

Dear Parishioners.

In preparation for Easter, we have scheduled additional time for the Sacrament of Penance. Fr. Schott, Fr. Luis and I will all be available for Confessions in church on Wednesday of this week, April 5, from 7:00-8:00 p.m. The final scheduled time for the Sacrament of Penance will be on Saturday, April 8, from 5:30-6:00 p.m. Please keep in mind that we do not celebrate the Sacrament of Penance on Saturday, April 15.

Let me offer this early reminder of the times for our Holy Week services. On Holy Thursday, April 13, the Mass of the Lord's Last Supper begins at 7:00 p.m. (There are no morning Masses on Holy Thursday.) On Good Friday, April 14, the Solemn Liturgy of the Lord's Passion and Death (which includes the reading of the Passion, Veneration of the Cross and Holy Communion) begins at 3:00 p. m. Stations of the Cross will be prayed at 7:00 p.m. On Saturday, April 15, the Easter Vigil begins at 8:00 p.m. On Easter Sunday, Masses will be at the regular times: 8:00, 9:30 and 11:00 a.m. and at 12:30 p.m.

Please remember that nominations for two at-large representatives to the Pastoral Council will be accepted until tomorrow, Monday, April 3. I have again put the nomination form on the over-leaf page of this issue of the bulletin. We will have the election on the weekend after Easter.

Palm Sunday is next weekend, April 8-9. If you have palms to donate for use in our liturgies, please bring them to the church on Friday so that we can prepare them on Saturday. If you have palm bushes and need us to come and cut the palms, please telephone the rectory. THANKS!

On Friday, April 7, we continue our parish tradition of having our school students depict the Living Stations of the Cross for our prayer at 2:30 p.m. and at 7:00 p.m. I invite all parishioners to participate in this special Lenten devotional prayer.

The Increased Weekly Giving Program we are now conducting is very important to our parish's financial stability. I remind you that there are two components to this campaign: 1) to urge all parishioners to use the church envelope support system, and 2) to ask all parishioners to commit to an increase in your weekly giving.

The reason why we're asking you to use the church support envelopes: they help you to keep your church support a priority and they help the Finance Council to know what we can actually expect as regular income so that we can budget accordingly. The reason why we're asking you to increase your offering: we are not now meeting all of our financial obligations, especially to our Archdiocesan commitment to pay faithfully our parish weekly assessment for the support of Archdiocesan offices and services, our insurance and clergy benefits (\$4,152.00 /week) and to make timely payments to retire our parish debt (which now stands at \$754,315.00 and on which we should be making monthly payments of \$8,680.68 to retire this debt in ten years).

It is through our faithful and sacrificial financial support of our parish that we help the reign of Christ to be a reality in our area and to grow. Returning to the Lord from the first-fruits of our resources is a way of thanking God for the blessings we have received and a way to help our parish ministries and services to be readily available to all.

If you have not yet returned your response envelope, please do so soon. It is important that you respond by using the special envelope so that we may properly acknowledge your response. I would like to thank all of you who have responded, with special thanks to those who have newly-committed to use the support envelopes regularly and those who have been able to increase your level of church support. Remember, if each of us does what we can, no matter how large or small, this project will be successful Fr. Ken for us all!

Dear Parishioners.

Once the sun sets on Holy Thursday, the entire Church is swept into its Passover. Time stops. As wondrously strange as this may seem, we enter eternity.

The Christian Passover will not be understood apart from keeping watch, waiting, anticipating. The Paschal Triduum requires of us a liturgical piety that prods us to put everything else aside even time itself - in the presence of the awesome mystery.

These words of Peter Mazar say it all. The week we begin today, on Palm Sunday, this week we call "holy," and its fulfillment on Easter Sunday are best understood when we participate in all the liturgies of the Paschal Triduum: The Mass of the Lord's Last Supper on Holy Thursday, the Solemn Liturgy of the Lord's Passion and Death on Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday night. Therefore, I urge all of you to "put everything else asside" and to join us for these significant and moving liturgies, our entry into and participation in the awesome mystery of our salvation, the remembrance of the dying and rising of Christ that have won for us everlasting life. For forty days of Lent, we have been forming ourselves, through prayer, fasting and works of charity in the image of Christ, the Suffering Servant and the Lord of Life. The liturgies of the Triduum enlighten the work we have been about and enable us to see its fulfillment.

