Dear Parishioners.

We enter today the most significant week of our Church's liturgy: Holy Week. For almost forty days, we have been journeying with the catechumens and candidates of our Church. As they seek the new life of Christ in our Church through the sacraments of initiation, we who are already initiated seek to renew that life entrusted to us in our baptism. During the liturgies of the Paschal Triduum and Easter, we remember the saving death and resurrection and we celebrate the new life of saving sacrifice to which our Lenten disciplines have led us. I cannot strongly enough urge you to make times in your schedules to participate in the beautiful and moving liturgies of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil.

As you make plans for the days of Holy Week and the Paschal Triduum, let me remind you of the opportunities for prayer here at St. Angela.

On Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday of Holy Week (April 6, 7,8), we will have our regular morning Mass at 8:30 a.m.

On Tuesday evening of Holy Week, April 7, Father Schott and will be available for the Sacrament of Penance in church from 6:00-7:00 p.m. Please note that this will be the final scheduled time for this Sacrament before Easter.

There is no morning Mass on Holy Thursday (April 9). The Paschal Triduum begins with the Evening Mass of the Lord's last Supper at 7:00 p.m. Quiet prayer before the Blessed Sacrament continues from after Mass until 9:30 p.m.

On Good Friday, April 10, the Solemn Service of the Lord's Passion and Death begins at 3:00 p.m. That evening, we will pray the Stations of the Cross at 7:00 p.m.

One Holy Saturday, the Easter Vigil Mass begins at 8:00 p.m. with the blessing of the new fire and the lighting of the Paschal Candle. We recall, through several Scripture readings, the history of salvation begun with the covenant with the people of Israel and fulfilled in Christ. We share in the renewal of our Baptismal promises, are sprinkled with Easter water, and come afresh to the Lord's table of the Eucharist.

On Easter Sunday, April 12, Masses will be at 8:00, 9:30 and 11:00 a.m.

When we reorganized our youth ministry program over a year ago, it was the hope that those who initiated this renewal that one day we would be able to have a full-time or at least part-time youth ministry director as part of our parish pastoral staff. Our youth group has been doing very well, with about 65 young people on the roster of members and the adult board is doing a fine job leading and coordinating this ministry with our youth leaders. During Lent, the CYO had a successful weekend retreat and just last weekend went together on a service visit to the Chateau de Notre Dame Senior Home. This, in addition to their meetings and social and sports activities, offers a well-rounded program for our high-schoolers.

While we are not yet in a position to have a paid youth ministry director, Diane Kratochvil has done an excellent job as our volunteer director. Diane has truly given her heart to this ministry. On your behalf, I thank Diane and the other adults who serve so well and so generously.

In order to allow us to continue to build toward the future, I have asked Diane to join us as a member of the pastoral staff and she has accepted this new role. She will join us for our monthly staff meetings and, as liaison to youth ministry, will keep me apprised of all that is going on with our youth group.

Because of this new role, Diane has had to give up her position on the Pastoral Council.

In accord with the Pastoral Council Constitution and based upon the recommendation of current Pastoral Council members, I have invited Emily Gros to take over Diane's Council seat and to serve the remainder of that term, and Emily has graciously accepted. I thank her for this and look forward to her service on the Pastoral Council.

Unfortunately, due to work commitments, Paul Briuglio has submitted his resignation from the Pastoral Council and I have, sadly, accepted this resignation. We will surface name of candidates at the next Council meeting to complete Paul's term of office. Paul promises that, when things settle down, he will again join us in more active role in parish leadership – and that's good news!





Dear Parishioners,

When I wake up in the morning, I have gotten into the habit of turning on "Morning Joe" while I am doing my morning routine of making my bed, showering and getting dressed. At the end of this show, the several regular and guest commentators offer as a final segment, "What have I learned today?" and each one answers the question. It's a good question that we ought all ask ourselves regularly. It is, I think, a very good question to ask ourselves about our experience of this now-fulfilled Lenten season: What did you learn this Lent? Here's what I learned:

During Lent, BEFORE I turned on "Morning Joe," I first read the reflection for the day in the booklet, "Seeking God, Finding God," which we made available to all parishioners at the start of Lent. I learned that I actually could make time each day for a bit more focused reflection on the Word of God and the spirit of the Lenten season.

