

Twice each year, we have the opportunity to support the mission activity of our Church, enabling the message and the active care of Christ to be brought far and wide throughout our world. One of those opportunities is afforded us this weekend as we celebrate World Mission Sunday. The monetary gifts you make in this weekend's second collection are used all over the world by those active in the ministries of teaching, preaching, sacramental celebrations; your funds help build and maintain and provide services through schools and hospitals. You enable missionaries to celebrate the love of Christ, to preach the love of Christ, to minister the love of Christ. I urge you to make not only a generous but a sacrificial offering to the Mission Sunday collection this weekend.

We had a very good meeting on Thursday, October 9 of our *ad hoc* Committee studying our parish facilities in light of current and anticipated future needs. The Committee members agreed on the conceptual master plan that has been developed by our architect, Kieran Weldon. The parish I lived in as a child in New Orleans (Our Lady of Good Counsel) is one of those parishes merging with another. One of the parishes in which I served as pastor (Little Flower) had never re-opened after Katrina and the church and rectory have already been sold to another religious denomination. I have many memories of the years I worshiped in those churches as parishioner and as pastor. I can imagine the pain of those who have to face the realities that have brought this situation into being, and I pray (as I hope you do!) for those facing these circumstances.

We are truly graced here at St. Angela to be a large, vibrant parish. We see younger families moving into our area, meaning that we have a future of continued growth and vibrancy. The *ad hoc* Committee, having heard your expression of needs feels very strongly that growing our facilities will make our future even more hopeful, more solid, more alive in building up the reign of Christ. The direction in which we are moving will be a bold step with great challenge. I look forward to the continuing development of our plans in preparation of sharing them with you.

I thank those who are working on this committee – they are putting in many long hours of reflection and discussion on your behalf and are doing it with care, sincerity, commitment and faith.

On Friday, October 24 at 7:30 p.m., our Family Life Organization a special gathering for married couples of our parish. At the "Wine and Cheese Social," couples will have time first of all to enjoy an evening out together and be able to visit with other couples of our parish. During the evening, Deacon Gil will share some thoughts on spirituality and married life and the social will continue. Because this event will be held in the parish Conference Room, space is limited and so reservations are required. Please telephone the rectory to make your reservation. (There is no charge for this evening.)

Men of the parish, please note: The 12th Annual Morning of Spirituality for Men, sponsored by the Archdiocese, will be on Saturday, November 1 from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. at St. Dominic Church. The theme for this year is "Called to be Saints," and the speaker will be Tim Murphy, Director of Manresa Retreat House. Mass will be celebrated by Archbishop Alfred Hughes and the homilist for Mass will be Fr. Anthony Rigoli, OMI.

Many men of our parish make a yearly retreat at Manresa and I am certain that, from them, we have all heard very positive comments. 

Dear Parishioners,

On Thursday of this week, October 30, I ask all those who serve in organizational and ministry leadership roles in our parish to meet with me in the Msgr. Kern Center at 7:00 p.m. I particularly ask that all members of our parish Pastoral Staff, members of the Pastoral and Finance Councils and School Board, officers and board members of parish organizations participate in this session. It is scheduled to last ninety minutes.

One of the goals for our parish set by our Pastoral Council is "To foster awareness of the relationship of each organization to the Parish Mission Statement and the 2007 Pastoral Plan and to other organizations within the parish." This kind of relationship must be based on open, honest and efficient communication among the leaders of our parish. I see this meeting as another vehicle in the process of developing that kind of communication. I would also like to use this as a time for our parish leaders to reflect with me on the "State of the Parish" report I shared with all of you in a homily several months ago.

I want us all to be aware of the importance of working together to grow the reign of Christ among us, of keeping our goals before us in pursuit of building up Christ's reign, and of supporting one another in this pursuit. This is the first time we are having this kind of session, so we will see if it proves a helpful addition to our parish schedule.

I ask all parish leaders to be at the meeting and to be punctual so that we can begin and end on time.

Please remember that November 1 of this year, All Saints Day, because it falls on a Saturday, is a holy day, but NOT a day of obligatory Mass attendance. For that reason, we will have only our regular 8:30 a.m. Mass on Saturday, November 1.

But, please note that we will have our customary special celebration of our Church's saints at an all-school Mass on Thursday, October 30 at 9:30 a.m. This is always a joyful Mass as we honor the patron saints of our younger students and the patron saint of each of our school's classes. All parishioners are invited to join with our school community at this Mass on Thursday of this week.

While we are looking ahead a bit, I would also like to remind families who lost loved ones this year that we will celebrate a Mass of Remembrance on Saturday, November I at 4:00 p.m. Families who have celebrated the funeral of a loved one in our parish since last November are invited to bring a picture of that deceased family member to the Mass that afternoon and to place it on one of the tables provided in the sanctuary. We will pray for these people in a special way at Mass. Family members are invited to a reception in the Center immediately after Mass. November is the month we especially pray for the deceased and this Mass of Remembrance has become an important part of this prayer.

New parishioners, please note: We want to meet and welcome you to St. Angela and afford you the opportunity to meet your parish pastoral staff and some other active parish families. We invite all new parishioners to a reception at the rectory on Sunday, November 2 at 10:30 a.m. That means that you can come over to the rectory after attending the 9:30 a.m. Mass or come to the reception then attend the 11:00 a.m. Mass. Please telephone the rectory and let us know if you will be attending, so that we can have sufficient coffee, juice and donuts prepared.





