



Dear Parishioners,

We extend our congratulations to our parishioner, David Aaron, who was instituted into the ministry of acolyte on December 26. David is in the formation class for the diaconate and who will, hopefully, be ordained a deacon in two years.

When I was in the seminary, there were still "major" and "minor" orders. Our class was the last class to receive the minor orders or porter, lector, acolyte, exorcist and subdiaconate. In the reforms of Vatican II, these minor orders were eliminated and three ordained orders remain: deacon, priest and bishop. The minor orders were replaced with the "instituted ministries" of reader and acolyte. These are considered lay ministries, but are still received by those preparing for Holy Orders.

Instituted readers not only proclaim the Scriptures at liturgy, they dedicate themselves to study and pray the Scriptures so that they will become leaders of those who probe the Word of God for wisdom and truth.

Instituted acolytes assist the deacon and priest at the altar and assist with ministering Holy Communion to the people at Mass. They also study the liturgy more deeply so that they can, by their example and their teaching, lead others to know and give themselves to the celebration of Mass. As one who knows the liturgy of Mass, instituted acolytes become those who train others for service at Mass as altar servers.

We look forward to having Dave serve as an acolyte at Mass during the remainder of his time in diaconate formation!

Today, we celebrate the final Christmas feast: the Baptism of the Lord. Born of Mary as Son of God, revealed through the shepherds as the hope for all people and, through the Magi, as the Savior of every nation, the feast of the Lord's Baptism now begins his public ministry.

As this Christmas season ends, I want once again to thank all those who helped to make our church and all of our Christmas liturgies so beautiful and inspiring.

A final thanks, too, from Fr. Ray and me for the many cards that we received from you and the abundance of Christmas treats you gave us. If we look a bit bigger around the waist, it's only because we have been enjoying all the sweets you gave us! Thanks to all who made our holidays so joyful!

On Saturday, January 24, the young people in our parish in second grade of our school and our CCD program will have their first opportunity to share in the Sacrament of Penance. Please keep them in your prayers during these final days of preparation, that they will truly see in this sacrament the Lord's love for them in the ready forgiveness and new life that is afforded them.

A reminder to members of the Pastoral Staff, Pastoral Council, School Board and Finance Council: there will be a joint meeting of these groups in the Kern Center on Tuesday of this week. 



Please remember in your prayers this week the young people in our parish who will celebrate the Sacrament of Penance for the first time on Saturday, January 24. Pray that they will truly see in this Sacrament, not only that day but all days in the future, the ready offering of God's healing love and mercy.

Parishioners who regularly participate in the 9:30 a.m. Mass see each week the early-childhood aged children dismissed after the Opening Prayer of Mass for their celebration of the Liturgy of Word. This is not a catechism lesson, but a true Liturgy of the Word, just on their level of understanding.

I thank those adults who so faithfully lead this ministry, and the teens who assist them. Thanks, too, to the parents who bring their children to that Mass and allow them to share in this celebration of God's Word.

Dear Parishioners,

Father Ray Hymel, who has been with us for two and a half years as parochial vicar, will be leaving our parish soon and will be receiving a new assignment in pastoral ministry. His final weekend with us will be January 31-February 1.

We certainly want to thank Fr. Ray for his ministry to us. There will be a reception for Father Ray on Sunday, February 1 from 12 Noon until 2:00 p.m. in the Msgr. Kern Center. All parishioners are invited to come and spend a little time with Father Ray to show our gratitude to him. Father Ray will celebrate the 11:00 a.m. Mass before the reception.

Let us also hold Fr. Ray up to the Lord in our prayers that he might find, in his next assignment, continued joy in service of the Lord and His people.

With this news also comes the word that we will probably NOT have another priest assigned to St. Angela as parochial vicar until July. This will, unfortunately, necessitate some modifications to our Mass schedule, both on weekdays and weekends.

On weekends, beginning February 8, we will temporarily discontinue the 12:30 p.m. Mass. All other weekend Masses remain as now scheduled.

