



I attended both of your programs for coping and while very different, they really did help. I have joined the Prayer Group on Wednesdays and have found a wonderful source of compassion, hope and prayer.

I just wanted to let you know how much I appreciate your kindness and efforts to reach out to those of us hit so severely. I am doing much better and I am grateful.

God bless each one of you.

I am so happy that you helped provide this new parishioner with the welcome and care she needed. And I know we have tried to do that for all those who have joined our parish since Katrina, the storm that changed so many of our lives. I hope that all of you will cherish the opportunities we will continue to have to reach out in support to one another and that others will realize and accept the opportunities they have to receive this care from us.

Sr. Paula and a group of parishioners have been working together to establish small support groups for those still coping with the after-effects of the storm and Sister will share more details about that with you in next week's bulletin.

We all have seen new faces in church: reach out and extend a welcome to the new folks you see. We have all seen the many "For Sale" signs in our neighborhood. As you see new families moving into your neighborhood, go ring their bell, after they've had a few days to settle in, and invite them to join you at Mass here at St. Angela and to register with us by telephoning the rectory. There are new friends coming for all of us to meet! And, of course, let us keep in our prayers those of our friends and families who have had to relocate after Katrina and support them with our continuing prayerful concern.

I will be out of town this week, attending the annual meeting of the members of the Federation of Diocesan Liturgical Commissions, since I am one of the delegates to that group from our Archdiocese. Please keep me in your prayers for a safe and profitable trip. I will be home in time for Masses next Sunday.

Dear Parishioners,

Each year, we have two very special opportunities to support the world-wide mission activities of our Church. Once each year, we welcome a member of a mission community to come and speak to us of the ministries and the needs of that particular community and we are invited to join with them in prayerful support and through our financial contributions. I am certain that you remember that a few weeks ago, Brother Herman Johnson, O.P., was with us and made an appeal for the mission work of the Southern Dominicans.

The other opportunity to support the missions of the Church is the annual world-wide Mission Sunday, which is this weekend. This is, in fact, the 80th Anniversary of the establishment of Mission Sunday and the theme this year is: "Charity: Soul of Mission." About this year's Mission Sunday, Pope Benedict XVI has said: Unless the mission is oriented by charity, that is, unless it springs from a profound act of love it risks being reduced to mere philanthropic ad social activity. In fact, God's love for every person constitutes the heart of the experience and proclamation of the Gospel, and those who welcome it in turn become its witnesses." The Holy Father concludes his message on Mission Sunday by stating: "Dear brothers and sisters, may World Mission Sunday be a useful opportunity to understand even better that the witness of love, the soul of the mission, concerns everyone. Indeed, serving the Gospel should not be considered a solitary adventure but a commitment to be shared by every community." Let us unite as the community of faith at St. Angela Merici Parish to contribute not only generously but sacrificially for the mission, both in our prayer and in our financial contributions. Pray for those who work in the missions; pray for them every day. And, today, contribute to the second collection, that those we pray for may experience our support and care.

When I arrived here as your pastor, now over three years ago, I met with Larry McNamara, who was then serving as chairperson of our Pastoral Council. Larry shared with me the good work the Council had done in the archdiocesan processes of Catholic Life 2000 and Catholic Life 2003, a large part of which was to set goals for parish life and ministries. One of the items that appeared in both of those goal-setting efforts was the establishment of a broader youth ministry for our parish. During my time here, this concern kept coming up again at Pastoral Council meetings and in discussions among our parish staff.

Several months ago, I asked the Pastoral Council to establish an ad hoc Committee to conduct a needs assessment on the issue of youth ministry and to propose, based on the findings of the needs assessment, a practical and realistic process to establish a renewed youth ministry for our parish. This has been a long process and, at times for the committee, a challenging one. Their work resulted in lengthy discussions, again among the staff and with the full Pastoral Council. The very good news is that the work of this committee has been completed. At the last meeting of the Council, the Committee made their final presentation on an expanded program. The Council accepted the recommendations of the Committee and I have accepted the recommendation of the Council.

