

I also want to commend those who took the time to participate in the liturgies of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil. In my homily on Palm Sunday, I suggested that we could all respond to the generous sacrifice of Christ by our sacrifice of time as we joined in the liturgies of these most special days. I hope that, next year and in the years ahead, more of our parishioners will join in this prayerful and faithful response. These liturgies, our memorial of Christ dying and rising for us merit our time and active participation.

Please remember that our annual parish Spring Soiree is Saturday, April 12! Supporting the Soiree is an easy and enjoyable way to fund special parish projects. Good food, good entertainment, great fellowship and the opportunity to go home with very nice gifts all add up to a very profitable evening for you and for your parish! Several weeks ago, I invited you to consider joining the pilgrimage Msgr. Jace Eskind and I will be leading to the Holy Land in November of this year. We have only six places available, so if you are interested, please sign up with Economy Tours soon. Brochures about the pilgrimage are available at the rectory – drop by during office hours to pick one up or telephone and we will mail it to you.

I will be away from the parish this weekend (April 4, 5, 6), as I attend the annual meeting of the Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem for which I serve as ecclesiastical master of ceremonies. This group is diligent and generous in providing funds for Christians in the Holy Land and the Church's ministry of education in the Holy Land.

On Sunday, April 20, young people of our parish in the second grade of our school and our CCD program will celebrate their First Holy Communion at the 12:30 p.m. Mass. Please offer special prayers for these children of our community as they near this wonderful sacrament of the Lord's Body and Blood.

In the course of my almost five years as your pastor, I have heard lots of parishioners talk about our parish facilities and what they see as our present and future needs. I have long felt that we are in need of more office and meeting space for both church and school activities. Parking needs (especially for funerals and 8:30 a.m. weekday Mass), handicapped accessibility to the church, a school art/music room, meeting space to accommodate groups too large for the Conference Room and too small for the Center, a cafeteria, a new church(!), a more defined entrance to the church: these and other ideas/suggestions/concerns have been spoken about with regularity.

When Archbishop Hughes was here for his pastoral visit in September, he recommended to us that we not allow this issue of facilities maintenance, improvement, expansion to fall on the back burner. Therefore, the parish Finance Council has decided at least to begin an active dialogue and serious study in regard to our facilities. We will have two facilities needs assessment sessions, to which all parishioners are invited: one will be on Thursday, April 24 at 7:00 p.m. in the Center; the other on Saturday, April 26 at 10:00 a.m. in the Conference Room. The purpose of these meetings is to try to reach a concensus from parishioners on what our facilities needs actually are, both immediately and in the future. That begins the process – probably a LONG process!

From these meetings, we will work with an architect to develop a new master plan for our complex. After a plan is developed, we will determine what any facilities development would cost and then begin to determine how to retire our current parish debt and to raise funds for facilities development (e.g., capital campaign or increased giving campaign???). All of this, of course, has to be done in conversation with the Archdiocese and needs archdiocesan approval.

Step one is to set a vision and agree on a plan. If you would like to be part of this process at this early point, please plan to be at one of the needs assessment meetings.





Dear Parishioners,

As I approach my fiftieth jubilee as a vowed religious, I thought it might be a good time to share with you what being a religious, a Sister of Mount Carmel, has meant to me.

Entering the convent at 17, right after high school, was exciting. I had boarded with the Sisters in Abbeville prior to this, but I quickly realized that living on the grounds gave me only a glimpse of their life. I had three years of training before I made vows. During that time I took college courses and taught one year at St. James Major in Gentilly. Much of my time was spent learning to meditate, striving for contemplation, trying to understand the importance of silence and solitude. I also did an enormous amount of spiritual reading and learning about the Carmelite saints.

When I entered, living the vows at that time meant giving up things: money, men, babies and my will. As the years passed I realized it means living simply, giving my life to all, and living religious life to the best of my ability. So the years have been good.

The Congregation saw to it that I received my college degrees and took care of my needs: physically, educationally, and spiritually. I am encouraged by the Congregation to continue to learn, study, and travel to broaden my experiences hopefully becoming a better religious. I have been challenged to search out ministries that I probably would not have even thought to do. Each has been a learning experience and a time of growth both mentally and spiritually for me.

