The 2006-07 school year was very special in so many ways. We used our annual theme, "Character Counts" as a tool for growth in the character traits of kindness, respect, trustworthiness, honesty and many others. As a school community we are constantly growing and changing. During this school year we achieved a long-awaited goal of becoming accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS). This recognition was a great honor in it validated the hard work of our faculty and staff in the journey to educational excellence. We look forward to continued growth as we continue to set new goals and reach new heights. There is a saying that "it takes a village to raise a child" and St. Angela Merici School is no exception. We exist only because of the support of the parish and the parents. Providing quality Catholic education means utilizing whatever support possible in order maximize quality with minimizing costs.

The most important way that you can support our school ministry is through your prayer. Please pray for our faculty and staff who are so dedicated to Catholic education and who play a crucial role in so many children's lives. Please pray for our school parents who are juggling so many challenges in this fast-paced world, but at the same time are striving to provide a nurturing home environment for their children. Of course, please pray for our blessed children, that they may see the goodness of God in all their experiences especially through their St. Angela Merici parish family.

You may not realize it, but there are other ways that you, as parishioners, can support the ministry of Catholic Education at St. Angela Merici School. Please contact the school office (835-8491) if you have any questions or would like to offer support in any of the following areas:

- Through the Boxtops for Education program General Mills offers cash back to schools when boxtops are submitted. These include cereals, baking products and many frozen foods. Information and product lists can be found at www.boxtops4education.com. You are encouraged to clip and save labels for the school and bring them to the rectory or the school office. We usually earn about \$1000 each year through this program, but the potential is much greater.
- Community Coffee products are also eligible for a "Cash Back for Schools Program." Products include their coffee, tea, sugar, creamer
 and filters. About \$400 per year is the income on this program. Please cut out the UPC product code on these products and submit to
 rectory or school office and the returns can be much more.

As the Pastoral Staff liaison to the Parish Fair and Soirée, let me take this opportunity to share some information on these events:

The proceeds of our Parish Fair are primarily dedicated to the school. These much needed funds allow tuition increases each year to be as minimal as possible. The upcoming Fair will be held on October 5th, 6th & 7th. There are many ways that you can assist in the success of the Fair:

- Properly broken egg shells are always desperately needed to make confetti eggs. You can break the egg with a hole about the size of a
 quarter, remove the egg for your use and rinse the eggshell with warm, soapy water and return to the egg carton. Eggshells can be brought
 to the school office or the rectory. However, if you need them picked up, leave a message at the school office. A volunteer will be happy to
 pick them up.
- Our students donate cake mix during the month of September. We need volunteers to bake the cakes and/or brownies during those days
 right before the fair. If you would like to be contacted to bake, please call the school office or the rectory.
- Many workers are needed to work the many booths at the fair. If you are able to work a shift at the fair, please contact us.
- If you are interested in the coordination efforts of the Fair, the committee is establishing a mentoring program to help orient new members to the Fair Committee. Contact me for more details either at the school office or by e-mail: cremont@stangelaschool.org.
- You may have some contacts or talents that would benefit the fair such as: restaurant owners or businesses willing to sponsor or make donations, construction/electrical talents, publicity connections. Let us know!

The proceeds for the Soirée go to a designated project that benefits the parish. Past Soirée income has gone to purchase new stage curtains and new sound equipment. The most recent Soirée proceeds will go toward refurbishing the restrooms and lobby of the Msgr. Kern Center. Ways to assist with future Soirées include:

- SALA, SAMA & Co-op are all involved in various aspects of the Soirée. SALA coordinates décor, SAMA coordinates the gaming, Co-op coordinates the auction. Other aspects of the Soirée are handled by the Soirée committee. We are in need of more help on the Soirée Committee and these sub-committees. If you would like to help you may contact me.
- Buy a ticket and talk it up with your friends and family! We have not sold the maximum number of tickets in prior years. Selling 300 tickets would greatly increase the profit. Not to mention that you can join the fun at a great parish social event!
- Auction donations are always in need. If you have any connections in this regard, contact me or someone on the Soirée Committee.



While Fr. Ken is on vacation, through the use of this column, we are able to inform and update you on various aspects of parish activities of which you may not be aware. Sister Paula has given you information on some of the many programs coordinated through her Religious Education office, and Colleen Remont told you about school activities and ways in which you can help support our school, our Parish Fair in the fall, and our Spring Soiree. This week I want to up-date you on some things about the parish facilities.