In next week's bulletin, I will share v ith you this new direction for youth ministry in our parish and the time-line for its implementation. In the meantime, allow me simply to thank the ad hoc Committee members and the full Pastoral Council for their very diligent and careful study, reflection and direction. I think what you will read next week will not only please but excite you!



Dear Parishioners.

At our last Pastoral Council meeting, the Council received the final report of an ad hoc committee assessing our parish's need for an expanded youth ministry program. This report was submitted to the Council by its members: Colleen Remont, Susan Aaron, Emily Coussou, Tracy Coussou, Diane Kratochvil, Glenn Scorsone, Kathleen Steen and Billy Steen. An earlier report, submitted after the group conducted a study of youth and their parents, was the product of much discussion at an earlier Council meeting, and led the ad hoc committee to additional meetings and refinement of their proposal. After more careful discussion and deliberation, the Pastoral Council recommended that I accept the smaller committee's report and its recommendations, which I have done. We will, then, begin the process of forming a new Youth Ministry in our parish. The next step is to identify adults who will provide leadership and have them trained by the Archdiocesan Office of Youth Ministry. We expect that this will happen November to January. Then, we will invite youth to come to some meetings to discuss direction for this ministry and to surface youth leadership who, with the adults, will form an advisory council to oversee our new program. A series of events will then be planned for the coming months.

As I mentioned in last week's bulletin, we have been discussing youth ministry in our parish since I arrived here. I am extremely grateful to the members of our ad hoc committee for moving us through the discussion process to genuine assessment of need and careful thinking-through of the formation of a solid program. They have served you well by their dedication to this project, which is a sign of their dedication to the youth of our parish family and our youths' continued formation in and living out of our faith.

We have discussed not only ministry to youth, but ministry by youth in our parish, and this will be a substantive part of our new program. We have discussed the need for adults to commit themselves to leadership roles, not only for a year or two, but for a longer term. We have discussed the need for us all to be open to our young people themselves in taking leadership roles in this ministry and helping to shape the kind of program that will serve them well.

Thanks to the ad hoc committee members for their caring and careful work of planning. Very special thanks to Ceily Gandolini, who has been our parish youth director, leading our parish CYO for 29 years. I am anxious now to see how all of this continues to develop, and I hope that you are too! To our young people, especially those in 8th, 9th and 10th grades: keep your eyes on the bulletin to find out more about our youth group as plans grow firmer over the next few months!

Because Lorraine and Bob Rodriquez plan to be moving to Oklahoma to be nearer their family, especially their beloved grandchildren, Lorraine has submitted her resignation from the Pastoral Council. In accord with our Constitution and By-Laws, the Council recommended another parishioner to take over Lorraine's term, and I have appointed Rosalyn Herrara for this service to our parish. I thank Rosalyn for so readily and eagerly agreeing to serve. Welcome aboard, Rosalyn!

During the month of November, I will be meeting with our parish organizations and with other interested parishioners in a needs assessment for our parish as we begin the process of setting new parish goals for the next several years. This continues the good work begun in our parish with the Archdiocesan pastoral planning processes, Catholic Life 2000 and Catholic Life 2003. This is, for us, Catholic Life 2007, since we will be setting those goals at a joint meeting of the Pastoral and Finance Councils, School Board and Parish Staff in January, 2007.

The first needs assessment gathering will be open to all parishioners, and it will be on Saturday, November 4, beginning at 9:30 a.m. in the Religious Education Library in the Annex Building. In this process, we will surface what you think we need to do to continue to flesh out our parish Mission Statement, what we need to do (in terms of staffing, facilities, ministries, organizations and finances) to continue to grow as a parish in living out the gospel mandate in our community. A second such gathering will be held on Wednesday, November 8 at 8:00 p.m. in the Conference Room. Please plan to participate in one of these meetings, which should last about 90 minutes. If you are a member of SAMA, SALA, Senior Citizens or Co-Op, Sr. Paula or I will be at your November meeting to conduct this process with you at your regularly-scheduled monthly meeting.