For those who have requested Mass intentions, we will transfer those intentions to available dates and times.

Father Jim Schott will continue to minister here at St. Angela, as he has done so faithfully and generous these past years. He will celebrate the 8:30 a.m. Mass on Monday, Tuesday and Saturday. I will celebrate the morning Mass on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday and preside at all school Masses. Father Schott and I will alternate the weekend Masses.

Because Mondays will remain my day off, any funeral that must be celebrated on a Monday will be in the context of a Liturgy of the Word (rather than Mass) and one of our deacons will preside at the funeral liturgy. I remind you that families who lose a loved one should contact the rectory to find out my availability for a funeral BEFORE discussing a day or time, and I thank you for your understanding and cooperation in this regard. Sometimes I am able to re-arrange my schedule and sometimes I cannot, so it is important that arrangements not be decided prior to our conversation.

I'm sure we can say that we ALL look forward to the arrival of a new parochial vicar for our parish this Summer!

There has been legislation placed before the U.S. Congress, referred to as the "Freedom of Choice Act." Regrettably, it is considered by our bishops to be the most extensive pro-abortion legislation in our nation's history. 





Dear Parishioners.

This weekend, we celebrate "Family Day" in our parish. The Archdiocesan Family Life Apostolate Office encourages parishes to observe this commemoration each year in the Fall, but because our annual parish fair is at that same time, we have deferred "Family Day" to this weekend. Several events help us to focus this weekend on families and their essential role in our society and our Church.

In church this weekend, you will see posters by young people in our school on the walls of the church. At each of our weekend Masses, a young person will read his/her essay on family life. When our children know the importance of family life and value their family life and experiences, we know that families are and will be strong. These are values that will guide them for the rest of their lives as they live in their families, as they grow to become parents, grandparents and great-grandparents and share these precious values with new generations.

On Saturday, February 7, we will have a Parish Family Pot Luck Dinner in the Center. Bring your favorite dish to share (you can drop them off as early as 3:30 p.m.). There will be a special "kid's table" and activities for the younger folks. Let us gather with our families at the pot luck and with our parish family, that we may support one another, bind ourselves together in care and friendship and deepen the relationships that carry us happily through life.

I want to acknowledge the good work of our parish Family Life Apostolate in coordinating this Family Weekend!

Please remember that there is a second collection this weekend: the annual Archdiocesan collection for the support of Archdiocesan Catholic Charities. After Hurricanes Katrina and Rita, Catholic Charities provided great and abundant care to the most needy and was the Catholic aid presence in our community. Many, many people need the services of Catholic charities. I urge your most generous support in the second collection this weekend.

An informal conversation with one of the members of the Priest Personnel Board confirmed that it is unlikely that we will have another priest assigned to us here at St. Angela until this Summer, following the next ordination of priests for our Archdiocese. Again, I also ask, should there be a death in your family, that you contact me at the rectory to determine my availability for days and times of funerals. While I am willing to be as accommodating as I can, there are times that I cannot change established commitments. Please remember that, should a funeral have to be celebrated on a Monday, Deacon Gil will preside at this funeral, which would be a Liturgy of the Word, but not Mass.

With Fr Ray's departure, we will also have to re-arrange "staff liaisons" for several of our parish organizations. This will be determined by our staff at our next regular meeting and I will share that information with parish organizations as soon as possible.

Dear Parishioners,

Mardi Gras began weeks ago and Mardi Gras parades begin full force this weekend – it's Carnival Time! Most of us immerse ourselves in the festivities and relish the opportunity to do so! But, of course, we must always remember that Mardi Gras is not a destination, it is a *prelude*. We get the frivolity and fun "out of our system" so that we can even more fully immerse ourselves in the serious and significant activities of Lent: commitment to conversion of life, turning away from sin all in preparation for the real goal: the new life of Easter. Lent is a time of repentance and renewal, a time of serious communal and self-examination. We look to see what keeps us from unity with Christ in the Church, engagement with Christ in his Church, and we set about to change our ways. Easter is our goal; Lent is the journey there; Mardi Gras is a prelude.

