



A little bit more about the announcement I made at the Masses last weekend:

First of all. I thank the many of you who took the time to make such positive comments about my ministry here with you these past nearly-ten years. I am humbled by your gratitude and grateful that you have found my ministry beneficial.

When I came here as your pastor, in my first homily, I mentioned that, up to that time, my longest parish assignment was seven years – my years as Rector of St. Louis Cathedral. That I have spent ten years here at St. Angela is a testimony to you, to the support you gave me, the cooperation we shared as we worked together. I have told my friends that I truly have been blessed in my forty years of priestly ministry because I have never had a "bad" assignment. I have, instead, had the privilege of working with wonderful priests, deacons, religious and laity in ways that I always have found Spirit-filled. But of all the places I have been, I have never felt as supported as I have here at SAM. You have been good to me and good for me! So, why leave?

The primary reason is that, in the time that I accepted Archbishop's invitation to return as Director of the Office of Worship, I have found it difficult to balance the two ministries. There have been times that I felt I was giving one or the other short shrift. I love parish ministry, but I love the Office of Worship too. I was very happy when Archbishop Aymond offered me that position and I feel that I still have the opportunity to make positive contributions to the Archdiocese in that service. The parish I accepted is smaller (only about 350 families to SAM's 2,000), and there is no school there. Right now, the parish office hours at Our Lady of the Rosary are 9:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. and, since that parish is only three miles from the Archdiocesan offices, it will be very easy to spend time each day at the Office of Worship after the parish offices close. There is also a priest in residence at Holy Rosary, so there is someone there who can assist on evenings and Saturday mornings when I have workshops for the Worship Office.

Also, I feel that, after ten years, though very good ones, you deserve someone with new ideas. SAM is celebrating fifty years as a parish this year. Msgr. Kern was here for 23 of those and I have been here for the next ten. Thirty-three years out of fifty with only two pastors: you deserve a bit more variety, I think. Father Charbonnet can bring a fresh eye and new talents to the implementation of the master plan, give input into the constantly-growing youth ministry of our parish and guide our organizations in their creative effort to implement effectively the new Mission Statements developed at the end of last year. He's more than twenty years younger than I and his extra energy will keep this wonderful parish moving forward.

I will be here through Friday, July 5 and Father Charbonnet will be here for the anticipated Mass on Saturday, July 6. As I said in my announcement, that means we will be together for almost three more months. I hope that we will continue to use that time to pray and work together and continue to build up the reign of Christ in this wonderful community of faith!

On Sunday, April 21, we will have a special Mass at 12:30 p.m. for the celebration with the children of our parish who will be sharing in their First Holy Communion. I invite all parishioners to this liturgy, to pray with and to support these young people as they continue to grow in the life of our Church.

As you may know, one grade of our school children and their families have been participating in the 9:30 a.m. Mass once a month and, on Sunday, April 14 (today!), these children and their families will be at the 9:30 a.m. Mass.

We have been keeping them in our prayers at Mass these past few weeks, and I ask that you keep them in your personal prayers each day of this week as they look forward to their First Communion, now just a week away.

Remember that GUMBALAYA is near: Saturday, April 20. This is a major fund-raiser for support of our parish, but it's also a great time! Your pay-one-price ticket allows you do sample tasting of the gumbos and jambalyas that are prepared for the cook-off trophy. Of course, beverages, desserts and other treats will be available as well. Kiddie rides, silent auction, entertainment all there on Saturday evening after the 4:00 p.m. Mass. See you there!





Also today, as the Archbishop wrote in his letter we printed in the bulletin last weekend, is the annual Archdiocesan-wide collection for our retired priests. There are a number of retired priests of our Archdiocese who have served selflessly in Christ's ministry for many years. As the article in the *Clarion Herald* this week pointed out, many of them continue to help out in parishes with sacramental ministry – just as Father Jim Schott has been doing here at St. Angela for a number of years. But, regrettably, some of our retired priests are ill or infirm and in need of special care. I received a lovely thank-you note from Sr. M. Laura Mercier, SSF following her visit with us to promote awareness of and devotion to Mother Henriette Delille. Sister wrote, in part:

Thank you so much for allowing us to visit St. Angela Merici Parish this past weekend and to introduce our new books to your parishioners. We were very warmly received and appreciate the fact that so many parishioners purchased books. We thank them for their, thus far, unparalleled generosity.

