Dear Parishioners,

See you at the Fair this weekend! As always, there will be lots of good food and drink, special entertainment by the bands that have been scheduled and, of course, by our school children, lots of games, booths and activities. Please come out and support this important parish activity. Remember that most of the proceeds are contributed to the school for the education and religious formation of our young people and some of the funds are retained for parish operating expenses.

There are two very special items being raffled this year: a desk, made by Deacon Sid Rougelot and, as I offered last year, dinner for six at the rectory that I will cook. Look for tickets for these raffles at the Basket Raffle Booth in the Msgr. Kern Center.

Pope John Paul II recently decreed that October, 2004-October, 2005 will be, for all in our Church, "The Year of the Eucharist." The Holy Father announced this in his homily on the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of the Lord this past June as he celebrated Mass at the Basilica of St. John Lateran. It will begin with the worldwide Eucharistic Congress in Guadalajara, Mexico, from October 10-17, 2004 and will end with the Synod of Bishops in Rome October 2-29, 2005, whose theme will be "The Eucharist: Source and Summit of the Life and Mission of the Church."

Archdioceses and parishes will be trying this year, in line with the Holy Father's call, to increase knowledge of the awesome gift of the Eucharist, faithful commitment to sharing in that gift in Holy Communion, enhanced Eucharistic prayer and devotion, all overflowing into sacrificial service of one another. I am happy to announce that our Pastoral Team and our Adult Faith Formation Committee will be working together to sponsor opportunities throughout this year to help us focus on the life-giving gift of the Eucharist. Two things are already planned:

On Saturday, October 30, Sr. Noel Toomey, O.P., will speak to us on the gift of the Eucharist. This talk will be in church at 9:30 a.m. Coffee and donuts will be served in the parish Conference Room from 9:00-9:30 a.m. I invite you to come to the 8:30 a.m. Mass to share in this gift of the Eucharist and to stay for coffee and Sister's presentation. Sr. Noel is a member of the religious community called the Eucharistic Missionaries of St. Dominic. Her life as a member of this community has been focused on the Eucharist. Sister now serves as the Director of the Archdiocesan Spirituality Center and therefore brings to us her own depth of spirituality. It will, I know, be an enlightening and inspiring morning.

On Saturday, November 20, the Office of Worship will sponsor a Morning of Reflection for liturgical ministers of the Archdiocese, and we have the privilege of hosting that morning here at St. Angela. Our own Fr. Luis, along with Fr. John Arnone (pastor of Holy Name of Mary Church), will be the speakers for this day of prayer. It will focus on the spirituality of liturgical ministers, based on some recent documents of our Church on the Eucharist, especially the Holy Father's encyclical letter "In the Eucharist and Its Relationship to the Church." Ministers, please note that pre-registration is required for this day. You will receive information about it with your new ministry schedule.

I will let you know of future parish plans for "The Year of the Eucharist" as they develop.

Our school Principal, Colleen Remont, and I will be attending the Catholic Schools Administrators' Conference in Biloxi, MS from Wednesday to Friday of this week (October 6-8). Then, I will leave from there to attend the annual meeting of the Federation of Diocesan Liturgy Committees. I will return to the parish on Friday, October 15.



Dear Parishioners,

THANKS to all those who took leadership roles in our parish fair, to all those who worked in preparation for and at the fair, to all those who donated items for the fair, to all of you who participated in the fair! This really is a great coming together of time and talent, of care and support, of dedication and zeal. The fair was a great success because so many people gave so generously. Since numbers are still being tabulated, we do not have a financial summary for you just yet, but we will for next week's bulletin. In that bulletin we will also list the major prize winners.

Several weeks ago, Claudette Craven, our Director of Religious Education, met with me to let me know that she has decided to retire from this ministry to our parish, in which she has been involved on a full-time basis since 1987, and part-time for several years before that. We haven't forgotten the survey conducted by our Adult Faith Formation Committee. The recent near-by hurricanes have slowed down their work a bit, but we do hope to have a report on the survey in the next bulletin.

