

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend (October 17-18), we will join our universal Church as we observe World Mission Sunday: a special day for us to support the mission activity of our Church through prayer and sacrificial financial support.

By praying in solidarity with others in our Church, especially those in mission lands, we show our trust in God to shower the Spirit of renewal all the more where it is needed. By praying for our missionaries, we give them strength for their challenging work. By contributing not only generously but sacrificially, we provide them with funds they need and use as they teach, provide medical care, food and clothing, as they build new seminaries and convents in lands where Catholicism is taking a foothold. By our contributions, we enable our missionaries to be with people in their daily lives and in the most serious emergencies.

Please be ready to make a generous offering to the second collection for World Missions of our Church this weekend!

In providing a great family atmosphere, with good community spirit, great entertainment, food and drink, in providing all with the opportunity to share their time and talents, in providing the opportunity for all to participate and to show our support for our school and our parish: in all of these ways, the parish Fall Fair was a great success. Again, I thank all those who planned, prepared, worked and participated in the Fair. It was a fun weekend for all!

Financially, though, the Fair this year was not quite as profitable as in previous years. I suppose the troubles in our economy were reflected in Fair income. The gross income from the Fair was \$114,796.20. Expenses totaled \$66,085.00. That means the **profit from the Fair** came to \$48,711.20. This number, we expect, will go up just a bit, when we receive back credits for items returned to vendors and some income from school "dress-down" days. However, at this point this is *below* the \$50,000.00 of projected Fair income that we budget for school operating expenses. And, of course, that means that we do not have any additional funds for supplementing the parish budget. Guess next year, I'll have to bake a few more pans of bread pudding!

At the parish Fair, a few people told me that they could not hear well in church at Mass. These people usually sat in the pews on the St. Joseph side of church. So, the following weekend, Father Peter and I stood near that section of pews during Mass and we realized why folks over there were having difficulties: the speakers were not working!!! Evidently, when we recently did some upgrading of microphones, something else got messed up. As you should have noticed last weekend, the problems have been identified and repaired. Now, for all of you who missed my homilies those weeks, I'd be happy to start preaching twice at Mass to help you catch up!

When you notice problems with the physical plant, please do not hesitate to let our Business Manager, Jackie Appleton know, so that we can take care of them right away. While Jackie and our custodians do try to monitor facilities, we are not always aware of problems if you don't let us know! Thanks to all of you who conscientiously do this now.







Dear Parishioners.

Dear Parishioners.

A parish school is the responsibility of the entire parish, not merely the responsibility of parents/guardians with children in school at any particular time. When a parish chooses to open a school and chooses to continue a school's ministry, everyone in the parish should feel a sense of responsibility for that school's services and the children entrusted to our care. There is the saying that it takes a village to raise a child; similarly, it takes the whole parish to support a school.

During my years here at St. Angela, there has been very good support of our school in a number of ways and great interaction between our school and parish communities. Daily Mass-goers welcome our children as they join us once a month as lower and upper grades participate in the 8:30 a.m. Mass and the times our whole school community joins us for Holy Day Masses. Parishioners come to the school play and St. Joseph Altar blessing. Parishioners at the Fall Fair are present right along with parents and families for the stage performances of our young people. Our school children serve at Masses on weekdays as well as on Sundays and our Children's Choir provides the music ministry on Scout Sundays. All of us look forward to the "Living Stations" during lent and to the living nativity scene at our Christmas caroling. We minister to our young people in and through our school and they, in turn, minister to all of us.

Even though Catholic schools have an outstanding record of fiscal responsibility and the per student cost is far below that of public schools, tuition alone cannot be the only source of a school's income. Here at St. Angela, over the years, families of our school children have been very supportive of additional fund-raising efforts. But this is not enough. Our Fall Fair is a total parish effort and provides financial support each year. "Box Tops for Education" coupons and proof of purchase labels from Community Coffee that some parishioners clip and drop in the Sunday collection also have helped over the years.

We have discovered and have begun another fund-raising effort that we believe can be *very* helpful to our school financially. "Scrip cards" are available for purchase through our school or on-line. They are like gift cards. You purchase them and use them at stores where you usually shop. You do receive full face value of the cards, but the school receives a percentage from the merchant. The idea, though, is that you use these cards *regularly* at places you generally patronize (e.g., the "big box" discount and home improvement stores, hardware stores, grocers, gasoline stations, pharmacies, clothing and department, restaurants and movie theaters). Recall how much you spend on groceries, medicines and gasoline each year; how much you spend on clothes, dining out, movies and household cleaning supplies. Imagine 3, 5 or 10 per cent of that coming right back to our school!