This Lent, I chose to "fast" from going to the movie and dining out on my day off and I chose to contribute the money I saved to Operation Rice Bowl of the Catholic Relief Services. While there were several movies that I really wanted to see and actually was tempted to fudge on my promise, I learned that I could discipline myself enough to remain faithful to my fasting. I learned that I don't need the immediate gratification those diversions would have provided. I also went to the Operation Rice Bowl web site and read about how these funds are used and learned that 25% remains right here in our own archdiocese. Even though I have participated in Operation Rice Bowl in the past, for some reason I never realized how much of those funds remain here to help the needy in our own area and to help this important project to spread. I also learned anew that I am responsible not only for the folks I live with every day – family, friends, parishioners, our civic community – but that I am really responsible for the state of our world and that my sacrifice helps in a small way to elevate the condition of all who share the planet Earth with me.

I also decided this Lent to try to spend a little more time with friends, so I hosted a few gatherings at the rectory and made the time to phone or visit with some folks I had not seen or heard from in a while. I learned how much of my joy and fulfillment comes from being with others and that even introverts like me need to "push" ourselves a bit to let others in who enrich us and make us whole.

Our liturgies during Lent became more simple. The absence of the organ and the softness of the piano allowed me to focus a little bit more on the words we were singing – words that reminded me of the spirit of this Lenten season. The absence of singing at the Presentation of the Gifts and at the end of Mass made me realize how much I like singing at those times, how much more festive and participatory and engaging our prayer is when we join together in song. The simplicity was good and reminded me that even simple prayer is good prayer, but at the same time, it renewed my sense of longing for a fuller, more joyful liturgy as we celebrate the life of Christ with us and among us.

Our prayer for our candidates each Sunday at Mass taught me again of how vital it is that we live our faith in a way that attracts others to Christ and our Church. Seeing them leave the assembly made me realize again how privileged I am to have been raised in this Catholic Church all my life and how much I should thank God for the privilege it is to stand with you, and all in this Church, to profess our faith in the Creed and to share at the Lord's table of the Eucharist.

Discipline, shared prayer, quiet reflection, sacrifice, responsibility, care, understanding, friendship, joy, engagement, the sacraments: all of these are values that help us to find, to live and to appreciate the life of Christ, the life of our Church and all of life all the more.

As we celebrate another Easter Sunday, I hope that *your* experiences during this Lent have helped you to learn more and, more especially, to want to *live* more the life that Christ holds out for us. Living for others, finding joy in living with others, deepening friendships, reaching out to others with care, joyful and expressive community prayer, confidence in the promise of everlasting life: this is the new life of Easter. May we live it together for the fifty days of this wonderful Easter Season and all days beyond!

On behalf of our entire parish staff, I wish all of you a blessed and happy Easter as we continue to live together the joy of life with the Risen Christ!

Next weekend, April 18-19, we will collect your donations for Operation Rice Bowl or ACCESS Pregnancy Counseling Services. Please bring your Rice Bowl or baby bottle to church and, before or after Mass, place it in the proper container on the tables in the sanctuary. Thank you for your support of these parish Lenten projects of fasting and prayer for others!



Dear Parishioners.

You may have head, by word of mouth, about a series of meetings we had in March, soliciting support for a major parish project. I would like to explain for all of you what this was all about so that there will be no confusion.

As you know, one of the goals set for our parish during the last round of goal-setting was: "To continue aggressively to retire the parish debt and to develop a new master plan for our parish campus." Both aspects of the pursuit of this goal are in process. As of today, our loan balance with the Archdiocese is \$328,918.11. We remain well ahead of schedule for what was a planned ten-year payoff of the debt.

Work on the development of a new master plan for campus facilities is also progressing. The first impulse of all on the ad hoc facilities committee was to keep all development on the current campus, that is, not to try to pursue the purchase of any more property for expansion. The committee and our architect tried very hard to keep to this idea, even though it was decided that, to meet current and future parish needs, we would have to add a new building to the facility. Lots of ideas were proposed, sketched, discussed and evaluated. Over time, we came to realize that we not only need a new building, we need more space as well. A parish dining area, more office space and flexible meeting space are additions the entire committee agrees we need.