I have placed on the tables in church where you pick up your hymnals for Mass two brochures from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. One is on "Faithful Citizenship" and deals with our responsibility as voting citizens; the second addresses the important moral issue of stem cell research. Please pick up a copy of each of these and take the time to read them carefully. I think they will help you considerably as you consider these very significant issues.

Sometimes tragedies hit close to home, like the recent spate of consecutive hurricanes. Sometimes tragedies affect the lives of people further away from us, but no less deserving of our Christian care. You were very generous several weeks ago in the collection we had for the hurricane victims in Florida. This weekend, the Archbishop asks us to consider and respond to the plight of the people of Sudan. The violence of war has affected millions of people in that nation. There are hundreds of thousands who have been driven from their homes and now live in refugee camps. Some world leaders have said that this is the worst humanitarian crisis in the world today. Catholic Relief Services has been in the Sudan bringing relief and aid, but much more help is needed. We will take up that collection at all Masses this weekend. We ask your customary generous support.

Mark your calendars: our next Parish Pot Luck dinner is next Saturday, October 16, beginning at 5:00 p.m. Bring a covered dish to share and join your fellow parishioners for a relaxing evening of food and fellowship!





Dear Parishioners.

There are many kinds of prayer. For those of us who remember our old catechism lessons, we learned that there are prayers of praise and adoration, prayers of thanksgiving, of contrition, of petition. There are lots of ways to pray: traditional formulated prayers (the Lord's Prayer, the Hail Mary, the Acts of Faith, Hope, Love and Contrition, the Morning Offering), spontaneous prayers. There is reflective prayer based on the Scripture or some spiritual author. There are postures of prayer: kneeling, with our hands folded or outstretched, lying prostrate. There are places for prayer: churches and chapels, retreat centers, a prayer space in one's home. One can actually pray anywhere at any time. As long as our prayer continues to open us to the mind and heart of God, as long as our prayer is a way for us to seek and know and find the strength to do God's will, as long as our prayer helps us to see our role in the family of faith and in building the reign of Christ, that prayer is beneficial prayer.

I have always found one of the most challenging forms of prayer to be quiet, reflective prayer before the Blessed Sacrament. Whether the Eucharist in church is exposed or in the tabernacle, I find that prayer has a very different feel to it. In church, I feel on "God's turf" and not my own. Because of that, I find it more difficult to be the one to set the agenda. Before the Blessed Sacrament, my prayer is less prayer of petition – me asking for what I want – and much more a openness to be still and listen for God to let me know what God wants, to let God set the direction for the conversation of that prayer and my life that will follow that prayer. I find prayer before the Blessed Sacrament much more calming than prayer filled with words and this calm affords me the opportunity to reflect more deeply and regain my own focus on my life and my ministry.

Inaugurating this "Year of the Eucharist," Pope John Paul II has written an encyclical letter "On the Church and Its Relationship to the Eucharist." In that letter, the Holy Father calls for all Catholics to renew and deepen our sense of amazement at the awesome gift of the Eucharist, to "admire the doctrinal expositions of the of the decrees on the Most Holy Eucharist," to welcome with him the progress of the liturgical renewal that has all been based on these teachings about the Eucharist, to continue to celebrate the Mass properly and well, to embrace how the Eucharist unites us in faith, nourishes us for service and impels us to mission, to see once again the value of prayer of adoration before the Eucharist. The Holy Father writes, "The Eucharist, as Christ's saving presence in the community of the faithful and as its spiritual food, is the most precious possession which the Church can have in her journey through history." (paragraph 9)

A few weeks ago, I told you that we would be reevaluating our practice of Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and closing Benediction on First Fridays. I thank those of you who took the time to share comments on this and who offered suggestions. Based on your input and with the recommendation of our pastoral staff, beginning on Friday, November 5 and continuing every First Friday through May, 2005, we will expose the Blessed Sacrament at the conclusion of the 8:30 a.m. Mass and continue adoration until 11:00 a.m. We will close this special time of prayer with Benediction at 11:00 a.m.

