and we know the major expense and effort that must be undertaken to restore normality to our lives in the storm's aftermath. I know that you will respond to this urgent appeal with open hearts.

You may recall that, several months ago, we initiated an Adult Faith Formation Committee for our parish. The charge that I gave to this group was to seek to develop a varied, structured and progressive approach to on-going formation in the faith for all the adults of our parish, that they would seek to provide for all our adults ways to learn about and grow in our understanding of the faith. I am happy to report to you that this committee has been very diligently working for these past months. At first, they met weekly, studying the document from the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, Our Hearts Were Burning Within Us, which is a pastoral plan from the bishops for adult faith formation in the United States. Having completed their weeks of study, they have been discussing ways to develop our parish plan.

The committee would very much like your input on this. They want to know what areas and topics of Church life and doctrine you might be most interested in, and when you would like to see opportunities offered. We need to hear your needs, your thoughts and your desires to fashion a plan that really will respond to your needs. In this bulletin next week, there will be a one-page survey prepared by our Adult Faith Formation Committee. It will take less than five minutes of your time to read and complete. With our committee members, I urge you to fill in the survey and to return it to us. You may either drop it (along with your regular church monetary offering, of course!) in the collection the following weekend, bring it to any parish meeting and give it to the staff member present, mail it to or drop it off at the rectory office. Based on your input, the committee will develop our parish plan for on-going adult faith formation. Thanks!

The first offering sponsored by our Adult Faith Formation Committee begins on Wednesday, September 1. Mr. Vincent Scozzari of the Institute of Catechetics and Spirituality will offer an eight-week course on the New Testament. I encourage all of you to consider participating. We extend a special invitation and word of encouragement to all Readers, whose ministry it is at Mass to make the Word of God come to life for others through their proclamation, to take advantage of this great opportunity to grow in understanding of that Word of life and truth. There is no charge for the course. It will be held in our parish Conference Room on Wednesday nights from 7:00-9:00 p.m. Please call our Religious Education Office, 837-9347, for more details.

If you did not pick up a packet of raffle tickets for the Fair last weekend, please remember to do so after Mass today. The Fair will be Friday, Saturday and Sunday, October 1, 2 and 3. Let's help get the Fair off to a great start by supporting the raffle!

Dear Parishioners,

This week, we received news that Fr. Meridier, who so faithfully assists us with sacramental ministry in our parish, has been diagnosed with Lou Gehrig's Disease. We pledge Father Willie our prayerful support and our faithful companionship with him in his illness.

The Office of Worship of the Archdiocese is currently conducting workshops to prepare people for service as Special Ministers of Holy Communion, both for service at parish liturgies and for ministry to the homebound. We are hoping to increase the number of Special Ministers at the 9:30 a.m. Mass on Sundays and are also open to increasing the number of ministers available for ministry to the shut-ins of our parish.

Special Ministers of Holy Communion must be fully initiated into the Church (i.e., have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Communion and Confirmation), must be in a valid sacramental marriage (if they are married), must be living a life in accord with the moral teachings of the Church and must manifest a special devotion to the Eucharist at Mass and in private prayer. Candidates for this ministry must be registered parishioners and faithful to Sunday Mass. Sharing in the awesome gift of ministering the Body and Blood of Christ, such ministers are to be rich in attitudes of respect for each individual, of compassion and the sensitivity we associate with the heart of Christ.

If you feel that you might be called to this ministry and would be interested in learning about service here in our parish and who might wish to participate in the Archdiocesan training sessions should contact me at the rectory to set up an appointment, which would be with me, Fr. Luis or Deacon Ray. The most proximate training session will be held at St. Clement of Rome Church at the end of October; registration through our parish office is required and would be arranged following the interview.

Our parish has been having exposition and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament on the first Friday of each month. Parishioners have been invited to spend time before the Blessed Sacrament in prayer on those days; during the school day, classes of students are brought to church for prayer and the Knights of Columbus try to schedule adorers during the hours of exposition.

While this is a good practice and an excellent opportunity for quiet, reflective prayer before the Lord's Eucharistic presence, we have noticed that there have been times during these days when no one is in church. In light of the fact that the next scheduled day for exposition is the day the parish fair begins (Friday, October 1), that there will be an early dismissal from school that day, and the hubbub of fair preparations, I have decided that we will cancel exposition that day. Because of the low participation in the prayer of those days in the past, we will use the next two months to evaluate this as a monthly practice.

If you have comments to share with us about monthly exposition and adoration or suggestions to offer on this practice. I would ask you

If you have comments to share with us about monthly exposition and adoration or suggestions to offer on this practice, I would ask you to jot them down and send them to me at the rectory or give them to any member of our Pastoral Staff. We will discuss this at our October staff meeting (October 20), and I will let you know about our decisions for the future.

I'm not sure that we ever "officially" announced this, but now that Fr. Luis is with us, we have begun again to have Mass (rather than a Communion Service) on Tuesday mornings at 6:15 a.m. That means that we do have Mass Monday through Friday at both 6:15 a.m. and 8:30 a.m. and on Saturday mornings at 8:30 a.m.

Also, we have been reviewing our Mass schedule for Holy Days of Obligation (the next one will be Wednesday, December 8, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception). We will be modifying that schedule just a bit. We will continue to celebrate the anticipated Mass of the Holy Day the evening before at 4:00 p.m. On the holy day itself, we will have Masses at 6:15 and 8:30 a.m. (instead of moving it to 9:00 a.m. as we had been doing), 12 Noon (as in the past), and we will be adding a Mass on the evening of the holy day at 6:00 p.m. We hope that the addition of this later Mass, which we will do on a trial basis, might be helpful to those who work and cannot get here for the 12 Noon Mass.

I will be on retreat this week, from Monday afternoon through Friday afternoon. Please keep me in your prayers during this special time, and know that you will be in mine as well.



Here in the United States, we live in a society that both guarantees to us the freedom to practice our faith and also presents significant challenges to that faith. Some of these touch on human life and dignity, marriage and family, war and peace, the needs of the poor and the demands of justice. The most important issue underlying them all is respect for human life.

Respect for life includes a number of issues: abortion, biotechnology which leads to the wanton destruction of human embryos, homicide, suicide, euthanasia, the removal of ordinary means of human support, the end of life, capital punishment, waging of war. Each of these life issues is linked to one another by a respect for the dignity and sacredness of human life. Each, however, is subject to a distinctive moral analysis. For example, we can never accept abortion, the destruction of embryonic cells or human cloning, euthanasia or physician assisted suicide, a redefinition of marriage or family. We may not perform an evil act in order to achieve some real or apparent benefit. Other issues are going to demand prudential judgment to determine whether the conditions that may make them licit in certain circumstances are fulfilled. Such decisions need to be guided by the gospel message of the Lord and the teaching of the Church.

As we commemorate Respect Life Sunday, I reiterate this teaching. I also want to extend a compassionate invitation to those who experience difficulty with the teaching or who have failed to live it. The Lord is merciful and he wants to heal us. Please feel free to approach your parish priest for assistance either in understanding or reconciliation.

May God grant us the grace to respect, reverence and protect human life in this world for eternal life in the next.
