Dear Parishioners.

Because we do not yet have full mail service restored, this will have to suffice as our parish bulletin for another week! We hope (and that this moment, it is still a hope), that we can be back to our customary mailed bulletin next week.

I want to thank the Kliebert, Cousson and Brown families, who spent many bours last week working to clean, mow, edge and rake around the rectory, the Meditation Garden, the church, the center and the school and who have helped to make our campus beautiful again. I want also to reiterate our thanks to those who, immediately after Kahrinn, came in to check our buildings and who kept a watchful eye on our facilities: Glean Scorsone, Chris Pease, Eric Broadbridge and Paul Bringlio were among the leaders in this. These kinds of taking-the-initiative in care is the sort of generosity I see all the time that makes St. Angela a very special place!

We have moved our first Mass of the school year: it will be on Wednesday of this week, October 5 at 6:00 p.m. We are doing this so that, not only our students, but their families may participate in this Mass as well. This is a very unique school year as we resume classes, for we welcome one hundred new students to our school. These are students who, because of damage to their schools from Hurricane Katrina, will not be able to return to their own parish schools for a few menths or even at all for the remainder of this school term. We are happy that we could accommodate so many of these families. We are happy to have them as part of our St. Angela family and even secretly hope that some of them will choose to stay with us even beyond hurricane clean-up! Welcome, new families and new students, you enrich us by the gifts, the energy and hope that you bring with you! Having the school Mass in the evening will allow our SAM families and students to welcome our new-comers and to begin to form new friendships.

All parishioners, of course, are invited to the Mass and reception, to support our young people and to welcome the new students and their families to our SAM community: First Mass of the school year, Wednesday, October 5 at 6:00 p.m.

I want to remind all members of the Pastoral Council, Finance Council and School Board that we will have a special joint meeting of these three groups on Tuesday of this week, October 4 at 7:00 p.m. The purpose of this joint meeting is to discuss what needs to be the focus of our parish in this time following Katrina and Rita and to review our calendar to make necessary adjustments.

At our weekday Masses, we have been reading these past weeks from the Books of Ezra, Haggai and Zechariah. These are books of the Hebrew Scriptures written after the return of the Israelite people from the Exile; they are the books of the Restoration. What a coincidence that we are reading these books, with their wise counsel, during the time of our own "Restoration" following Hurricane Katrina and Hurricane Rita. I really have appreciated these readings in a whole new way because of our own experiences these past several weeks.

One thing that the Israelite people learned from the prophet Zechariah was that the Restoration did not mean a simple return to their former way of life. Things had changed and had changed dramatically. The Restoration could recapture some of the old, but it had to be open to the new as well. For the Israelite people, the greatest challenge Zechariah pronounced was that, in this new settling of their land, it would not be only the Jewish people who would be invited into renewed relationship with God. Zechariah proclaimed: There shall yet come peoples, the inhabitants of many cities; and the inhabitants of one city shall approach those of another and say, "Come! Let us go to implore the favor of the Lord"; and, "I too will go to seek the Lord." Many peoples and strong nations shall come to seek the Lord of hosts in Jerusalem and to implore the favor of the Lord. (Zech. 8:20-22) The Restored Israel would be the catalyst of many more nations and peoples finding the new hope they found, the new possibilities that existed for them. The Restored Israel would be the channel through which the love of God would flow to many and through which the hearts of many would approach God.

As we seek the restoration of our lives, our homes, our businesses, our community, we recognize that we can serve as that same channel of God's presence and the voice of God's invitation. We, still imbued with faith, still holding on to hope, anxious to remain close to God and to have God be our strength, we are prophets to those who might be weak in hope, wavering in faith, wondering about God's presence. Let us stand firm and help each other to stand firm so that all around us might say, as they said to Zechariah and to Israel: Let us go with you, for we have heard that God is with you. (Zech 8:23)

This is certainly a time for each of us to re-evaluate our faith and our relationships, finding ways to deepen both so that we will have hope always before us; and it is also a time to make some more practical adjustments as well. Those who participate in weekday Masses know that we have, by adjusting the lighting in church, created a bit of a "chapel within a church" for weekday Masses. Senting for morning Mass, Monday through Saturday, is in the center section of church only. This helps us to be more a community at prayer, more united in body, so that we will be even more inspired to be one in mind and in spirit.

We will soon be working with our extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion so that we will be able to add Communion under both kinds at these Masses. I will say more about this in next week's bulletin.