Remember that Wednesday of this week is All Saints' Day, a Holy Day of Obligation. There will be an anticipated Mass on Wednesday at 4:00 p.m. and Masses on November 1 at 6:15 a.m., 8:30 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.





Dear Parishioners.

November 1 was All Saints' Day and November 2 was All Souls' Day, initiating for us a month of remembrance and prayer for the deceased. We have a tradition in our parish that has us pray for the recently deceased in a very special way, as we invite families who have lost a loved one in the past year to join us at one of our weekend Masses for a remembrance at Mass and a reception for family members. This year, the Mass for Families of the Deceased will be on Saturday, November 11 at 4:00 p.m. We invite families who have lost a loved one in the past year, who was a member of our parish, to bring a photo of that person and place it on the tables that will be in the sanctuary. During Mass, we will pray for these deceased parishioners. A reception for families will follow in the Center.

I ask all parishioners to remember in your prayers those of our fellow parishioners who have passed away this year.

Eternal rest grant to them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May their souls, and the souls of all the faithful departed, rest in peace. Amen.

Thank you for your generosity to the missions of our Church! The second collection, on Worldwide Mission Sunday, was \$5,102.33, which is a wonderful sign of your desire to spread the message and the care of Christ to the very ends of the earth. This is a great gift, given in faith and in care!

I want to remind you that, during this month, we will be conducting a series of needs assessment gatherings for our parish, as we seek to develop goals for our parish life and ministries for the next several years. This week, Sr. Paula and I will be conducting this process with the members of SALA at their regularly-scheduled meeting. There are also two parish-wide meetings scheduled: Saturday, November 4 at 9:00 a.m. in the parish Conference room and Wednesday, November 8 at 7:00 p.m., again in the Conference Room. I encourage all parishioners to try to participate in one of these sessions. If you are a member of SALA, SAMA, Senior Citizens or the Co-Op, I will be at your November meeting for the needs assessment.

We will compile the results of these conversations with input we received in our pre-Katrina parish information gatherings. From your input, the Pastoral Council, Finance Council, School Board and Staff will set short-term and long-term parish goals at a joint meeting they will have in early January. As I have already shared with you, I consider this a very important parish project and I hope that you will take the time to be part of it!

On February 7, 2006, the Bishops of the State of Louisiana promulgated a document entitled, Approaching Death: The Moral Choices, a revised version of a statement they issued together in January, 1995. The Bishops offered us a recommended health care advance directive and discussed end-of-life issues (e.g., "ordinary" and "extraordinary" means of preserving life, medically assisted nutrition and hydration to sustain life), who is to make these decisions and moral directives on determining on how to decide. These are challenging, oftentimes, difficult decisions that many of us have already had to face with our loved one and many of us will have to face in the future.

On Saturday, November 11 at 9:00 a.m., Father Stephen Roundtree, S.J., professor at Loyola University, will be with us to discuss the bishops' statement and end of life issues from a Catholic perspective. This promises to be a very useful and informative session, with lots of time for your questions. Please join us. The session will be in the parish Conference Room and will begin at 9:00 a.m. (actually, right after the 8:30 a.m. Mass!). We will conclude no later than 10:30 a.m.

Advent begins with our weekend Masses of November 25-26. In preparation for this new season of the Church Year, I will be offering a special session for those who serve as Readers at weekend Masses, "An Overview of the Readings of Advent/Christmas, Cycle C of the Lectionary," on Saturday, November 18, from 9:00 a.m. until 11:00 a.m. in the parish Conference Room.



Dear Parishioners,

Each year, our parish St. Vincent de Paul Society coordinates the preparation and distribution of Thanksgiving food baskets for the needy of our area. Our entire parish participates in this important Christian charitable activity by donating non-perishable food items to be included in the baskets. The St. Vincent members add some fresh food to the baskets before they are received by the recipients.

Please bring your non-perishable food items to church next weekend, November 18-19. The collection boxes will be placed in the sanctuary of church and we ask you to place your food donations in the boxes before Mass. In this way, we can see our parish concern for the needy and our willingness to work together to help them, and we will include them and our St. Vincent members in the prayers of Mass in a special way.