From the day I started my ministry here at St. Angela Merici, I have felt welcomed, accepted and loved by you. Since many of you knew me from St. Louis King of France in the 1960's, this gave me the comfort of knowing some of the parishioners before I arrived here. This ministry has been one of growth in love, prayer, learning and sharing. Each of you is a gift to me in your own way. I thank Fr. Ken for giving me the opportunity to minister here and for allowing me to share my story with you.



Dear Parishioners,

THANKS to all who helped plan, who worked at and who participated in the Spring Soiree! It was a great evening: good community spirit and lots of friendship shared, good food, plentiful libations, a great band, lively dancing and wonderful auction items. Because I am writing this the morning after the Soiree, we do not have a final financial report to share with you this week – it will be in next week's bulletin. The only disappointment is that we did not sell all the tickets to the Soiree, which perplexes me more than a little. Such a good event with a deserving cause (the continuing improvement of our parish facilities): I do not understand why each year this is not a sold out event.

For all those who did support the Soiree and all those who attended, I thank you. On behalf of all our parish family served by their dedication, special thanks to the Soiree Committee members for their generous and selfless work in support of our parish!

As you may recall, those who serve on our Pastoral Council serve staggered four-year terms, so that about half the members' terms expire every other year. This provides both "new blood" on the Council (new members with new ideas, new energy, different insights) and, by retaining half the members, continuity in our deliberations as well. This year, June Prados, Robert Coussou, Glenn Scorsone, Clay Plaisance and Buddy Mazzeno complete their terms of office. Dianne Kratochvil is completing one term as an appointed Council member. I have already decided to appoint her for a second term, and thank her for agreeing to continue on the Council.

If you would like to nominate someone to serve on the Pastoral Council, or if you would like to offer your services, please complete the form at the bottom of this page and return it to the rectory this week by mail or by dropping it off. Please note that, if you nominate someone, you must check with them first to make certain that they are willing to serve.

Both the Pastoral Staff and the current Council, at their meetings last week, surfaced names of people they think would be good candidates for this parish service. We are now in the process of finding out from them if they are willing to be nominated for a four-year term on the Council. At the end of this week, when you have had the opportunity to nominate as well, we will present the list of names to the organizations who have to elect new Council members (SALA, Senior Citizens, the Building and Grounds Committee), asking them to select someone from this list of candidates.

Other candidates will be presented to the parish for an election: we have to elect one at-large Council member this year. I will then appoint one additional parishioner to serve on the Council.

The Pastoral Council, with the School Board and Finance Council, form the major consultative bodies to me as your pastor. I meet with them and they provide a "pulse of the parish," guiding the life and ministries of our parish. I valuee the work of these councils and the input they provide, the counsel they give. The Pastoral Council helps to determine and guide the spiritual life of our parish. Together, we seek to discern what is the will of the Lord for us here at St. Angela as we seek to build up the reign of Christ in this community of faith. Pastoral Council members need, then, to have a well-formed adult spirituality, to be one who is able (with others) to discern ways to build up the reign of Christ, to be good listeners (as they hear the needs of parishioners), to be willing to work with others on the council to come to a consensus as we make decisions, to make the time to be present to others at parish gatherings and activities. Nominees must be practicing Catholics, registered and active in our parish and over 18 years of age. Nominees must also be willing to participate in a special formation session later in the Summer, date to be arranged







Dear Parishioners.

Several weeks ago, I mailed to each household in our parish a letter explaining that it is time for our Finance Council to begin finalizing the parish budget for the fiscal year that will begin on July 1 of this year. With that letter was a card recording your current level of church support and asking you to let us know what your intended giving will be beginning on July 1. Thus far, 337 families have returned that card to us. With slightly over 2,100 registered households, that is not the return we expected or needed. This weekend, we will have Stewardship Intention cards available at all of the doors of church and, if you did not complete the card that was sent, the Finance Council and I ask that you take a few minutes before or after Mass to stop at one of the tables, complete your form and drop it in the box that will also be there. If we do not know what you intend to give in support of your parish, its activities, organizations and ministries, we cannot budget properly.

If you can increase your offering, that is wonderful. Please do! If you cannot increase your current level of giving, we understand that, but we do need to know (not guess) what your financial support will be. Please remember my basic approach to giving (whether it is giving of time, talent or treasure): if each of us does what we can, we will accomplish a great deal as we seek to build up the reign of Christ in our community.