We have also changed the time for the Sacrament of Penance. It is now calculated on Saturday evenings, from 5:30-6:00 p.m. I'll also say a bit more about this in next week's bulletin.

MASSES NEXT WEEKEND: Because a number of parishioners have not yet returned to their homes, we will have Masses next weekend on Saturday at 4:00 p.m. and Sunday morning at 8:00, 9:30 and 11:00 a.m.

We will return to our regular weekend Mass schedule on the weekend of October 22-23.

SACRAMENT OF PENANCE: Effective immediately, we will celebrate the Sacrament of Penance on Saturday afternoons from 5:30-6:00 p.m. or other times by appointment.

Weekday Masses: Again this week, we will celebrate only one weekday Mass, at 8:30 a.m. The church will be opened each morning at 8:00 a.m. and will be locked at the end of the school day at 3:00 p.m.

SIGN-UP FOR LITURGICAL MINISTERS: There is a sign-up sheet in the sacristy (on weekdays) and in the vesting room (on weekends) for liturgical ministers to serve at weekend Masses for the month of October. We ask all Readers, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and Altar Servers to volunteer to assist at our weekend Masses for the month of October.

CCD Classes will resume on Monday, October 10. We have room in our classes for children of new parishioners who attend private or public schools. For the new families, we ask that you come to the Religious Education Office during this week, between 3:30 and 6:00 p.m., to register. This will enable the first night of religious education classes to go smoothly.

CHOIR NEWS: The choir will resume weekly rehearsals on Tuesday of this week at 7:30 p.m. in church. We know that we have folks attending Mass here at 5t. Angela from neighboring parishes that will not be able to resume their Masses for a while: if any of you are choir members in those parishes, we would LOVE to have you join us in our choir (even if only temporarily) and sing at the 11:00 a.m. Mass. For more information, please call Peter Weilbaecher, our parish Music Director, at 466-9823.

MASS INTENTIONS FROM THE PAST WEEKS: Because of interruption in Masses due to the hurricane, we have moved all Mass intentions from the past weeks and the 6:15 a.m. intentions to days with "multiple intentions." Please note that Mass intentions are temporarily being posted on the Bulletin Boards in church. We will once again print these intentions, sanctuary lamp and memorial flowers when we return to our regular bulletin format. THANKS for your understanding in this!

Housing needed: We are still receiving inquiries about housing in our area. If you know of a home for sale in your neighborhood, or if you have room/s in your own home for rent, or if you have room/s in your home you're willing to have people use on a temporary basis, please call the rectory and let us know, so that we can pass that information along.



Dear Parishioners.

It looks as though more and more parishioners are able to return to their homes and we had a wonderful attendance at Masses this past weekend, with folks even having to stand at the 11:00 a.m. Mass, with parking places rather difficult to find — good problems to have! Since things are progressing more quickly than we had anticipated, we will return to our full Sunday Mass schedule NEXT weekend, October 15-16: Mass on Saturday at 4:00 p.m.; Masses on Sunday at 8:00 a.m., 9:30 a.m., 11:00 a.m. and 12:30 p.m.

Please note that we are now celebrating the Sacrament of Penance at a later time on Saturday, from 5:30-6:00 p.m. There are a few reasons for this change, that Fr. Luis and I had been mulling over for a while. First of all, Fr. Luis and I both have Archdiocesan responsibilities outside of the parish. In addition to being Director of Vocations for the Archdiocese, Fr. Luis also serves as a chaplain to the Hispanic Apostolate. He regularly has weekend commitments for the activities of the Vocations Office and for the Hispanic community in our archdiocese. My commitment is more limited, as I serve on the Archdiocesan Liturgical Commission and am a voting representative for the archdiocese at the annual meeting of the Federation of Diocesan Liturgical Commissions. (I am on my way to that meeting as you read this edition of the Bulletin!) it happens rather regularly that the priest who is to celebrate the 4:00 p.m. Mass also is the priest celebrating the Sacrament of Penance. Both Fr. Luis and I prefer to have time to prepare for Mass. When we celebrate the Sacrament of Penance before Mass, it is necessary to keep on eye on our watch, and we do not like this split focus. Sometimes there are people remaining in line when it is time to stop, and they are a bit frustrated when they have waited for the Sacrament and cannot be served that day.

By moving Confessions to a later time, it allows the priest more adequate time to prepare prayerfully for Mass. By not having anything after Confessions, we are not hurried in any way. We can take our time with each penitent and we can stay beyond the schedule time when need be.