As Sister Laura reminded us, popular devotion to a candidate is required for the cause of canonization to move forward. I hope that you will continue to pray through the intercession of Venerable Henriette in your personal prayer, allowing devotion to her to spread.

When Father Marlon came to our parish, his plan at the time was to be here for only one year. Father is a priest of the Diocese of Masbate in the Philippines. He had received permission from his Bishop to come to the United States for a year to be close to the members of his family now living in the United States. His mother and sister live on the West Bank and his father in Las Vegas, Nevada. Even though his status was "on vacation," Father wanted to work in parish during his stay here, since the length of time allowed by his bishop was more than he had anticipated.

In order to work here, though, Father Marlon needed to acquire a work visa from the United States government, which he did get. This is a three-year visa. If Father returned to his native country before the visa expired, he would not be allowed to return to the U.S. for the other two years. Therefore, he petitioned his bishop to allow him to remain in the U.S. for the duration of the visa, and his bishop has agreed. Also, Archbishop Gregory Aymond has agreed to allow Father Marlon to continue to reside and work in the Archdiocese. Therefore, Father Marlon will be staying here at St. Angela and continue here in full-time parish ministry.

On Saturday, April 13, I joined 38 parishioners as we went to the exhibit on Pope John Paul II at the New Orleans Museum of Art. Everyone spoke very positively about the exhibit. We are sponsoring another excursion to NO-MA in May, but there already is a waiting list for that trip. Even though you may not be able to participate in this trip, I encourage you to make the time to get to NOMA to see the exhibit. If you had the opportunity to participate in any of the events of Pope John Paul's Pastoral Visit to New Orleans in September, 1987, this will bring back wonderful memories. If you were not here for that visit, this exhibit provides a wonderful summary of that experience and offers some outstanding artwork by artists inspired by the life and ministry of the Holy Father. Treat yourself to an excellent, enlightening and inspiring opportunity!

2013 Year of Family + Faith April 28, 2013: 5th Sunday of Easter

Jesus gives us a "new" commandment: "love one another. As I have loved your, so you also should love one another." This commandment is not as "warm and fuzzy" as it sounds, but, actually, is all about laying our selfishness aside for the benefit of others. 

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

As you know, our Archdiocese and many other people of faith and goodwill, have been praying and advocating for an end to violence, murder, and racism in our beloved City of New Orleans.

I regret to inform you that the struggle for peace in New Orleans continues and has taken another turn. Planned Parenthood, the nation's largest abortion provider, plans to construct a 7,000 square foot facility at 4636 S. Claiborne Avenue near Napoleon Avenue. They intend to open this facility in 2014.

From their own testimony, Planned Parenthood will perform abortions at this new facility, which will be the largest of its kind in Louisiana. We anticipate an increase in the number of abortions in New Orleans.

We know from well-documented facts that more Planned Parenthood equals more abortions. In fact, in 2011, Planned Parenthood performed over 330,000 abortions across the U.S., representing over 1/3 of our nation's abortions every year.

Moreover, for every one hundred forty five abortions that Planned Parenthood performs, they facilitate only one adoption referral. Nine out of ten pregnant women who enter the doors of a Planned Parenthood facility have an abortion.

There are many issues, from violence in the streets to poverty, which hurt our community. This regional abortion center will not solve our problems; it will only create more. This is not the future New Orleans needs.

Together, we must stand for a peaceful New Orleans, not one with more abortion and more Planned Parenthood. Our voice matters for the future of our city.

Most Reverend Gregory M. This multimillion-dollar "New Orleans Health Center" will become a regional abortion center in the heart of New Orleans, leading to an increase in abortions in New Orleans.

Facts are Clear: More Planned Parenthood = More Abortion



Dear Parishioners.