Let us keep in our prayers those who have been, throughout our Church, preparing for the Easter Sacraments of Initiation. Let us pray that their joy will be full when they share in the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation, becoming full members of our "one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church," united with us at the altar in prayer, in community and in commitment to the Lord's service.

Let this be our united prayer during Holy Week:

Order these hours in mercy, saving God, for we stand together at the center of our seasons when night and day run together and we call the cross our glory. Fill us only with hunger for the words of scripture, only with thirst for that stream whose waters drown us into the death of Jesus. There alone is our salvation, our life and our resurrection.







Dear Parishioners,

At the 12:30 p.m. Mass today we celebrate the First Holy Communion of forty-six young people of our parish family. What a joyous day for them, for their families and for all of us as the Lord welcomes them to the table of the Bread of Life. In their sharing in Holy Communion, they know the true joy of the Easter mystery: Christ shares with us his own life, his new life in this wonderful sacrament. We welcome these young people to Mass, along with their family and friends, and we pray that they may always revere the true presence of the Lord, and be faithful in receiving the Lord, in the Eucharist.

Saturday:

As we announced at the Masses last weekend, Fr. Luis, at the request of Archbishop Alfred Hughes, will be leaving our parish to become parochial vicar at Nativity of Our Lord Parish in Kenner. As you know, Fr. Luis is one of the priests who ministers to the Hispanic community and he goes to Nativity to continue to focus on that ministry. We assure him of our prayerful support as he takes on this new challenge, while continuing his service as Director of Vocations for the Archdiocese.

Please plan to join us for a reception for Fr. Luis on Saturday, May 13, 5:00-7:00 p.m. in the Center. This will be our opportunity to thank Father for his two years of dedicated ministry to us here at St. Angela and to wish him well in his new parish assignment.

The Parish Fair, normally held in October, will be on Friday, May 5 and Saturday, May 6. Let us all support this important fundraising parish activity and spend time in fellowship, enjoying good food, fun and entertainment. Please note that the Fair is only on Friday and Saturday, since we will need Sunday as the clean-up day so that school can resume as usual on Monday morning.

I want to thank all of you who responded to our Increased Giving Campaign. For the campaign, a total of 1,945 parish households were contacted by mail. Thus far, 631 families responded to the campaign, either pledging to increase their financial support of the parish or explaining why, at this time, they are unable to do so. From those who responded positively, we should be able to expect an increase in weekly giving of \$2,735.55.

At my request, the Finance Council of the parish has named an ad hoc Budget Committee. Committee members are Vernon Kliebert, Mike Prat and Jackie Appleton. This committee is meeting this week to begin working on a parish budget for the fiscal year that begins July 1, 2006 and ends June 30, 2007. This budget will be based entirely on projected ordinary parish income (the weekly collection, sacramental stipends, income from votive candles). The committee will present the proposed budget to the Finance Council at their May meeting and, when reviewed and approved by that Council, I will accept it as the budget for next year and share that budget with you so that you will be able to see how we will steward your contributions.

At my mandate, priority will be given to paying our weekly assessment to the Archdiocese and making weekly payments to retire our parish debt. As you can surmise, because of the effects of Katrina, our Archdiocese continues to face serious financial challenges. We have begun and will continue to do our part to support the services and offices of our diocese at this critical time by faithfully paying our assessment.

Also, it is essential that we aggressively work to retire our parish debt so that we can remain on a firm financial footing as a parish. In the almost three years that I have been here with you as pastor, I have heard people say that we need to expand the facilities and thus the programs and services of our school, that we need more space for parish meetings and activities, that we need better and more storage area. One person even said that he thinks we need to build a new church! Well, folks, we cannot begin to think about any of this, to evaluate what are our real and greatest needs, to think about any sort of expansion, unless and until we are debt-free. Your faithful support of your parish, and responsible spending based on that support, will begin to move us in the right direction.

There is a bit more information that I want to share with you about the campaign, and I will do that next week.