Lent is NOT a journey we make alone. Our parish Lenten Mission helps us to focus as a parish on our corporate, communal journey and to be of support to one another as we journey together. Our parish Lenten Mission this year will begin on the weekend of February 28-March 1, when our mission preachers will speak at all the Masses, and the Mission will continue on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday of that week, March 2, 3, 4.

Our mission preachers will speak at the 8:30 a.m. Mass each morning and the Mission Service each of those nights will be at 7:00 p.m. Father James Marchionda, O.P. and Sr. Ann Willits, O.P. will be our missionary team for this year. I will offer more information about them next week. For now, please mark these dates on your calendar. I have heard Father Marchionda speak at several liturgy workshops I have attended over the years, heard him speak a few years ago here in our Archdiocese at the Catholic Schools Administrators' Conference and worked with him when I served as Director of the Office of Worship and he conducted a choral reading session on music for children's liturgies here in our Archdiocese. He is a gifted speaker and very talented and skilled musician. This will, I think, be an exciting and dynamic time in our parish!

I would ask all those who serve as extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion, readers, altar servers and ministers of hospitality to offer your services for our Masses on Ash Wednesday. There is a sign-up sheet in the sacristy this weekend and I ask those in these ministries to come to the sacristy and volunteer for one of our Masses.

Masses on Ash Wednesday will be at 8:30 a.m., 12 Noon and 6:00 p.m. Ashes are distributed DURING Mass, immediately following the homily.

I would like to say a word of gratitude to our parish Family Life Apostolate for the fine work they did helping us to observe Family Day in our parish last weekend. Coordinating with our school, they conducted the essay and poster contest and the sharing of those essays and posters with us in church over the weekend. They coordinated the pot luck dinner and recruited our CYO to help staff the children's activities. They set up and cleaned up the Center for the dinner. They are committed to family life in their own homes, to helping us strengthen family life in every home and to strengthen our bonds as a parish family of faith.

The pot luck was a bounteous offering of food and drink – GREAT food! I thank all those who participated. It was a relaxed and enjoyable evening of parish community.

Let me admit, though, that I was very disappointed at the turn-out. While we did have about one hundred parishioners there, all of whom enjoyed the evening, we were expecting many more. If we are to continue to grow as a parish community, I think it is important for us to take advantage of these kinds of occasions when we can meet folks who come to different Masses on weekends, to get to know each other better, to build friendships that link us together. I encourage all parishioners to consider participating in future pot luck dinners.

Dear Parishioners,

I wish you a safe and Happy Mardi Gras! But, more importantly, I wish you a Holy Lent! Lent: a time for those preparing to come into our Church at Easter to intensify their preparations, for us to support them with our prayers (especially in the rites they will celebrate during our weekend Masses), for us all to journey with them to Easter by a process of purification and renewal. Lent is a time for us to recognize the new life we have already received in our Baptism, to acknowledge that our sin has sometimes tarnished that life and dimmed its light, and to acknowledge that Christ can renew that life in us, restoring it to its full power if we cooperate in the spirit of the Lenten season.

Time for prayer, works of sacrificial charity, acts of self-discipline are the steps we take on the journey of Lent to renew ourselves in Christ. We seek to rise anew in the way of Christ, who gave himself for the life of us all. We seek to immerse ourselves more in the mind and heart of the Lord in prayer, more in the obedience of the Lord in our self-discipline, more in the spirit and determination of the Lord in our sacrificial acts of charity. Becoming more and more like Christ will make Easter a genuine celebration of the new life that Christ brought to earth.

We do not make the journey of life alone; we do not make the journey of faith alone; we must not try to make the journey of Lent alone. We are ALL on the journey, TOGETHER. We journey with our candidates for reception into the full communion of the Church as we pray with and for them and as we show them how to live in and with Christ in the Church. We support one another as we pray and sacrifice together. We receive and accept support from one another in our prayer and corporate acts of sacrifice.

