

Dear Parishioners,

Last Sunday, we began "Child Church." Child Church is the Liturgy of the Word for children who have not yet shared in Holy Communion for the first time. We began Child Church for our children of the ages four and five. In a few weeks, we will add Child Church for children of ages 6 and 7, who have not yet made their First Communion. The way child Church works is this: following the opening prayer of the Mass, the priest celebrating the Mass will dismiss the children and they will go with their prayer leader to one of the classrooms in the Annex. The children will celebrate the entire Liturgy of the Word together: they will hear the readings proclaimed, hear a homily on those readings, join in praying the Apostles' Creed and have General Intercessions based on the proclamation of the Word. Then, following our praying of the General Intercessions in church, the children will return to their families in church for the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

I think it is important to note that this is NOT a catechism lesson, not some form of CCD taking place on Sunday morning. It is the Liturgy of the Word: the proclamation of Scripture, homily and intercessions. The purpose of Child Church is to allow our young people to hear God's Word on their level of language and understanding. The readings are taken from the approved Lectionary for Masses with Children. The adults who will lead this liturgy work under the supervision of Sr. Paula, our Director of Religious Education, and use materials for Scripture explanation and Intercessions that are from one of the major publishing companies that provide this type of material.

I would like to encourage parents with children in these age groups to consider making the 9:30 a.m. Mass on Sundays your family prayer time so that your children can participate in this valuable experience. To register, please contact Sr. Paula in the Religious Education office at 837-9347.

We will, of course, let you know when we will be able to add six and seven year-olds to this.

I would like to thank once again all who had a role in making our annual parish fair a success. I have heard lots of good things about the Fair weekend. We will give you a complete financial report on the Fair after all the outstanding bills have been paid, but it does look as though we came close to last year's total income and profit.

On Saturday, October 27, there will be a meeting for all those who serve as Communion ministers to the homebound of our parish. This is an important meeting and so I ask all those who serve in this important ministry to be at the meeting at 9:30 a.m. in the Conference Room.

Today is Mission Sunday, an annual observance in our Church when we are called to pray for those who serve as missionaries in our Church and to pray for those they serve. It is also a day for us to contribute to the work of missionaries by our financial offerings. Please be extra generous in your contribution to this weekend's second collection. Our financial assistance is a tremendous help to those who serve in mission lands. Missionaries bring the Word of God through their teaching and preaching. They bring the care of Christ in the sacraments they celebrate and the aid they give in food, clothing, education and health care. They reveal the universality of the Church as they go to new lands and as they bring with them, through this collection, the support of other Catholics who care enough to make financial sacrifices. I believe this to be one of the most important of the special collections we have and I urge your most generous contributions!

Dear Parishioners,

As your Finance Council, we feel that we need to address what we see as a disturbing trend in our weekend collections. Several months ago, when we spoke with you, we shared first our gratitude that most parishioners had remained faithful to the pledges that were made to our increased giving campaign of 2006. Because of your conscientious and committed financial contributions, we reported to you that we were up-to-date on our parish weekly assessment payments to the Archdiocese (our "parish share" of support of the Archdiocese, insurance payments and clergy benefits payments) and that we were also up-to-date on payments on our parish debt. All of that was very good news and our hope was that this would continue to be the case. However, something has changed. As you have seen in the weekly report that is here in the bulletin, our collections have seen a significant decrease in the past three months.

In order to meet our ordinary and budgeted expenses, our total weekly income must be \$18,000.00. Our collections need to be \$16,100.00 and our "extraordinary income" (e.g., stipends, donations, votive candles, book-rack income) equal to the difference. Our "ordinary income," that is, the weekly collection income, has begun to be significantly below our expectation and our need. Because of the shortfall in contributions, we are now behind in payments on both our parish assessment and our loan payment. As of October 17, the day we are preparing this letter for publication here in the bulletin, we are delinquent to the Archdiocese \$9,202.00 in payments on our assessment and \$2,000.00 on our loan.

For a number of months we were current on all payments, so we know that we can meet our budgeted expenses when all parishioners remain faithful to conscientious and sacrificial parish financial support. We need you to help reverse the current trend and get us back on the right track.

If you are still meeting the offering level you promised in 2005, THANK YOU! If you have not been keeping up in recent weeks, PLEASE do all that you can to return to your level of promised giving.