You may have noticed within the past couple of weeks that one of the large pine trees at the corner of Pomona and Melody is gone. One morning, following 8:30 AM Mass, one of our parishioners stopped by the rectory to say the tree was in a very "precarious" position. To say the least!!! The tree was leaning against the building supported only by a limb. After the tree removal people arrived, but before their equipment was here, the tree shifted and fell. One of the limbs damaged the iron fence on Melody. The tree was removed and the fence has been repaired. All of this thanks again to our everhungry critters – TERMITES!!!

As always, while school is closed, this affords us the opportunity to accomplish work on our property to maintain and improve the facilities and to prepare for the reopening of school in August. The school website — www.stangelaschool. org — actually gives you the time to re-opening of school on August 14 down to the second! Summer, for us, passes much too quickly. Mike and Alberto are well in to the process of emptying classrooms to strip and re-wax the floors. They have also removed the carpet in the Religious Ed Library and are striping and refinishing the stone floor. This will be an improvement as this room is now used as a multi-purpose room for school activities as well as parish meetings.

As Father Ken mentioned before he left for vacation, he and I met with the contractor to facilitate improvements to the lobby and restroom area of the Kern Center. The plumber is looking at options for the restrooms and we will then have a price for the work. This project is funded with proceeds from the Spring Soireé.

Also going on in the Center this summer is some reorganization of spaces. With all of the activities that go on here at St. Angela, we are seriously limited of space. At the end of last year, thanks to Family Life, the pantry off of the kitchen became a "Community Pantry" with an inventory of paper products and supplies. This frees the organizations using the Center from purchasing basic supplies for their meetings and functions and is working out very well.

This summer we are moving Coach James' office in the Center to the area shared by the sound equipment. A new partition wall is being built to protect the sound equipment from the athletic supplies. The "stuff" that had been located in that area is now being incorporated into the Community Pantry and will be closer to the kitchen for convenience. Of course, as with any clean-out type project, we find some real treasures that can be disposed of to provide more space.

We have installed an iron fence around the garden in the Courtyard of Saints. One of our parishioners generously plants and maintains this garden year round. Since plants and flowers don't like being walked on, a fence is necessary to maintain the beauty of this area and allow for seasonal enhancements.

Father Ken will be back next week and will tell you about the Mysteries of Light that have recently been installed in the Mary Chapel.

Dear Parishioners,

Through the generosity of three parish families – Bob and Linda Armbruster, Minnie Flynn and Bob and Helen Hughes – the stained glass artpieces in Mary's Chapel depicting the Mysteries of Light have been completed. We thank these parishioners for the generous financial donations each made for the purchase of the art. This addition of the Mysteries of Light adds more beauty to Mary's chapel and brings up-to-date the depiction of the mysteries of the rosary.

I want also to add a special word of thanks to Ruth Goliwas, designer and artist of the windows, for her good work. Ruth did a fantastic job blending the new stained glass with the existing ones. Thanks, finally, to our own staff members, Mike and Alberto, who assisted with the installation.

We will bless the windows today during the 12:30 p.m. Mass, and also have the opportunity at Mass to thank the Armbruster, Flynn and Hughes families for their contribution of this art to celebrate the events in the life of Christ and his Mother that they depict.

At the Pastoral Council meeting in June, the Council completed work on the parish goals for the next three years. In a few weeks, we will have a meeting of the leadership of all parish organizations and committees to share with them these goals and how we will pursue their implementation. This has been a long and challenging process. It actually began in the Spring of 2005, when we began the series of parish information gatherings. At that time, we not only shared with the groups of parishioners who met information about the state of the parish, but also solicited their input on parish needs and suggestions about future parish activities. After we began to get back on our feet following the chaos and aftermath of Katrina, we met with parish organizations and did a needs assessment process. From the pre-Katrina and post-Katrina input, the members of the parish Staff, Pastoral Council, Finance Council and School Board met and began to think about your input and turning these into goals. After we meet with the parish lay leaders and discuss the goals with them. I will share them with all of you, along with a report on that meeting.

Setting goals (as we did in Parish Life 2000 and Parish Life 2003), is an important project. It makes us evaluate our on-going development as a parish and helps us to work together on common projects, as we seek to meet the real needs of our parishioners. I thank the Staff and the members of our Councils, especially the Pastoral Council, for the serious and careful work on this.