Catholics in parishes across the nation are being asked to contribute to the Catholic Home Missions Appeal. But what is a "home mission?" And why should we support it?

You know the answer if you have ever visited eastern Kentucky or Tennessee; driven through rural Georgia, Alabama and Mississippi; spent time on the Mexican border; or passed through scattered small towns in Wyoming, Montana and Oregon. 

Dear Parishioners.

The Parish Fair is this weekend - see you on the Fair grounds for good fellowship, good food and good fun!

Let me remind you that our farewell reception for Fr. Luis will be on Saturday, May 13, 5:00-7:00 p.m. in the Center. Please plan to join us as we gather to thank Father Luis for his two years of dedicated ministry to us here at St. Angela.

Of course, many of you have been asking whether or not another priest will be sent here as parochial vicar. I have been told by the Archdiocesan Vicar for Clergy that another vicar will not be available until July, if then. I will continue to pursue this.

But, there is good news: I have spoken with Fr. Wayne Paysse, who is the Director of the Office for the Propagation of the Faith, and he will be assisting us with sacramental ministry. Fr. Paysse was serving as the Pastor of Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish in New Orleans, as well as serving in the Propagation of the Faith office. This mission ministry will become Father's full time position and he will be residing at Notre Dame Seminary, and will assist us with Masses on weekdays and weekends, with the Sacrament of Penance for parish and school, and with funerals. Please welcome Father Paysse to our parish as you see him at Masses.

Today, people from throughout the Archdiocese will gather at St. Louis Cathedral to receive the Medallion of the Order of St. Louis – recognition for outstanding and long-standing service to their parish communities. I am pleased to announce that Muriel Carriere and Leon and Tee Toups have been selected as our parishioners to share in this honor. Let me share with you why they are our honorees for this year:

Muriel has lived in our parish since 1968. Her two youngest children attended St. Angela School and, during that time, Muriel and her husband were very involved in school activities. Two of her daughters were married in our church, two still live in our parish, and six of her grandchildren have attended our school. 



I would like to share with you a few more observations from our Increased Giving Campaign. A total of 1,982 letters were sent out in the initial mailing. Approximately 35% of these families responded to the appeal, either indicating that they would increase their parish support or explaining why circumstances prohibited them from being able to do so at this time. Total responses show that there is a verifiable increase of \$2,766.33 in weekly offerings. We have been told by the professional company that assisted us with this campaign that the response percentage and the amount of verifiable increase is very good, given current circumstances.

Here's the good news: Of the current 1,084 families who regularly use church support envelopes, 612 indicated that they would increase their offering. That is an increased response from 56% of already-committed supporters. Sixty-five more families have indicated that they will begin using church support envelopes on a regular basis, making them more committed to faithful parish financial support.

Here's the not-so-good news: Of the 898 families who do not currently regularly use envelopes, those 65 who have indicated that they will begin to do so translates into a meager 7% increase. Time and experience have proven that those who request and use church support envelopes are more committed and even more generous givers. I had hoped that more families would respond, and I will pray that, over time, more will. The more that all of us do our part, in a conscientious and sacrificial way, the more we reflect the committed and sacrificial love of Christ for all and the more we, through parish organizations and ministries, can help the reign of Christ grow in our community.

Based on the results of this campaign, the Finance Council is now working carefully on a budget for the Fiscal Year that begins July 1 of this year.

On May 12, I celebrated my 33rd anniversary of ordination to the priesthood. On my anniversary, I always find myself reflecting on my years of ministry, the various parishes and other ministries in which I have served, the many people who have been part of my life. I always offer a special prayer for those who have helped - by their support, by their example, by their challenge - to make me a better priest as time goes by. Believe me, the people of St. Angela have a special place in that prayer of thanksgiving. I am truly happy to be your pastor, for, in giving me the opportunity to serve you and in the embrace you have offered me, the support you give to me, the committed faith you manifest and the generous service you give one another, you have made me a better person and a better priest. May we continue to grow together in the Lord's love and service! Fr. Ken



