



Dear Parishioners,

On Wednesday, December 26, eleven men from around the archdiocese were received into candidacy for ordination as permanent deacons. I am happy to tell you that our parishioner, David Aaron, was one of those men. David has been in the formation class for deacons for over a year and, with this admission to candidacy, is moving forward in this formation program. It is expected that David, with these other candidates, will be ordained to the diaconate in 2010. Please join me in congratulating David and join me in praying for his perseverance in pursuit of the diaconate through the next two years of formation. Thank you, David, for this willingness to serve the Lord in this important ministry. We also thank David's wife, Susan, and their son, Leo, for their support of David as he prepares for this service to our Church.

Bill Williams has been serving as our sacristan for almost five years, and has done an outstanding service to us by opening the church in the mornings several days each week (others have volunteered for the remaining days), overseeing sacristy and Mass supplies and setting up for our Masses. Bill has stepped down from that position and I take this opportunity to thank him for these years of very generous and committed service. There are many details for the sacristan to attend to, and Bill has done this with conscientiousness and care.

David Hitchcock has now taken over this role, and I welcome David and thank him for accepting this position. I am confident that he like Bill, will do a fine job serving all of us.

I might mention here that we do have volunteers who unlock the church each morning and that I have asked all of them to have the church unlocked about forty minutes before the first Mass of the day. That affords them time to set up for Mass and allows for those who wish to come early for quiet prayer to do so. Please do not expect the church to be opened any earlier than that. If you wish to come for quiet reflection earlier than that, I would suggest that you might want to take advantage of the beauty and quiet of the Meditation Garden of the Saints that is located between the church and the Annex. The garden is amazingly maintained by Billy Robinson and the artwork is a fine aid to prayer and contemplation.

In cooperation with Economy Travel and Tours, I will be leading a pilgrimage to Egypt, Sinai, the Holy Land and Istanbul from November 10-21 of this year. This twelve-day pilgrimage will include time in Bethlehem, Jerusalem, the Dead Sea and Mount Sinai as well as the stops in Cairo and the Church of St. Sophia in Istanbul. The package includes all hotels, transportation (from New York), sightseeing and three meals each day.

We will be joined on this pilgrimage by Msgr. Jace Eskind, Judicial Vicar of the Diocese of Lake Charles and pastor of St. John Bosco Church in Westlake. Fr. Jace and I have been friends for about 25 years and I am glad he will be leading this tour with me. We will also be joined by Fr. Frank Montalbano. O.M.I. I had always said that, if I ever had the opportunity to visit the Holy Land, I would only want to go if Fr. Frank would be there also. Fr. Frank (whose brother, Herb is our parishioner) has taught Scripture for fifty years and has paid numerous visits to the Holy Land. He probably knows more than any of the tour guides that will be with us! I believe that this will be a prayerful and insightful experience in the lands of the Bible. In addition to being an inspiring aid to prayer this will be a true aid to our appreciation and understanding of the Scriptures we hear every time we celebrate the sacraments.

Dear Parishioners,

There is no doubt about the meaning of Lent, as we hear from the readings of the first days of the Lenten Season: "Even now says the Lord, return to me with your whole heart." "Be reconciled to God." "When you fast, do not look glum." "Fast so that your voice will be heard on high." "This is the fasting I desire: setting free the oppressed, breaking every yoke; sharing your bread with the hungry, sheltering the oppressed and homeless, clothing the naked and not turning your back on your own." "If you bestow your bread on the hungry, then the light shall rise for you in the darkness and the Lord will guide you always."

Prayer, fasting, deeds of mercy: these are the traditional actions of Lent and their purpose is twofold: to lift and remove the burdens of others and, in doing these actions, to come closer to being one with God in mind, heart and spirit.

During Advent and Lent of last year, and during this past Advent, we have had very successful parish seasonal projects. During the past two Advent seasons, we have had our "angel trees,; from which you selected names of people for whom you purchased Christmas gifts. Last Lent, we prayed and fasted to provide spiritual and financial support to three outstanding causes: ACCESS, Habitat for Humanity and Catholic Relief Services. Our pastoral staff has discussed what we might take on as this year's parish Lenten project.

There will be a similarity to last year: we will ask you to fast from something on which you customarily spend money (food, drink, entertainment, for instance) and to save that money for a particular cause. And, while you are fasting, we ask you also to pray for that cause, for the people it serves and for those who have leadership roles in that effort. However, this year we will all take on one particular cause at a time.

