Dear Parishioners,

How did you do on your Lenten journey? Have you seen, through your acts of prayer, penance and sacrifice, that you can be a better person? Are you more open to listening to God in prayer? More aware of the needs of others, and how your outreach can help them? More sensitive to those who are in need of your prayerful support? If you are, then you have a special appreciation of the new life in Christ that was the goal of the journey we set out on together forty days ago. Sacrifice, repentance, conversion lead to life — for ourselves and others. As we freely unite ourselves with the sacrifice of Christ, we also unite ourselves in being, for others, the gift of salvation, bringing them new hope, new courage, new life.

Please bring to Mass next weekend your baby bottles in support of ACCESS Pregnancy Counseling Services or your rice bowl in support of Catholic Relief services. Bins will be on tables in the sanctuary for you to place your contribution before or after Mass. We will see, as the returns grow with each Mass, our Lenten sacrifice and prayer come to fulfillment.

We extend congratulations and welcome to all those throughout our Church who will share in the Easter Sacraments of Initiation this weekend and a special word of welcome to Neivan Morantez of our own community who will be Baptized, Confirmed and share in the Eucharist for the first time at the Easter Vigil.

As we see nature around us come back to life, we celebrate with joy the new life of Christ that is ours this Easter Day. On behalf of all the members of our pastoral staff, I wish you and your families a very Happy Easter!

In order that our staff may enjoy an Easter break, please remember that our parish offices are closed on Easter Monday and that there are no Masses that day. We return to our regular Mass schedule and regular office hours on Tuesday.

Please remember the two special activities that I told you about in last week's bulletin: Faith and Family Night at the Zephyrs baseball game on Saturday, April 24 and the tour of churches on Saturday, May 22.

Our parish CYO is coordinating the Zephyrs game and tickets must be ordered by Monday, April 12. Tickets are only \$7.00 each, so this could be an affordable evening for your family as you join with others of our parish family for the game.

The trip to three new churches on the Northshore is an offering of our Adult Faith Formation program and begins with an overview of the document, "Built of Living Stones." The tour, by air conditioned motor coach, includes lunch.

Please contact the rectory office for more information or to make reservations for either event.

During this Easter Season, youth of our parish will be completing their preparation for and will be sharing in Sacraments of Initiation. Teens of our parish will welcome Bishop Shelton Fabre back to our parish on May 13 as

l ask all parishioners to keep these young people of our parish in your prayers in a special way during these final weeks of their preparation for these sacraments.

On Thursday, April 15, at the meeting of our Senior Citizens Club. I will make the presentation on the master plan for parish facilities. I URGE you to complete and return this card in order that our parish Finance Council can prepare the budget for the coming fiscal year. When each of us does their part, our common efforts allows us to accomplish much.

The Scriptures put this question on the lips of each one of us, "What return shall I make to the Lord for all of his goodness to me?" Please consider this question as it applies to your financial support of your parish.



Dear Parishioners,

On behalf of all of our parish, I would like to say "Thank you" to all those who helped to make the liturgies of Holy Week, the Paschal Triduum and Easter such beautiful, meaningful and moving experiences of prayer. There were members of our Liturgy Committee who did the planning, the many liturgical ministers who offered their services, those who helped decorate the church for each service, those who helped set up and clean up, those who provided palms and those who helped clean and prepare them. Many hours of preparation, many hands and a whole lot of heart was put into these liturgies and the results were a blessing to all who took part in them. To those who helped in any way, I thank you all!

If you did not participate in the liturgies of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil, I think you missed a real opportunity to experience and join in some of our Church's most beautiful prayers. I hope that next year more parishioners will schedule their activities to include these moving services.

During the Parish Mission at the beginning of Lent, I sat in the section of church nearest the Blessed Mother's shrine. I admit that I don't hear too well to begin with (too much rock-and-roll coming through my headphones at way too many decibels in my teenage years!), but I really had to work at hearing Bishop Fabre's reflections. I found that particularly frustrating because I actually thought that we had addressed that problem in an earlier fix of the sound system. Obviously, I was very wrong.

