Dear Parishioners.

What a wonderful celebration of Christmas we had in our parish! Beginning with the school Christmas presentation through our celebration of Christmas liturgies, there was a spirit present in our community that brought needed brightness - Christ's own light - to our hearts and spirits. I would like to thank all those who did so much to make these holidays special in ways that we needed them to be. Our school choir and students in the live Nativity scene performed wonderfully at Celebration in the Oaks, our choirs and music ministers made our parish caroling a joyful night, along with the children of our school who repeated the Nativity scene. Our SAMA Kitchen Krewe fed us well and our Family Life Organization took care of set-up and clean up for our caroling party. The number of parishioners who joined in the caroling made this not only a festive but a memorable evening

Special thanks go to the members of our St. Vincent de Paul Society and Kitchen Krewe, who prepared and served almost 100 hot meals for the needy in our area for Christmas. This annual outreach to others is a Christmas gift from our parish that touches the hearts of many in need.

Our Christmas liturgies were beautiful, as was our church with its Christmas decorations. Thank you to all of our planners, decorators and liturgical ministers who served us so well, especially to our choirs, cantors and musicians who made Christmas Day ring out with joy!

I thank the members of our Adult Faith Formation Committee who developed the idea for our parish Christmas Project, to provide gift certificates to the families in our area affected most by Katrina. This was a terrific idea and I was gratified by how all of our parish organizations and so many of you in the parish responded to this special appeal. I was overwhelmed by the generosity and care all of you showed in your response to the invitation to participate. We collected over \$11,000.00 for this project. This was a greater response than we had ever anticipated. Thank you all!

With your generous gifts, thus far we have distributed \$8,000.00 in gift cards to 116 families in our area. Obviously, families with greater need received more, as did families with children, so that gifts could be purchased for them for Christmas. Other gift certificates have already been purchased and are being held for some families who felt their post-Christmas needs would be greater. At this time, the remainder of the money is being held to provide the families most seriously affected with on-going needs in the coming months. I am very grateful to Sr. Paula Marie and Colleen Remont for overseeing this dispersal of funds. Your generosity has made this a very good Christmas for many who lost much in Katrina.

Finally, we received 21 boxes of new toys from Kappa Delta Sorority in Memphis who had a toy drive for Katrina victims. All of these gifts were distributed before Christmas.

THANKS to all of you who have done so much to make this "Christmas like no other," as I referred to it in my Christmas homily a joyful Christmas in spite of the difficulties we have all faced these past months! May the Lord's peace fill our new year and every day in it!

In the post-Katrina needs assessment survey we conducted, a number of families expressed a need for winter clothes, for bed and bath linens and for furniture. At the same time, a number of families told us they had just such items to share. We do not anticipate for this to be a major project, but we would like to provide the opportunity for those who have and those who need to come together. Therefore, if you have any of the above items you would like to share, please bring them to the Msgr. Kern Center on either Friday or Saturday, January 13 and 14. If you are in need of or know families in need of these items, please come to the Center on Sunday or Monday, January 15 and 16, between 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. and select the items you need. In this way, we continue in helping one another rebuild from the storm.

Do you remember that, on the weekend Katrina hit, we were scheduled to have our Parish Ministries Fair? We have rescheduled the Fair for the weekend of January 21-22, when we will also be celebrating the Feast of our patroness, St. Angela Merici at all of our weekend Masses. Some weeks back, I wrote the following article for the bulletin. It appeared after Katrina but before we were able to begin mailing out the bulletin. This past Saturday, as we were celebrating the 4:00 p.m. Mass, two cell phones rang during Mass and, more disturbing, were ANSWERED during Mass. I repeat the article I wrote and hope that, this time, it has a longer-lasting effect:

We come to Mass, confident that God will speak to us. God does: in the word of Scripture and in the instruction of the homily. We come to Mass, confident that God will act in our lives. God does: in the Eucharist, the Body and Blood of the Risen Christ, God provides us with the strength we need to live holy and faithful lives. We come to Mass, confident that we will find support in our journey of faith, a journey that can be filled with times of great joy and yet also times of great pain and struggle. God does provide that support: as our sisters and brothers in faith sing and pray with us, we know that we are not alone. The Sign of peace is a pledge that we are and will be as present to each other and as selflessly giving of ourselves to each other and is the Lord whom we will soon come to Holy Communion to receive.