I would also remind you that Fr. Luis and I realize that Saturday evening may not be a convenient time for everyone and we are happy to make an appointment with you to celebrate the Sacrament of Penance at another, mutually convenient time.

We thank you for your understanding in this matter.

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal states that: Holy Communion has a more complete form as a sign when it is received under both kinds. For in this manner of reception a fuller sign of the Eucharistic banquet shines forth. Moreover there is a clearer expression of that will by which the new and everlasting covenant is ratified in the blood of the Lord and of the relationship of the Eucharistic banquet to the eschatological banquet in the Father's kingdom. (GIRM, 281)

In the past, we have ministered Holy Communion under both kinds on a very limited time, generally only on Holy Thursday and on Thanksgiving. We will soon be offering Communion under both kinds, giving all a greater opportunity to share in the fuller and beautiful sign of the Lord's presence in his Body and Blood, at all weekday morning Masses.

To prepare for this, I ask that all those who serve as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion to come to the sacristy after any Mass this week to get instructions from Fr. Luis or me on how we will minister the Blood of Christ at these Masses.







Dear Parishioners,

THANKS to all those who helped prepare for, who ministered and assisted at and who helped clean up after our two special Masses, the Parish Welcome Home Mass and the Opening of School Mass, and the receptions that followed. It was wonderful to have these opportunities to be renewed in our faith by the Lord's Word and Sacrament and to be supported in faith by the prayer of one another. Many of those present for these liturgies and the receptions commented how good it was to rekindle old friendships, to know each other were safe and on the way to getting lives back to normal, to have the opportunity to share their own stories of these past few weeks and to hear each others' stories as well.

There was a special meeting of the Pastoral Staff, the Pastoral Council, Finance Council and School Board this past Tuesday, at which we discussed ways of helping each other in the aftermath of the hurricanes that affected us. Those present for this meeting said that they thought these kinds of gatherings are important for us and encouraged the Staff to schedule more similar opportunities for folks to gather. We will do this.

Of course, due to the storms, our calendar of events has had to be reviewed, and the Councils offered some good insights how to do that. The Staff will work on a revised calendar over the next few weeks. I do need to hear from leaders of parish organizations (SAMA, SALA, Senior Citizens, Co-Op, Scouts) on your plans for future meetings and activities so that these can be included in our calendar deliberations.

The Ministries Fair was, as you know, scheduled for Katrina weekend. One lesson from Katrina that we learned was how much we really do rely on the sharing and service of one another. We need each other. We want to reach out in care for one another. Through the Ministries Fair, we can all seek and find ways to that right here in our parish, serving the common good of our St. Angela family of faith. The Ministries Fair will be re-scheduled.

The Parish Fair also fell victim to the storm. We will move the Parish Fair to the weekend of May 5-6-7. The Fair Committee will be meeting soon to determine if we can have a "full-blown" Fair or a scaled-down version. We chose that weekend because it was the weekend scheduled for the Soiree, so the facilities were already scheduled for a parish fund-raising event. We will NOT have a Soiree this year, but hope for it to come back strong in 2007. We hope to schedule a Fish-Fry soon, since so many looked forward to that event for good fellowship and good food! We'll work with the SAMA Kitchen Crew to set a date in the very near future.

We have decided to put on hold the remainder of our Parish Information Gatherings and the needs assessment and goal-setting that we had scheduled for November, December, January. It is pretty obvious that our overwhelming need right now is to help each other, our families, our neighbors, our community get our homes and our area back in order from the storms. New goal-setting for the parish can easily be deferred to a time when we feel back to a higher degree of normal.

The Staff will meet on October 19 for this calendar work. If you have suggestions to offer us, please speak with any staff member before that date.







Dear Parishioners.

The weekend Katrina was hurtling toward us was the weekend we were scheduled here at St. Angela to have our Parish Ministries Fair. As the storm came closer and as civic officials were considering whether to call for an evacuation of our area and trying to figure out if it would be "mandatory" or "recommended," Fr. Luis and I were in the rectory trying to figure out if we should have all our Masses or some of our Masses or whether we should stay or go ourselves. When the members of our Pastoral Council telephoned me to ask if we were canceling the Ministries Fair, I must admit I didn't want to at first - I didn't think people would be leaving, even if an evacuation were called for and I didn't know when we could possibly re-schedule an event that would cover the whole weekend. Katrina caused confusion all around then and, having experienced her magnitude, I'm not surprised she is still causing us confusion now.

