Keep in mind that most of the proceeds from the Fair go to the support of our school ministry. The financial success of this year's Fair is crucial. While our school's Finance Committee does an excellent job at budgeting for the school year, this year we registered fewer students than we had anticipated, and so our school's projected income will be much lower than we had anticipated. We need the proceeds of the Fair to help us not only meet budgeted expenses, but to compensate for the projected shortfall for this year. I am, therefore, unabashedly asking you to come to the Fair and spend LOTS of money: you have a good time and you help support our school at the same time. What could be less painless?!?!?

We will, of course share with you information about the financial success of the Fair as soon as we can when Fair bills have been paid and income and expense reports reconciled.

Just a reminder that I will be away from the parish from Monday through Saturday morning, as I participate in the annual meeting of the Federation of Diocesan Liturgical Commissions, attending as one of the representatives from our Archdiocese.

Our region is hosting this year's meeting, with over two hundred delegates from throughout the United States coming to the meeting in Alexandria, LA. We hope that they will all enjoy our Southern hospitality.

Please keep me in your prayers this week, for safety in my travels and for a profitable meeting.

Next weekend, on Saturday, October 9, we observe the memorial of St. Francis of Assisi. and we will again offer the **Blessing of Pets** that day. St. Francis manifested a respect and love for all of God's creatures and it has become a tradition in our Church of offering that blessing on his feast day. The blessing will be in the school yard at 6:00 p.m. on Saturday, October 9.

For the blessing, all pets must be leashed or caged. The school yard will be closed immediately after the 4:00 p.m. Mass that day, with parking permitted in the faculty parking area between the Center and the Annex and in the area behind the Center, near the early childhood play area.

There is, of course, parking on the street as well. The remainder of the parking lot will be closed for the safety of those participating in the blessing.

Refreshments will be served following the blessing. Please note that we will not celebrate the Sacrament of Penance that afternoon so that we can clear the parking area of all vehicles and prepare what is needed outside for the blessing. If you desire to share in this sacrament, please contact Fr. Peter or me at the rectory for an appointment at another time.

On Friday of this week, October 8 at 10:00 a.m. our school community will gather in church for a special prayer service that will include the Installation of Beta Club members and recently-elected members of this year's Student Council. Parishioners are invited to join in this service, which Father Peter will lead, and to join in prayer for these new leaders in our school.

As you would suspect, all parishes in our Church have much in common as we seek the build up the reign of Christ through our varied ministries, organizations and programs. All parishes, for instance, have liturgical ministers who serve the community's prayer. Every parish, by the mandate of Canon Law has a Finance Council that oversees, with the pastor, the parish's temporalities and helps make certain that financial resources are stewarded properly. By Archdiocesan mandate, each parish is to have a Pastoral Council, a consultative body in the parish to help foster the parish's spiritual growth.

But, then, every parish is different as well. Every parish seems to have one or several ministries, organizations, or activities that are unique to that community. St. Angela Merici is no exception to this.

I have served in a number of different parishes in my thirty-seven years as a priest, but this is the first parish that I have been a part of that has a "Parish Prayer Line." I think this is a wonderful ministry, and I want to say a few words to encourage more of you to participate in it.

The purpose of the Prayer Line is simple: we pray for one another, particularly those in our parish in special need. The process is simple: you let us know who in our parish, in your family, among your friends is in need and we include that person in the weekly e-mail that is sent out. You can keep us all informed of how that person's situation progresses as we include them in our prayer.

The prayer line is sent out in "blind e-mail" form, so that no one knows your e-mail address except for our Prayer Line coordinator, Elaine Ridgley. The address you provide for us is used ONLY for sending the weekly Prayer Line information and is never made available to anyone else.

I have always valued this kind of intercessory prayer. I have asked others to pray for me; I have appreciated the support when others tell me they pray for me. I have promised to and have prayed for those who have asked my prayers. This has always been a great support to me in my ministry and has been an important part of my ministry.

I strongly encourage you to join in this parish family prayer. To join the Prayer Line, please contact our parish secretary, Dianne Goodrow (835-0324 or dianne@stangela.org) and she will pass along your e-mail address to Elaine.

I want to thank Elaine Ridgley for her good and faithful service as our Prayer Line coordinator. We are truly grateful for the time she invests in this parish service.