If you contribute regularly, especially through the envelope system, THANK YOU, for we need that regular income. If you are not currently consistent in your contributions, PLEASE consider requesting church support envelopes so that we know that we can rely on your faithful support in the future.

If you are a new parishioner to St. Angela and have not yet registered in our parish, PLEASE contact the parish office so that we can get your family registered and share with you information about the life, activities, organizations and ministries of our parish. We want to get you involved and active in parish life so that you will be able to see all that we accomplish together, with and for one another. We are convinced that if you become active in parish life, you will know how much St. Angela is worth the investment of your time and your financial support as well.

We regularly sing at Mass the hymn, "Let Us Build the City of God." That is a good prayer for us to sing often, for it reminds us of our mission as followers of Christ. Coming together with generous spirits, generous hearts, generous hands and, yes, even generous pocket-books will help us to continue to build that city of God that is seen in our mutual support, our ready service and the life of the organizations and ministries of this parish: all meant to bring to all the joy, hope, compassion and peace of Christ himself.



Dear Parishioners,

Please come celebrate with the members of your pastoral staff who are celebrating birthdays this month at the party this Saturday, Nov. 10, from 5:00-7:00 p.m. in the Center. Deacon Gil and I share Nov. 14 as our birthday (though Gil is a tad older than I); Deacon Nick's birthday is Nov. 10 (the day of the party); our parish Secretary, Dianne Goodrow's birthday is Nov. 12, and our parish Business Manager, Jackie Appleton, celebrates her birthday on Nov 22. Deacon Nick will be on retreat that day, but Dianne, Jackie, Gil and I all hope you will be able to spend some time in celebration with us.

If you were on the parish campus this week, you probably noticed the cranes outside the Center. We were completing repair work to the Center roof from Hurricane Katrina. During the storm, the corner of the roof was peeled back by the wind. Our temporary repair lasted for two years (!) and now the permanent repair is completed. Panels on the roof were replaced and the insulated ceiling on their interior was also repaired.

We are now back in the sacristy, though it did take ten weeks to complete the repairs from the broken water pipe on the second floor. Since the sacristy received the worst of the damage, we took this as an opportunity to replace the carpet in the sacristy and to paint as well. Several of the hollow-core doors were badly warped by the water and we are waiting for six new doors to be made and installed. As you can tell, there was no serious damage to the carpet in the church and so, when the sacristy work is finished, work from the flood is over.

Now we're looking at two more pine trees, for we suspect there may be termites in them. I'll let you know!

Please remember to bring extra canned goods or other non-perishable items to church next weekend for the Thanksgiving baskets to be prepared by our St. Vincent de Paul Society and distributed to the needy in our area. Your generosity in the past has enabled us to assist a number of needy families each year, and we hope that this year will be no exception. Please place your food items in the bins in church.

And, with Thanksgiving Day approaching, please remember to mark your calendars for our parish Thanksgiving Masses. Our school community will celebrate a Thanksgiving-themed Mass on Thursday of this week, Nov. 15, at 9:30 a.m. Our parish Thanksgiving Day Mass will be next week, Thanksgiving Day, Nov. 22 at 8:30 a.m. (Please remember that this is the only Mass on Thanksgiving Day.)

We all do have much to be grateful for and it is fitting for us to give special thanks to God on Thanksgiving Day.

I ask all those who serve as extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion, readers, ministers of hospitality (ushers), music ministers and Senior Servers please to come to the sacristy this weekend to pick up a copy of a very special book we have for you: Living Liturgy. Dear Parishioners.

On behalf of our parish Finance Council, I want to thank you for your quick and conscientious response to the letter that appeared in the bulletin two weeks ago about our Sunday collections. The collection this past weekend amounted to \$21,946.00. This will help us to catch up on our missed Archdiocesan assessments and late loan payments, especially when we add in the collection from the November 1 Holy Day.

I thank those of you who give faithfully, generously and even sacrificially. Your conscientious financial support in the Sunday collection allows us here at St. Angela and on the Archdiocesan level to continue to build up the reign of Christ through our organizations and ministries.

Please continue this conscientious level of giving!