Please plan on joining in the corporate times of Lenten parish prayer: Our parish Mission, led by Father James Marchionda and Sister Ann Willits, which will begin next weekend and continue Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday of that week with a special homily at the 8:30 a.m. Mass each morning and the Mission Prayer Service each evening at 7:00 p.m.; Stations of the Cross each Friday night of Lent at 7:00 p.m.; special prayers for life and for those who serve in and are served by the work of Catholic Relief Services.

Please plan on joining in the corporate sacrifice of Lent: fasting during the days of Lent and donating the money saved from your family budget by fasting to either Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese and its Pro-Life services or Operation Rice Bowl of the U.S. Bishops' Catholic Relief Services. (These are two of the projects we supported in Lent last year.)

We join with all in our Catholic Church following the Lenten discipline of fasting and abstinence: Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all who are 18 years of age but not yet 59 years old. Those who fast are to take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted to maintain strength, according to each one's needs. Eating between meals is not permitted. Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all 14 years or older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent.

We fast from food to remind us that there is more we seek than physical satisfaction. It reminds us of higher goals and higher values. Fasting reminds us that we rely on the Lord for our ultimate strength and nourishment. Abstinence is a discipline of body and mind that guides us in paths of obedience and sacrifice.

I encourage each household to determine from what each family member will fast during Lent and how much money that will mean each person will donate at the end of Lent to a very worthy cause that serves others.

Sacrifice, prayer, discipline: opportunities of the forty days of Lent to pursue the kind of life Christ lived to save us and the kind of life we can live to bring his salvation to all.

Dear Parishioners.

We welcome today Father James Marchionda, O.P. and Sr. Ann Willits, O.P., our mission preachers for this year. At our Masses this weekend, they will offer an introduction to the Parish Mission, as they speak at all of our Masses. There will be a Mission Prayer Service on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday nights, beginning at 7:00 p.m. Our Mission will conclude with a reception on Wednesday night, following the prayer service.

As I have been sharing with you these past few weeks, our Lenten journey is a corporate one, as we walk together these forty days of Lent to the new life of Easter. Prayer, fasting and works of charity are the means we use to make ourselves one with Christ. We give and find support and strength on the journey as we recognize that we are in this together.

I hope that you will make the time in your busy schedules to attend the Mission Services. I am confident that you will be uplifted, challenged and guided as you hear the messages Father Jim and Sister Ann share with us at the beginning of our Lenten journey.

Also during this Lent, as we did last year, I urge each household in our parish to pray and fast for one of these two important causes: Catholic Relief Services, through "Operation Rice Bowl," or ACCESS Pregnancy and Referral Services of Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese of New Orleans. Catholic Relief Services aids the most needy overseas in a global effort to end hunger and poverty. ACCESS is an archdiocesan effort to support and guide pregnant couples away from abortion and to counseling and adoption services. Both of these programs and services seek to promote the right to life and the worth and dignity of every human life. Please select one of these. This weekend, take home a "rice bowl" or a baby bottle. As you fast, place the money saved from your personal or family budget in the rice bowl or bottle and we will collect these contributions the Sunday after Easter. Each day, pray for those who need and those who offer these service of our Church, using the prayers provided with the container. Jesus gave his life for others, sacrificing his life for the salvation of all. We fast and pray for others during this Lent, sacrificing in order that we make bring others the hope, courage and support that will aid in their salvation.

Lenten fasting from food is NOT simply dieting. We fast from food to remind us that there is more we seek than physical satisfaction. It reminds us of higher goals and higher values. Fasting reminds us that we rely on the Lord for our ultimate strength and nourishment. No matter from what we choose to fast, we fast (do with less) so that others will have more, especially those who are wanting for the most basic necessities of life.

A reminder about our Church's regulations in regard to days of fast and abstinence: Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all who are 18 years of age but not yet 59 years old. Those who fast are to take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted to maintain strength, according to each one's needs. Eating between meals is not permitted. Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all 14 years or older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. Good Friday is a day of fast and abstinence for all of the appropriate age, as mentioned above.