Dear Parishioners.

I have mentioned before, I am a member of and the ecclesiastical master of ceremonies for the Southeastern Lieutenancy of the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem, an international group committed to the support of the Christian people and the Catholic ministries of the Holy Land. This group of extremely generous benefactors provides great support for those Christians who live and work in the area where Jesus himself lived and ministered, where the message of God's love and salvation was made flesh in this world in Christ.

Sadly, the number of Christians in the Holy Land continues to decrease. The tensions and difficulties there are not only religious but also political and economic. Who will control land and who will control access to and rights to water are significant issues. I was overwhelmed on my pilgrimage to the Holy Land two years ago to see the wall built around certain areas, basically confining the Christian communities in, and the resultant challenges these people face in getting to work, to vital services, even to shopping.

Rami M. Qumsieh is a resident of the Holy Land who has begun a ministry to seek on-going support for those Christians who live and work there. He works diligently to support the only active Catholic TV station in the Holy Land. Last week received this note from him that I want to share with you. Mr. Qumsieh writes:

Pope Benedict XVI will head a Synod of clergy, religious and laity at the Vatican. From October 10-24, 2010, this Special Assembly will focus on the Christians of the Middle East. The Synod of Bishops will meet and pray, discuss and debate the Christians who live and lived in the land sanctified by the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. For centuries, there has not been a gathering of this magnitude. The Christian presence in the Middle East is crushed; yet we seldom hear or read about the plight of he Christian character of the Holy Land. As we pray during Mass, "... and the good of all His Church." I ask you in a special way to pray for the success of this Synod. The ramifications of a strong vibrant Christian community in the Middle East impact directly our safety here in the West. PEACE.

I ask you to add this intention to your personal prayer this week, as this Synod and Assembly continue.

In November, we will have the opportunity to support this Catholic TV station, as we welcome a member of Holy Land Direct to our parish to hear him speak about this situation. We will also have at that time religious olive wood articles, hand made in the Holy Land by the Christian community for sale. Proceeds from this sale support the Catholics who live in the Holy Land. Their visit with us will be during the first weekend in November.

Also coming to St. Angela during November for a special visit is retired Archbishop Philip M. Hannan. He will be here following the 4:00 p.m. Mass on Saturday, November 13. He will have autographed copies of his most recent book for sale and will be available to meet parishioners and to take photos with you.

Please mark this date on your calendar. Of course, I'll also be reminding you about his visit in future issues of the bulletin.

I hope that you remember that we have a pattern here in our parish of conducting needs assessments gatherings for parishioners and then having our parish Staff meet with members of the Pastoral Council, Finance Council and School Board to review those needs and to set short and long-range goals for our parish as we develop a three-year parish pastoral plan. We begin this month a series of meetings that will help us shape future ministries and activities for our parish, as we gather for needs assessment. Sr. Paula and I will be at the meetings of parish organizations during November to conduct the needs assessment. But we know that not all parishioners are members of these organizations (SALA, SAMA, Senior Citizens, Co-Op) and not all members can attend every meeting, therefore, we have scheduled several other needs assessment gatherings that are open to all parishioners, and the first of those will be on **Thursday**, **October 28** at 7:00 p.m.. This meeting will be in the Parish Conference Room.

I urge you to make every effort to participate in this process. What we hear from you will determine the direction and development of ministries and activities for our parish in the years to come. The entire process will be valuable only if we share our thoughts openly, listen to each other carefully and plan together with genuine openness to the movement of the Holy Spirit among us.

There will be other open meetings and I will let you know those dates as they get closer.

Please also pray for the success of this process here in our parish.

Dear Parishioners,

We extend a warm word of welcome to Archbishop Philip M. Hannan, retired Archbishop of New Orleans, who is with us this weekend (Saturday, November 13). The Archbishop, now 97 years old, is with us to visit with and chat with parishioners and also has available for purchase (\$25.00 each) autographed copies of his new book autobiography, *The Archbishop Wore Combat Boots*.

Archbishop Hannan will be in church from 5:00-6:00 p.m. Please plan to stop by for a few minutes to visit with him.

If you choose to purchase a copy of the book, cash and checks will be accepted. Please make out the check to "Archbishop Philip Hannan."