God speaks. God acts. God supports. Our community reaches out and pledges care, out loud and actively. It all happens right there. You know what? You do not need a telephone to receive any of this. This past weekend, I celebrated three of the weekend Masses. Cell phones went off before or during every one of them. THIS IS GETTING OUT OF HAND. It is distracting to our real purpose for the prayer of the Mass. It is disrespectful to the Lord and to the community. It is downright annoying to me. It's time for this to end. Please regard the church as a NO PHONE ZONE. God will speak to you from the pulpit, not call you on your cell. Leave the phone at home. Leave it in your car. Stop even bringing them into church, PLEASE!



We are in the process of contacting those who had been serving as Readers and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion at that Mass in the past to make certain that we do have the ministers we will need to begin on that date.

As we have been doing at 8:30 a.m. Mass, we will minister Holy Communion under both kinds at Mass and we will have everyone seated only in the center section of the church for Mass.

To my sisters and brothers in the Lord:

2005 was year like no other. 2006 will be a year where we continue to adjust to a world so powerfully rearranged by Hurricane Katrina. Over the past few months, I have heard the question "Where are the Catholics?" meaning what have we done in response to this national disaster?

The primary heath and human service arm of our Archdiocese is Catholic Charities. Through them, we help those in need-even those who have never before been in need. So where were we—through Catholic Charities? Even as the hurricane hit, Catholic Charities was at the Superdome ministering to the ill and frightened and at Armstrong Airport assisting in the medical evacuation of 345 fragile seniors. We were in Baker, Louisiana in a closed Walmart warehouse, running a virtual food bank-at one point distributing 400,000 pounds of food daily. To date, Second Harvest, which operates under the Catholic Charities umbrella, has supplied nearly 40 million pounds of food to the area impacted by Katrina and Rita. We were serving evacuees in Baton Rouge, in Alexandria, and in 19 travel trailer parks throughout the state. We were providing counseling and case management services to New Orleans police and firemen and to evacuees in shelters, motels and hotels. We were providing emergency assistance, help with rent and utility payments, food, medicine and clothing at seven centers set up throughout the metro area. We were in a mobile medical van that, early on went to devastated New Orleans peighborhoods bringing critical primary medical care to distraught residents. And where are now? devastated New Orleans neighborhoods bringing critical primary medical care to distraught residents. And where are now?

We are in your neighborhood with the Louisiana Spirit program—where outreach workers go door to door in seven civil parishes, providing help with personal recovery plans, information and someone to talk to. We are in the houses of the elderly, the disabled, and those without means, helping to gut and clean so that each house can once again become a home through Operation Helping Hands. We are continuing to serve those we served before, the abused and neglected children, the battered women, the profoundly disabled children and adults, the families in crisis and the families seeking to adopt. We are where there are people in need. Because at Catholic Charities, people are the heart of the matter. We have all been touched by this disaster, some more than others. I pray that you have not experienced too much of a personal loss. Whatever your personal situation, please know that you are in our prayers. If you need a helping hand, please let us know and we will do all we can to help. If you are in a position to help others, please do so whether by volunteering or by a financial contribution in today's second collection. We are all a part of Catholic Charities and the ministry to care for those in need. When someone asks "Where are the Catholics?"-Tell them we are where people are in need, where Christ has called us to be. Christ has called us to be.





Dear Parishioners,

As I announced in last week's bulletin, we will begin 6:15 a.m. Mass, Monday through Friday, on Ash Wednesday, March 1. As we do at 8:30 a.m. Mass, we will offer Holy Communion under both kinds at Mass. We are now in the process of making certain that we have sufficient ministers committed to serve as Readers and as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion for that Mass. There is a sign-up sheet in the sacristy, and I ask ministers who plan to be at 6:15 a.m. Mass to check that schedule and sign up for any liturgies that are still in need of readers of Communion ministers.

I offer these two reminders also: 1) All those who attend weekday Masses are to sit only in the center section of the church for Mass, as this expresses our unity at the Lord's tables of Word and Sacrament and fosters full, conscious and active participation in the Mass. 2) When there is only one priest in the parish, the 6:15 a.m. Mass will be replaced with a Communion Service led by one of our deacons or a lay minister. These changes will be announced in the bulletin.