We will pray the Stations of the Cross on the Fridays of Lent at 7:00 p.m. This traditional Lenten devotion reminds us of the suffering and death of the Lord for us and, through its prayer, challenges us to lives of sacrificial service of and care for others.

Our school children will also pray the Stations each Friday, but the time varies because of the school schedule. Parishioners who might like to pray the Stations during the day are encouraged to check here in the bulletin each week for the time of the school Stations.

Our first Lenten Fish Fry Dinner is this Friday, March 6. Hope to see you there!



Dear Parishioners,

Lent began in imitation of the forty days of Jesus in the desert. As he was preparing to go up to Jerusalem, where he won for us reconciliation with God and one another in his sacrificial death and his glorious resurrection, so Lent became a special time of prayer for those preparing for the Easter Sacraments of Initiation into the Church. In support of those who were participating in this intense prayerful reflection and preparation, those already baptized began to take on the same activities of prayer and fasting in solidarity with the catechumens and as a way of renewal of their own baptism. This tradition has continued in our Church over the centuries.

I urge you to pray these Lenten days for all those in our Church who are preparing to begin the new life of Christ at Easter through the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. I urge you to pray in a special way for those in our parish in this special time of their preparation. This year, Cliff Hardeman and Jeff Henderson are preparing to come to Catholicism from other Christian religions. On Easter Sunday, they will make their Profession of Faith and share in the Sacraments Confirmation and Eucharist.

Also during these weeks, the young people in second grade in our school and CCD program are preparing for their first reception of Holy Communion, which will be on Sunday, April 26.

Youth in the 11th grade are preparing for the completion of their Sacraments of Initiation and will share in the Sacrament of Confirmation on Thursday, April 30.

Let us hold all of these folks in our prayers during this Lenten Season.

Let us also continue to pray and fast for the special causes our parish is supporting this Lent: Operation Rice Bowl of the U.S. Bishops Catholic Relief Services and ACCESS Pregnancy Counseling Services of Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese. I hope that you have your rice bowl or baby bottle in a prominent place in your home, along with the special prayer sheet, and are being faithful for fast and prayer for that cause, for the people who minister in those services, and for those to whom they minister.

God says, through the voice of the prophet Isaiah: "This is the fasting that I wish: releasing those bound unjustly, setting free the oppressed, breaking every yoke, sharing your bread with the hungry, sheltering the oppresses and the homeless, clothing the naked when you see them, and not turning your back on your own."

Let us, as a parish community, make our fasting and prayer be for the increase of others who need us. If you have not yet selected your "Rice Bowl," to help alleviate world hunger or your baby bottle for support of ACCESS Pregnancy Counseling Services, these are still available in church.

A Lenten Day of Prayer for Liturgical Ministers will be held on Saturday, March 14, 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. at Our Lady of the Rosary Church in New Orleans. The sign up form is in the Sacristy.

Dear Parishioners,

I wonder how Noah and his family were doing fifteen days into the flood. How were the Israelites doing fifteen years into their desert sojourn? And how was Jesus faring fifteen days into his desert prayer? Did any of them have a difficult time "getting into" the experience? Did they think perhaps they had made the wrong decision and wanted to get out of this commitment? Perhaps they were already hitting emotional or spiritual bumps in the road.

Our Lenten trek of forty days, of course, relates to all of those Scriptural journeys. As we stand ready to begin the Third Week of Lent, how are you doing? Did recuperation time from Mardi Gras delay your serious entry into Lent? Have you thrown yourself into the Lenten disciplines of prayer, fasting and works of charity, or have you found yourself not quite in synch with the season yet, or have you already found yourself wavering in your dedication?