You will be receiving in the mail in the next few weeks a letter from our school principal, Mrs. Colleen Remont, and me with all the details about this "Shop with Scrip" program and a list of all the participating merchants. Please read this letter and see how you can participate in this new program. It will take just a little effort on your part, but be of great support to our parish school!



Dear Parishioners.

Thursday of this week is Thanksgiving Day. On behalf of all of our pastoral staff, I wish you and your families a Happy Thanksgiving! Even in this time of economic uncertainty, we have much for which to be thankful, most especially that we live in a nation whose ideals are based on sound Christian principals (freedom, justice, equality and life) and that we are free to worship according to our own consciences and faith traditions.

Even though it is not a "holy day of obligation," many, many people choose (and rightly so) to begin thanksgiving with our great prayer of thanksgiving, the Mass. I invite all of you to consider joining in our parish Mass on Thanksgiving Day at 8:30 a.m. Father Peter will be preaching at that Mass. As is our custom, there will be a collection at Mass for the support of our parish St. Vincent de Paul Society. The number of people seeking our assistance has increased these past months, and your generous offering will help us to continue to serve those around us in immediate need.

And as we give thanks, let us keep in our thoughts and prayers those who have less than we, those most affected by the economic downturn and those seeking worthwhile employment. Let us also keep in our prayers those who travel during this long holiday weekend to be with family and friends. And, finally, let us pray for those who cannot be with family on this holiday due to distance, work or military service.

If you receive this bulletin in the mail in time, please remember to bring some non-perishable food items to church this weekend for the Thanksgiving baskets that will be prepared and delivered by our St. Vincent de Paul Society and will be distributed on Tuesday of this week.

There is also a second collection this weekend: the annual national collection for the support of the Campaign for Human Development. In a letter to the faithful of the Archdiocese, Archbishop Gregory Aymond tells us that:

For nearly 40 years, the Catholic Campaign for Human Development has offered a solution to poverty by funding low-income community groups all over the United States that find lasting solutions to the root causes of poverty. CCHD supports the poor and low-income in acquiring affordable housing, fair wages, access to health care, and vocational training. The leaders of CCHD-funded groups are low-income community members who want to change their situation for a lifetime.

In the Archdiocese of New Orleans, CCHD funds the Jeremiah Group, an interfaith community organizing group that maintains excellent working relationships with both city and state-level decision makers. The group organizes faith leaders to effectively promote social justice in the halls of the capitol, particularly addressing the need for affordable housing. The Jeremiah Group is helping our communities of faith to live our their prophetic call to be a voice for justice and equity in our recovery.

CCHD also funds the Latino Farments' Cooperative of Louisiana. LFCL serves emerging farmers, enthusiastic gardeners and conscientious consumers. LFCL works to provide access to farmland, resources, education and training so members can grow healthy food in urban sustainable farms. They also work to foster entrepreneurship and address the socioeconomic issues of the Latino community.

Please remember that we have only one Mass, at 8:30 a.m., on Thanksgiving Day and on the day following Thanksgiving. Also, please keep in mind that our parish offices are closed on Thanksgiving Day and the following day. The offices will reopen on Monday, November 30 at 9:00 a.m.

REMOVE ABORTION FUNDING

Congress is preparing to debate health care reform legislation on the House and Senate floors. Genuine health care reform should protect the life and dignity of all people from the moment of conception until natural death. The U. S. bishops' conference has concluded that all committee approved bills are seriously deficient on the issues of abortion and conscience, and do not provide adequate access to health care for immigrants and the poor. The bills will have to change or the bishops have pledged to oppose them.

As the U.S. bishops' letter of October 8 states:

It is essential that the legislation clearly apply to this new program longstanding and widely supported federal restrictions on abortion funding and mandates, and protections for rights of conscience. No current bill meets this test...If acceptable language in these areas cannot be found, we will have to oppose the health care bill vigorously."

Dear Parishioners,

Please remember that Tuesday of this week is the Feast of the Immaculate Conception of Mary. This is our national patroness and a national holy day of obligation for us as Catholics. We will have an anticipated Mass of the holy day on Monday, Dec. 7 at 4:00 p.m. Masses on December 8 will be at 6:15 a.m., 8:30 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.

I ask all those who serve as readers, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion, altar servers and ministers of hospitality please to come to the sacristy after Mass this weekend to offer your services at these Masses. A sign-up sheet for needed ministers is on the vesting table.

I would like to share with you this final report on the roof repair of our main building and the campaign which funded the repair.

The final inspection of the roof was done about three weeks ago, and the work was accepted as complete. of course, with a roof repair, you need a few good rainfalls to make sure everything actually is OK and, as I write this bulletin, we are having a rather rainy day and nothing is leaking, so it's looking good!