Dear Parishioners,

OK, admit it: you're anxious about the coming hurricane season, aren't you? When the 6 o'clock news team counts down the days until it all starts again, you stomach jumps at least a little bit, doesn't it? When you saw the big headline that the flood-gates will not be ready on time, you weren't really surprised, but you felt your spirits sink a little anyway. You wish FEMA and the Corps of Engineers would both sink into the sunset. You waited so long for that flooring, those countertops and those appliances that you felt like kissing them when they finally arrived, but then you told yourself you're not getting attached to that stuff again. Almost every conversation includes either the phrase "before the storm" or "after the storm." All the dread about "Y2K" that never materialized became the real dread of "Post-K." That line the priest says in the embolism of the Lord's Prayer at Mass, "free us from all anxiety," is a real prayer for all of us. Anxiety has been part of the game for eight long months, and not a fun part either. "For Sale" signs keep appearing in our neighborhood. Our friends, or some of our family, are moving around and moving away. We realize the after-effects of Katrina will linger far beyond even the coming hurricane season. We're all still coping.

A few weeks ago, Janice Carbon offered a presentation on coping with anxiety in this post-Katrina moment. She looked at stress, anxiety and coping from a Scriptural perspective, leading in a discussion of all this from the spiritual point of view. About eighty people participated in the two sessions that were offered. We want to continue to provide our parishioners with assistance on dealing with these issues in our lives. On Monday, May 29, we welcome to our parish Dr. Fred Davis, a psychologist, who will continue this conversation with us and make a presentation on "The Katrina Blues and How to Cope with Them." This will be in the parish Conference Room beginning at 7:00 p.m. Dr. Davis will focus more on the psychological elements of identifying dealing with stress and anxiety. Along with Janice Carbon's presentation, we feel this will provide a well-rounded approach to living our lives at this time and, through the assistance and support we receive, moving on in our lives. We invite all parishioners to attend this session.

Thanks again to all who planned, prepared for, worked at and supported our re-scheduled Parish Fair. Considering that we're all a lot more used to having the Fair in October and that we were competing with Jazz Fest and the many, many other activities of May, the Fair did well. The fair grounds abounded with good food, great fellowship, high energy and good music: just as a festival should! While all of the bills have not yet been processed, a fairly close estimate is that the Fair profit will be right around \$42,000, which includes the profit from the two fish fry nights. 

Dear Parishioners.

"Disrespectful!" "Sacrilegious!" "Blasphemy!" "A distortion of what the Church believes!" "Desecration!" All these things are being said about The DeVinci Code, novel and movie. Some religious folks are up in arms that a novelist would intentionally distort Christian teachings and beliefs. Well, to be honest, I'm just not terribly upset that something that purports to be fiction is actually fictitious, that someone who writes stories for a living makes up a pretty good story about theories that have been around for hundreds of years. What troubles me is that I see Catholics do things every day that I believe are more disrespectful of our Catholic faith than this novel could ever be.

We say that we believe that, at every moment, Christ is truly present in the Eucharist reserved in the tabernacle. The King of salvation is truly present and I see Catholics walk in front of the tabernacle without any form of reverence being shown. That is sacrilegious. Traditionally, we genuflect before the tabernacle, for "every knee shall bend in heaven and on earth [to] proclaim Jesus Christ is Lord." The Lord of life is present on the altar at Mass and I see Catholics turn their back on the altar and walk out of Mass, leaving early, walking away from the Eucharistic presence just to beat the traffic out of the parking lot. That is sacrilegious. The Eucharist is the great sacrament of unity, binding us as one with the Lord and with each other. Mass is the Pascal Banquet, a feast of love. I see people at morning Mass receive Holy Communion and walk out the door, as if this were the Paschal fast-food restaurant, or receive Holy Communion and then go off to a dark corner of the church to sit all alone. This is disrespect for the unity the Lord is trying to instill in us and that reception of the Eucharist demands of us.

We say we believe that the Lord speaks to us in the Scriptures, that we hear at Mass, as in all the sacraments, the actual and ultimate Word of truth and life. Every day I see folks walking in late for Mass, while the readings are being proclaimed, seemingly not paying one jota of attention to the Word being proclaimed. Walking around while God is speaking to you, not paying attention to the God who wants to guide your steps, who wants you to hear the very truth of God's own mind and heart, that is disrespectful.