And so, we have once again had some work done to try to improve the sound system in church. This work was done during Holy Week and will be in need of some fine tuning in the weeks ahead. This time we think we have found the right consultant and audio company to work with us. While there were a few glitches during our Triduum liturgies, they are ones that can be easily fixed. On the whole, I think we are moving in the right direction. Please let me know if things are getting better from where you sit!

We expect that very soon the team of carpenters Jackie Appleton and I met with before Easter will be able to be here to do some work modifying several pews in church to allow for wheelchairs to be accommodated in the pews. We will have several places in each of the three seating areas of church for those with wheelchairs or walkers to be able to sit with the rest of the assembly and to sit with their families. I hope that this new accessibility will make all feel more welcomed in our community and comfortable at our community prayer.

We are now looking into the possibility of making at least one door to the church fully handicapped accessible. This may take us a little time, so I ask your patience on this new project.

On Thursday, April 15, our Senior Citizens Club will sponsor, as they do each year, a Morning of Reflection, to which all parishioners are invited. It begins with Mass at 8:30 a.m. and continues until Noon.

This year's speaker will be Sister Judith Gomilla.

Please remember to keep in your prayers the youth of our parish who will be celebrating their First Holy Communion on Sunday, May 2, and those teens of our parish who will welcome Bishop Shelton Fabre back to our parish for their reception of the Sacrament of Confirmation on Thursday, May 13.

As I have mentioned to you before, I currently continue to serve as the ecclesiastical master of ceremonies for the Southeastern Lieutenancy of the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulcher of Jerusalem, a group whose special mission it is to support the Christians in the Holy Land.

I will be attending the annual meeting of this group next weekend. I will be leaving the parish on Thursday, April 15 and will return on Tuesday, April 20.

If you have a little room in your prayers, please pray for safe travels for me and all who will be attending this meeting.

We begin again our sessions to explain to you the proposed new master plan for our parish campus.

Our architect and I will be making this presentation at the Senior Citizens' Club meeting on Thursday, April 15 at Noon. You do not have to be a member of the club to come to this part of their meeting!

There will be another presentation on Saturday, April 24 at 9:00 a.m. in the parish Conference Room, repeated on Sunday, April 25 in church immediately following the 11:00 a.m. Mass.

Dear Parishioners,

There are two sessions remaining for you to hear about the master plan for our campus, as developed by an *ad hoc* committee of our Pastoral Council: today, immediately following the 11:00 a.m. Mass in church and Tuesday, May 4 at 7:00 p.m. in the parish Conference Room. 

A member of the architectural firm that worked with us on the development of this plan and I will each make a presentation and there will be time for your questions and comments.

I remind you that, at this time, presenting and explaining the plan is all we are about. This committee was set in place to develop the plan, and that is what they have done. Their work was accepted by the Pastoral Council as the completion of the goal that was set in our planning process of Catholic Life 2007.

Should this plan (as we hope!) meet with your approval, we may want to discuss further development toward the implementation of the plan in the goal-setting we will do in January, 2011, following the next round of needs assessments that will take place this Fall. But more about that part later in the year!

There are still openings for our trip on Saturday, May 22 to learn about the document of the Bishops of the United States about church design and furnishing, *Built of Living* Stones, and to tour three new churches in our diocese to see how they implemented the instructions of this document. We will also have lunch during the day and we will return in time for the 4:00 p.m. Mass that afternoon.

In order to lower the cost significantly to make this opportunity more open for our parishioners, we will be using cars instead of a bus. The cost for the tour will be \$20.00 per person. This includes lunch at Friends Restaurant in Madisonville during the day. Because of restaurant accommodations, we are limited to 25 people, so please call soon to make your reservation.

Archbishop Gregory Aymond has asked all parishes to participate in a postcard campaign to our members of Congress, supporting and joining with the Bishops of the United States in their call for comprehensive immigration reform.