We wish a Happy Mother's Day to all mothers, grandmothers and godmothers! We assure you of a special place in our prayers at Mass this weekend.

The Medallion of the Order of St. Louis King of France was begun by Archbishop Philip M. Hannan, providing parishes with the wonderful opportunity to recognize women and men for their outstanding, exemplary, faithful and continuing service to their parish communities. While none of us offer our service with the goal of being "honored" for it, it is a welcomed opportunity to acknowledge generosity of heart, proper use of the gifts of the Holy Spirit, and love for Christ and his Church. It is good to have the opportunity to highlight the ministry of a few in order to inspire even more to equal and perhaps even greater service.

On Sunday, May 5, two couples from our parish received from Archbishop Gregory M. Aymond the Medallion of the Order of St. Louis: Gayle and L.A. Grossimon and Marylynn and Dan Judlin. I am happy to be able to share with you highlights of their service to you in the life of our Church.

Gayle and L.A. have lived in St. Angela Merici Parish for forty years. L.A. has been a member of SAMA for all those years; Gayle a member of SALA, and now on the SALA Board.

Their three sons all went to our parish school, then on to Jesuit High School. While there sons were in school here, they also were Altar Servers and that began their parents' involvement, in getting them here early for Mass and in serving as chaperones for Altar Server outings. When their sons went on to high school, so did Gayle and L.A.'s time and service, working in the school Bazaar for all ten of their sons' high school years.

L.A. served on the St. Angela Merici Pastoral Council during the pastorates of both Msgr. (now Archbishop) John Favalora and Msgr. Crosby Kern. He taught CCD classes for our parish while his own children were in our school. Gayle has been a teacher in Summer Bible Camp for the last 5 years.

Both Gayle and L.A. have served as team members in our parish RCIA process, assisting and leading other adults interested in joining us in the Catholic Church. Gayle began serving when Deacon Gil was leading the RCIA team and now both L.A. and Gayle have been on the team with Sr. Paula. They have been doing this now for about five years.

Both Gayle and L.A. have been serving as extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion at our weekend Masses, and have been involved in this ministry for seventeen years. Gayle also serves at one of our morning Masses during the week and also ministers Communion to the homebound of our parish.

L.A. a trombone player, for twenty years joined our choir and music ministers to play for major liturgies, especially at Easter and Christmas.

L.A. has been in the Knights of Columbus since 1991, is a Fourth Degree Knight and, for the past ten years, has been on the Master Staff of the Knights. In 1995, L.A. and Gayle both joined the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem, supporting Christians and Catholic charities in the Holy Land.

Marylynn and Dan Judlin have lived on Ridgeway Drive all the way back when that area was part of St. Louis King of France Parish, making them founding members of St. Angela Merici. In those days, the parish was divided into smaller areas, to help keep track of new families moving into a growing community, and Marylynn and Dan served as Block Captains..

Both of their daughters attended St. Angela School. During that time, Marylynn was a Room Mother and both of them became Scout leaders, staying on as Scout Camp Directors even after their daughters graduated from our elementary school.

Over the years, they were involved in various parish study groups, even before Dan converted to the Catholic Church in 1988.

Marylynn and Dan have served as extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion for over twenty years and have served in this ministry both at Mass and in ministry to the homebound of our parish.

Dan was asked by Msgr. Crosby Kern to begin serving as a minister of Holy Communion and server at 6:15 a.m. Mass, which he did and, because there was need, he was also a Reader at that Mass. Dan became a Reader at 8:30 a.m. Mass about 20 years ago, and served for ten years in that ministry.

Dan, under the leadership of Claudette Craven who was then our Director of Religious Education, was a CCD teacher, even acquiring Archdiocesan certification for that ministry.

Dan also served as a leader in our Summer Scripture Safari program.

Bother Marylynn and Dan have been members of our parish Vocations Committee and, for five years during that service, also coordinated each weekend those who would receive and return the Vocations Cross and prayer.

Dan has served twice on the Pastoral Council. His first round of service was with Msgr. Kern, when the Council developed parish goals for Archbishop Francis Schulte's initiative of pastoral planning in Catholic Life 2000. Dan has returned to the Council and is now in his second four-year term.