We say that we come to Mass so that the power and love of God may transform our lives, just as the power and love of God transform bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ. We say that we come to Mass to celebrate that we are one people, united in faith and love, pledging to give of ourselves to be one in support, care and service. We come so that the Lord can mold into "one body, one spirit in Christ." Every day I see people sitting alone for Mass in a dark corner of church; every Sunday there are those who stand in the back of church, usually talking to one another throughout Mass. I'll sit where I want. I can stand here if I want to. You can't tell me where to sit for Mass. This attitude destroys any spirit of unity, of support, of mutual cooperation, of handing oneself over to the Lord. This attitude fights the very establishing of unity the prayers of Mass and the very meaning of the Eucharist try to make real. That is disrespectful of the very goal of our Catholic worship.

The words of a novel or the actions of Catholics – which ought anyone expect be more true and more faithful to our beliefs? Come on, folks, Dan Brown is not the bad guy here! Think about it. Talk amongst yourselves. I'm going to the movies.

I want to remind you that Dr. Fred Davis will make a presentation on "Coping with the Katrina Blues" tomorrow night (Monday, May 29) at 7:00 p.m. in the Conference Room.

This is important: I need to remind you that it is essential that, when a family member dies, families contact me at the rectory BEFORE making contact with the funeral home so that we can discuss the availability of one of the priests or deacons for the funeral. While both Father Schott and Father Paysse will be assisting with funerals on occasion, their availability is limited. Since we no longer have a parochial vicar, we need you to be flexible about the time for a funeral. I thank you for your understanding and cooperation.







These groups, representing all parishioners, are invaluable in discussing significant parish issues and concerns with me, our school Principal and pastoral staff, and thus helping to set goals for parish life and ministries and evaluating the growth of our parish in fulfillment of those goals.

Several people who have been serving on these councils are completing their terms this June and new members will be beginning service. Leaving the Pastoral Council are Phyllis Giroir, Beth Homer, Inez Maxwell, Ida Mialaret and Susan Morise. The new members coming onto the Council are Mia Corrente, Bill Farrington, Pam Pendzimaz, Rob Whitaker and Janice Wolff. Susan Aaron, Billy Robinson and Billy Steen begin a new full term. Leaving the Finance Council are Billy Douglass and Sam Criscione, and coming onto this Council are Larry DeBlieux and Ferd Schaff. Paul Briuglio, Scott Elston and Ferd Schaff are leaving the School Board and Paul Galloway, Paula Hawkins and Chris Pease are beginning their terms on this Board.

I thank those who are completing their terms for their committed service to our parish and thank those who are coming on for the willing service they are pledging to give!

Summer Safari Bible Camp begins tomorrow, and we have 247 young people registered and ready to participate in this fun learning experience. The energy of Safari runs high for two full weeks – that of our children, the teens who serve as Camp Counselors, the adults who are faculty members and all those many adults who help staff the Camp. Please keep all the Safari members in your prayers that this year may again be a fun way to experience God's presence in the living word of Sacred Scripture.

The new hurricane season is upon us. We certainly are united in prayer that we will not face again the tragedy of last summer; we pray that no one will! If you remember, Katrina came in last year the weekend we were scheduled to have our parish Ministries Fair and so we faced some real confusion here: should we continue with plans for that or follow the counsel of civic authorities and head out of town? Some parishioners, assigned to liturgical ministries at Mass that weekend delayed leaving with their families to be here for their scheduled ministries. To avoid any confusion in the future, I discussed this with the Pastoral Council last October and this is now our established parish practice:

When an evacuation is called for by local civic officials, whether this is a recommended, voluntary or mandatory evacuation, all scheduled parish activities, including liturgical services, will be cancelled immediately. The Blessed Sacrament and parish sacramental records will be secured according to archdiocesan policy, parish facilities will be secured and all parish staff, including clergy, will follow the evacuation order and vacate the parish campus. All parishioners should similarly follow the evacuation order. Insurance regulations prohibit us from offering parish facilities as an evacuation shelter.