I want to thank Fr. Ray and all the parish staff for taking on a bit of extra work while I was on vacation these past weeks. Thanks to Jackie Appleton, Colleen Remont and Sr. Paula for taking over my column here in the bulletin these past weeks and sharing information with you about areas of parish life and ministries for which they are responsible.

Sr. Paula is on vacation and will be out of the parish until July 30. Fr. Schott will be leaving on July 21 for a conference and will return to us on July 31.

Next weekend (July 21-22), we will welcome Fr. Johvino Carpio, a member of the religious community of the Society of Foreign Missions of Columbia, South America, who will be with us for the annual appeal for a specific foreign mission. Father will speak of the work of his community in Latin America and Africa. I will share more information about this with you in next week's bulletin.

Father Johvino will be staying in the rectory for three weeks and will be assisting with weekday Masses during these weeks.

For 123 years the *National Black and Indian Mission Collection* has served the Catholic Church well in the Black and American Indian communities. Time is approaching for the year 2007 collection and it is needed more today than ever in the over a hundred year history.

The Collection of last year played a big part in being able to allocate special grants to the Gulf Coast States where hurricanes and flooding did such terrible damage to black churches and schools and to Indian Parishes in Louisiana. Now, I ask everyone in the Archdiocese to be as generous as possible to the 2007 National Black and Indian Mission Collection. Let the collection of this year be another good one - that we all may share in the rebuilding efforts of the Church that has suffered so very much.

While Fr. Ken has returned to us from his vacation, as you can imagine, he has been quite busy "catching-up" with activities that have happened here in the parish during the time that he was away. So this week I will share with you more about the happenings in the parish.

Particularly those of you who attend daily Mass may have observed – and heard – some contractors working on the property during these past several weeks. Through e-rate funding from the federal government related to communications, since Katrina our school was placed in a 90% reimbursement bracket for re-wiring. This work actually began in May before the end of this past school year. It has continued all summer and hopefully will be completed within the next couple of weeks so that it can be tested and fine-tuned so that everything will be up and running satisfactorily prior to the reopening of school on August 14.

The work has involved placing conduit for the new wiring throughout the school, in the first floor areas of church (classrooms, conference room, and Director of Music office), throughout the annex, in the gym, and under the covered walkway connecting the three buildings. This new wiring will make available up-graded telephone service for the school and will improve the data lines for computers in all three buildings. It also will provide for video surveillance for all of the buildings.

School has been busy since last Saturday when a group of parent volunteers began working to help spruce up school for the reopening. They worked Saturday during the day and then each of the evenings during the week during the time the Cabbage Ball program was going on in the school yard. Their list includes painting a number of classrooms and the computer lab in school, along with painting classrooms in the annex. Thanks to all who have helped with this project. Next year we plan on publicizing this volunteer work effort well in advance so we can involve some of our parishioners, who may not be directly connected with school, to come out and help. The old adage "the more the merrier" also helps to get more work done and allows it to be done more quickly.

We have received the proposals from the contractor for renovations to the gym foyer and restrooms. As soon as Father Ken reviews these we will be proceeding with the work. This obviously will not be complete prior to the opening of school and the resumption of meetings and functions that are held in the gym, but we will do out best to provide the least inconvenience for those using the facilities.

As Father Ken mentioned in his column last week, this weekend we welcome to our parish Father Johvani Carpio who will make an appeal at each of the Masses for the work of his community an the mission in Latin America, Africa and Southeast Asia. His order also has a parish in The Bronx, NY.

Father Johvani will be staying at the rectory for several weeks and will be helping us here at St. Angela celebrating Masses while Father Ray and Father Schott are away from the parish.







Dear Parishioners,

I am certain that you noticed, but am amazed that no one has said anything yet: July 6 marked the fourth anniversary of my serving as your pastor and, customarily on the weekend nearest that occasion, I speak at all the Masses presenting my "State of the Parish" reflections. Well, you certainly noticed that this presentation didn't happen, and I'm certain that you're all wondering why! There are two reasons: one happenstance, the other deliberate.

The happenstance reason: I was on vacation both the weekend before and the weekend after the anniversary. The deliberate reason: The Pastoral Council (as I told you a few weeks back) has completed work on our parish goals for the next three years; we will be having a special meeting of all those in parish leadership roles during the second week of August, and I wanted to do that before I give my State of the Parish report; and, I want to wait until we are ready to share with you the final financial report for the fiscal year that ended on June 30. Our parish Business Manager, Jackie Appleton, has told me that I should have the financial report by the end of this week and, with the leadership meetings to be held on August 18 and 23, I will be ready to give my State of the Parish presentation at all the Masses on the weekend of August 25-26.