"All are welcome in this place." I am certain that you recognize these words from one of the hymns we regularly sing in church. These words, first and foremost, remind us of the gratuity of God's love. Our God welcomes us. God, whose heart is filled with unconditional love, wants to welcome us to this sacred place to hear the wisdom and truth of the divine word, is eager to welcome us to feast on the Body and Blood of the Risen Christ in the Eucharist. God's heart is a heart of ready welcome.

But the words of this hymn are also a challenge to us. There is the challenge of looking into our own hearts to ask ourselves if we are as welcoming of others as God is of us. As we look around the church at Mass, singing that hymn, are we truly open to welcoming into our hearts each and every person we see there with us? Or do little grudges we hold on to make us less welcoming of someone who may have harmed us, deliberately or inadvertently; do our prejudices buried within us well up as we see people of different nationalities or races? "All are welcome," we sing, and the words challenge

And, while there is nothing we can do to merit God's freely-given love, there is nonetheless the challenge for each of us to examine our own lives and ask if we live the kind of life that is the grateful and proper response to God's welcome. Should God welcome me just as I am, or is there some wrong from my past I need to right, some reconciliation with another I need to seek, some aspect of my life's actions that I need to change that will allow me to fully appreciate God's ready welcome and my place in this assembly?

And, there is a challenge, too, for us to make our churches a place where all do feel welcome. There are many with physical disabilities who may not feel welcomed when the structure and arrangement of the church does not meet their needs. I am happy to let you know that we are taking steps to make our church more welcoming for all.

Thanks to a very generous monetary donation from one of our parishioners, we have cut down one pew in each of the three seating sections of the church to accommodate those with walkers, crutches or in wheel chairs, allowing adequate space for them in places where they can now sit with their family members or caretakers who bring them to church. We are still looking for the right kind of signs to designate these seats more clearly, so this is still a work in progress! The creation of these three spaces was the first step.

The donated funds will allow us to create three more handicapped seating areas. But I would like your input on where the final three pew spaces should be. Currently, all three already completed are off the side aisles. Do you want some off the center aisle in each section? Is the front of church better for seeing and hearing, or is the back of the seating area better for quicker access from the parking areas? Should we put one more in each seating section or group them close to the two areas nearer the handicapped parking spots in the school yard? After I hear your input, we will then do the work needed on the pews and have six handicapped pews in church. I hope that this will keep us in the direction of helping each person feel that "all are welcome in this place."

Archbishop Gregory Aymond now has a weekly video blog. In this brief video (about ten minutes each week), the Archbishop shares reflections on current events in the universal Church and in our Archdiocesan Church as well. It is posted on the internet by noon each Friday. I encourage you to make viewing the Archbishop's blog a part of your week. You can access the Archbishop's blog through the Archdiocesan web site, www.arch-no.org.

By the way, the Archbishop turned 61 on his birthday this week, November 12. May the Lord continue to grant him many more years of happy and fruitful ministry with us here in the Archdiocese!





Dear Parishioners.

As you may know, I had the privilege of serving in the Office of Worship of the Archdiocese for fourteen years: two years as Associate Director and twelve as Director. I truly enjoyed this ministry, some of which was on a full-time basis, and sometimes part-time while I also served as pastor of a parish and as rector of St. Louis Cathedral. Even though I did leave that service some years ago, I have always remained active in liturgy in the Archdiocese, serving as a liturgical consultant on the construction of new churches, as a master of ceremonies and as one of the representatives of the Archdiocese to the regional and national meetings of the Federations of Diocesan Liturgical Commissions.

During a recent conversation with Archbishop Gregory Aymond, I have agreed to return to part-time service as the Director of the Office of Worship. I feel that my knowledge of, experience in and love for the liturgy will continue to prove beneficial for this service to our Archdiocesan Church.

The thought of two jobs frightens me a bit, with a parish as large and as active as ours, but I have already worked out with Father Peter the realignment of a few responsibilities and, with his cooperation and the support of our Pastoral Staff, I think this will be do-able.

Father Ray Hymel, our former associate pastor is currently in the Office and will remain on the staff, in the same capacity in which he now serves. This July, we hope to have a new full-time associate director in the Office of Worship, and that will be a great addition.