Some months back, we were told that the house at 828 Melody Drive was for sale. Some of the staff and Pastoral Council members and I toured the property, first thinking about possible additional office space. After discussion, we decided not to pursue that option. Continuing to refine the master plan, we began to think again: what if we purchased that house as a rectory (residence only for the priests) and used the current administration/residence only as office/meeting space? That seemed more appealing. This idea was brought to both the Pastoral and Finance Councils and both agreed with this possibility. Our longer-standing parishioners will probably remember that the residence on Melody Drive was once the rectory, and very little would have to be done to it to make it the priests' residence. Because of the size of the house, it would also accommodate a third priest "in residence," giving us another priest to assist with sacramental ministry in our parish.

While we thought purchasing this house would be a good idea, we also realized that it had to be done without increasing the parish debt. Clay Plaisance, who had recently completed his term on the Pastoral Council, offered to work with me to develop a plan to raise the needed funds. We estimated that we would need a total of \$350,000.00 to purchase the house, do the needed work in it and cover the costs of new office furniture. The plan Clay and I came up with was to try to raise about half of that from major parish donors, then present the plan to the rest of the parish to try to raise the remaining funds. That way, the purchases could all be made in cash, with no addition to our debt. This plan was approved by our Pastoral Council and Finance Council and also received the needed approval of the Finance Office of the Archdiocese.

Three meetings were held in March. We invited those who had contributed generously to the parish in the last campaign under Msgr. Kern and those who give generously in their weekly church offering. In all, heads of about fifty parish families were invited to the meetings. Clay and I presented the plan to them and asked (unabashedly!) for donations per family in the \$10,000.00 range. More would certainly be welcomed. Less would be appreciated and still needed. Twenty-nine families were willing to make pledges and those pledges came to a total of \$99,500.00. This was far less than we had anticipated. While most people who came to the meetings thought that purchasing the house was a good idea, we did not meet our expected goal. Therefore, I decided that we would not go any further with this project. I was and am convinced that, if we could not raise a minimum of \$150,000.00 from major donors, we would not raise the needed funds, even with a parish-wide appeal.

I had high hopes for this project and I considered it worthwhile, responsible, prudent and do-able. I am saddened that it did not meet with greater success and come to fruition. Perhaps when people feel more confidence in the economy and as property in our area becomes available we can re-visit this attempt at growth.

I thank Clay for the time, effort and energy he devoted to leading this project and all those who had been willing to support it.

She was a substitute teacher in our school for one year and is now in her first year of service with Child Church. Teresa has been involved with our school Co-Op for nine years and has served on the Board for four of those years and has also served as the President and Vice-President of the Co-Op.

These two woman truly are committed to Christ, his Church and our parish. They have and do give generously and selflessly, in their families and in our parish. We thank them for all they have done, are doing and will do for our parish. We congratulate on this well-deserved recognition!

Today, May 3, we will have a new parishioner welcome at the rectory at 12 Noon (following the 11:00 a.m. Mass). The new families we know about have received invitations in the mail, but if your family is new to our parish, I invite you to join us. This is a very single-purposed social: an opportunity for our Staff members and Family Life Committee members to say "Welcome" to you and for you to meet us as you become a new part of our parish family. We will serve a light lunch as part of our social.

We extend our congratulations to the young people in our parish who shared in the Sacrament of Holy Communion for the first time last Sunday and the youth of our parish who shared in the Sacrament of Confirmation this past Thursday night. Both were wonderful, joyful celebrations. It is always a happy occasion in families on these special days and an equally happy occasion for all of us in the family of faith as we see our young people continue to grow in the love of Christ and in the life of our Church.

I want to express thanks for some significant financial contributions:

First, to all the parishioners who participated actively in our Lenten prayer and fasting in support of ACCESS Counseling Services of Catholic Charities and Operation Rice Bowl of Catholic Relief Services. Your contribution to ACCESS was \$4,498.37; contributions to Operation Rice Bowl totaled \$2600.63.

Thanks to the Knights of Columbus of our area for their generous donation of \$1,380.00 to install School Reach, an instant emergency parent contact telecommunications, for our school. This will afford us easy, effective short-notice communication with school parents should there be any kind of emergency on a school day.