This repair is a new layer of veral over the older layer, and all of the vents on the roof were repainted and sealed and new flashing put on the outer edge of the building. This recapped roof has a life expectancy of 10 to 15 years, with a written ten-year warranty on the material.

Along the way, there were two change orders from the original scope of the work: additional repairs around an area drain and replacing the dome sky light over the sanctuary, which we found to be cracked. This made the final, total cost of the project \$123, 995.00. As of today, the campaign took in a total of \$124,383.00. The overage, as we had said when we announced the campaign, has been used to pay on our parish debt to the Archdiocese.

Again, I thank all of you who participated in the special, emergency campaign. This shows what we can do when we all make a little sacrifice and all work together!

Thanks are due for two more projects which you have supported extremely well:

Fifty-five families received baskets of food for Thanksgiving, filled with food you provided for our parish St. Vincent de Paul Society. You generous donation of \$2,918.00 to the Thanksgiving Day collection at Mass will allow our Society to continue to provide emergency financial assistance to the needy in our community.

All of the angel ornaments were taken last weekend, which means that needy families will be receiving gifts at Christmastime. Thank you for so generously responding to this annual project. Please remember to bring the wrapped gifts, with the angel tags securely attached on the outside, to church this or next weekend.

Here is an early reminder: Please mark your calendars for our annual parish Christmas caroling on Sunday, December 20 at 6:00 p.m. in the Msgr. Ken Center. This is always a wonderful way to enter into the joy of Christmas!





Dear Parishioners,

As I announced here in the bulletin a few weeks ago, we hope to begin a new parish custom this weekend as we offer Blessing of Expectant Parents. If you are expecting a new addition to your family, and receive this bulletin in time, please telephone the rectory or, even before one of the Masses this weekend, come to the sacristy and let us know you're at that Mass. The blessing will take place following the homily at each of the Masses where we know expectant parents are present.

In the sacristy this weekend are the sign-up sheets for readers, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion and altar servers for the Masses on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day. I ask all those who serve in these ministries please to offer your services for our Christmas Masses and to indicate that on the sign-up sheets.

Ministers of Hospitality, please remember that you will have a meeting on Saturday, December 19 at 10:00 a.m. in the parish Conference Room and will have the opportunity to sign up for Christmas Masses at that meeting.

Please remember that our annual parish Christmas caroling, which includes a light meal and refreshments, will be on Sunday, December 20 at 6:00 p.m. in the Msgr. Kern Center. This is always a very enjoyable evening of parish fellowship, and I encourage all parishioners to join us.

As you begin to make you plans for Christmas and its season, let me remind you that our Christmas Mass schedule is:

December 24 at 4:00 p.m. (our Adult Choir provides the music ministry at this Mass)

December 24 at 6:00 p.m. (our Children's Choir provides music ministry at this Mass)

December 25 at 8:00 a.m.

9:30 a.m.

11:00 a.m. (our Adult Choir returns for this Mass)

Note that, on Christmas Eve morning, we will have only the 8:30 a.m. Mass. There are NO morning Masses the day after Christmas. However, since this will be a Saturday, we WILL have our regular anticipated Mass of Sunday at 4:00 p.m. We also have our regular schedule of Masses on Sunday, December 27. For the Holy Day on January 1, we will have an anticipated Mass on Dec. 31 at 4:00 p.m. Masses on January 1 will be at 9:30 and 11:00 a.m.

Also, please note that both Father Peter and I will be in the Confessionals in church on the evening of Tuesday, December 22 for the Sacrament of Penance, from 6:00-7:00 p.m. This is the last scheduled time for Confessions before Christmas.

Last winter, the heaters in the Kern Center breathed their last. Because the weather remained rather mild and because the replacement cost is high, we delayed this work. However, since we do not want to take another chance on the weather and, because we have a number of activities scheduled for the Center these next few weeks, we have ordered the replacement units. This project will cost \$17,000.00. Perhaps you have noticed that the weekly collections have not met our anticipated budget and, at this time, we do not have this amount of funds in our operating account. With the approval of the parish Finance Council, we have arranged to borrow this money from the Archdiocese, with this being added on to our parish debt. I am hopeful that our Christmas collection will be high and that we will be able to repay at least a part of this new loan quickly.

Please do your best to be faithful to your weekly offering to your parish so that we can maintain our facilities and continue to offer the services you need in parish life.

Once again, I thank all of our parishioners who participated in our Advent/Christmas project, providing gifts for the needy in our community. Altogether, 300 children each received a toy, clothing and shoes for Christmas with the well-over 900 gifts you brought to church! This was a true total parish project, participated in by our parishioners, with some special help from SAMA, CYO, our school families and faculty, Junior Beta Club and Student Council. 