We have reviewed the Archdiocesan and our parish calendar and have come to realize that there are already four special causes that will be brought to our attention this Lent: Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese, the Churches in Eastern Europe, U.S. Bishops' Catholic Relief Services, and our parish St. Vincent de Paul Society. The first three, all annual Archdiocesan-wide appeals, will be aided by second collections during Lent. Our parish's St. Vincent de Paul collection is taken up at the liturgy on Holy Thursday night. The first of these collection, in support of Archdiocesan Catholic Charities, will be on the weekend on Saturday and Sunday, February 9 and 10. Please decide what it is you and your family, together or individually, will fast from, save that money and, on the weekend of Feb. 9-10, place that money in the second collection.

Beginning on Ash Wednesday, offer this prayer each day:

Gracious and loving God.

from your own heart you have shared with us in love the most bountiful gifts.

From our hearts we seek to aid those in our local community now in need.

From our charity, the product of our prayer and fasting,

help to improve the lives of the needy

through the work of Associated Catholic Charities.

Help those who serve in the ministry to persevere in their work

and guide us to a deeper and greater respect for each human person,

your own son and daughter,

united with in the love of Christ our Lord. Amen.

As we enter into the Lenten Season on Ash Wednesday and accept ashes as a sign of our desire to be reconciled with God, let the acceptance of ashes be our sign of our willingness to participate actively and fully in this parish Lenten project.

Please also remember that ashes are distributed during Mass only on Ash Wednesday, immediately following the homily.

Dear Parishioners.

This weekend is the annual Archdiocesan collection in support of the work of Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese. Please remember that our parish Lenten project this year is to pray and fast for the causes that have already been scheduled for special collections. That means that, when the collection is taken up in church, we encourage you to give what you would normally donate to this cause each year AND to add to that the money you have saved thus far this Lent as a result of your fasting.

All of the proceeds of this collection remain, of course, right here in our own diocese. In the two and a half years since Hurricane Katrina, Catholic Charities has served more than 850,000 people through their network of programs and services. With the addition of grants and assistance from the U.S. Catholic Bishops and Catholic Charities, U.S.A., our local Catholic Charities has given out more than ten million dollars to help struggling families pay their rent, buy groceries and other items like school uniforms. Operation Helping Hands, a post-Katrina program of Catholic Charities, has gutted 1,874 homes of the elderly, disabled and disadvantaged using 14,000 volunteers. Forty-eight homes have been rebuilt and Catholic Charities is in process of developing thousands of new homes in our area. Through Second Harvest Food Bank, Catholic Charities has distributed more than 107,000,000 pounds of food to hungry children the elderly and families.

This cause is truly in need of and deserving our generous Lenten sacrificial support!

The next cause we ask you to support through your prayer and fasting is the international collection for support of the Churches in Eastern Europe. After living for decades under the oppression of Communism, these churches are now finding a resurgence in the practice of the Catholic faith. In order to provide for their needs, these communities need to refurbish their churches, build seminaries and convents, provide medical and care facilities and services. As we prepare for this collection next week (Feb. 16-17), let us unite daily in the prayer:

God of new life, in your mysterious providence your Church must share in the sufferings of Christ your Son. Give to those who are persecuted for the faith the spirit of patience and love, that they may always be true and faithful witnesses to your promise of eternal life.

As our sisters and brothers in Eastern Europe rise to new life from the oppression of Communism, fill them with renewed joy and enthusiasm.

May their restored freedom allow them to grow in your service and to work to bring your love to all in their nations..

We pray this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Dear Parishioners. While I was serving as the Director of the Office of Worship, I was asked to prepare the liturgies for the statewide convocation of priests that was going to take place. One of the hymns we used at one of the liturgies had this refrain to the verses of the song: "Let us bring the gifts that differ and in splendid, varied ways, sing a new Church into being, one in faith and love and praise."

At the conclusion of the liturgy, when he offered some closing remarks, Archbishop Schulte commented on that hymn and asked rhetorically, "What was wrong with the old Church?" Of course, the image was not to be taken literally. Praying for a "new Church" was praying for renewal in the Church – in keeping with Christ's call to newness of life, seeking to cooperate with Christ who promises to make all things new. Nonetheless, because the text actually might be confusing to some, we actually stopped using it. Jesus established our Church and, though it is sinful and always in need of reform and renewal, we don't need a different Church from

There is a hymn whose text I don't care for. One of its verses goes like this: "We must walk that lonesome valley; we have to walk it by ourselves. Oh, nobody else can walk it for us, we have to walk it by ourselves." I don't agree with that one! A priest friend used to say: "The journey of faith is a personal one, but it is not a private one." In other words, because we are a Church, a community of believers, we do not walk the journey alone. While each of us has his or her own life, with its own joys and struggles, its own rewards and challenges, while each of us is different and is called by the Lord in different ways to different tasks, we are all in this, as St. Paul well reminds us, as one body, seeking the common good, the benefit of all. Yes, each of us has a journey, but if we try to walk it alone, we will more than likely fail. We support one another. We journey together through our deserts and into our promised lands. The ecclesiology Jesus preached, the ecclesiology the apostles and, preeminently St. Paul, proclaimed was that we are on a journey together. We never should try to or have to walk it alone.