Thank you for your cooperation with this request. Thank you to all who do what you can, large or small, in support of your parish and all we do together to share and spread the mind and heart of Christ.

I thank those who took the time to participate in one of the facilities needs assessment meetings that we had last week. I expect to receive a report on the meetings from our architect this week and I will be sharing that report with you in the weeks ahead. At the next meetings of the Pastoral and Finance Councils, we will discuss what will be, based on that report, the next step in the process.

Each year, we are given the opportunity to select two parishioners to receive from the Archbishop the Medallion of the Order of St. Louis. This recognition is given to people from each parish of the archdiocese for outstanding and long-standing service to the Church through their parish service. While it is always a challenge to select only two people for this honor, since there are so many faithful and, generous active parishioners, I think our parish staff has done a good job selecting this year's St. Louis Medallion recipients: Alma "Puddin" McNamara and Anna Schmidt.

Puddin' McNamara and her husband, A.J., moved into the parish before the church was built. Their son, Price, was the first baby baptized in SAM, in the building that was the rectory at the time. All four of the McNamara children attended St. Angela Merici School. Puddin' was a charter member of the parish Prayer Group (a member for 35 years). Over the years, she has assisted with preparation of the parish bulletin; she taught second and eighth grade in the CCD program; she has served in the liturgical ministries of reader and extraordinary minister of Holy Communion (in fact, she has been an extraordinary minister since the inception of that ministry here at SAM). As a member of SALA for many years, since the time her children were in school, she has not only been a member but has served in leadership as club historian, Installation Luncheon Committee and vice-president. She has provided one-on-one care ministry to families, has been a member of Magnificat for 20 years and has been on the Metairie Chapter of their Service Team and is active in Life in the Spirit sessions. She has been active in the Catholic Charismatic Renewal and on the staff of the yearly conference for many years.

Anna Schmidt and her husband, Deacon Gil, have lived in SAM since 1973. They have been married for 54 years and had nine children, but lost one in childbirth. Anna taught third grade of CCD for several years. Some of their older children attended St. Louis King of France School but, after they moved into our parish, Anna became immediately active in the PTA. Like Puddin', Anna had been an extraordinary minister of Holy Communion since the introduction of that ministry here. Over the years, she was active in hospital visitation and has been and still is an active member and leader in SALA, having served that organization as Membership Chairperson, on the committee that plans trips for the group, as treasurer and has been active in the SALA ministry related to parish Baptisms, that is, making the robes for the sacrament and, after the baptism, sending congratulatory cards to the families. While Deacon Gil was in his three and a half years of preparation for diaconal ministry, Anna was of great support to him and took care of the family all those nights (twice a week for those years) while he attended classes in order that he might serve all of us as deacon.

We thank Puddin' and Anna for their generous, sacrificial, joyful service as members of our parish family and congratulate them on the well-deserved recognition that they will receive today at St. Louis Cathedral.

I take this opportunity to thank ALL those who give generously of themselves to our parish. I hope that the example all of them offer will inspire more people to step forward in parish service.

Dear Parishioners,

We have received the report and summary from our recent facilities needs assessment gatherings and you can see that entire report on the parish web site, www.stangela.org. I invite you to take a few minutes to look over that summary. I think both of the session went very well. Though different people attended each session, they were quite similar in the items of concern people shared and the agreement on our parish needs in regard to facilities. Originally, I had hoped that our facilitator would process us to develop a prioritized list of needs, but we did not have enough time to accomplish that. Therefore, I will bring the report to our Pastoral Council, Finance Council and School Board for their continued reflection and refinement to reach a consensus on the degree of importance for these recommendations. After a prioritized list of needs is agreed upon, we can then determine the next step in the process, a master plan and time-line for implementation. That time-line, of course, requires the pay-down of our current parish debt and plan for determining how to raise whatever funds would be needed as we improve or grow our facilities.

If I don't mention all of this again for a while, don't get alarmed. Our Councils do not meet during the Summer months, and so it will tal us a while to continue to refine our plan.

Let me mention one thing in regard to facilities: the issue of parking came up at both meetings. I know that parking is a real problem, both on weekends and for the 8:30 a.m. Mass during the week. As we think about long-term solutions, let me remind you of a few things that are of immediate concern: Off-street parking for 8:30 a.m. Mass during the school year is behind the Msgr. Kern Center. During Lent, when the Mass

attendance increased, we did permit parking in the handicapped spaces behind the church. We should not do that at other times, because this interferes with morning school drop-off, morning assembly, early physical education classes and recess. 