For many years now, both of these couples have been manifest in their love for the Lord, the Church and this parish community. We congratulate them on the honor of receiving the Medallion of the Order of St. Louis. We thank them for their service, commend them for their example and, of course, look forward to their continuing leadership in our parish community!

Dear Parishioners,

And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit
and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim . . .
Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven staying in Jerusalem:
"Are not all these people who are speaking Galileans?
Then how does each of us hear them in our native tongues"
from Acts of the Apostles 2:4-11

That first Pentecost day, the Apostles were certainly caught up in the divine flow of the Holy Spirit. It was the Spirit who gave them the courage to burst forth from their sequestered room and boldly proclaim Christ. It was the Spirit, filling their hearts with Christ's farewell gift of peace that moved them to want to bring this peace to other troubled, confused, grieving, seeking hearts.

Here is the reflection of one contemporary author on the meaning of this Pentecost Sunday:

The Spirit of God that "blows" through the community of disciples is the ultimate "flow" of God's compassion and peace, giving shape and direction to Jesus' community. From that Pentecost to our own today, the Spirit catches us in its "flow," drawing us into communion with God, with the world, with one another. The flow is the Spirit working through us, carrying us, inspiring us to Easter transformation. Pentecost is a moment of profound realization and transformation for the small band of Jesus' disciples: the Word they had heard and the wonders they had witnessed came together in a flow of understanding, clarity, unity and courage that compelled them to carry on the work Jesus had entrusted to them – and now, to us. Pentecost is the flow of God's love in or midst, a love that transcends words and laws and sentiments to embrace the heart and soul of each one of us. It is the very presence of God in every act of charity and compassion, in every moment of forgiveness and peace we extend and experience, in every effort we make for justice and community.

God does not treat us like computerized robots: God does not "program" us to *force us* to do these things, in "entrusting," God *trusts us* to do all of this in our own free will. God gives us the tools: the seven-fold gifts of the Holy Spirit, the wisdom of the Scriptures and the teachings of our Church, the inspiration of holy and dedicated leaders, the support that comes by living closely in a family of faith. God *wills* for us to live in the flow, God *wills* for us to be transformed, but God allows us to respond with our own free will to all the blessings offered.

Have you allowed God to transform you in any way this now-concluding Easter Season? Have you taken the time this Pentecost Day to identify the gift of the Holy Spirit specially given to you for the common good and determined how to use that gift in a new way to join anew in the Spirit's "flow"?



Dear Parishioners,

This morning, for the first time as members of St. Angela Merici Parish, we are gathered together to offer the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. Together we worship Almighty God by offering Him Christ our Savior. Today very much like a large family, we give thanks to God for the many blessings of health, prosperity and the Faith. From our meager beginning we will come forth as a strong and God-loving people. United in spirit and spurred on by a common purpose, for the good of ourselves and especially our children, we will construct not only physical buildings but also a City of God.

Those words were written by St. Angela Merici's founding pastor, Father Joseph Calato in the first bulletin published for the parish on Sunday, June 7, 1964. That day, at Leon's Restaurant on Phosphor Avenue, over 1,400 people gathered to pray at the three Masses celebrated that Sunday morning (remember, in those says, there was no anticipated Mass of Sunday on Saturday afternoon). Because the number of new parishioners at those Masses was so large, the very next weekend, the Mass scheduled was changed to allow for five Masses to be celebrated by Father Calato and the Assistant Pastor (now known as "Parochial Vicar") Father Jerry Dabria. St. Angela Merici Parish was off to a quick and exciting start.

Here we are, fifty years later, and still a vibrant Catholic faith community. Fifty years of Faith: celebrated in liturgical and devotional prayer, taught in our parish school and in many and varied adult religious formation programs, lived in service and in wonderful social gatherings. Fifty years of Faith is the theme selected by our Anniversary Committee for this year of commemoration of our parish's Golden Anniversary.