During this month of November, we continue to remember in our prayers all the faithful departed. It is often quite difficult to lose a loved one. Even when someone has been ill for a time or suffered great pain in their last days, it is difficult to let go. Our tears often flow freely, sometimes are even uncontrollable as we express the grief we feel in our hearts, deep in our guts. That is why it is important to continue to focus on the promise of the God of life, the promise that God wants all to come to share everlasting life. The pain of loss can be tempered by the promise of immortality. The pain of separation can be softened when we focus on the promise of the Eucharist: that there is a banquet in heaven to which Christ wants to welcome us. The anxiety of having loved ones leave our homes is lessened when we remember the promise of Christ that he has prepared for us a room in God's heavenly mansion.

The prayers and rituals of the Catholic funeral liturgy are well-designed to help us face the pain of death and yet move us to hope. The various liturgies of the Church, from prayers after death, either in the presence of the deceased or soon after the body has been taken for funeral preparation; the prayers at the time of the beginning of visitation; the prayers of the vigil service; the prayers of the funeral liturgy itself; the prayers of final commendation and burial, all these prayers acknowledge the challenge yet share with us words of consolation, support and hope. It is important that we, then, honor the Church's liturgy and allow it to affect us, touch our minds, our hearts and spirits, console us and renew our hope.

I want to take this opportunity to remind you of several things about our parish services for those who have loved ones who are terminally ill, and about funeral preparations and funeral liturgies here at St. Angela.

Should a member of your family become terminally ill, please let us know at the parish office. Fr. Ray and I, and our parish deacons, want to be available to that person in presence and in prayer. There are prayers in our "Rite of Pastoral Care for the Sick" for those who are near death. When someone dies, it is certainly appropriate to call the priest, for there are prayers with the family for those who have died.

After a person has died, we ask that families contact us at the rectory before you go to the funeral home so that we can discuss with you possible times for a funeral liturgy, whether it will be in church or not. We ask that you hold possible times for a funeral negotiable until we can all agree, since both Fr. Ray and I have not only parish obligations but responsibilities outside the parish as well.

We are happy to provide for family visitation in church the day of the funeral. Our Family Life Apostolate provides refreshments in the "family room," and we can allow up to two hours of visitation before a funeral liturgy. Our parish provides the services of an organist and cantor for the funeral liturgy whether the funeral is in church or in a funeral home chapel. Musical prayer is an essential part of our Catholic liturgy. It is also a great consolation at a funeral, an expression and a deepening of our faith as well. A priest or deacon always accompanies the family to the cemetery for the rite of committal.

Your priests, deacons or some of our lay parishioners assist the family with the selection of options that are available for the funeral liturgy and the selection of ministers for the liturgy as well.

Let me add one very important instruction. The Church now does allow for cremation and for the cremated remains to be present at the visitation and funeral liturgy. However, the cremated remains of a loved one are respected just as the body of the deceased. This means that cremated remains MUST be interred at the end of the funeral. The Catholic ritual does not allow for cremated remains, in whole or in part, to be taken home. There is also an Archdiocesan policy that states that priests and deacons are not permitted to celebrate a funeral liturgy if the cremated remains are not immediately interred. Letting go is difficult, but letting go is an act of trust and faith. Though we must say farewell to a loved one, whether their remains are in a casket or an urn, we entrust them to the care of God and we have faith that we will see that person again in the next life. Let go; have faith; trust: this is a challenge, but our parish's and our Church's prayer, our parish's and our Church's ministers are there to offer support and care.

As November continues, please continue to pray for all those who have died, especially members of our parish family, that they may enjoy eternal rest in everlasting life.



Dear Parishioners,

Thank you for your generosity in bringing food items last weekend. The members of our parish St. Vincent de Paul Society prepared and distributed over seventy baskets of food to needy families in our community. This rich outpouring of Christ-like concern on your part has helped brighten the days and the spirits for those less fortunate than we. On their behalf, I thank you!

For the past seven years, Beth Kliebert has faithfully coordinated and authored our parish prayer line. However, Beth now feels that it is time for her to move on to other areas of service. That means that, if the prayer line is to continue, we need a volunteer to come forward to take over this responsibility and ministry. It does take several hours each week to receive information from others who wish to have people and intentions included in our community's prayer, to collate it, type it up and send it out through the e-mail prayer line. Some basic computer skills, of course, are required, but we can provide someone to show you how it's done. If you think you might be interested, please contact me at the rectory or speak with one of these members of our parish Family Life Apostolate Board – Kay Dornier, Kim Schaff, Robin Coussou or Janice Wolff – since the Prayer Line is one of our Family Life ministries.