The position of the Bishops is this:

In January, 2003, the U.S. Bishops outlined principles for comprehensive immigration reform in their pastoral statement, Strangers No Longer: Together on the Journey of Hope. They state that any just immigration reform should include the following elements: 1) a broad-based legalization of the undocumented, which includes a path to citizenship; 2) a worker program which creates legal avenues for migrants to enter the United States legally and safely and which includes labor protections for both U.S. and foreign workers; 3) reform of the family-based immigration system to reduce waiting times for family reunification; 4) the restoration of due process for immigrants, taken away in 1996. so immigrants can have their day in court; and 5) policies which address the roots causes of migration, such as unemployment and underemployment in sending countries.

This weekend (May 2 and 3), a packet of prepared post cards will be available at the doors of the church. You need only fill in your name and address, the names of our Senators and Representative and return the card to the tables where you picked them up when you come to church during this week or next weekend May 9-10. We will bring the completed cards to the Archdiocese, and they will take care of getting them to our Congresspersons.

Archbishop Aymond feels that this is an important issue that Congress will be discussing and seeking to address in the months ahead, and feels that now is the opportune time for your voice to be heard in solidarity with our Bishops. Please consider participating in this postcard campaign.



Dear Parishioners,

As I write this note to you, we still have a few openings for the tour of churches on Saturday, May 22, and I really think that you should consider joining us. This is more than merely a visit: it is a learning opportunity for adults interested in church design, church architecture and sacred art.

As you may know, one of my outside-the-parish ministries is to serve as a liturgical consultant on the design, renovation and decorating of churches in our Archdiocese. So, we will begin our day at 9:00 a.m. in the Conference Room, where I will share with you the basic principles of church design and furnishings as we find them in recent Church documents, especially the documents, *Built of Living Stones*, published by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops.

Then, we will have the opportunity to see how these principles were executed at three new churches in our Archdiocese: Mary, Queen of Peace in Mandeville, St. Anselm in Madisonville, and Our Lady of Lourdes in Slidell. I served as liturgical consultant on the Mandeville and Slidell churches and they were designed by Kieran Weldon of Fauntleroy and Latham Architects, who has developed with us our proposed new master plan for our campus.

The extra treat in this (other than hearing me speak, of course!), is that Our Lady of Lourdes Church has just been dedicated (May 15), and so we will be among the first to see this new church, replacing one that was destroyed by Hurricane Katrina.

We will have lunch (seafood gumbo, salad, coffee or tea and dessert) at Friends on the Tchefuncte Restaurant in Madisonville and expect to be back in the parish in time for the 4:00 p.m. Mass Saturday afternoon. Cost for the entire day is \$20.00 person.

We will be car-pooling and the restaurant is limiting seating for lunch, so if you'd like to join us, please telephone Sr. Paula at 837-9347.

It's something of a whirlwind of activity for the next several weeks as our school year comes to its conclusion. Pre-K3 has its end-of-the-year party this Tuesday and Pre-K4 follows on Wednesday. Kindergarten students have their party on Thursday and their Promotion Ceremony will be on Friday morning. The end of the year Mass for our school community will be on Wednesday, May 26 at 10:00 a.m. and 7th Grade Promotion follows that afternoon at 1:00 p.m. The school Awards Assembly will be on Friday of that week and dismissal for all students follows at 11:30 a.m.

We have certainly missed the daily presence of our Principal, Colleen Remont, as she continued to be treated for her illness, but have seen her pretty regularly during the year and have been bolstered by the good news that she is responding well to treatments and is on the road to remission and recovery, and should be back full time when the school offices reopen later this Summer. Special thanks to Joan Madere for her good work as our Acting Principal!

On the whole, this has been a very good school year. Our children learned, as the theme of this year challenged them, how to "Put Your Best Foot Forward." Now they can take the values implied in that challenge, and their new learning on how to meet the challenge, into all of their Summer activities and family life.