Dear Parishioners,

WELCOME, SAFARI! Our Summer Bible Camp brings lots of energy and enthusiasm, shown by the young people who participate, to the teens and adults who serve as counselors and assistants and leaders. We hope that this annual journey into the Scriptures for our youth will be rewarding and enriching!

On behalf of our parish Finance Council, I would like to that those of you who responded to our fiscal year contribution cards. Of the 2,100 registered in our parish, 800 of those are identified contributors, either contributing through the parish envelope system, through automatic bank drafts or by check. When we sent out the letter asking what your contribution would be for the coming fiscal year (July I through June30), 451 families responded.

The Finance Council has presumed that the families who did not reply will continue their current level of financial church support. With the information we did receive and with that presumption in place, we have begun to work on the parish budget for the coming fiscal year. When the budget is prepared by the *ad hoc* committee and reviewed by and approved by the full Finance Council, I will share that information with you. We will publish a full report of the current fiscal year as soon as possible after July 1.

Allow me, please, to say a word about the letter and the intent cards I asked you to complete and return. We will be doing this every year. The Finance Council and I need your input to know what we can rely on as parish income so that we can budget appropriately. I intend to keep us, with the oversight of the Council, on firm financial footing, controlling our spending and continuing as aggressively as funds permit, to continue to reduce our indebtedness to the Archdiocese. When you let us know what your support of your parish will be, we can budget wisely and well. I hope that, next year, even more parish households will respond to our contribution information request.

Today, June 1, we will have a "New Parishioner Welcome" at the rectory at 12 Noon. Our parish Family Life Apostolate invites all new parish families to join us for this social. New parishioners who have recently registered in our parish should have received an invitation through the mail. But, whether you received one or not, if you are a new family in our parish, please join us so that we can meet one another! The social lasts from Noon until 1:00 p.m., and we do invite leaders of parish organizations to be with us, so that our new parishioners can begin to put some names and faces together and begin to feel truly part of our St. Angela family. We do know that new families are moving into our neighborhood. We welcome you and hope that you will come to the social and begin to be active members of our wonderful parish!

Following our facilities needs assessment meetings, we posted on our parish web site the results of those two sessions. We began a discussion at our Pastoral Council meeting on May 13 to reflect together with Pastoral Council and Staff about the input we received from the parishioners who took part in these meetings and to determine what the next step in the process should be.

The Council recommended that we set up a smaller *ad hoc* committee, composed of members of the Pastoral Council, Finance Council, School Board and Pastoral Staff. Serving on this committee will be: Jackie Appleton, Sara Aucoin, Paul Armbruster, David Barbier, Mia Corrente, Larry deBlieux, Paul Galloway, Gretchen Lowe, Pam Pendzimaz, Colleen Remont, and Billy Steen. This committee will meet to review the input from parishioners, to prioritize the recommendations and to offer to the full Councils recommendations of a master plan to be finalized by our architect.

I would encourage you to take a few minutes to review the report on the needs assessment meetings and, if you have comments, to share them with members of the *ad hoc* committee before they meet on Tuesday, June 10.

Dear Parishioners,

Please remember that there is no 6:15 a.m. Mass this week, since both Father Schott and I leave for vacation this weekend. We return to our regular Mass schedule on Monday, June 23, when Fr. Franklin will be in to assist us for several weeks. Please welcome him back to St. Angela when he arrives next weekend.

You have seen the signs on the fences around the church campus announcing the volunteer work days this week. We need your help to paint classrooms and do some other work on our buildings as we prepare for the coming new school year. I certainly hope that members of SAMA and school dads will turn out for the projects to be coordinated by our School Board Building and Grounds Committee. Of course, ladies are welcome as well. Painting, dusting, cleaning are all part of the plans and lots of hands will help the work speed along!

There are no activities on campus until August 4, as we take the time to clean, paint and polish in preparation for new activities to begin in August. But planning for those activities is already well under way.

Our parish Ministries Fair will be held on the weekend of August 23-24. After each Mass that weekend, we invite all parishioners to come to the Center to learn about and sign up to participate in parish ministries and organizations. To help you prepare for that weekend, we will highlight here in the bulletin each week a different ministry or organization. We have asked the leaders of these groups to share with you an explanation of that ministry/organization, what the commitment to it will be and any formation required for it. I have also asked leaders of these groups to state where specific needs might be.