Welcome back, faculty! Our school faculty returns this week for their annual before-school-opens meetings and to prepare their classrooms. They always return excited about their ministry to our young people, and I'm sure this year will see them with the same eagerness and enthusiasm. I hope our kids are eager, too, for now we're just one week away from the beginning of a new school year!

As our teachers return, as our new school parents meet on August 4, as our new students have their orientation on August 13 and as our school begins on August 14, I urge all of you to hold our faculty, students, parents and staff in your prayers, that this will be another great year for all involved and that, through our ministry of Catholic education, we will help our children grow in wisdom, age and grace.

On December 16, 2006, Archbishop Alfred Hughes issued his pastoral letter on racial harmony, Made in the Image and Likeness of God. The Archbishop asked all Catholics to read and reflect on his letter, particularly to discern personal and community calls to action. To help members of our parish in this process of reflection, we will have three gatherings to discuss the pastoral, and those sessions will be this week on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday nights, 7:00 p.m., in the parish Conference Room. Please note that this will be an open discussion among participants, not a lecture on the letter, so those attending are expected to read it in advance of the first session on Wednesday night. Copies of the pastoral are available at the rectory during office hours (9:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m.), or in the sacristy after any Mass. Please consider taking the time to join your fellow parishioners to discuss the pastoral letter.





There is new wiring throughout the school building so that our technology can grow, all new computers in our Computer Lab, and Coach has new digs in the Center.

Let's have a great year together!

We bid farewell to another of our music ministers: Paul Bouquet, who has been serving both as cantor and as organist, is "moving on up." He has taken the position at St. Edward the Confessor Parish as Director of Music. This is quite a positive step up for Paul and, while we are certainly sorry to have him leave, we cannot but be happy for him and this new opportunity. We wish him the best as he begins his new ministry at St. Edward.

Work on the rest rooms in the Center has begun. This upgrading includes all new fixtures in both rest rooms, so this is a BIG job. Of course, that also means that these rooms are out of commission for a while. When you come to the Center for meetings and other gatherings, please be patient while this work is in progress.





Dear Parishioners,

We should know a lot more about a time-line for repairs, and the extent of needed repairs soon, and I will let you know that in next week's bulletin. In the meantime, we did find out that I'm pretty good handling a wet-vac, so give me a call if you're ever in need!

I want to thank those who participated in the parish survey, made available last weekend in church, in preparation for the Archbishop's upcoming pastoral visit to our parish. Remember to mark your calendar, if you have not already done so: the Archbishop will preside at the 4:00 p.m. Mass on Saturday, September 22 and there will be a parish reception in the Center after Mass for you to chat with the Archbishop. He will return on Monday, September 24 and celebrate Mass with our school community at 1:30 p.m. All parishioners, of course, are invited to participate in that Mass as well.



Dear Parishioners.

Several weeks ago, Sr. Paula led a series of discussions on Archbishop Hughes' pastoral letter on racial harmony. I asked Sister to share with you a summary of those sessions, and here is her report:

As you know, we held discussion evenings on the Archbishop's pastoral letter on racial harmony. We were a small but vocal group, as everyone came prepared for our discussion. In the pastoral, Archbishop Hughes tells of his history with racial awareness. One thing we realized was that all of us were from this area, and we have had different and more personal experiences of working and living in racial harmony and/or tension throughout our lives than those of the Archbishop. The discussion brought back memories of Archbishop Rummel's struggles in the 60's. We all told stories of our experiences of these times.

The pastoral describes all that the archdiocese is doing to continue to work for harmony at the archdiocesan level, and gives recommendations for those who work for the Archdiocese of New Orleans. Other recommendations for parishes and all Catholics follow. We found that we are already following some of the recommendations, but we agreed that we would suggest to our parish's Pastoral Council and Finance Council the possibility of twinning with a church parish whose racial makeup is different from ours. Our second recommendation is that we remember to pray in our petitions at liturgy, both weekday and weekends, for those who are different from us.