Let me offer this early reminder that our parish Thanksgiving Day Mass will be at 8:30 a.m. on Thanksgiving Day, November 23. That will be the only Mass that day. Beginning that day with Mass is an excellent way of offering our thanks to God for the many blessings in which we share every day!

Note also that our school Thanksgiving Mass will be on Friday, November 17 at 9:30 a.m.

On February 7, 2006, the Bishops of the State of Louisiana promulgated a document entitled, Approaching Death: The Moral Choices, a revised version of a statement they issued together in January, 1995. The Bishops offered us a recommended health care advance directive and discussed end-of-life issues (e.g., "ordinary" and "extraordinary" means of preserving life, medically assisted nutrition and hydration to sustain life), who is to make these decisions and moral directives on determining on how to decide. These are challenging, oftentimes, difficult decisions that many of us have already had to face with our loved ones and many of us will have to face in the future.

This weekend, on Saturday, November 11 at 9:00 a.m., Father Stephen Roundtree, S.J., professor at Loyola University, will be with us to discuss the bishops' statement and end of life issues from a Catholic perspective. This promises to be a very useful and informative session, with lots of time for your questions. Please join us. The session will be in the parish Conference Room and will begin at 9:00 a.m. (actually, right after the 8:30 a.m. Mass!). We will conclude no later than 10:30 a.m.

Advent begins with our weekend Masses of November 25-26. In preparation for this new season of the Church Year, I will be offering a special session for those who serve as Readers at weekend Masses, "An Overview of the Readings of Advent/Christmas, Cycle C of the Lectionary," on Saturday, November 18, from 9:00 a.m. until 11:00 a.m. in the parish Conference Room.

Readers, please note that there is a sign-up sheet in the sacristy for this session, so that I can know how many hand-outs to prepare for those interested in attending.







Dear Parishioners,

Today, at all of our Masses, is the annual national collection for the Campaign for Human Development. Dear Parishioners,

Yes, the melodies were familiar, even though we hadn't sung them for a year. It will take a week or two for them to come back to mind and to mouth, but the songs of Advent bid us to that "waiting in joyful hope," that we pray for during this season of preparation for the Lord's coming. I particularly like the opening song, "God of all power, you kindle the stars; spark in your people, spark in us a season of light." The melody is as upbeat as our eagerness to welcome the Divine into our lives and the words challenge us to be rekindled with the spark of the Lord's life and to be ready to welcome that life when it fills us, when it sheds its light upon our paths and leads us to new blessings of joy and gladness.

The familiar strains of "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel" are heard in the Holy, Holy, the Memorial Acclamation, the Great Amen and the Lamb of God, and these familiar acclamations become a new prayer of longing and expectation.

The colors of Advent: the purple and pink of the new dawn remind us of the dawning of the Son of Justice that is on the horizon. The candles of the Advent wreath remind us of the longing hearts of times past and times present that burn for the arrival of the Lord of justice, truth and peace. "Come, Lord Jesus," we pray. come and fill us with all the gifts that God holds for us. Come, Lord Jesus!

Dear Parishioners.

This weekend will certainly be an interesting combination of decorations and prayer. This Sunday is, of course, the Fourth Sunday of Advent, and we will be lighting the final candle on our Advent wreath, voicing again our prayer of Advent longing, "Come, Lord Jesus." In the readings we will hear preludes of Christmas themes as the prophet Micah foretells the coming of the Messiah from the humble land of Bethlehem and Mary, herself pregnant, goes to visit her cousin Elizabeth, full with the child to be called John the Baptist.

And, there will be poinsettias a-plenty, trees and brightly-adorned wreaths surrounding the simple Advent wreath, for our last Advent Mass will end on Sunday around 1:30 p.m. and our first anticipated Mass of Christmas will begin two and a half hours later (barely time for both lunch and a nap between things!). With Christmas decorations all around us, we will once again sing Advent carols and wear the vestments of Advent, as sights and sounds collide.