While we did cancel the Ministries Fair and, after Fr. Luis made several telephone calls to other parishes and diocesan officials, we also ended up canceling the final two Masses of the weekend, we did have parishioners hanging in Limbo with their own needs and their own family concerns. Some people remained in the area longer than they wanted to because of our delay in making a decision about the Fair. Some remained because they were assigned as liturgical ministers at the later morning Masses. In retrospect, I think we waited too long to make a local decision here.

The Archdiocese has no clear plan for church parishes in such events as we faced with Katrina. We had no clear plan in place here. I do not want this lack of clarity to exist here any longer. At the special meeting on October 4, attended by members of our Pastoral Staff, the Pastoral and Finance Councils and the School Board, we agreed on this statement:

It is the practice of St. Angela Merici Parish that, when an evacuation is called for by local civic officials (whether this be termed a recommended, voluntary or mandatory evacuation), all scheduled parish activities, including liturgical services, will immediately be cancelled. The Blessed Sacrament, parish sacramental and archival records will be secured according to Archdiocesan procedures, all buildings of the parish will be secured, and the clergy of the parish will follow the call to evacuate. The Dean of the East Jefferson Deanery will be notified of the final destination of the parish priests.

In following this procedure, the Pastoral Staff and lay leaders of St. Angela Merici seek to respect the expertise and leadership of our local government and to encourage all parishioners to do the same. The facilities of St. Angela Merici Parish do not serve as an evacuation site for local residents.

I thank the members of our staff and consultative councils for their careful consideration of this statement and the clear practice we will now automatically follow. I hope that this will help us all to move more quickly should we ever face such a serious situation again, while I hope (as I'm sure you do!) that we never have to rely on this practice.

I shared with you last week that we are reviewing the parish calendar and will be rescheduling some parish events that were effected by Katrina and Rita. I will let you know a revised schedule as soon as I can.



Dear Parishioners.

Tuesday of this week, November 1, is the Solemnity of All Saints, a Holy Day of Obligation for us as Catholics. The belief we have in "the communion of saints" announces our belief in the truth and power of the Resurrection of Christ and that we are, as St. Paul said, "coheirs with Christ" of all the good gifts of God, including everlasting life. Those who have died, who "have gone before marked with the sign of faith," now live in the eternal presence of God. The holy women and men who have gone before us, whether officially canonized by our Church or not, are our examples, our intercessors and our inspiration. We join together on All Saints Day to honor our ancestors in faith and to be refreshed and renewed in and through our union with them.

Please note that we will have the following schedule of Masses for the Holy Day: on the eve of All Saints Day at 4:00 p.m. and on All Saints Day at 8:00 a.m., 10:00 a.m. (primarily for our school children) and 6:00 p.m..

November 2 is, of course, All Souls Day. With the Solemnity of All Saints and the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed on November 2, November has traditionally become a month for us to hold in our prayers all our deceased loved ones. Last year we began what I hope will become a tradition for us at St. Angela: on the first Saturday of November (this year, November 5), we invite to the 4:00 p.m. Mass families who lost loved ones since this time last year and we hold them in our prayers in a special way at that Mass and invite those families to a reception following the Mass, so that we can share mutual support through prayer and fellowship. Families of those who passed away from November of last year are invited to bring a photo of their loved one and we will place these photos on a table in the sanctuary for the Mass.

We sent invitations to these families a few weeks ago and I hope that many of them will be able to join us for this commemorative prayer. I ask all parishioners to keep these families in your prayers next weekend, that they may feel the hope of the promise of Christ in everlasting life and be embraced in our hearts in their need.

Last week, we had a meeting with parents of the young people in our parish (in second grade in our school and in our CCD program) who are now beginning their preparations for their first celebration of the Sacrament of Penance. I ask all of you to keep these children in your prayers during these weeks of preparation for this Sacrament, that they may truly come to know the tender mercy of our God that is offered to them. They will celebrate First Penance at a special service on January 10, 2006.

MARK YOUR CALENDAR: On Sunday, November 13th we will have a Parish Pot Luck Dinner, beginning at 1:30 p.m. (so that we can include those who attend the 12:30 p.m. Mass). Because we were not able to have the Parish Fair this month, we wanted to have some opportunity for parishioners to get together for a social event. With more folks returning home each week, this will give us the opportunity to "catch up" with each others' Katrina journeys. We will also include at this dinner a special welcome to new parishioners and "temporary" parishioners who are now part of our St. Angela family. Plan to bring a dish to share and to spend some relaxed time with your SAM family!