We ended with a quote from the encyclical "Deus Caritas Est," by Pope Benedict XVI: "Love of neighbor is thus shown to be possible in the way proclaimed by the Bible, by Jesus. It consists in the very fact that, in God and with God, I love even the person whom I do not like or even know. This can only take place on the basis of an intimate encounter with God, an encounter which has become a communion of will, even affecting my feelings. Then I learn to look on this other person not simply with my eyes and my feelings, but from the perspective of Jesus Christ. His friend is my friend . . ."

I want to thank those who participated in these sessions and for their thoughtful recommendations. Our parish used to twin with St. Vincent de Paul Parish in New Orleans, providing them with additional income from our own collections. Sister will take this recommendation to begin twinning once again to the Pastoral and Finance Councils for their discussion and decision.

The carpet in church does seem to be drying and we are continuing our efforts to get it all dry. There does seem to have been some shrinkage already, however, so we are still monitoring what's going on before deciding what the next step needs to be. We are also watching the walls in the sacristy for mildew or mold, since these walls had lots of water come down on them.

The work in the Center lobby has been completed, with new paint, new ceiling and new lighting fixtures. In the rest rooms, we are only waiting on the new stalls. A new air conditioning/heating unit for that area is ordered and, when it arrives and is installed, the work in the Center will be complete.

Monday is Labor Day. Please remember that our parish offices are closed on Labor Day and that there is only one Mass that day: at 8:30 a.m. For those traveling or enjoying leisure activities: have a great and relaxing time! Let us, on Labor Day, keep in our prayers all those whose labor benefits us. Let us also keep in our prayers those who are unemployed, those who seek jobs that equal their talents, follow their interests and whose salary and benefits meet their needs and the needs of the families they support. Let us pray for all those who work on these civic holidays and whose commitment to their work allow the rest of us to have safe and happy leisure time.



Dear Parishioners.

Three or four times each year, we host at the rectory a gathering for families who are new to our parish. Our Family Life Apostolate hosts the evening with Fr. Ray and me. This is a very informal gathering: just an opportunity for us to meet families who have moved in recently and affording them the opportunity to meet us, other members of our parish pastoral staff who will be serving them in various ways, and the opportunity for them to begin to meet other parishioners, since Family Life members are joined by some of the leaders of our parish organizations. The Family Life Apostolate has mailed invitations to the new families we know about. But, if you are new to our parish and have not yet had the opportunity to register with the parish office, I'd still like to invite you to this gathering today (Sunday, September 9) at Noon at the rectory.

When I gave my "State of the Parish" report in church two weeks ago, I told you that one area we are trying to develop more fully is a planned program of on-going adult faith formation. We know that we never stop growing as individuals: there is always more potential to develop and mature intellectually, emotionally, spiritually. While many of us in our parish who are now adults were privileged to have an upbringing that included Catholic elementary and high school education and, thus, benefited from the religious education we received then, we certainly do not expect what we learned in those years to be all we know about our faith; we do not expect how we prayed then to be the prayer style that always lasts a lifetime. Relationships and the circumstances of life change us. As we grow, our relationships with others change (hopefully, deepen and grow more intimate). Our relationship with the Lord and with the Church is no different. Adult faith formation helps us to develop and deepen our spirituality. It offers us opportunities to learn more. It guides us to new avenues of service.

The recent discussions we had on the Archbishop's pastoral letter was one form of adult faith formation. The Sunday readings discussions that are now held on Thursday mornings and evenings are others. The booklets of reflections we offered you last Lent were another.

This coming Saturday (September 15), our Adult Faith Formation Committee is sponsoring a Morning of Reflection for adults of our parish. Sr. Marina Aranzabal, a Teresian Sister, will be the speaker. Her topic is "Prayer. Can it change the way I look at my life?" I hope that you will consider participating in this morning of reflection and prayer. It begins with Mass at 8:30 a.m. and continues until 12 Noon. Child care is being provided. Have you ever thought to yourself or said out loud anything like this: "I just need time to think!" "I need some peace and quiet!" Have you ever wished that you could have some time to discern where the Lord might be leading you in your life? If so, this morning is for you.

So that proper accommodations can be made for those attending and to make certain that we have adequate staffing for child care, please call the rectory and let us know if you will be attending.

I thank all of those who took part in the survey of parish life that we have conducted at recent parish meetings and also made available for all in church as we prepare for Archbishop Hughes' pastoral visit to St. Angela.

Please remember that the Archbishop will be with us for the 4:00 p.m. Mass two weeks from now, on Saturday, September 22 and that there will be a reception after Mass so that you can meet and chat with him.