Let's pray that we really do not need to rely on this practice this year or any year in the future! Let this we our united prayer, both at Mass and in our personal prayer:

Through the intercession of Our Lady of Prompt Succor, may we be spared the loss of homes or property during this hurricane season.





Dear Parishioners.

There is new artwork in church. On the column near the tabernacle chapel, we have had the image of Blessed Francis Seelos. In addition to Father Seelos, there are two other people who served in the New Orleans area whose causes for canonization are in process: Mother Henriette Delille and Msgr. Jean Eyraud. Images of all three of these holy servants of Christ are now on that wall, with a brief biography of each. I invite you to look at these pieces the next time you are in church and to include these people in your prayers, that they might be named saints of our Church. From the biographies, learn about their lives, that you may be inspired by and profit by their example. Pray through their intercession for our local Church in the Archdiocese and for our parish, that we might all grow together in their own spirit of humble and committed service.

I thank Ruth Goliwas, the artist and contributor, for the drawings of Fr. Seelos, Mother Henriette and Msgr. Eyraud.

At the conclusion of the parish Mission this Lent, we distributed a booklet entitled Living Prayers, as a remembrance of the Mission and as an on-going aid to the personal and family prayer that Fr. Rodriguez spoke of and to which he encouraged us during the Mission. There were some families who came to the Mission who did not receive one of these booklets, and we have finally received the additional shipment of them. If you came to the Mission and did not receive one of these booklets, please stop by the rectory during regular office hours (Monday through Friday, 9:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m.) and we will be happy to give you one. We'll give you a week to do this and, if there are any extra copies, I will put those in church and make them available to others while this supply lasts.

We have several very dedicated parishioners, serving as extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion, who regularly bring Communion to the homebound of our parish. If a member of your family is in need of this service, either because of a terminal, debilitating or chronic illness or during a time of recuperation, please do not hesitate to contact us at the rectory. I like to visit these folks the first time and then one of our extraordinary ministers goes regularly for ministry of Holy Communion. They are very helpful in letting me know if one of the people they visit want me to return and celebrate with them the Sacrament of Penance or the Anointing of the Sick. They let me know if the situation becomes more critical and when it might be time for the Viaticum (the real "last rites" of the Church). Please know that this pastoral care is readily available to all; we're just a phone call away.

When there is a death in a family, it is important that the family contact me at the rectory before going to the funeral home to make arrangements. We can discuss when one of the deacons or I will be available to celebrate with you the funeral liturgy and come up with some options for times for the funeral services. We can also discuss a time to meet with you for the preparation of the funeral liturgy. This call is all the more important during this time that we do not have a parochial vicar in the parish. I thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

Speaking of a parochial vicar, it may be a while before we get another priest stationed here with us. There is only one candidate for priestly ordination this year. I have been told by the Director of Priest Personnel that they are indeed looking for a priest to send here, and so let us remain hopeful and prayerful that this will happen soon.

I will be leaving for vacation on Friday, June 16 and will return to the parish for Mass on Monday, July 10. Fathers Jim Schott and Wayne Paysse will be celebrating Masses in my absence and, with our deacons, will be available for funerals as well. Please pray for me and my traveling companions that we will have a safe and restful time away. Know that you will be in my thoughts and prayers as



Dear St. Angela Parishioners,

Fr. Ken is on vacation for the next three weeks, and, in his absence, he has asked several others of us on the Pastoral Staff to share some information with you on areas for which we are responsible. Over these next two bulletins I want to up-date you on some things about the parish facilities.

Our parish had rather minor damage as a result of Hurricane Katrina. We were blessed to have volunteers who had returned to the neighborhood shortly after the storm and helped Father Ken and Father Luis in clearing the property of all the loose trash and debris. The hurricane downed a number of trees on the property, but none of the buildings was seriously affected. There was only minor gutter and roof damage at the rectory from two of the trees. An air-conditioning unit that serves the administrative area in school is mounted on the roof. The unit rolled off of the pad it is set on and caused an open hole in the roof over the school offices resulting in water damage to the flooring in this area. The carpet in the Principal's office was replaced. The gym had minor damage when the front portion of the roof was pulled back by the wind. Water entered the building and caused the motor of the milk cooler to be damaged. The iron fence surrounding the property was pelted by the storm and required repainting. The vinyl fence around the chillers lost some segments, and the wooden fence at the rectory was destroyed. Finally, with the outage of electricity, all food in the refrigerators and freezers was lost. This food loss was the only item not covered under our insurance coverage. The cost for the repair of these damages was a little over \$27,000.00. Our parish has a \$500.00 deductible, and the remainder is covered by our insurance.