I want you to know that I have been in regular communication with Father Pat Williams, Director of Priest Personnel for our Archdiocese, in regard to a new parochial vicar for our parish. The Archdiocese remains aware of our need for another priest here at St. Angela and I am assured that we are "on course" to have another priest assigned here. However, priesthood ordinations for our Archdiocese will not be until the beginning of June and so new assignments for all parochial vicars will probably not be effective until later that month.

I urge you to pray for the men to be ordained this year, that they will be open to the Holy Spirit's action in their lives as priests; pray for all those priests who will receive new assignments this year, that they will find their new assignments enriching for themselves and their new parishioners; pray that we will indeed have the services of another priest in our parish this Summer; and pray for vocations — there are now more priests in our Archdiocese past retirement age, though still active, than there will be new priests to replace them when they do retire!

Dear Parishioners,

We welcome back to the parish this weekend Brother Louie, who will be celebrating 8:30 a.m. morning Mass on Saturday and Father Weber, a Vincentian priest, who will be celebrating the 9:30 and 11:00 a.m. Masses on Sunday. Brother Louie and Father have been with us before, for both weekend and weekday Masses, so please welcome them back to St. Angela. I am out of the parish this weekend, participating in the annual meeting of the Southeastern Lieutenancy of the Order of the Holy Sepulchre, for which I am currently serving as ecclesiastical master of ceremonies. I will be back in the parish Monday evening. I thank Father Weber, Brother Louie and, of course, Father Jim Schott for leading you in prayer this weekend.

Those who served in leadership roles and on the committee for the planning of the Spring Soiree did their customary outstanding job. There was very good food, a great band, lots of excellent auction items (some donated by local merchants and some made by our school children). The evening was lots of fun and those who came had a great time. The profit from the Soiree this year is about \$15,000.00. That's the good news.

The bad news: we sold fewer tickets this year than ever and ticket sales have actually *decreased* each year since we started this party back up in our parish. We sold only 165 tickets, which means that we lost out on \$14,000.00 from ticket sales alone. Of course, a small crowd at the Soiree also impacts the results of the auction.

The goals of this evening were to provide a nice evening of fun and fellowship for the adults of our parish and to raise funds for unbudgeted improvements to our facilities. Over the past four years, with Soiree proceeds, we have been able to make some significant improvements to the Msgr. Kern Center: new lighting and sound system, stage curtains, renovated restrooms. I am proud of what we have accomplished by working together. We then decided to move on to more improvements to our parish school facilities. But the Soiree has become too much work for its diminishing returns and the poor attendance. With the small income from the Soiree, we would be able to do little. Therefore, after discussing this with our pastoral staff, I have decided that we will discontinue the Spring Soiree. Perhaps in time we will hit upon another event that will meet with better acceptance by and participation from parishioners and provide the kind of success needed to make the effort worthwhile.

Our school year comes to a close this week. All parishioners are invited to join our school community for the end of the year Mass on Wednesday of this week at 10:00 a.m. We come together in prayer to thank God for all of the blessings of this school year. We also pray for the welfare of our children during their Summer break, safety for those who will be traveling this Summer, and for healthy refreshment in the use of their leisure time. Please come and join us for this special liturgy.

Our Seventh Graders, leaving us after this year, will have their Promotion Ceremony that same day, at 1:00 p.m., in the Msgr. Kern Center. We certainly wish these young people well as they leave elementary school to begin their high school experiences after Summer break. We have seen these young people grow and mature during their years with us here at St. Angela. We will miss seeing them every day, but know that they will, with the foundation we have laid with them in learning and in Catholic values, continue to grow in the Lord's wisdom and grace.

Special thanks to our school principal, Mrs. Colleen Remont, our administration, faculty, staff, Co-Op and myriad parent volunteers for a great year!



As the school principal, Fr. Ken asked me to share a few of my thoughts with as the 2008-09 school year comes to an end this week. 



Dear Parishioners,

On Sunday, June 7, 1964, the members of the brand new St. Angela Merici Parish assembled for their first Sunday Masses. Father Joseph Calato, founding Pastor, welcomed his new flock to the three Masses held in the Banquet Room of Leon's Restaurant on Phosphor Avenue. We are now forty-five years old: Happy Anniversary to you all!!!