We will continue to bring groups of our school children for periods of adoration. We will encourage all of our parish organizations to commit to having members spend time in prayer on those days. It is my hope, and that of our entire pastoral team, that in this Year of the Eucharist, our parish family will embrace First Friday exposition and adoration as an opportunity to express our openness to the Lord in prayer, our deep and abiding love for the great gift of the Eucharist, and our desire to accept and embrace this, the greatest possession of the Church on our journey of life.

Fr. Meridier has asked me to express to you, on his behalf, his deep gratitude for your expressions of concern, affection and support as he faces the disease ALS (Lou Gehrig's Disease). Father has told me that he has been touched by all of the cards, notes, promises of prayers and words of encouragement that so many of you have offered to him since we learned of his illness.

We will all continue to be of prayerful support to Fr. Meridier, and we are enormously thankful to him for so generously continuing his service to us here in our parish. Father will continue to be with us for Mass, the Sacrament of Penance and parish activities and events as long as his health permits.





Dear Parishioners,

3) the endorsement of any candidate for any office is against Archdiocesan policy, so permission would NOT have been given, even had it been sought;

4) we do not approve of any brochures or other materials being put on your cars while you are at Mass – you don't need that kind of nuisance when you come to church;

5) when this has happened in the past, we have contacted those responsible, when we can find out who they are and let them know very clearly that this is not permitted and not to be repeated.

The information this past weekend was published by a Washington PAC group and we do not know who was responsible for placing that material on your automobiles. I apologize for this. If it happens again, please let me know IMMEDIATELY (I am at almost every Mass every weekend) so that we can handle this as quickly as possible.

Did you know that our parish bulletin is on our web site every week? If you fail to receive your copy in the mail, you can find it at www.stangela.org.

In addition to all of our regular meetings and activities, there's a number of special things going on this month:
-- Saturday, November 6 (this weekend), we begin what I hope will become an annual tradition: at 4:00 p.m. Mass, we welcome families of those who have died during this past year. We will offer special prayers during Mass for those parishioners of ours who

Dear Parishioners,

We all know that many Scripture stories of Jesus ministering to the sick, the dying, to families of the deceased. The path that Jesus walked was always a flexible path that would move wherever he needed to go to care for people at this great moment of human need. Like our Lord, we hold ministry to the sick, the homebound, the terminally ill, the bereaved in high importance. We have a generous and dedicated group of parishioners who regularly bring Holy Communion to the homebound. Father Luis and I make an effort to visit the sick in hospitals when families inform us of this. Fr. Luis and I visit those who need the Sacrament of the Sick at the onset of serious illness or before surgery. Our deacons assist us with visiting those who are near death to bring the Viaticum (Holy Communion and special prayers as death approaches, which are the "last rites" of the Church). Again, Fr. Luis and I, when families call, make every effort to visit with a family at the time of the death of a loved one. At that time, we pray with the family and begin discussing plans for the funeral liturgy.

Msgr. Kern began the custom here (an excellent one!) of providing the services of a cantor, organist and servers at funeral liturgies when they are celebrated here in our parish church. When there is visitation prior to the liturgy, our Family Life Organization provides coffee for the family in the parish Conference Room. Family Life reaches out again, offering to prepare a meal for the family home after the funeral, if this is needed.

I am very happy to share with you that we are, with the cooperation of the members of SALA and Family Life, we are now ready to expand our ministry to the bereaved at the time of the death of a loved one. We are now in the process of calling forward parishioners to serve in this expanded ministry. We would like to have a group of parishioners willing to be available to serve as Readers and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion at funeral liturgies. We would also like to have a small group of parishioners willing to work with a family preparing the funeral liturgy in case Fr. Luis, our deacons or I are unavailable to meet with the family. This has happened several times already, especially on weekends, when we are rather fully committed already to weekend Masses and other planned parish activities. The members of SALA have agreed to take on this new Bereavement Ministry under the auspices of their organization as a new committee.