Let me begin this process now by sharing with you information about some of our liturgical ministries.

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion minister the Body and Blood of Christ at our weekday and weekend Masses and also assist in bringing Holy Communion to the homebound of our parish. Before beginning in this ministry, interested persons meet for an interview with a member of the Pastoral Staff and then must participate in a basic formation workshop conducted by the Archdiocesan Office of Worship, with a follow-up session here in the parish with Fr. Ken, who coordinates this ministry. They are then delegated by the Archbishop for a term of service that will end in November, 2013. Those who come forward for this ministry must be 18 years of age, have received the sacraments of initiation and, if married, be validly married in the Church. Those who minister Holy Communion must be faithful to Sunday Mass, have a true devotion to the Blessed Sacrament, usually manifested by participation in Mass occasionally on weekdays, and time committed to prayer before the Blessed Sacrament. Our hope is to have sufficient extraordinary ministers to allow us to offer Communion under both kinds not only at weekday Masses, as we already do, but at Sunday Masses as well. We have particular need for ministers who are regularly available for 12:30 p.m. Mass on Sundays.

Readers at Mass proclaim the Word of God to us on weekdays and weekends. Candidates for this ministry must have received the sacraments of initiation and have excellent skills for public reading. Interested persons must complete an interview with a member of the Pastoral Staff and participate in a basic formation session conducted by the Archdiocesan Office of Worship, with a follow-up session here in the parish with Deacon Nick, who is coordinator of this ministry. We are in particular need of Readers at the 4:00 p.m. Mass on Saturdays and the 8:00 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. Masses on Sundays.

We will be sharing a lot more information with you in the weeks ahead so that you can discern where you are being called to more active service in our parish!

I will be leaving for vacation following my Masses on June 15. See you in July!

Dear Parishioners.

We had an excellent meeting on Tuesday, June 10, at which members of the Pastoral Council, School Board, Finance Council and Pastoral Staff prioritized the items on the parish "wish list" developed at our facilities needs assessment meetings. The meeting lasted four hours, which is a genuine sign of the dedication of those who are working for you on this project – dedication to you and to our parish's continued growth and development. Thanks to the outstanding leadership of Clay Plaisance, who facilitated the meeting, care was taken that no elements of the report that you read on our parish web page was lost and that nothing new was added: all that was done was based solely on your input.

Based on the work we accomplished, our architect, Kieran Weldon, will develop two or three options for a master plan for our campus and will present these back to the *ad hoc* committee at the next meeting, scheduled for August 5.

The members of the committee agreed that the highest priority is to be given to the development of a new multi-purpose meeting space and full-service kitchen that can be used for both parish and school activities, the addition of some new classroom space for school growth and additional office space for both church and school administration. There is also a solid agreement that our facilities need a stronger "front door" or "face" that obviates for all the location of our church and then our school parish offices. The committee members also agreed that, after forty years of use, our current facilities need some overall upgrading. Not lost in the shuffle was the need for more parking and attentiveness to handicapped accessibility to all of our facilities.

I will, of course, keep you informed of the steps we take in this process. In the meantime, I thank all of you who contribute faithfully to the financial support of your parish. We remain on time with our share of support of the Archdiocese through our parish weekly assessment and, because of careful monitoring of expenses by our Finance Council and business manager, we remain a bit ahead of schedule on our debt payments, all of which contributes to our ability to think about and begin planning for the future!

I thank all of you who participated in the election for our new Pastoral Council member. The election was won by **Debbie Galloway**, who will serve a four-year term on the Council.

There are two appointed positions to be filled and I have appointed Lee Lowe for a new four-year position and Diane Kratochvil has been appointed for a second four-year term.

Susan Aaron has resigned from the Council and I have asked Mary Toups to complete Susan's remaining two years. There is one remaining position to be appointed by the committee.

Other new Pastoral Council members, as elected by parish organizations, are: Trisha Wrubleski, Dan Judlin, Rosalyn Bryant, all of whom will begin four -vear terms this August.

I thank all of these parishioners for accepting these positions on the Pastoral Council and I look forward to working with them and other Council members in the years ahead.