We have now completed the series of seven sessions, sharing with you the proposed master plan for the continuing development of our parish campus to meet the needs of our parish organizations, and ministries (including our school ministry). I am very happy to share with you the *very* good news that the proposal was very well received by all who participated in these sessions. In fact, no negative views were expressed at any of the meetings, and there even was some enthusiasm for trying to implement the plan sooner rather than later.

I estimate that the sessions were attended by about 600 parishioner altogether, and so hearing positive comments from that many folks was extremely encouraging!

This completes the goal set by the Pastoral and Finance Councils and School Board: that we continue aggressively to retire the parish debt and develop a new master plan for our campus to meet current and anticipated future needs. It is my firm hope that, when we begin a new round of needs assessments this Fall, we will hear a call for us to proceed with the implementation of the plan and projecting a time-line for that implementation, but we shall see!

When things quiet down just a bit after school ends, I will put the information about the master plan on our parish web site, and I'll let you know when that material appears there, particularly for the benefit of those who were not able to be at any of the meetings.

Dear Parishioners,

Your neighbors need you!

As we announced in church two weekends ago, Archbishop Gregory has asked that a special collection be taken up to allow Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese to continue to assist the people of the Gulf Coast communities of Louisiana in the face of the worsening oil spill. As the Archbishop said in his letter to us, Catholic Charities has been on the scene from the beginning of this tragedy to provide counseling, financial aid and food to those already seriously affected. Your financial support will allow those services to continue.

There will be a second collection this weekend (May 29-30), and we ask your most generous support. This disaster is threatening the very way of life for those involved in the fishing and tourism industries of the coast, and we can help.

Also, our parish food bank is seriously low. With the economic downturn lingering, the members of our St. Vincent de Paul Society have been called upon by more people in our neighborhood than ever before. We have been providing emergency financial assistance and non-perishable food item to more families than we used to. During the month of June, I ask you to consider bringing one or two canned or boxed food goods to church when you come to Mass each weekend. If everyone helps out a little bit, we will be able to help many in the weeks ahead.

You heard the appeal from members of our parish Finance Council last weekend, and I join them in urging your cooperation with our annual stewardship appeal.

It is time for us to finalize a budget for the parish for the new fiscal year that will begin on July 1. Back in February, I sent to each registered family a letter and a response card, asking you to let us know what your regular financial contribution to your parish will be beginning July 1 and continuing through that fiscal year. Regrettably, only 20% of parish families returned their intent cards. If we do not know how much we will be receiving in church support, we cannot budget accurately. That is why we need your cooperation.

Also, you know that your household expenses rise each year. So, too, do the expenses of your parish. I ask that you consider an increase in your parish financial support. We told you that this year's budget was based on a weekly income from the Mass collections to total \$16,000.00. If you are in the habit of looking at the weekly reporting here in the bulletin, you will know that collections have been off. In response, we have done our best to monitor and reduce expenses. We have done pretty well with that, but at this point we are in a deficit of about \$8,000.00 and we still have six weeks remaining in this fiscal year.

If next year's collections do not project an increase, we will have to look to cut items from the budget or seriously reduce expenses in some areas. But, of course, we do not want to resort to that unless we have to. By completing and returning your intent card, we will have a better idea what to plan for.

If you did not complete the intent card mailed to you a few months ago, please take a moment to clip and complete this form. Place it in the collection this weekend — with your financial contribution, of course! — so that we can process the returns quickly and proceed with budget planning.

This is important, so please take a few moments to show your financial support of your parish and its ministries.

Father Peter is out of the parish this weekend, participating in the ordination and Mass of Thanksgiving of a close friend of his in Kansas City.

We congratulate Fr. Jim Schott on his birthday today (May 30) and our music director, Peter Weilbaecher, on his birthday on Tuesday of this week and Fr. Peter on the 5th anniversary of his ordination on Friday.