As we journey together through this Lenten season, I urge you to see and to use our parish Lenten Mission as an aid to our personal journey, filled with communal support and encouragement.

We welcome today Fr. Paul Mast, our mission preacher for this year. Fr. Mast will introduce the Mission as he preaches all the Masses this weekend. The mission services will be on Sunday, Monday and Tuesday nights, beginning each night at 7:00 p.m.

You are not alone on this Lenten journey. We are in this together. Let your participation in the Mission be a sign of your serious intent for this Lenten season. Let it be a sign that you are open to the Lord and the support of one another. Let it be a sign that you are willing to support your fellow parishioners as we journey to Easter life together.

Please note that we ask the teachers not to assign homework during the Mission so that parents will not have to oversee their children's homework those nights. We provide child care during the Mission, so you will not have to find or pay baby-sitters.

There will NOT be a Penance Service any nights of the Mission this year, and so we will celebrate the Sacrament of Penance individually on Sunday and Monday nights. We hope that you will take advantage of this special sacramental opportunity. Let me remind you that we also hear Confessions on Saturday evenings from 5:30–6:00 p.m. and that there will be another additional opportunity for you to share in the sacrament of Penance on Wednesday, March 19, from 6:30-7:30 p.m.

Finally, please remember that the Mission concludes with a reception on Tuesday night.

Our next special collection will be on the weekend of March 1-2. It is the annual national collection in support of Catholic Relief Services. From now until the collection, we ask you to continue your Lenten fast and to donate that money, in addition to your regular offering, to this collection that weekend. Each day until that weekend, let us pray this prayer as a parish community:

Loving God, every time we say the prayer that Jesus taught us, we pray that you will give us our daily bread, that you will supply all we need to live and to grow. May this blessing not only be ours, but one day soon be your blessing on all people. May there come the day when no one will go to bed hungry, when no one will have to hunger for food, no one will have to hunger for respect, no one will have to hunger for justice, no one will have to hunger for mercy. Lord, may this prayer I offer be my pledge to share my blessings with those who have less than I do. May this prayer be my pledge to bring your mercy, justice, respect and care to all, for I know this is your will. Father, may your will be done! Amen.



Dear Parishioners.

I want to commend and thank those who participated in our Parish Mission this week. Fr. Paul Mast invited into a spirit of reflection each evening, teaching us how to quiet our hearts and our minds as we opened ourselves to listen to the reflections of each witness, to the gospel passages he shared and his preaching. That method of quieting ourselves so that we could be still and open to God's Spirit moving within us, God's word pouring into us, God's guidance and support filling us is a valuable method that all of us can continue to use in our private prayer. The witnesses challenged us to see in our lives the movement of God they saw in their lives and Fr. Paul challenged us as well to allow the Lord to "download" the divine program of salvation into us.

I want, on your behalf, to thank those who assisted Fr. Paul and all of us with the Mission: Sister Paula and the members of the planning/evaluation team that met with her and Fr. Paul before and during the Mission, our liturgical ministers (music ministry, ministers of hospitality, altar servers) who ministered each night, our Family Life Organization, who prepared and served at the reception.

On Sunday night, after the Mission service concluded, I drove over to my house in Mississippi to take part of my day off. It was, of course, a bit late when I arrived there, but when I pulled into the driveway, I could not help but notice that the intense weather earlier in the week had left a lot of tree branches in my driveway and had deposited a rather large barn on my front porch. Since it was late, I figured I could deal with all of that in the morning. On Monday morning, I went outside and saw, in the back yard, many more branches and pieces of branches. I also noticed that the grass was beginning to grow again and realized that, after a few months' reprieve, I would soon be cutting grass again. Spring is arriving and new life is here: the grass is growing and the trees are just beginning to sprout anew.

"Lent" come from an old English word that means "springtime." What a magnificent reminder: Lent is primarily a season for us to come back to life, to Christ's life. In seeing and acknowledging our sins, we are called to focus on the repentance that leads to renewal, to make certain that, during these forty days, we turn away from sin and, by being more faithful to gospel, to live Christ's life. During these forty days of penance, we seek to strip ourselves of what we do not need or what keeps us from leading the life that God has in mind for us. Each week of Lent, we should be able to see ourselves sprouting into new life.

So, at this mid-point of the Lenten season, how are you doing this Lent? If you have been faithful to your Lenten promises, do you see that new life sprouting? Are you more aware of the good Christ can and wants to accomplish in you and through you?

If you have not been faithful to your Lenten resolution, do not give up: there is still plenty of time during this season to renew your commitment and work more diligently at renewal.

If you never got around to determining your Lenten direction, now is the time to begin: it's never too late!