That day, two babies were baptized: John P. McNamara and Wallace F. Montz. The young families in this area were growing and the parish grew quickly: by the next weekend, Father Calato had already added two more Sunday Masses (remember, this was the days before the Saturday evening anticipated Mass).

A week later, Father initiated SALA and SAMA and the first meetings of these two organizations were held. Ninety-seven men attended the SAMA meeting and 122 women were at the SALA meeting. In the bulletin the following week, Father Calato thanked all who had attended, noting their "enthusiastic spirit . . . cooperation and good will."

He also reminded all of the parishioners that "our real purpose as a parish [is] to receive sanctification as a group around the altar of sacrifice, inspire decent and moral living, building a rich spiritual heritage for the family, and in the end be rewarded with eternal happiness in heaven!"

It was soon announced that two Ursuline Sisters would staff the parish school, when it was built. There was a sign on the "new" property announcing the location of the new parish plant and architects were already at work designing the new building. At the five Masses, 1402 parishioners joined in prayer.

The weekday Mass, Confessions and Baptisms were celebrated in the "rectory chapel" where Father Calato lived, 900 Beverly Garden Drive.

I have invited several of our founding parishioners to share some reflections with you on the first and early days of our parish's life and one of them will speak briefly at each of the Masses this weekend.

Our purpose, as Father Calato stated it, has certainly not changed over these forty-five years, and many folks have helped many, many more, to achieve and live that purpose. As we celebrate this anniversary, let us express our thanks for all those who have gone before us and for those continuing to minister so generously among us. Let us also pledge each to do our part, willfully, joyfully and generously, to continue to make St. Angela Merici a vibrant faith-filled community of worship, guidance and care.

Nick Gagliano, one of our parishioners who will speak this weekend, offered this further information about the Leon family, who donated the use of their banquet hall for Masses those early days of our parish's life:

The family name was really "Leone," but in his early adult years, Marion dropped the "e" and became known as Marion Leon. He grew up in the French Quarter where his mother and father operated a small grocery store, and he took pride in being a successful amateur prize fighter in St. Mary Italian Parish, and his face and nose showed the effects; he always said, "You should have seen the other guy." While in his 30's, he served in the Navy in WWII, and was part of ship's company on the aircraft carrier USS Enterprise, and was injured in the celebrated battle of Midway Island, after which he was assigned to land duty in San Diego. While still in the Navy, he married a New Orleans girl, Olivia Zanco, more familiarly known as Mimi, in 1943, and after discharge from the service, he and Mimi settled in Metairie on Demonsthenes Street, and opened a small neighborhood grocery and meat market on the corner of Demonsthenes and Phosphor. He was nearly wiped out in the 1947 hurricane and flood, but gradually made his way back, and ultimately decided to phase out his grocery business and started up Leon's Restaurant at 706 Phosphor, which started modestly and eventually added a banquet hall. As Marion reached retirement age, they sold the restaurant and banquet hall, and it is still there, pretty much as it was with some cosmetic changes . . . Mimi died in 1980, at the age of 60, and Marion died in 2002, at age 92. Their four daughters still live in East Jefferson . . .

I will be leaving town this week for just a few days. Sr. Susanne Kullowitch, SCC, who served with me when I was pastor at St Francis of Assisi Parish, is celebrating her 60th Jubilee in Wilmette, IL, where her community's Motherhouse is located.





Dear Parishioners,

Each year, we are given the opportunity to support a particular mission activity of our Church by having someone from a missionary community visit us, celebrate Mass with us, explain to us the ministry of their community and invite us to support them through our prayers and our financial support. This weekend, we welcome Father Conrad Goulet, SSS, a priest of the Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament.

This congregation was founded by St. Peter Julian Eymard in Paris, France in 1856 and, since that time, has gone on to serve in mission lands on all continents of the globe. We continue to pray for Father Ken as he enjoys some time off this month. While he is away Sister Paula and I will be using this space to share information with you.

First, we thank Father Conrad Goulet who shared with us the mission work of the Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament. Let us pray that their work will continue to build the Kingdom of Christ in the world. Thank you for your generous support to be used in the missions.

While Father Ken prefaced my space as "bad news", hopefully it is necessary information for our parish needs.