Dear Parishioners.

The loved ones who touch our lives are not separated from us, even in death. All parishioners are invited to join with our school community at this Mass on Thursday of this week.

I would also like to remind families who lost loved ones this year that we will celebrate a Mass of Remembrance on Saturday. November 1 at 4:00 p.m. Families who have celebrated the funeral of a loved one in our parish since last November are invited to bring a picture of that deceased family member to the Mass that afternoon and to place it on one of the tables provided in the sanctuary. We will pray for these people in a special way at Mass. Family members are invited to a reception in the Center immediately after Mass.

On Wednesday of this week, the parents of children in our parish preparing for their first celebration of the Sacrament of Penance will meet. I ask all parishioners for pray for these families as this special time of catechesis begins and to pray in a very special way for the children preparing for this sacrament, that they will come to know the ready mercy of our God, the joy of the sacramental life of our Church and the new life and new hope this sacrament of mercy offers them and all of us.

We welcome some new altar servers, who will begin their ministry this month: Angelica Hofstetter, Will Leonard, Gina Lowe, Josh Reyes and Nicholas Winningkoff. I thank these young people for coming forward in service to our parish in this liturgical ministry.







Dear Parishioners,

I will be leaving tomorrow (Monday, November 10) on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land. Msgr. Jace Eskind, Judicial Vicar of the Diocese of Lake Charles and I will serve as tour hosts for 45 pilgrims who will be joining us. I ask you to keep us in your prayers during our travels and I want to assure you that you will be in my prayers at Mass each day and as we visit the lands and shrines of important significance to our faith. I will be returning to the parish late in the evening on Monday, November 24. Say extra prayers on November 14, as I celebrate my 61st birthday in Jeruslem!

I have invited other members of our pastoral staff to use this page in the bulletin to share information with you while I am traveling.

Let me highlight, though, a few things that will be happening in my absence.

Next weekend is the annual national collection for the support of the United States Bishops' Campaign for Human Development. Funds from this collection are used to support self-help programs that help people break the cycle of poverty. This is a very worthwhile effort, and I encourage your customary generous support.

Our school community will celebrate a Thanksgiving Mass on Wednesday, November 19 at 9:30 a.m. All parishioners are invited to join our school children, their parents and our faculty for this Mass.

On the weekend of November 22-23, we ask you to bring non-perishable food items to church as you assist our St. Vincent de Paul Society prepare Thanksgiving food baskets for the needy in our community. Each year, we distribute about 65 baskets of food to families in special need. The food items you bring help to make these baskets gifts that assist these folks for much more than one day. Please be generous in your support of this effort and place your food items in the bins in each of the church's hallways.

Also that weekend, there will be sign-up sheets in the sacristy for readers, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion, hospitality ministers (ushers), and altar servers to volunteer your services for the Masses of December 7-8, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, our national Holy Day of Obligation.

I will be home in time for this, but I want to extend an early invitation to all to participate in our parish Thanksgiving Day Mass on November 27 at 8:30 a.m. Let us join together in praise and thanks to the God who has blessed us so abundantly.

The parish's Fall Fair made a profit of \$54,000 this year. While that is just a bit lower income than last year, the Fair was still a great success with this profit and with the good time it afforded to all of us. THANKS again to all of those who planned and worked the Fair and to all of you who participated in it and supported it. \$50,000 of this profit is dedicated to support the operating budget of our school. The remaining \$4,000 will be used for other parish projects.

We have finally completed work on one of the rest rooms in the school. Completed in phases, the total cost of this project (the first time the rest rooms have been renovated since the school was built) was \$40,000. Funds for this project were from our annual Soiree and from other special donations to the parish. We still have five rest rooms to go!

As we draw near to the season of Advent, the parish has planned ways to help all of us deepen our prayer life during this holy time of waiting. We have an Advent booklet for each family. This booklet includes Scripture passages, a short meditation and a prayer for the day. This can be used as a way to begin the day or as a night prayer. We also have Advent wreath prayers that will be available for each family who would like one. The SALA ladies will have them at the tables where they provide the Advent Wreaths as they do each year.

One of the events planned is that the children (one child and one adult) are invited to light the candle of the Advenwreath at all the weekend Masses. On December 8th we celebrate the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. We celebrate the fact that from the moment of her conception she was exempt from original sin. Pope Pius IX proclaimed, "The most Blessed Virgin Mary was, from the first moment of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege of almighty God and by virtue to the merits of Jesus Christ, Savior of the human race, preserved immune from all stain of original sin."

Mary, under the title of the Immaculate Conception is the Patroness of the United States. This feast is always celebrated as a Holy Day of Obligation. Our mass schedule for the feast is as follows: 6:15A, 8:30A and 6:00P

During Advent our young people who are in immediate preparation for Confirmation will have their Day of Reflection. It is scheduled for December 14 beginning with attendance at the 11 a.m. Mass with their parents here at St. Angela. We have a retreat director who will lead them in activities to help them prepare for the reception of this sacrament. Pray that they will be open and ready to receive the graces of the day.



Dear Parishioners,

I spoke at all the Masses this past weekend, reminding you of the need to keep our vision broad this Advent. I hope that you are taking advantage of the Advent wreath prayers and the Advent booklet of reflections.