Our next special collection will be on the weekend of March 1-2. It is the annual national collection in support of Catholic Relief Services. From now until the collection, we ask you to continue your Lenten fast and to donate that money, in addition to your regular offering to this collection, that weekend. Each day until that weekend, let us pray this prayer as a parish community:

Loving God, every time we say the prayer that Jesus taught us,

we pray that you will give us our daily bread, that you will supply all we need to live and to grow.

May this blessing not only be ours, but one day soon be your blessing on all people.

May there come the day when no one will go to bed hungry,

when no one will have to hunger for food, no one will have to hunger for respect,

no one will have to hunger for justice, no one will have to hunger for mercy.

And, Lord, may this prayer I offer be my pledge to share my blessings with those who have less than I do.

May this prayer be my pledge to bring your mercy, justice, respect and care to all, for I know this is your will.

Father, may your will be done! Amen.





Dear Parishioners,

I will put my spirit in you that you may live.

Each year, our school students offer the Living Stations for our prayer and reflection. Please join us this coming Friday, March 15. The Living Stations will be portrayed at 10:30 a.m. and again at 7:00 p.m. This is always a moving and prayerful experience and I encourage all parishioners to attend.

One of the goals set by our Pastoral Council was to have each parish organization do a self-study to evaluate how it can continue to serve its own membership, remain aware of and work toward fulfilling our parish Mission Statement and the other goals that have been set for our parish, and work with other organizations in seeking to achieve these goals. Two phases of this self-study have been completed. The members of each organization, at one of their recent meetings, completed a self-study evaluation and the results of that have been tabulated. That was step one. Sr. Paula and I (the committee set up by the Council to lead this process) have met with the leadership of each organization and have studied the results of the surveys.

Discussing these results, the leaders of each organization have developed an action plan for that organization, a plan on how to direct the organization in support of our Mission Statement and pursuit of our goals. That was step two.

These action plans will now be brought to the Pastoral Council at their meeting this week for the Council's review and comment. If approved by the Council, the action plans will then be sent back to each organization for further refinement and implementation.

I would like to thank the members of our parish organizations for their cooperation and participation in this important process and add a very special word of thanks to the leadership of the organizations for the time they have devoted to this process in developing each action plan.





Dear Parishioners.

We enter today the most solemn week of the Church Year, Holy Week. Today, with the crowd of Jerusalem, we acclaim Jesus our Messiah. But, unlike them, we already know what lies ahead: Jesus moves just as willingly to his suffering and death. He was sent by God to reveal God's love. He will do whatever it takes to prove that love. He manifests great confidence in God. God rewards that confidence in the glory of the Resurrection.

The liturgies of the Paschal Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday) are the most moving liturgies we celebrate all year. I not only invite you, I encourage and even urge you to make the time to participate in them. In the celebrations of those liturgies, you will experience the love Christ has for all of us, for you, as He enters his Passover. You will also see the fulfillment of your Lenten prayers and practices as these liturgies unfold and call us to participation in them.

The Liturgy of the Lord's Last Supper begins on Thursday night at 7:00 p.m. This liturgy includes the reception of the oils blessed at the Cathedral for use in our parish sacramental celebrations throughout the coming year, and the washing of the feet, a "homily in action," as we follow the command of Christ to be ready and willing to serve even the humble needs of one another. Following the Mass, we continue with quiet prayer before the Blessed Sacrament until 9:30 p.m. At the time of His Passion, Jesus asked His sleepy apostles, "Can you not watch and wait with me for just an hour?" That is the invitation of Thursday night: to watch and pray with the Lord as we anticipate the remembrance of his saving passion and death. There will be a collection on Thursday night for the support of our parish St. Vincent de Paul Society and their ministry to the needy.

On Good Friday at 3:00 p.m., we celebrate the Solemn Liturgy of the Lord's Passion and Death. We read the Passion account from St. John's gospel, which shows Jesus "in charge," of this moment, freely and fully accepting his death for us. The veneration of the cross is part of this liturgy, when we come forward to pledge that we, too, are willing to embrace the sacrificial spirit of Jesus, ready to give ourselves for him and for others.

On Holy Saturday, the Easter Vigil begins at 8:00 p.m. This is, of course, the only Mass on Holy Saturday. The new fire is lit and, from it, the Easter Candle, proclaiming the Risen Christ as the Victor over sin and death, the Light for the journey of faith we make together. Our shouts of joy and acclamation announce Christ risen from the grave, and proclaim our belief that his victory will be ours.

Our Easter Sunday Masses will be at 8:00, 9:30 a.m. 11:00 a.m. Throughout Lent, Jesus called us to repent of our sins and to follow him to new life. On Easter Sunday, our joy is unbridled as we come to the end of that 40 day journey and celebrate the victory that cannot be taken away.