First of all, and prior to the end of our school year, one of the "big" air conditioning units in our gym failed. There are two units serving the main area of the gym, and they are more than thirty years old. We have been fortunate, through our service contractors, to keep them functioning. But, about the middle of May, the one that serves the "front" area of the gym is no longer fixable. We solicited proposals for the replacement of the unit. This is a 25-ton unit and, with the advancement in the design of air conditioning systems, this new system is much more energy efficient. Fortunately, our 2008/2009 parish budget was able to absorb the \$15,200.00 cost for the replacement of this unit.

The equipment arrived last week, was installed June 11 and 12, and is now up and running. Thankfully our Scripture Safari was not adversely affected with the lack of air conditioning in one of the units. When it's summer, there's never a "good" time for air conditioning failure, but we are glad to have the work completed so quickly.

Now - the second note Father Ken referred to - roofs.

Gache Garloton

For several years we have had recurring problems (leaks) with the roof of the main building. We have attempted numerous remedial efforts and have also used diagnostic procedures, including infrared images, to determine moisture areas on the roof and areas of penetration. The roof is now 20 years old. With the assistance of the Archdiocesan Building Office and the roofing manufacturer, we have a recommended program of correction.

It is recommended that we install a new cap sheet over the entire roof. Among the work to be done is to clean the roof, install a new perimeter edge, system vents put in to allow moisture to escape, a new cap sheet laid over the entire roof, flashing repaired, and all steel painted. The cost of this work is \$122,500.00. While this is a costly process, it is approximately 35% of the cost of a new roof, and we will have a roof that will serve us for many years to come.

At this time we do not have the funds on hand to pay for this work. We will have a special collection the weekend of July 11 and 12 to assist in paying for this project.

We also have some leaks in the metal roof on the gym. This roof was coated some years back, but areas of the roof are now rusting through causing the leaks. We are in the process of getting a proposal to repair and re-coat these areas.

At the beginning of June St. Angela Merici celebrated 45 years as a parish. As these years pass our physical plant is aging and these repairs and replacement, along with on-going preventative maintenance, insure that we may continue to worship, educate, and socialize in our facilities for many years to come.





A MEMO FROM SISTER PAULA:

As Father Ken mentioned in an earlier bulletin, this article will be about our Religious Education Activities. As you probably know, we hold our CCD classes at St. Clement of Rome, but all immediate Sacramental preparation for First Penance and First Communion is held here. Our Confirmation program is a two year program. All 10th graders are expected to register in August as they begin their sophomore year. Confirmation is held during their junior year.

During the coming year we have many opportunities for you to strengthen your faith and learn more about the faith we practice. One of the easiest is our Children's Liturgy of the Word at 9:30 am Mass every Sunday. The children from ages 4-7 leave church and attend this part of Mass nearby. The readings are the ones we have in church, but easier for them to understand. This gives you an opportunity to listen and hear the Word as read and preached at Mass. RCIA (the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) will be held on Thursday nights and will help those who are searching for God in the Catholic Church. This is a journey for them and us to learn more, to pray and share with others who practice the Catholic Faith.

Every Tuesday morning, immediately after 8:30 mass, we have a Scripture class in the Religious Education Library. This is a wonderful way to learn Scripture and ask the questions you've always wanted to ask.

There will be a wine and cheese evening with a speaker in September. This would be a nice evening out with your spouse. For those who want to strengthen their family faith life we have Familia every other Wednesday morning.

We sponsor a Fall retreat on a Saturday morning in September. It is a way to strengthen our relationship with God and to deepen our prayer life. Twice a year we provide a "Book Study". This usually lasts a few weeks and is on a relevant topic. And, of course, you can travel to Greece with me to visit the early communities St. Paul founded.

Our Lenten Parish mission will be given by Bishop Shelton Fabre. He was here for Confirmation and did a great job with the candidates. His homily was down to earth and had a strong message. Hopefully you will be able to attend our 2010 Mission.

We have been offering and will continue to offer basic sessions of the New Testament. This is just another way to become familiar with the life of Jesus and the letters from St. Paul and others.

Other planned activities include: Benediction, Adoration, a speaker in Advent, sessions on the Nativity Narratives, a series of talks on the Beatitudes, and a morning on understanding World Hunger.

Hopefully you will find something among all of these planned activities that will strengthen your faith life, your prayer life, and your family life.