As you know, the goal of the 2005 Soiree was to raise funds to put stage draperies in the Center – a project we had hoped to complete in the Fall of that year. Like many other things, Katrina put a glitch in those plans. The curtains themselves have been made and the company actually did come to install the rods. Then, we found out that there was not enough structural support for the rods and drapes. A steel frame would have to be designed, constructed and installed first. Based on drawings from our structural engineer, proposals were received and accepted before Katrina. The curtains are in storage. The steel fabricator who had accepted the project will begin the work to erect the structural support after our Safari program finishes this week. Upon completion, the drapes will be installed.

In December, 2005 we received a special donation from a parish family, which they wanted used on a special project of Fr. Ken's choosing. After consulting with the Staff, he decided that we would continue to up-grade the Center by adding more and more flexible lighting, since the center is used for so many different events. We have been working with Jason Crumb, an electrical engineer and also one of our school dads, for the design of this project. New fixtures have been selected and ordered and should be received within the next six weeks or so. The installation of the fixtures and control panel will take about a week to complete, so this should be accomplished before the end of the summer.

Next week I will share more information with you about our parish facilities and ways in which you can help.







Last week I brought you up to date on the damage caused by Hurricane Katrina here at St. Angela, and also the special projects that have been underway over the last year. This week we will look at some of the on-going maintenance of our parish, and our plans for the future to maintain and improve our parish.

Next Sunday:

Recently it was noticed that some of the pews and kneelers in church were coming loose from their moorings on the floor. Our parish Building and Grounds Committee has undertaken the project of refastening all of the pews and kneelers, replacing the hardware where necessary. Glenn Scorsone coordinated this project and was assisted by David Aaron, Ted Ball, Eric Broadbridge, Yeu Chin, Timothy Chin, Robert Coussou, Larry Deblieux, Mark Delesdernier, Tom Gerace, Louis Hymel, Vernon Kliebert, William Romig, Andrew Scorsone, Denis Van Geffen and Trey Van Geffen. Some of this work was done in April, and they will complete the project during the summer months.

Several weeks ago, with funds donated by the School Co-Op Club, a shade canopy was purchased to cover the playground equipment in the fenced area behind the Kern Center. Thanks to the efforts of Paul Galloway, Wayne Hawkins, Carey Johnson, Chris Pease, and David Perez, this canopy was erected on a Saturday, and our children now enjoy a shaded playground.

While summer seems to be quiet from a school standpoint, our maintenance staff is extremely busy preparing for the opening of school in August. Each classroom is emptied of all furniture, and the tile floors are stripped and waxed. The halls and administrative area floors are also stripped and waxed. All of the restrooms, and each of the stairwells leading up to school, are pressure washed. Our school has a Grounds and Maintenance Committee that help accomplish projects during the summer months. One or two nights, either at the end of July or beginning of August, are designated to paint several classrooms, halls, doors, and whatever minor repairs that are necessary to help freshen the school and brighten the learning environment for our students. Volunteers are always welcome to assist with these projects. If you have some time you can share with us, please call me at the rectory and I will pass your name on to the committee.

The next major project to be undertaken will follow the next Soiree. As we continue to improve our facilities, proceeds from the 2007 Soiree will be used to up-grade the lobby area and restrooms in the Center, and to improve Center stage lighting.

There are occasions when families make a donation to the parish for a special memorial, like the tile art that is in church and in the meditation garden. Fr. Ken has been working with Ruth Goliwas, who has designed and executed a significant amount of the artwork that you see on our campus, to design new stained glass for Mary's shrine for the Luminous Mysteries of the Rosary, should a donor come forward at some time in the future.