The "Year of the Priest" ends on June 19 with a "Meeting of Priests" with Pope Benedict in St. Peter's Square. During this year, you were asked to pray for the growth in holiness of all of us who serve you as priests. Many of you committed yourself to a regular offering of prayer and many special activities for priests were held during the year, as people showed appreciation for the ministry that priests offer each and every day.

Father Peter and I join together to thank you, the people of St. Angela Parish, for your prayerful support this past year. We thank you for your daily acceptance of us and our ministry. We appreciate the kind gestures and words you have offered us way before as well as during this Year of the Priest.

At the recommendation of one of our parishioners, we would like to bring this Year of the Priest to a close here in our parish. We will take up a special collection to send Father Peter and me to Rome JUST KIDDING!!!

Actually, we are suggesting that you send an "End of the Year of the Priest Thank-You Note" to one priest who has served you and your family well over the years, whose example of spirituality and holiness and faithful ministry has in some way touched your life personally or the life of your family.

I will say a bit more about this in next week's bulletin and we will provide you with a sample note as well.

Dear Parishioners,

THANK YOU for your concern for our neighbors!

The special collection for Catholic Charities to continue to provide emergency assistance to the people of Gulf Coast of our Archdiocese was a very generous \$ 7,217.50

By the end of the weekend, the food collection boxes in church were overflowing, making a great start at replenishing our parish food bank.

That's the good news. The not-so-good-news is that, sadly, the tragic oil spill continues and more and more people's lives are being negatively affected. When those who fish do not have adequate income, the merchants in the area begin to suffer. When merchants sell less, their suppliers need to bring less. When no one is shopping, workers at stores are not needed. The same sad sentence could be reiterated by those who find their jobs in the tourism industry. Please keep our neighbors on the Coast in your prayers each day. Pray as Archbishop Aymond has asked us, this simple but sincere daily prayer: "Through the intercession of Our Lady of Prompt Succor, may God protect the people and the environment of the Gulf Coast."

While the shelves of the food bank are filling up, the need continues. In recent months, the members of our St. Vincent de Paul Society have been assisting a record number of people. Full shelves will not remain full for long, and so I urge you to continue each weekend this month to bring a few non-perishable food items to church. We need our pantry's shelves not to be full, but to overflow.

We're going to give this one more try: Way back in February, I sent a letter to each registered family of our parish, sharing with you the importance of your faithful financial support of your parish. With that letter was a card, which I asked you, on behalf of our parish Finance Council, to complete and to return so that we could begin to budget for the fiscal year that will begin on July 1. We received back information from about 20% of our parish households. So, several weeks ago, members of our Finance Council spoke at each of the Masses, asking those who had not yet responded to do so, as the new fiscal year is rapidly approaching. We reproduced in the bulletin two weeks ago a copy of that intent card and made more cards available in church. Unfortunately, returns still have not been very good. From the appeal in church and in the bulletin, we have received only about 61 more responses. *PLEASE*, if you have not yet done so, complete the information at the end of my column, clip it and return it in the collection this weekend.

If you read the bulletin regularly, you have seen that our collections have been down for the past several months. While we occasionally have a "good" weekend, most of the time the collection has been in the \$11,000 to \$12,000 range each week.

That is well below our budgeted 2009-2010 weekly projection of a \$14,000 to \$16,000 weekly income from the collection. Thus far, we are running a deficit of about \$7,000 for the current fiscal year. The reason we are only that much behind, in spite of the lower than anticipated collections, is that we simply have not done some of the things for which we had budgeted – e.g., fewer adult faith formation opportunities, fewer ministry formation sessions, deferring some improvements to, and ordinary repair of parish facilities.

To make certain that we can budget rightly for the next fiscal year, we need to have a good idea of anticipated revenue. If you can increase your offering in the new fiscal year, that's wonderful. If you cannot, that is certainly understandable in these difficult financial times. But, either way, your Finance Council needs to know. If each of us do our conscientious part, we'll be OK. Can we count on you?