Dear Parishioners,

This past Monday, we sent home with the children of our school a confidential family needs assessment, and last weekend, I asked each family of our parish who does not have a child in school to pick up a similar form in church. We ask that you complete and return these forms as soon as possible. We are all now in the process of recovering from Hurricanes Katrina and Rita. While much help comes from members of our own family and our circle of friends and other assistance is being provided through businesses, insurance settlements, government agencies and other charitable institutions, we certainly want to be sure that we respond and help as best we can as a family of faith. We know that some aid will need to be long-term and we want to be sure that we plan well for that. Please take some time to complete the needs assessment questionnaires and to return them to school or to the parish office so that we can develop plans in a timely manner.

I thank the members of our parish pastoral staff and the lay leaders of our parish who serve on the Pastoral Council, School Board and Finance Council for their concern for all of you and for helping us to focus our parish time and resources on providing the assistance you might need as we restore our lives and, in the help we offer each other in this restoration, grow together in the care and concern of Christ.

Please plan to join us for the special PARISH POT LUCK DINNER on SUNDAY, NOV. 13, beginning at 1:30 p.m. With more and more parishioners able to return home and wanting to have the opportunity to visit with each other and "catch up" on our post-Katrina life, with many new parishioners in ping us (either on a temporary or permanent basic), with our Fair boying to be so school upday this is

life, with many new parishioners joining us (either on a temporary or permanent basis), with our Fair having to be re-scheduled, this is an important social event for our parish at this moment. Bring a dish to share and come spend some time with your parish family in the Center next Sunday!

Just a reminder that the Archdiocese has cancelled second collections for the remainder of this calendar year. This means that we will NOT have collections this year for The Campaign for Human Development and the Retirement Fund for Religious. While these are worthy causes, the need in our own area is tremendous at this time. Many families are devoting their limited resources to family recovery and, of course, that is truly a primary need. If you fared well during the storm and have financial resources to share, we encourage you to contribute to recovery and assistance efforts for Katrina and Rita victims in our area.

One significant way that we show our concern for and support for one another is through intercessory prayer. Holding up others to the Lord in our prayers, especially holding them up by name, keeps them in our hearts and keeps them present to the Divine Heart. Letting them know we are praying for others allows us to share in their joy and lends them support and strength in times of need. There are bonds of unity forged and sustained through prayer. We are connected to others when we pray with them and for them. Our Parish Prayer Line is a magnificent vehicle to engage us in this connectedness as a parish community.

Those of you who are already part of our parish Prayer Line also know what a great gift it was following Katrina, as the prayer line united us during our recent evacuation diaspora, keeping us informed of each other's location, as well as our needs in prayer. I want to encourage all of you to participate in the Prayer Line. Dear Parishioners,

Many of us have Thanksgiving traditions: a meal with extended family at home or at a fancy restaurant; a vacation get-away with the kids or perhaps just for the "two of us"; a relaxed time at home, with chores pushed aside or a visit to those out of town that you don't get to see quite often enough. For others, plans change every year, depending on circumstances. Some years we feel we have a lot for which to be thankful; some years may have been more difficult or seem more lean; still, we know that we do have things for which to say "Thank you,," and people to whom to say it.

This year is probably going to be a bit different for almost all of us, for Katrina still has so much of our lives upended. One thing that does not change, though, is the One to whom our thanks ought ultimately be directed: God the Source of all that is good, God who nurtures and sustains us through good times and bad. What a worthwhile tradition for all of us to make certain that we begin our Thanksgiving Day activities with the prayerful celebration of Mass. Our parish Thanksgiving Mass with be on Thursday morning at 8:30 a.m. Please plan to join your parish family as we gather to thank God for the blessings in which we share because of the abundance of God's own presence and love in our lives.

When we eat this bread and drink this cup,

we proclaim the death of the Lord until he comes.

This is, of course, one of the Memorial Acclamations we proclaim during the Eucharistic Prayer at Mass. In recent liturgical documents, Communion under both kinds at Mass, that is, Holy Communion in the forms of both bread and wine, has been more and more strongly encouraged. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal supports this as the fuller sign of joining in the gift the Lord has given us in the Eucharist.

Our parish has traditionally offered Communion under both kinds at Masses on Holy Thursday and Thanksgiving and we know that this needs to be expanded. Beginning on Monday of the First Week of Advent, we will begin ministering Communion under both kinds at out weekday morning Masses. I will be offering some instructions on this at Mass in the next two weeks.