I would like to continue to share some information with you about liturgical ministries as we prepare for our Parish Ministries Fair in August.

Ministers of Hospitality serve as the hosts and hostesses of the assembly as we gather for Mass. They are present to greet worshippers as they enter for Mass and are ready to assist them with hymnals, to seat them and attend to any specific needs. If anyone needs special assistance during Mass, these ministers are ready to help. If someone is not able to join in the procession to Holy Communion, ministers of hospitality make certain a Eucharistic minister is led to them so that they may share in the Body and Blood of Christ. Ministers of Hospitality also take up the collections at Mass, arrange for and assist in bringing gifts to the altar during the Presentation rite. These ministers also assist congregants as they leave church and help clean up the church for the next liturgy.

Ministers of Hospitality (who can be men or women) need to be warm, outgoing and hospitable, as we would expect any host or hostess to be. These ministers are expected to be able to arrive at church about fifteen minutes before Mass so that they will be ready to greet other parishioners as they begin to arrive for Mass.

There are two meetings a year for Ministers of Hospitality, one before Easter and one before Christmas so that we can prepare together for those special days.

We are in particular need of ministers of hospitality for the 12:30 p.m. Mass on Sundays and encourage those who regularly attend this Mass to step forward for this ministry.

The following is a continuation of some of the ministries in our parish that try to meet the needs of the parishioners and also could use your time, talent, energy, creative insights. Before you come to the ministries fair, please pray about becoming active in any of the ministries listed with Sr. Paula as liaison. You know you have many gifts to offer to our parish. And I do need your help.

Faith Formation

Many programs are contained under the title of Faith Formation. This is because we try to meet the spiritual needs of all ages in the parish. We will begin with Children's Liturgy of the Word, which we call Child Church. The children ages 4-7 are dismissed after the opening prayer in Church and taken to different rooms in the annex building for the Sunday readings and homily. These readings are on a level the youngsters can understand. They say a Creed and have intercessory prayer. We need adult leaders for this program. Requirements are Safe Environment class and a session on how to lead Child Church and to observe a session one Sunday. Sr. Paula is the liaison for this ministry and can be reached at 837-9347. We also need teens to help with CD player, give attention to the youngsters if necessary and to open heavy doors. This is a good activity for our youth group to work.

CCD or Religious Education for those who do not attend Catholic schools falls under Faith Formation. Our religious education includes youngsters from grade 1 through grade 11. We need adult instructors who attend one planning and Safe Environment session. Our children attend CCD at St. Clement of Rome, but do need to be ministered to by our parishioners. This is a way to share your time, talent, faith and prayer in support of the religious growth of the students. We try to have 2 adults per class. That way less preparation is needed on the part of the instructor. Teens also serve as helpers in each class. This allows for the needs of all students to be handled. Instructors are encouraged to attend the classes sponsored by the Archdiocesan Office of Religious Education. Sr. Paula is the liaison for this ministry and can be reached at 837-9347.

Our SAFARI or Summer Bible Camp is a fun time the first 2 weeks of June. This is for children who have completed pre K 3 through 6th grade. We need adults to teach the lessons, usually a 20-30 minute time period. The rest of the day is for art and crafts, music, activities, snacks, after-care movie time and then after- care play time. Adults also accompany the 6th graders on field trips. The instructor is asked to attend one planning meeting, including a Safe environment session. The instructor remains with her class as the children move from session to session. As you can see we need instructors, helpers in art and crafts preparation, adult music supervision, helpers in serving snacks and in helping to lead or observe teens in the activities session. So we need lots of adult help. The teens serve to decorate the rooms, help move the youngsters from one activity to the next and take care of attending to the youngsters. The high schools they attend count this as part of their required service hours. For those of you who love paper work, computer work and organization, we need you too. Sr. Paula is liaison for this ministry and can be reached at 837-9347.

PREPARATION FOR CONFIRMATION is done during the sophomore and junior years of our parishioners. We ask to have Confirmation in January, so must have sessions for the 2 years. The candidates meet on 3 Sunday nights from 4-6 pm. We need adults to monitor small discussion groups, to assist in serving their pizza and drink. One session for training and Safe Environment is needed. A love for teens is an asset. We have about 65 candidates a year. For those of you who like paper and computer work, your service would be greatly appreciated. So you can see you really are needed. Sr. Paula is liaison for this ministry and can be reached at 837-9347.