My service in the Office will require some office time at the Archdiocesan Administration during the regular work-week, but much of what is necessary can be done by phone, fax and e-mail. I've always said that I'd rather be busy than be bored, and I am sure now that there will be no room for boredom in my life or even in my vocabulary! This additional assignment will begin on the First Sunday of Advent. Keep me in your prayers!

Please remember that our parish Thanksgiving Day Mass will be this week, November 25 at 8:30 a.m. Remember, too, that there is no 6:15 a.m. Mass that day.

Our Thanksgiving Mass affords us a very fitting way to begin this civic holiday as our forebears did, thanking God for the blessings of this land in the freedom we have and in the bounty of this land.

Please consider participating in Mass on Thanksgiving Day!

THANK YOU for your positive reaction to the presentation by Mr. Rami Qumsieh about the challenging situation faced by Christians in the Holy Land. And, of course, special thanks for the tremendous support you gave to those Christians by your purchase of hand-made olive wood religious articles after each Mass. Mr. Oumsieh told Father Peter and me before he left of how gratified he was by your attentiveness to his presentation and by how many of you took the time to stop by to chat with him in the Conference Room after each Mass and your purchases of these products. Rami had told me that he will be sending, when he gets back to his office, a letter for me to share with you, which I will do. He went from here to the Diocese of Houma-Thibodeaux to make a presentation to the priests of one of the deaneries in that diocese, so I expect that the letter will be coming from him in time for next week's bulletin.

As I have done before, please allow me to remind you that, when a death occurs in your family, it is appropriate for you to contact Fr. Peter and me here at the rectory **before** you go to the funeral home to make arrangements. In that way, we can let you know what days and times one of us will be available for the funeral liturgy, so that there will be no confusion when you are with the funeral director. Certainly no date or time should be published in the newspaper until we have all agreed on that time. This one call to the rectory can save all of us frustration or misunderstanding later.

Please keep in mind, too, that if a family member is critically ill, Father Peter or I would like to come to visit and offer the Church's beautiful and consoling prayers with the sick person and the entire family who can be present.

Please do not besitate to call us.

Even when there is a sudden, unexpected death, please call so that we can come and offer with you and for the deceased the special prayers the Church has at the time of death.

When we are at liturgies or at meetings, we may not be able to answer the emergency line, but you can leave a message on our message recorder and we will get back in touch with you as quickly as we can.

This year we will once again have as our special parish Advent project, in association with Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese of New Orleans "Christmas angels," which will allow you to purchase Christmas gifts for some very needy children in our community. The angel tags, with children's names and gift suggestions, will be available on the First Sunday of Advent, November 27-28. The gift-wrapped packages are to be returned to church on the weekend of December 11-12, so that they can be brought to the children's homes before Christmas.

This has, in the past, been a very well-received parish project, and I hope that you will help make it a success again this year!



The Collection for the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD) is approaching in our archdiocese. CCHD carries out Jesus' mission to "bring glad tidings to the poor...to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free" (Luke 4:18)

Shortly after the oil tragedy in the Gulf began, the Bishops of the United States allocated funds specifically for groups working to empower people in the highly affected areas along the Gulf Coast. Here in the Archdiocese of New Orleans, CCHD provided much needed support to three organizations: the United Commercial Fisherman's Association, the Louisiana Oysterman's Association, and the Louisiana Bucket Brigade. Both the United Commercial Fisherman's Association and the Louisiana Oysterman's Association are working directly with those most affected by the spill to advocate for just solutions to the challenges they face. Meanwhile, the Louisiana Bucket Brigade is empowering citizens to report sightings of oil or the scent of oil.

In addition to these special emergency grants, the Catholic Campaign for Human Development funds both the Micah Project and the Latino Farmers Cooperative of Louisiana. Micah works with churches throughout the New Orleans area to find the most pressing needs of the community and how to best address these needs. One Micah local organizing ministry is working to ensure that the community has input on the educational priorities of local schools. The Latino Farmers Cooperative is working for equal access to food for all people regardless of their race or ethnicity.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us that

"There exist also sinful inequalities that affect millions of men and women. These are in open contradiction to the Gospel: 'Their equal dignity as persons demands that we strive for fairer and more humane conditions. Excessive economic and social disparity between individuals and peoples of the one human race is a source of scandal and militates against social justice, equity, human dignity, as well as social and international peace."

- Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 1938, quoting Gaudium et Spec, no. 29

Dear Parishioners.

Again this year, we will join with Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese of New Orleans on a special Advent project that will bring happiness to needy children and families in our Archdiocese this Christmas, as we invite all of you to participate in our Christmas Angels project.

At Mass this weekend, we will have Christmas trees whose "ornaments" are in the shapes of angels. On each angel is the name and a little information about a needy child in our community. Take an angel or two off the tree, purchase the recommended gift and, on the weekend of December 11-12, bring the gift-wrapped package, with the angel tag secure d outside the package, back to church. All of these gifts will be brought to Catholic Charities, who will get your gift to the correct child in time for Christmas.

Your participation in this project in the past has been overwhelming, and we hope that this will be true again this year.

I received a letter from Mr. Rami Qumsieh, who made the presentation on the struggles of and challenges to the Christians in the Holy Land two weeks ago. He wanted me to express to all of you his gratitude for your warm welcome, your attentiveness to his message and your very generous purchases in support of the Christian artists who made the olive wood religious articles that so many of you took home with you that weekend. Sales of articles amounted to over \$13,000.00. Thank you all!

Thanks, too, to all of you who remained after the 4:00 p.m. Mass last Saturday and all of you who joined with them and visited with Archbishop Philip Hannan. I know how much these visits mean to him, and he and you all seemed to have a great time together. About 150 of his books were purchased that weekend and during the week and, as one of those purchasers, I think we are all looking forward to reading his autobiography.

You like to have good neighbors, don't you? Neighbors who are friendly and engaging, who respect your property while enjoying their own, who sometimes even go out of their way to make the lives of others in the neighborhood a little bit happier. Just as we like to have good neighbors, we must also first have to be good neighbors.

I remind you of the importance, then, of being respectful of the neighbors around our parish church, school and rectory properties. I well know that parking is a challenge here for morning Mass, for school drop-off and pick-up, for weekend Masses and for funerals. BUT, we need to be careful that we do not worsen the situation by not following school procedures or ignoring traffic and parking laws. Some of our campus neighbors have had a difficult time lately because of situations that some of our parishioners have created, and that's not neighborly and it is not Christ-like caring and respect.

It is illegal to park opposite someone's driveway, within three feet on the same side of a street at a driveway entrance or within twenty feet of a corner or stop sign. For our neighbors' peace, for our children's and other parishioners and your own safety, please keep these facts in mind.

Father Peter, Colleen Remont, Jackie Appleton and I have met this week with civic officials to review our school drop-off and pick-up procedures and to get some advice from them about what we might be able to do better. Also, along Melody Drive, on our side of the street, new signage has been installed that we hope will make parking allowances or prohibitions more clear.

When I was a kid, back at the dawn of time, I remember walking home from Our Lady of Good Counsel School and riding my bike to and from St. Catherine of Siena School. There was a very large bike yard there to hold all our bicycles during the school day. Times have changed. In my seven years here, I have not seen one child ride a bike to school. A few walk, some come on the school buses provided by Jefferson Parish, most are driven by family members. We must face the fact that maybe it's time we look more creatively at parking: what worked when the church was built isn't working quite so well now, and hasn't for a while. I have asked Father Peter and Jackie Appleton to meet with our Councilperson and begin a dialog with civic officials that may allow us to make all of this work better for the good of us all.

You follow the laws, be good to our neighbors and I'll keep you informed of what we might be able to do differently.

THANKS!

I would like to thank all who took an active part in our needs assessments gatherings. Your input will prove helpful as we continue in this process of goal-setting for our parish for the next four years.

All of your responses are now being collated by Sr. Paula and will be distributed to the members of our parish Pastoral Staff, Pastoral Council, School Board and Finance Councils. All of the members of these four groups of parish leaders will meet in January to reflect together on your comments and then will establish goals to meet the needs that have been surfaced. In turn, the reaching of these goals will become the primary focus of the work of our parish ministries and organizations during the coming years.

Having looked, about a week ago, at the comments that we had received by that time, most of you have very positive feelings about our parish, and I am truly gratified to know that. By establishing and working on goals together, we continue to grow in unity, we continue to call out the talents of more people in service, and we can continue to help the reign of Christ and his kingdom of justice, truth and peace grow in the lives of all members of our parish family.