The prayer line, currently with over 180 members, links our parish together in a very special way as we pledge to offer intercessory prayer for one another. I know that those who participate in this and are on the "receiving end" of the prayers feel special support and care in their times of need. Those on the "giving end" are generous in including in their prayer the needs of other members of our parish family.

In the aftermath of Katrina and its diaspora, the prayer line helped us to find each other, scattered as we were, and share support in that critical time of need for all of us.

I have been the beneficiary of the prayer of others and I believe that this prayerful concern and support has been a significant gift in my own life and my priestly ministry. I believe in the power of prayer. I believe in the strength that comes from this mutual support. I will truly be praying that someone will come forward for this important ministry.

I take this opportunity to thank Beth for the generous heart and time she devoted to this ministry from its inception. Without her unique care, I do not think the prayer line would have the significant life it now has in our parish. I know that, whatever new ministry Beth finds, she will give that same generosity and commitment. Thank you, Beth!

We recently received from Archbishop Alfred his written report on his pastoral visit to our parish. The report contains specific commendations for our parish and also specific recommendations to our pastoral staff, Pastoral Council, Finance Council and School Board. The members of the parish staff have already read the report and, at the Pastoral Council meeting last week, we read the report together and reviewed each of the recommendations that the Archbishop made to us in regard to our parish goals as we set them forth in "Catholic Life 2007."

The Pastoral Council had modified several goals, in accord with the Archbishop's recommendations, and has prioritized several others, as he suggested as well. The entire written report from the Archbishop and our report on how we have adjusted the goals, strategies or priorities, can be found on our parish web site, www.stangela.org. I encourage all parishioners to take a few minutes to read the good things the Archbishop had to say about our parish.



Dear Parishioners,

I want to express once again words of thanks to all who generously donated food for our Thanksgiving baskets. As I mentioned last week, over seventy baskets of food were prepared and delivered to the needy in our area and to needy in Blessed Seelos Parish, with whom we share our food pantry. I also want to thank the members of our St. Vincent de Paul Society for their work for the needy, not only at Thanksgiving time but throughout the year. Thanks, too, to those who assisted them in the preparation and distribution of the baskets. Finally, thank you for your generous financial support of the ministry of our St. Vincent de Paul Society through your contributions in the collection on Thanksgiving Day. The collection totaled \$4,347.60, and these funds are distributed by St. Vincent de Paul workers to those who come to us in emergency need throughout the year.

As you come to church this weekend, you will see again and hear again the sights and sounds of Advent, our time of preparation for Christmas and its season that follows. "People who have walked in darkness have seen a great light," is the reading of the Christmas liturgy. During these four weeks of Advent, we wear and decorate with the purple of nightfall, and we are called to reflect on the darkness of our lives which we need Christ to brighten.

Our spoken and sung prayers repeat the refrain, "Come, Lord Jesus," as we express our longing for the Lord who came in time and come to our hearts anew as we "wait in joyful hope" for the final coming of the Lord of glory.

The Advent wreath is lit each week and burns each day at Mass. The circle of the wreath indicates the eternity for which we long, the eternal reign of the Prince of Peace. The greenery of the wreath reminds us of the new life that the birth of Jesus brought to earth, the very life of the Divine. The candles remind us of the many generations of people who awaited the coming of the Messiah. The light of the candles reflects the warmth of the divine heart and the light of Christ that is coming to fill the earth anew at Christmas.

Listen for the sounds Advent. Look for the colors. Reflect on them and, through this reflection, identify the real gifts you should seek for Christmas: gifts of warmth and light, gifts of a new heart and a new spirit, gifts of wonder at the presence of God on earth and the hope and peace that the acceptance of God in our lives can bring.

This will be a hectic few weeks as we shop, decorate, write and mail Christmas cards and greetings, visit with family and friends. Don't let it get so hectic that you miss this opportunity to be still, to listen, and to reflect. Even if you cannot attend Mass each day, read the readings, whose references are here in the bulletin. Use the booklet we are distributing at Mass this weekend to enrich your reflection. Pray that the Lord will come to you and, through you, to all the earth.