The Knights of Columbus have their Spaghetti Dinner today. Please support this fund-raising activity for the Knights, who have always been very generous in supporting activities of the Church, and who are equally generous in their commitment to our parish life and activities. Dinners are available (eat in or take out) in the Center today from 10:30 a.m. until 2:30 p. m.

The entrance procession at Mass is not merely a functional getting folks from here to there procession. It is a visual image of the Church gathering for prayer and a visual unifying element for the assembly. Each person and each thing in the entrance procession is a symbol of Christ calling us in unity as his body. The procession is led by the cross: the very sign of our salvation. Servers remind us of Jesus, the suffering servant, who mounted that cross to lift us up to everlasting life. The readers and the Deacon image for us Jesus, the preacher, teacher and prophet, the Word made flesh. The Book of the Gospels, carried in the procession, is the Word of God made available to us to be our wise guide to fullness of life. Placed on the altar, it shows the essential unity of God's Word and God's action in our lives. The priest, imaging Jesus the shepherd, gathers us into the divine heart and mind and, as Jesus did for his disciples, is ready to teach us how to pray.

When there is a "main entrance" to a church and a "center aisle," it is logical for the procession to enter by that route. Our church is a little different, isn't it? There is no real "front door." In actuality, because of the location of our parking lot, most people come in the "side doors," making them the front door! The three seating sections in the nave are identical, with the three center aisles in all of them being visually and functionally equal, making, in effect, three main aisles.

For this reason, as I'm certain you've noticed by now, we are shifting the entrance/recessional pattern. During Advent/ Christmas, we enter and exit via the door on the Melody St. parking lot area. Now, we enter and exit from the door near the St. Angela statue. We will shift to another quadrant for the Lent/Easter seasons of the Church Year. Of course, this will also give the priests and deacons the opportunity to greet and chat with all of you before and after Masses, helping us not only to image but to be good shepherds!

Dear Parishioners.

I know that there are lots of mixed feelings about Mardi Gras this year. There are some who see having Mardi Gras at full throttle indicates that life is returning to normal and that our area is back on track. There are others who feel just as strongly that parades will distract our own and national attention away from the challenges that face us and imply that we are not as serious as we should be at this time in our lives. We've heard the arguments on both sides and our own feelings lean to one side or the other. No matter which way your own tendencies lead you at this time, Mardi Gras will yield to the IMPORTANT and serious season of Lent, and I would ask you to begin to focus on that.

Lent is our time of individual and corporate renewal in preparation for Easter. Lent is a time when we sacrifice to unite ourselves with the saving sacrifice of Christ. Lent is the time for us to focus on our sin in light of God's mercy as manifested in the life-giving death of Jesus. We join with Jesus on the journey to Jerusalem, where we will die to selfishness and sin and be prepared to rise with the victorious Christ to new life, to fullness of life. During Lent, we reflect honestly, looking into our own hearts to find the roots of our sin. We take on acts of self-discipline and penance so that we can change our attitudes and actions and transform them into attitudes and actions of righteousness. We walk with Christ, through sacrifice, to new life.

During Lent, we will begin again the 6:15 a.m. Mass, affording all parishioners two opportunities each day to share in the transforming power of the Eucharist as we come together in the great prayer of our family of faith. We will again pray the Stations of the Cross each Friday night at 7:00 p.m., that we might reflect on the obedient acceptance of Jesus that led him willingly to take up his cross for us. Of course, the highlight of every Lent here at St. Angela is our annual Parish Mission. This year, the Mission will begin on the weekend of March 11-12 and will continue on the nights of March 13, 14, 15. This year's Mission will be preached by Fr. Jose Rodriguez, Fr. Luis's brother. For now, just mark your calendar with these dates; I will be saying much more about the Mission in the next two bulletins.

This Lent, I will also be asking you to give serious reflection to the finances of our parish and our Archdiocese. I will be sending you some mailings and speaking at Masses about our weekly giving program as a manifestation of our commitment to the ministry of Christ in our local Church.