In this strange blending-together, or even in its visual/aural cacophony, we face the challenge to be open and ready: ready to greet the Lord. Don't let this clashing-together of Advent/Christmas become the image of your life: everything rushed and crammed in, little time to breathe moving from one event to another, not allowing time to think, to savor, to appreciate. Instead, let us all try to take the time not only to sing carols, but to let the words and images fill us with new dreams and visions of God's graced-filled presence among us. Let us listen, really listen, to the words of Scripture that reveal the wisdom of God in the Word made Flesh. Let us cherish the joy of the holiday, the gleaming faces of children as they open their gifts, the smiles of family and friends as we visit, the bounty of the earth as we share food and drink. Take the time to appreciate and to express your appreciation to God who, living with us, makes every moment worth savoring.

As is our custom, this one bulletin will cover the next two weeks, so - on behalf of our entire parish pastoral staff, I wish all of you and your families a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year!

At all of the doors of the church we have 2007 calendars. We invite each family to take one as you leave Mass this weekend.

In the sacristy, we have a Christmas remembrance for those who serve us in liturgical ministries. I ask those who serve as Readers. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, Ministers of Hospitality, Choir /Music Ministers and Servers to come to the sacristy after Mass and pick one up.

There will be a second collection at all Christmas Masses for our support of clergy welfare (support for retired Archdiocesan priests and for the priests of the Archdiocese in need of special medical attention) and the charitable ministries of the Archdiocese. As always, we ask your customary generous support.

Please keep in mind that our Adult Choir will sing at the 4:00 p.m. Mass on Christmas Eve and again at the 11:00 a.m. Mass on Christmas Day, with caroling beginning about a half hour before each of those Masses. Our Children's Choir will sing at the 6:00 p.m. Christmas Eve Mass, and the caroling will begin about 5:30 p.m. On Christmas Day, caroling will begin ten minutes before the 8:00 a.m. and 9:30 a.m. Masses. So, come to Mass early and prepare for the great celebration of the arrival of Emmanuel in special song.

So that Fr. Ray, our parish office staff and I can have some time to enjoy (and recover from!) the weekend activities, please note that there are NO MASSES on December 26 and our parish offices are closed that day. We return to our regular schedule of Masses and office hours on Wednesday, December 27.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in the Lord:

Fifty years ago Archbishop Joseph Rummel issued a landmark Pastoral Letter, "The Morality of Racial Segregation." In his ground-breaking message, he declared racial segregation to be "morally wrong and sinful" and announced that he was ordering the gradual integration of all Catholic schools. Despite intense opposition, he remained steadfast in his teaching and opposition, his resolve.

As we mark this fiftieth anniversary, it is timely found to take stock of the progress made and the challenges remaining. Almost twenty-five percent of Catholic school children come from African, Latino, Asian or Native American families. While a number of church parishes are still black by choice, our territorial church parishes are open to members of every race. timely for of our

But we still face unaddressed issues in our midst. Too high a proportion of blacks and other racial or ethnic minorities experience a limited choice in education because of failing public schools, little or no health insurance, a dearth of affordable housing and serious economic disadvantages. Katrina has exposed the sad realities which not only entrap those caught in the web of poverty, illiteracy, illegal drugs and violence, but paralyze us all.

This week I issued a pastoral letter on racial harmony: "Made in the Image and Likeness of God", to provide a reflective analysis, the Church's teaching and concrete proposals for a plan of action. I am asking that this message be read thoughtfully, studied in our parishes and schools and implemented in the concrete proposals contained in it.

Pope Benedict XVI, in his encyclical letter, "God is Charity", says this: "... if in my life I fail completely to heed others, solely out of a desire to be 'devout' and to perform my 'religious duties', then my relationship with God will also grow arid. It becomes merely 'proper', but loveless. Only my readiness to encounter my neighbor and to show him love makes me sensitive to God as well..."

Pope John Paul II, in his September 1987 visit to New Orleans, declared: "There is no white Church. There is no black Church. There is only the one Church of Jesus Christ."

God grant us the grace that Hurricane Katrina may provide a water-shed experience as we continue to work toward a new New Orleans.