I would ask all those who are extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion and who regularly come to any weekday Mass to make some time to see me for instructions on this ministry. We will need more ministers at weekday Masses and so we will have a sign-up sheet following these instructions. Ministers, please plan to stay for a short time after Mass on any one of these days this week: Monday, Nov. 21; Tuesday, Nov. 22, Wednesday, Nov. 23; Saturday, Nov. 25. We will need three Communion Ministers at each morning Mass beginning in Advent. Thank you for your help!

Please note that the parish office will be closed the day after Thanksgiving, Friday, November 25.

Dear Parishioners,

"O come, O come, Emmanuel." "Come, O long awaited Savior." "O come, divine Messiah! The world in silence waits." "To a world awaiting the break of day, come, Emmanuel." These are the opening words of several different Advent hymns, some of which we will be singing at Mass on the Sundays of Advent. We pray for the Lord to come into our minds, our hearts, our spirits, our families, our community, our world. We pray for the Lord to come to us with hope, wisdom, direction, light, strength. Advent is not a season of gloom, but a season of joyful hope as we await the arrival of the new and everlasting dawn. Advent is not a season of somberness, but a season of eager expectation that God's promise of presence will soon, and very soon, be fulfilled.

The waiting of Advent is not a "sit back and wait" activity, but one of preparation. A new life is coming among us: prepare. Make room. Get everything in order. Open up the doors to let Him in. Be open for the One who wants to come to you and fill your life with God's own peace.

Listen at Mass for the change in music: hymns that we sing only during the Advent season that give us a genuine focus, the acclamations at Mass from the "Missa Emmanuel," drawing us back to that familiar chant melody of the hymn, "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel." Listen for the change in response to the General Intercessions: "Come, Lord Jesus," as we join in that plaintive cry for the Lord to come and dwell among us. Look for the Advent symbol: the Advent wreath, with its growing flame, kindling our spirits. Look for the special Advent décor and notice the colors: a shade of purple that incorporates the blue of royalty, as we await the dawning of the Prince of Peace, and the rose of Gaudete (Rejoice!) Sunday.

We need to rekindle our hope at this time, don't we? We need the reminder that the Lord wants to dwell among us, bringing peace to our calm, joy to our gloom, light for the new directions our lives might need to take. We need this season of light to fill our hearts with hope.

The members of SALA will be making Advent wreaths for prayer in your home available this weekend. Sr. Paula and I have prepared prayers for the wreath as well. Please take advantage of this opportunity for prayer at home, prayer that truly invites us to unite with one parish family voice, praying, Come, Lord Jesus!

On December 13, Deacon Gil celebrates with his classmates the 25th Anniversary of his ordination to the Diaconate. Our parish will celebrate this special occasion with Deacon Gil on Sunday, December 11. We will pray with Gil at the 12:30 p. m. Mass that day and follow Mass with a reception in the Center, from 1:30-3:30. Come to both, come to either, as your schedule permits, but please make plans to join us for some of that celebration, as we join together to thank Gil for his faithful, generous and caring ministry in our parish during these years.

COPING WITH POST-KATRINA STRESS DURING THE HOLIDAYS

This Christmas season will be like no other in Southeast Louisiana. Psychiatrist Dr. Elmore Rigamer, is the Medical Director of Catholic Charities Archdiocese of New Orleans. Previously he served as Medical Director of the US State Department and Foreign Service providing psychiatric care and counseling services to American victims of terrorism in the Middle East and Eastern Europe. He's a wonderful resource and has some tips on how to cope with the post-Katrina holidays. We hope you find them helpful.

WHAT TO EXPECT

- 1. Expect to 'cel sadness, loss, hope and even jubilation.

 These are conflicting feelings-but accept that it is normal to have them both at this time-sometimes at the same time!
- You are at the stage in recovery where you may feel overwhelmed. You may feel that you can't do everything you need to. Understand that this too is normal and will pass.
- Isolation is the worst enemy of recovery. Feeling you are alone, that you have no support and no one to talk to-that's the psychological enemy. Combat it by drawing on the support of family, friends, and the community.
- 4. This year is something like the first holiday after the death of a loved one-and in some cases it is.

So what can you do?

Do what you would normally do during the holidays-or at least the parts that don't stress you out. Do what you enjoy doing and don't set unrealistic expectations. Make sure you take time to be with other people. Give and get support. Don't exhaust yourself.

This is an opportunity to get closer to the real values in life.