Are you a member of another Christian Church or perhaps are not yet baptized in any religion and are interested in learning more about the Catholic faith? We will begin again our series for folks who might be at this point on their journey of faith. By joining in this you are NOT committing yourself to becoming Catholic; we are simply beginning with the opportunity to question, to listen and to learn. If you are interested in joining us, sessions will begin in March. Please contact Sr. Paula (837-9347), Fr. Luis or me so that we can meet with you and discuss with you the process and schedule for our parish.

Dear Parishioners,

I have said this before, and I am happy to be able to say it yet again: St. Angela Merici parishioners respond generously when you see the need. Two things prompt my repetition.

The first is this: your response to the annual collection for Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese. As you may have seen in last week's bulletin, contributions to the collection totaled \$6,856.10. In his letter announcing that collection, Archbishop Hughes shared with you the work of Catholic Charities in assisting those most affected by Hurricane Katrina. Your overwhelming support of this collection this year shows to me your conscientious commitment to helping all in our area recover from this storm.

The second: your response to the parish Ministries Fair. At our Pastoral Council meeting on February 14, it was reported by the Fair coordinators that a total of 136 parishioners signed up for the various parish ministries and organizations. From the Fall Fair to Familia, from Scripture Study to Choir, from Senior Citizens to Altar Severs, parish groups will soon see new faces bringing new enthusiasm in participation and service.

Just a reminder that Masses on Ash Wednesday will be at 6:15 and 8:30 a.m., 12 Noon and 6:00 p.m. Ashes are blessed and distributed at Mass, immediately following the homily. This is the only time ashes are distributed. Why? In the Scriptures of Ash Wednesday, we hear the clarion call of God, through the voices of Jesus himself, St. Paul and the prophet Joel to repentance, to conversion to new life. This is a rather serious message. We hear the challenges of that call in the homily. We pledge that we respond to that call in the acceptance of ashes – the sign that we will, with Christ, take the road of self-sacrifice. Ashes are not magic; they are our response to the call to sacrificial discipleship, and so we receive them as our response to the call. Still, we are realistic enough to know that we cannot walk that challenging road on our own strength. We are at Mass with the community, pledging and accepting our community support, relying on one another's and offering to give others, strength for the journey. We are at Mass to share in the strengthening food of the Eucharist, Bread of Life for those on the journey of faith.

Our annual Parish Mission will begin on the Second Sunday of Lent, with our mission preacher giving the homily at all Masses on the weekend on March 11-12. He will also preach at the morning Masses on Monday through Wednesday of that week and the special Lenten Mission Prayer Service on Monday through Wednesday nights at 7:00 p.m.

Our Mission preacher this year is Father Jose Rodriguez, Fr. Luis's brother. Father Rodriguez is a priest of the Diocese of Worcester, Massachusetts and is pastor of St. Joan of Arc Parish in Worsester. I hope that you have marked your calendar with these dates and will plan to be at the Mission. I will offer more details about the Mission in next week's bulletin.

Please remember that our parish offices are closed on Lundi Gras and Mardi Gras. They will reopen on Ash Wednesday at 9:00 a.m. I hope that all of you will have a safe and happy Mardi Gras!

Lent and Easter Regulations

Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound to fast may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to each one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years or older on Ash Wednesday and on all Fridays of Lent. The determination of certain days as obligatory days of penance should not be understood as limiting the occasions for Christian penance. The spirit of the season of Lent should be maintained throughout the weeks of Lent. The obligation to observe penitential days of the Church is serious. Failure to observe individual days of penance is not necessarily considered serious. No one should be scrupulous in this regard. People should seek to do more rather than less, since fast and abstinence on the days prescribed should be considered a minimal response to the Lord's call to penance and conversion of life.





Dear Parishioners,

Lent is a journey to new life, to a more Christ-like life, a life that finds its meaning and its fulfillment in being with others, in sharing with others, in mutual support. Lent is the journey to die to all selfishness and sin and to share in the freedom of the daughters and sons of God, the freedom won for us by Jesus, our very brother. During Lent, we take the time, in prayer, to reflect on our lives and to determine how we can, should and must walk with Christ the path of sacrifice, with the goal of bringing new life to others.