How are you doing as part of our parish community? If you participated in the Parish Mission, are you still reflecting on the insights of Father Jim and Sister Ann? Did any of their reflections give you a direction for Lent and beyond? Have you been using each day the booklet, "Seeking God, Finding God," which we have made available to you? Are you fasting and praying for one of the causes we have chosen as a parish to support: ACCESS Pregnancy Counseling Services or the "Rice Bowl" project of U. S. Catholic Bishops' Relief Service? Have you perhaps been taking advantage of daily Mass and homily or Friday night Stations of the Cross? We are not on the Lenten journey alone; we are support and encouragement to one another. If you have not been too faithful thus far, if you have been off to a slow start, if you have not yet even gotten into the spirit of the Lenten season, the doors of the ark are still open; get on board for the journey to Easter life: renewal in Christ.

Please add to your prayer intentions each day the catechumens and candidates for reception into the Church, who are in their final weeks of prayerful reflection as they get ready for the Easter sacraments of initiation. Pray in a special way for Jeff Henderson and Cliff Hardeman, two young men of our parish who are preparing for reception into the full communion of our Church on Easter Sunday.

I pray that all of you are doing well about fifteen days into our Lenten journey!

Our school students' annual play has its final performances this weekend (March 14-15). Our school St. Joseph Altar, in the Msgr. Kern Center, will be blessed at 9:30 a.m. on Thursday of this week, March 19. Please support these activities of our young people!

I would like to remind all those who are Hospitality Ministers (Ushers) at our weekend Masses, that we have an important meeting on Saturday, March 21 at 10:00 a.m. in the parish Conference Room. This meeting is to prepare for the liturgies of Holy Week, the Paschal Triduum and Easter Sunday. Ministers, please make every effort to attend this meeting, which will last only one hour.

Dear Parishioners.

We are now about half-way through Lent. Throughout our Church, there are men and women preparing for the Sacraments of Initiation, seeking to live new life with Christ in our community of faith. Some being baptized for the first time, some coming to us from other Christian religions, they are confident that, with using the Catholic Church, they will find the values, the support, the community, the joy and hope that will bring their lives fulfillment. Please continue to pray for all of these people. Even though we do not know them and will not ever meet most of them, keeping them in our thoughts and prayers is part of what it means to be "catholic."

Here in our parish, I ask you to pray in a special way for Cliff Hardeman and Jeff Henderson, who are preparing to be received into the full communion of our Church at Easter. Each Sunday, Cliff and Jeff join us for the Liturgy of the Word and then are dismissed to reflect on those Scriptures in their own lives as they journey this Lent to Easter life in the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist.

As all of the catechumens and candidates of our Church journey these weeks, we journey with them. Already fully initiated, we seek to renew our lives in Christ, our lives in the Church through the Lenten disciplines of prayer, fasting and good works. But we do these not simply to make ourselves better; we do them to seek to better the lives of those around us as well. That is why we join together in prayer and fasting for a cause: either in support of those who minister in or those assisted by ACCESS Pregnancy Counseling Services or the Rice Bowl project of Catholic Relief Services. As we seek new life in Christ, we recognize that such life is a life with and for others. Keep up that Lenten good work!

As we approach the culmination of the Lenten journey and begin to prepare for Holy Week, the Paschal Triduum and Easter, I want to remind all those who serve as Ministers of Hospitality (Ushers) that we have an important meeting this weekend, Saturday, March 21 at 10:00 a.m. in the Conference Room.

I also ask all those who serve as Readers, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and Altar Servers to offer your services for the special liturgies of the Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday and Easter Sunday. Please come to the sacristy this weekend, where you will find the sign-up sheets for these liturgies. We need your help!

I would like to encourage all of you to consider participating in the liturgies of the Paschal Triduum. On Holy Thursday, we commemorate the Lord's Last Supper with his disciples. This is, for us as Catholics, the very institution of the Eucharist, our sharing in the Body and Blood of the living Christ. This Mass begins on Holy Thursday at 7:00 p.m. As Jesus left that meal to pray in the Garden of Olives, he asked his apostles, "Can you not watch and pray with me for an hour?" The quiet prayer of adoration before the tabernacle of reposition continues after Mass that night until 9:30 p.m.