This first weekend of Advent we also invite you to participate in our parish Christmas Adopt-a-Child project. As we did last year, this weekend there will be some Christmas trees in the corners of the sanctuary filled with angel tags rather than ornaments. The tag will have the name of a young boy or girl and a gift request. We ask you, before or after Mass, to take a name from the tree and then purchase the requested gift. The gift-wrapped items will be returned to church the second weekend of Advent—December 8 and 9— and the gifts will be picked up by Catholic Charities to be distributed to the children before Christmas. The time we are given for shopping this year is only one week, but your usual generous response will add to the joy of this Advent in preparation for Christmas.

December 8 is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, a holy day for Catholics and the national holy day for the United States. That means that, even though the feast falls this year on a Saturday, our obligation to participate in Mass in observance of this feast is not dispensed. Please note our schedule of Masses for the Immaculate Conception on December 8: anticipated Mass on Friday, December 7 at 4:00 p.m. Masses on the feast itself, Saturday, December 8, will be at 8:30 a.m. and 11:00 a.m.

As you may know, there has been much talk surrounding the release of the film, *The Golden Compass*. The new movie is based on the first book of writer Phillip Pullman's "His Dark Materials" trilogy. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops Office of Film and Broadcasting stated that the movie itself, independent from the books and the writer's personal beliefs is not as objectionable as the books themselves. The USCCB gave the film an A-II rating meaning suitable for adults and adolescents. However, this is the first movie, and the director has vowed that if it is successful, he will make the sequels which he has indicated will not be so watered down in degrees of violence and anti-Church messages. The danger in this film is that it may lead children and even adults to read the books which are decidedly anti-Catholic, a fact that the writer himself is quite proud of.

Archbishop Hughes cautioned people about these books in the November 24 edition of *The Clarion Herald* and in his homily the same week, which may be found online at www.archdiocese-no.org. The Archdiocese Office of Communication strongly recommends that parents be made aware of the anti-Christian messages targeted at children in these books, and therefore cautions parents about letting their children view this film. Dear Parishioners,

"Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice! The Lord is near." This is the entrance antiphon for this Third Sunday of Advent. We rejoice, for the preparations we have been making are soon to be fulfilled. The feast of the Lord's Incarnation is near. Christmas is approaching, and approaching rapidly, and that fills us with joy.

Notice that the antiphon does not say: "Stress out all the more, for Christmas is near." Instead, we are beckoned to rejoice. If you have been using the Advent reflection booklet we made available on the first Sunday of Advent, you have probably profited by the brief reflection it offered. Focusing on the deeper meaning of Christmas can keep us rooted in the Lord and bring calm and peace even in the midst of this season's hectic activity. If you have been praying the Advent wreath each day, you have probably benefited by the reflection that calls us to, contemplating the generations that awaited the Messiah, sensing the joy who saw that waiting fulfilled in Jesus, knowing the peace of all who have lived since, uniting themselves with God's eternal Gift, the divine Son. Rejoice! The Lord of salvation, of fulfillment is near to you, as near as your own heart!

To help us get into the spirit of Christmas, I invite you to join in our annual parish Christmas caroling tonight (Sunday, December 16) in the Center. Hosted by the school's Co-Op, with food prepared by SAMA's Kitchen Krewe, I have found this to be a peaceful, warm and engaging time as our parish music ministers lead us in song, as they sing some special festive selections and as some of the youth of our school depict the Living Nativity. Plan to join your fellow parishioners at 6:00 p.m. tonight for the caroling.

Please remember that we will have an additional opportunity to share in the sacrament of Penance as part of your Advent reflection and preparation. We will hear Confessions on Wednesday night of this week, from 7:00-8:00 p.m. Fr. Schott, Fr. Ray and I will all be available in church for this sacrament of the Lord's coming to us with mercy and compassion.

Our school choir will be singing at City Park's Celebration in the Oaks on Monday night at 6:15 p.m. All are encouraged to be there to support our young people in this good civic endeavor.

THANK YOU to all who participated in our parish Christmas project, bringing gifts for the needy in our community. We had so many gifts brought that we had to move some off the altar and into a storage room between Masses last Sunday, just so that we'd be able to move in the sanctuary for Mass! This is a great outpouring of concern and support, and, on behalf of the many, many people whose Christmas will be a bit brighter thanks to you, I extend my thanks and gratitude.