More frequent participation in Mass and the Eucharist, commitment to common devotional prayer (e.g., the Stations of the Cross), more time spent in private prayer and reflection are common and important elements of the Lenten journey. As you know, we will reinstate the 6:15 a.m. Mass (Monday through Friday). As a parish, we will pray the Stations of the Cross on Friday nights of Lent at 7:00 p.m., beginning March 3. Our school community will pray the same Stations on Friday afternoons at 2:30 p.m. (to which parishioners are invited), beginning on March 10. (We will be using a new book for Stations this year, and they will be available to you free of charge. They are the Stations of John Paul II.) The tradition of abstaining from meat on Fridays of Lent is a unified and public Catholic act of penance, but many people take on additional personal acts of sacrifice. Lent is a fine time to share in the Sacrament of Penance, that sacramental review of life and commitment to conversion of life.

Our common parish activity for Lent is our annual Parish Mission, which will begin next weekend and continue on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, March 13, 14, 15. We begin each evening at 7:00 p.m. We welcome Fr. Jose Rodriguez as this year's Mission preacher. Father's topic is "The Family That Prays Together Stays Together." Father invites not only adults to this Mission, but young people from sixth-grade and up. We will provide child care for younger children. I urge all parishioners to participate in the Mission. Father Jose will also preach at the weekday Masses each of the three days of the Mission, and will celebrate a special Mission Mass with our school community. On Tuesday night of the Mission, we will have a Reconciliation Service, and there will be a number of priests joining us that night for all present to share in the Sacrament of Penance individually.

I urge all of you to make plans to be at our Parish Mission, that we may have a common direction for our parish Lenten journey to new life.

After careful reflection and discussion, with the encouragement and approval of our parish Finance Council, we have begun a Weekly Giving Program in our parish. Each registered parishioner will receive this week a letter from me requesting that you consider the importance of supporting your parish Church by means of the envelope system, and to consider an increase in your level of offering. In that letter there will be a red response envelope. We need to pull together as a parish to meet our financial obligations and not only to maintain but to increase the number and quality of our services and ministries, all done in the name and spirit of Christ. Just as Jesus gave selflessly of himself that we might have life, our parish contributions reflect our own commitment to give generously and completely of ourselves to help bring Christ to others.. Lent is a good time to reflect on sacrificial giving, and I am asking you to give my letter careful reading and to take time to reflect on the content of the letter. Then, indicate on that red envelope your decision and your commitment.

If you do not receive a letter this week, it means that your family is not on our mailing list. In that case, we will have additional packets available for you next weekend.

The first Lenten Fish Fry will be this coming Friday, March 10, beginning at 5:30 p.m. This is wonderful opportunity for parish fellowship as well as the occasion to enjoy good food. See you there!

Dear Parishioners.

Time out. When used properly, it can help change the pace of the game, even the momentum of the game. Time out. It gives us time to be refreshed and regain stamina for the remainder of the contest. Time out. It allows the team to focus and align their wills.

Remember those thoughts I share in the homily last weekend? Well, this weekend we begin our special Lenten parish "time out," as we take the time to join in our Parish Mission. We welcome today Fr. Jose (also known as "Father Andy") Rodriguez, who is our Mission preacher for this year. Father will speak at all Masses this weekend, introducing the Mission and the themes he will develop at the Mission services on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday nights. Please remember that Tuesday night's prayer service will be in the context of a Penance Service and will include time for individual Confession and absolution. Several additional priests will be with us on Tuesday night for Confessions. On Wednesday night, there will be a reception in the Center to conclude the Mission.

Father Andy will also offer an early session (in the Parish Conference Room) on the annulment process in the Church and the healing benefits of pursuing an annulment for those whose marriages have ended. This will begin at 6:15 p.m. on Wednesday evening.

The Theme for our Mission this year is, "The Family That Prays Together Stays Together." Father Andy invites not only adults to this Mission, but young people from sixth-grade and up. We will provide child care for younger children and a supervised homework room for young people up to fifth garde. I urge all parishioners to participate in the Mission, that we may have a common direction for our parish Lenten journey to new life and be of mutual support as we make this journey to Easter life.

Our Weekly Giving Program is now underway. Hopefully, you have received a letter from me and I ask that you take the time to pray and reflect on the two requests I ask in that letter, and that you respond by using the red response envelope that is enclosed with that letter. Of course, the conscientious participation of ALL parishioners is essential for the success of this effort. If you did not receive the letter yet, we'll give the postal service a few extra days (since I know they are in Katrina-recovery mode too!), and we'll be looking for your red envelope response in next week's collection. If, by the end of NEXT week you have not received a letter, we will have extra copies in church for you to pick up, for that would mean that your family is not on our mailing list. I thank you for your response to the needs of your parish!