Talking about good neighbors, Rotelli's Pizza has made the first Tuesday of each month a special day for us here at St. Angela. Rotelli's will donate back to our parish ten per sent of their sales on those days. That is a wonderful offer! 





ALL PARISHIONERS are invited to a reception for David the evening of the ordination here in the parish. David will serve as Deacon at the 4:00 p.m. Mass on December 11 and the reception will follow Mass, from 5:00-7:00 p.m. in the Msgr. Kern Center. Please do stop by the reception to congratulate David and to share with his family the joy of this special day!

Each weekend, a family in our parish takes the Vocations Cross and Prayer and, during the week, offers their ministry of prayer for vocations to the priesthood, diaconate and religious life. We regularly offer, in the Prayers of Intercession at Mass, intentions for men and women to respond generously to God's call to orders and to religious life. It is wonderful to see these fervent prayers answered in David's ordination, and, of course, in all of those in this ordination group. Just these few minutes can keep you grounded and the focus will give you the reason to remain in that spirit of joyful hope that we pray about at Mass each time we join in that celebration.

Please remember, too, that the Lord is willing to come to you with forgiveness and new opportunity in the Sacrament of Penance. That sacrament is celebrated each Saturday evening from 5:30 p.m. until 6:00 p.m. in church and Father Peter and I will both be in church on Wednesday, Dec. 22 from 6:00-7:00 p.m. for confessions as well. You can also make an appointment with either of us by contacting us at the rectory.

Last Sunday, we welcomed in special prayer several adults of our parish who are now preparing to join us, from other Christian religions, in the Catholic Church, a course of preparation that will last until Easter. Please keep them all in your prayers during the coming months, that the Holy Spirit, who prompted in them the desire to unite with us as Catholics, will guide the steps of their journey as they learn more about our Church and the wonderful faith that we are privileged to live and to share. 



(Please remember, too, that a dinner reception for Deacon David is this weekend -- Saturday -- from 5:00 until 7:00 p.m.)

Today I am happy to let you know that there is even more good news: Deacon David has been assigned to minister here at St. Angela! David and I have met to begin a conversation on what areas of ministry he will be involved in as he joins us on the parish Pastoral Staff. I look forward to having him share his talents with us in this new leadership role in ministry.

If you receive this bulletin at home before the weekend, please remember that this is the weekend we ask you to return the gifts you purchased for our Christmas angels project. Wrap the gift(s) you will be providing for needy children in our community and please make certain that the angel tag is securely attached to the outside of the gift. We will be bringing all of your packages to Catholic Charities this week so that the gifts can be distributed to the children in time for Christmas.

There are lots of pre-Christmas activities in which many of us are invited to participate. Speaking of Christmas liturgies, I want to remind all those who serve as Readers, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, Altar Servers and Ministers of Hospitality (Ushers) that the sign-up sheets for the liturgies of the Christmas Season are in the sacristy. We need you to volunteer your services for the many Masses of Christmas Eve and Christmas Day, the Feast of the Holy Family on December 26 and the Feast of Epiphany on January 2.

Let me remind you that the Sheriff's Office of Jefferson Parish has posted new signs on Melody Drive to deal with the parking problems that were raised by one of our neighbors. Basically, there is now no parking allowed at any time on the church side of Melody Drive. Too many of us were guilty of blocking driveways or too near neighborhood driveways or opposite driveways, parking in the wrong direction or too near to the intersection and so the Sheriff's Office had to respond to this.

I have asked Fr. Peter and Jackie Appleton (our parish Business manager) to contact our Councilperson to discuss what we might be able to do to deal with our limited off-street parking. One idea we had a while back was to see about doing angled off-street parking along Melody Dr. and along Pomona facing the church on each street. This will, however, need cooperation from our civic government and so we are pursuing that.

Please be aware of and, of course, in adherence with the posted signs and the parking laws. Please be patient, too, as we seek a long-tern solution, if one exists, with our limited property!

As I try to determine how to balance my dual responsibilities as your Pastor and as Director of the Office of Worship, Fr. Peter and I have been determining how we can share some of my duties to "free up" some periods of time for me to go to the Office of Worship.