Dear Parishioners,

HAPPY FATHER'S DAY to all the fathers, grandfathers and godfathers in our parish community! Please be assured that we will keep you in our prayers in a special way at all of our Masses this weekend.

We also hold in our prayers deceased fathers, that the God and Father of us all will welcome them to his heavenly home.

I want to offer this follow-up to our final request for your completing the parish financial intent forms that we made available several times these past weeks.

We currently have 1952 households registered as parishioners here at St. Angela Merici. Of these, 996 households are what we call "identified contributors," that is, they either contribute financially to the parish by automatic debit from their bank accounts, use the church support envelopes or make contributions by check, thus allowing us to keep record of name and address. During the course of this intent appeal, 484 households responded. That means that, of all our registered parishioners, 25% have indicated to us how we can rely on them for our ordinary parish income through the collection.

From this information, our Finance Council will now project anticipated income from the collection and other sources and finalize the proposed budget for the new fiscal year that will begin July 1.

When we have completed the annual financial report we send each July to the Archdiocese, we will share that with you so that you can see how your stewardship during the past fiscal year was managed in support of parish life and ministries and our financial commitment to the Archdiocese. At that time, we will also share with you the budget projections (income and expenses) for the new fiscal year.

As you might recall, each year I give you, at Mass one Sunday, what I call my annual "State of the Parish Report." Since I will be away for a few weeks, and since many parish families travel during these Summer months, I will share that reflection with you at all of the Masses on the weekend of August 14-15.

Speaking of vacation, I will be leaving for mine today, following the Masses. I'll be using some of this time to travel with my sister and some friends and then spending some quiet time and catching up on housework and garden work at my place in Mississippi. Please keep me and my travel companions in your prayers, and know that you will be in mine. I will return on July 19, which is the same day Father Peter will be leaving for his vacation, returning on August 6.

Father Jim Schott will also be out of town for a while around the week of the Fourth of July.

While I am away, I have asked other members on the parish staff to take over this space in the bulletin. You will be reading messages from Fr. Peter, Sr. Paula, Mrs. Colleen Remont (our school Principal) and Jackie Appleton (our Business Manager).

Also, arriving soon in our parish is Father Philip Odii. Father is a priest of Uganda who studied here at Notre Dame Seminary. He will be on his Summer holiday and will be here in the U.S. to visit classmates and friends. He was looking for a rectory to reside in during his stay, and we have offered him hospitality here at St. Angela for the month of July. In return, he has offered to assist with sacramental ministry, and thus will be helping us by presiding at both weekday and weekend Masses during his stay. Father Philip is expected to arrive here at St. Angela June 27 or 28. Please extend a warm welcome to Father Philip and make him feel at home for the month he will be spending at St. Angela.

With Father Philip, Fr. Schott and Msgr. Carroll helping out, we have "covered" nearly all Masses for the Summer, even with all of us traveling a bit. There are only a few days we will need other priests to assist with weekday morning Masses, and we are working on this. However, if we are not able to find this help, there may be a few days this Summer when we will have to cancel the 6:15 a.m. Mass. Of course, we will let you know those days in advance through announcements here in the bulletin.

THANKS to all who helped make Summer Safari a big success: Sr. Paula, adult and teen volunteers, parents who registered their children and the young people who participated!

We received an invitation this week, addressed to the Parishioners and Staff of St. Angela Merici Church. It is an invitation for all to participate in the ordination to the priesthood of Deacon Peter Finney, a young man from our Archdiocese who has been studying in Rome. Deacon Finney will be ordained on Saturday, July 10 at 10:00 a.m. in St. Louis Cathedral.

There is a parish connection here. Deacon Peter Finney is the nephew of Barbara Finney Weilbaecher, wife of our parish Music Director, Peter Weilbaecher.

I hope that some of you will be able to join in this special celebration.

That Deacon Finney is the only one being ordained this year for service in our Archdiocese as a priest, we are all reminded of the importance of praying for and promoting vocations!