We have not yet set dates for formation for these ministries, but if you would like to serve in any aspect of this bereavement ministry, please contact me at the rectory. We will set up information and training sessions in the coming weeks.

On Tuesday of this week, November 30, SALA will sponsor their annual Morning of Reflection, and all parishioners are invited to participate. This begins with 8:30 a.m. Mass in church,; coffee follows Mass and the talks begin at 9:30 a.m. in church. Sr. Jeanne Moore, O.P. is the speaker for the day. I had the great privilege to work with Sr. Jeanne when I served as associate pastor at Our Lady of Lourdes Parish in Violet, and Sr. Jeanne gave several workshops and days of prayer for the Archdiocese at my invitation when I served as Director of the Office of Worship. I know Sr. Jeanne to be a truly holy woman of faith. She has a deep and fervent love for Sacred Scripture and holds an advanced degree in Scripture as well. I am confident that you will profit greatly by this investment of a few hours of your time, and strongly encourage you to participate in this day. Even though this is sponsored by SALA, please do note that ALL parishioners are invited for this Day of Prayer, as Sister Jeanne leads us into reflections on Advent from a Scriptural perspective.

ATTENTION, USHERS: I would like to remind those who serve as ushers at weekend Masses that we will have a special meeting to prepare for Christmas on Saturday, December 11 at 10:00 a.m. in the Center Coffee and pastries will be served. I ask ALL ushers to make plans to participate in this meeting, which will afford us time to discuss your ministry as well as look forward to our holiday schedule and ministers we will need for these Masses.



Dear Parishioners,

The Advent wreath. Violet vestments. Hymns, repeated over and over throughout the season, that remind us that the Lord is coming, that remind us of eager longing, hopeful waiting, patient preparation. Advent has its own sights and its own sounds. That is why we selected the Mass setting we introduced last weekend. Based on the extremely familiar melody of "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel," it weaves all through the Mass that plaintive chant, the sound of the season. Perhaps you will even keep this melody in your mind as you participate in other activities of this season, making all of Advent the prayer for the Lord Jesus to come to us, in our lives and in our hearts, a reminder for us to make room each day for the Lord to enter. Come, Lord Jesus!

It is important that each liturgical season has its own sound, its own sights, its own unique feel, for in that, it allows us to view the constant of the Paschal mystery from a variety of perspectives. With the leadership and cooperation of our skilled music ministers, we hope to continue to develop this pattern of seasonal music, using the "Missa Emmanuel" only during Advent, singing another setting from our repertoire, the "Mass of Redemption," for the Christmas season, and using the very familiar "Mass of Creation" during Ordinary Time. That means, of course, that we will be learning two more Mass settings, one for Lent and another for the Easter Season.

I would like to express my gratitude to all of those who helped to make Thanksgiving a special day for a number of needy families in our area. Did you notice, on the Sunday before Thanksgiving, how the food boxes in church were filled to overflowing? Because of the generosity of the parish families who brought food, the members of our St. Vincent de Paul Society, under the leadership of Bro Schexnayder, were able to prepare 70 Thanksgiving baskets! These were distributed to 120 adults and children. A total of thirty-six donated hens were included in these baskets and 17 vouchers for turkeys for the larger families. Assisting Bro were Byron Falgout, Ralph Berni, Frank and Georgi Hebert and Leon and Tee Toups. It was a massive job, sorting the boxed and canned goods and preparing the baskets, and we thank these people for their dedicated service.

Let me remind you that our St. Vincent de Paul organization is called upon throughout the year for emergency assistance, and so your gifts of food throughout the year, your financial offerings to the Poor Box, your support of the collections on Thanksgiving Day and Holy Thursday help us to serve the needy every day. Thank you for your attentiveness to the poor and our compassionate response, in Christ's own name, to the needy.

I also want to thank Kim Schaff, who coordinated the reception for Claudette Craven weekend before last. Kim, and those who worked with her from SALA, Family Life and Co-Op, did a magnificent job preparing and hosting Claudette's retirement gathering. Thanks to you all!