Father Peter will take the lead in working with our parish Finance Council, along with Jackie Appleton, and will also take the lead, working closely with Colleen Remont, in providing presence to and work with our school.

Father Peter will also begin alternating with me in writing these bulletin columns.

I am grateful to him for being as willing as he is to "step up" and take on more responsibilities here in the parish in support of my Archdiocesan ministry.

Even though it is no longer considered a penitential season, many people still choose to share in the Sacrament of Penance as part of their preparation for Christmas, and this is certainly a very good impulse!

In addition to regularly-scheduled Confessions on Saturday evenings from 5:30 until 6:00 p.m., Father Peter and I will be in the Confessionals in church to celebrate with you the Sacrament of Penance on Wednesday, December 22, from 6:00-7:00 p.m. Please note that this will be the final scheduled time for this Sacrament before Christmas.

Food contributed by SALA, Senior Citizens, and school families, along with the collection from our parishioners the weekend before Thanksgiving, enabled our St. Vincent de Paul Society to distribute a total of 83 boxes of food to those in need from our area. They also shared some of the boxes with Blessed Seelos parish.

We also shared food from our food pantry with Catholic Charities who provided food baskets for 65 families impacted by the oil spill.

Thanksgiving day collection for our St. Vincent de Paul ministry was \$3,765.75



No one is shut out of this joy; all share the same reason for rejoicing. Our Lord, victor over sin and death, finding no one free from sin, came to free us all. Let the saints rejoice as they see the palm of victory at hand. Let the sinners be glad as they receive the offer of forgiveness. Let the pagans take courage as they are summoned to life.

Christian, remember your dignity, and now that you share in God's own nature, do not return by sin to your former base condition. Bear in mind who is your head and of whose body you are a member. Do not forget that you have been rescued from the power of darkness and brought into the light of God's kingdom.

My prayer for you is that all of you will have a truly blessed and joyful Christmas. May our gathering at our Christmas Masses and our joyful song and eager prayer herald our readiness to welcome the great gift of the Son of God and the salvation He has brought, and continues to bring, to this earth.

For those of you traveling during the holidays, we wish you safe travels and joyful time with the family and friends you will be visiting.

On behalf of our entire parish Pastoral Staff, whose pleasure it is to serve you each day, Merry Christmas to you all!

Immigration reform is a difficult and often controversial issue. The US Catholic Bishops have consistently called for immigration reform that respects the dignity of life and the family while ensuring safety for the people of this nation.

Right now, federal legislators are debating and possibly voting soon on the Development, Relief and Education for Alien Minors Act (DREAM Act). This piece of legislation represents a bipartisan initiative that would allow some undocumented students, many of whom came to the United States as very young children with their parents, to be eligible for in-state college tuition and would give them the opportunity to adjust their legal status through a process contingent upon their completion of two years of college or military service.

Those who would benefit from the DREAM Act are talented, intelligent, and dedicated. Having entered the United States as very young children, often through no choice of their own, these students have contributed to their schools and communities. The DREAM Act represents a practical, fair, and compassionate solution for thousands of young people in the United States who simply want to reach their God-given potential and continue to be positive contributors to society.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us that

The more prosperous nations are obliged, to the extent they are able, to welcome the foreigner in search of the security and the means of livelihood which he cannot find in his coun try of origin. Public authorities should see to it that the natural right is respected that places a guest under the protection of those who receive him.

God calls us to respect and protect the life and dignity of all people. The DREAM Act would help us welcome and affirm the dignity of some of our most vulnerable sisters and brothers.

Dear Parishioners,

Continuing to sing and to listen to Christmas music is a way to welcome the One who comes to lighten and to fill our spirits with His own Spirit of joy and hope.

And so, liturgically, the joyful celebrations of Christmas continue as we celebrate today the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph and look forward, next weekend, to the Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord. Let us continue to listen to the Scriptures and to reflect on the Christ who wants to be part of our family life, on the Christ who seeks new ways to reveal himself to us and to all the world as Savior.

Please remember that there is NO 4:00 p.m. anticipated Mass of Sunday on Saturday, December 25, since it will be, obviously, Christmas afternoon. Neither will there be Confessions that afternoon. Our parish office is closed and will re-open Tuesday, January 4, 2011. Our school will re-open Wednesday, January 5, 2011. 