On Good Friday, we observe the Passion and Death of the Lord, we join in veneration of the cross at the Solemn Liturgy beginning at 3:00 p.m.

On Holy Saturday, we begin the night watch at the Lord's tomb and celebrate the Resurrection with the lighting of the Easter Candle and the Easter Vigil Mass beginning at 8:00 p.m.

These are beautiful, moving and inspiring liturgies. Treat yourself to participating in them as we come together in prayer and see the journey of Lent find its fulfillment.





Dear Parishioners,

"These forty days of Lent, O Lord, with you we fast and pray . . ." These are the words of one of the hymns we sing regularly during this Lenten season. As others around us are coming into the Church through Baptism or reception into our Church from other Christian Churches, those of us already baptized seek, with them, renewal of mind, heart and spirit. We do not take our own baptism into Christ for granted. We know that the new life given us in baptism, merits renewal and refreshment as we grow and seek to become more like Christ, more at one with Christ. I hope that you are remaining faithful to your Lenten promises, especially those who pledged, through your fasting and prayer, to support others, to sacrifice for others through support for ACCESS Pregnancy Services or the "Rice Bowl" project of Catholic Relief Services. Jesus sacrificed for others and so, then, do we. The new life of Christ was given to all; our sacrifice and prayer affords a new life of hope for others as well. We will truly know the joy and fulfillment of Easter if we continue to be dedicated to the Lenten disciplines of prayer, fasting and works of charity.

As you make plans for the days of Holy Week and the Paschal Triduum, let me remind you of the opportunities for prayer here at St. Angela.

On Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday of Holy Week (April 6, 7,8), we will have our regular morning Mass at 8:30 a.m.

On Tuesday evening of Holy Week, April 8, Father Schott and I will be available for the Sacrament of Penance in church from 6:00-7:00 p.m. Please note that this will be the final scheduled time for this Sacrament before Easter.

There is no morning Mass on Holy Thursday (April 9). The Paschal Triduum begins with the Evening Mass of the Lord's last Supper at 7:00 p.m. Quiet prayer before the Blessed Sacrament continues from after Mass until 9:30 p.m.

On Good Friday, April 10, the Solemn Service of the Lord's Passion and Death begins at 3:00 p.m. That evening, we will pray the Stations of the Cross at 7:00 p.m.

On Holy Saturday, the Easter Vigil Mass begins at 8:00 p.m. with the blessing of the new fire and the lighting of the Paschal Candle. We recall, through several Scripture readings, the history of salvation begun with the covenant with the people of Israel and fulfilled in Christ. We share in the renewal of our Baptismal promises, are sprinkled with Easter water, and come afresh to the Lord's table of the Eucharist.

On Easter Sunday, April 12, Masses will be at 8:00, 9:30 and 11:00 a.m.

If you have Sago palms in your yard, we ask you to cut and bring your palms to church on Friday, April 3 so that they can be prepared for use next weekend at our Palm Sunday Masses. If you are unable to cut the palms, please telephone us at the rectory so that we can set up a time on Friday to come and cut them. THANKS!

On Thursday of this week, April 2, our Senior Citizens Club is sponsoring a morning of reflection for their members and invite all parishioners to join them. They begin by participating in the 8:30 a.m. Mass, then break for coffee and donuts, returning to church at 9:30 a.m. for the reflections. This year, Msgr. Paul Metrejean, a retired priest of the Diocese of Lafayette, is the speaker for the Morning of Reflection.

Msgr. Metrejean and I joined the faculty at Notre Dame Seminary at the same time, where he served as Spiritual Director for the seminarians. I know Fr. Paul to be a man of deep faith, committed to the Lord through prayer and service. I am confident that his words will enlighten and inspire, and so I encourage all of you who are able to join our Seniors for the Morning of Reflection. Msgr. Metrejean will also preside and preach at the 8:30 a.m. that morning.