Hoping that you do receive this bulletin on time, I remind you that our first Lenten Fish Fry is this Friday, March 10, beginning at 5:30 p.m. The Fish Fry provides good parish fellowship as well as good food, and provides "seed money" for our parish fair. I hope to see you there!

Let me remind you that we pray the Stations of the Cross on the Fridays of Lent at 7:00 p.m. This week, our school children will pray the same Stations at 2:30 p.m., and of course parishioners are invited to join them if you find this earlier time more suitable to your schedule. (Please note that the school will NOT pray the Stations on March 17, as there will be a prayer service for them that morning with their St. Joseph Altar.)



Dear Parishioners.

Lent looks different. The church is simpler - no flowers or plants, a simple altar cloth, fewer candles. Lent sounds different. We use the piano for accompaniment to our singing, a softer sound than the organ. There is, in fact, less singing, for the Gloria is absent, we exit without song, the Communion song is simpler and we do not join in a congregational hymn at the Presentation of the Gifts. The acclamations of the Mass are sung, but the melody is more plaintive than grand, almost in the way we sing them an invitation into reflection. But, then, we do sing the Kyrie in the penitential rite, following a longer pause, as we call to mind our sins and our need for renewal in this special season. The pace of the Mass has a slightly different feel to it, with that pause at the penitential rite and the quiet after Communion.

We strip away any excess during this season and make things easier to see and hear and feel. That's exactly what is supposed to be going on inside of us as well throughout this season. We lead a simpler life, thanks to our fasting. We lead a more quiet and reflective life in our Lenten prayer. We reflect more on the direction our life needs to take as we commit ourselves to sacrificial acts of charity and penance.

How is your Lent going? Do you have the feeling that you are moving closer to the Lord, more intimate in your response to God's invitation to life? Do you have the feeling that your Lenten disciplines and practices are leading you to renewal in Christ? We're half way through, and this is a good week to take stock and make whatever adjustments we might need to make as we seek to draw closer to the Lord and the new life of Easter.

Did you know this? During the season of Ordinary Time, the first reading and the Gospel are linked thematically. During that season of the year, if you arrive early for Mass, it's a good idea to look in your hymnal and, read quietly and slowly before Mass begins. Try to see the connection and then listen at Mass as the homilist assists you in opening up God's Word. But, during Lent, it's a bit different. The first reading on Sundays of Lent leads to the next week, not to the Gospel. If you read those first readings across the six weeks of Lent, you trace the "big picture" course of salvation history. So, as you come to Mass each of these Sundays of Lent, open your hymnal and read the first reading from the past weeks, and see the history of God's love that is leading us to the miracle of Easter salvation in Christ.

The Pastoral Council is one of the major consultative bodies in a parish, along with the Finance Council and School Board. The Pastoral Council helps to evaluate, set goals for and monitor the growth of the spirituality and faith life of the parish. I consider this to be a vital parish group, essential for me in my service to you as pastor, and to our Pastoral Team, as we seek to identify and respond to your needs. This year, two members of the Council, elected by you at-large two years ago complete their terms: Susan Morise and Phyllis Giroir. Inez Maxwell, an appointed member, also completes her term.

Please note that, on the folded leaf of this issue of the bulletin is a nomination form. If you would like to nominate a parishioner for one of these Council seats, please complete the form and drop it (with your weekly offering, of course!) in the collection or mail it to or drop it off at the rectory. We will take nominations through Monday, April 3. Before nominating someone, please make certain that: 1) they are registered members of the parish; 2) they are willing to accept the nomination and participate in the election process; 3) are able to attend Pastoral Council meetings faithfully (they are generally on the second Tuesday of each month); 4) they will be able to participate in a formation session for all new Council members on Tuesday, August 15, 7:00-9:30 p.m.

Susan, Phyllis and Inez are eligible to serve another full term on the Pastoral Council.

Don't forget: Stations of the Cross prayed on Fridays of Lent at 2:30 p.m. and 7:00 p.m.

Reminder: our next Fish Fry is Friday, March 31.