It is, I believe, important to observe this milestone of parish life. It is important for us to look back, that we might remember and honor our founding families, who lived such a lively faith and who laid such a firm foundation of faith for us to build on. They did, in fact, build those buildings and they did, in fact, initiate the building of the City of God in this area of Metairie. We need to thank them: prayerfully for those who have passed away, and with glad celebration for those many who are still with us.

We must use this milestone occasion as an opportunity to evaluate, adjust and develop the ways we do, and potentially can rely on, to build up the reign of Christ in this little corner of God's awesome creation.

I thank Claudette Craven, Coordinator of our 50th Anniversary Committee, and all of the committee members who worked with her to develop a year-long plan for observing and celebrating St. Angela Merici Parish's 50th Anniversary.

This observance begins next weekend! On Saturday, June 1, Archbishop Gregory M. Aymond will return to St. Angela to be the principal celebrant at the 4:00 p.m. Mass, initiating our Golden Anniversary Year. We have invited back for that liturgy all the priests who have served here and also all those who served as our School Principal. A reception will follow Mass in the Msgr. Kern Center. I hope that many of you will be able to join us for that special Mass and reception as we unite to celebrate Fifty Years of Faith!

In order that Fr. Marlon and I can both attend the reception, please note that there will be no Confessions on Saturday, June 1. Please feel free to telephone the rectory to make an appointment with Father Marlon or me for this Sacrament during the week.

I would like to thank all of you who sent greetings, participated in the Mass and Reception or simply shared words of congratulations and support on my 40th Anniversary of Ordination. It was a wonderful and memorable weekend. I extend very special words of thanks to our parish music ministers who provided beautiful music for the Mass, all those who served in other liturgical ministries and our gracious and selfless Family Life Apostolate members who coordinated and served at the lively reception. Thank you all!

Many of you had the opportunity to meet and welcome your next pastor, Father Beau Charbonnet. You kept him busy, because we were the last two people at the reception and, at 9:00 p.m., he was just getting something to eat as others were cleaning up around him!

Father Beau also came to our regularly-scheduled meeting of the Pastoral Staff on Tuesday, May 15 and had the opportunity to meet and chat with these folks he will be working with very soon. After that meeting, he stayed for dinner with Fr. Marlon and me and then he and I talked about St. Angela parish until about 11:30 that night (way past my bedtime!!!). He was anxious to hear all about the parish and remains truly excited to be coming here for his first pastorate.







The profit from our recent Gumbalaya was about \$35,000.00. THANKS to all who made that occasion such a success! A Spring fund-raiser was begun several years ago (we started with a Spring Gala and shifted to the Gumbalaya) to provide funds for unbudgeted parish needs.

At the meeting of our parish Finance Council on May 22, the members of the Council recommended to me, as I accepted their recommendation, to use the funds in this way:

\$10,000.00 will be used to replace the floors in the school hallway. Those tiles, now over 45 years old, have begun in some places to crack and some have actually broken. In a recent inspection by the Board of Health, we were asked to prioritize the replacement of the tiles. You may recall that we also have a parish goal, from the last round of goal-setting, to improve the "first impression" look of our parish facilities. This work, to be done this Summer after Safari Bible Camp ends, will satisfy both the Board of Health's request and our own parish goal.

\$15,000 will be given to the school for the school's operating budget, to end well this fiscal year.

\$10,000 will be retained in the parish for unbudgeted needs: some to get a "jump start" on 50th Anniversary expenses.

Once again, thanks to all who helped plan, coordinate, work at and who participated in this event!

You may not realize it, but there are other ways that you, as parishioners, can support the ministry of Catholic Education at St. Angela Merici School. In this tough economy, it is crucial that we squeeze every penny that we can to assist with school expenses. Please contact the school office (835-8491) if you have any questions or would like to offer support in any of the following areas:

The **Scrip program** is a very important way that every parishioner can assist our school. This program allows you to purchase gift cards, not only for gifts, but for your every-day purchases. The school gets a percentage profit in return. Orders are made weekly (every Wednesday morning) during the school year and are ready for pick-up the following Thursday. Orders during the summer will be placed on the following dates: June 19th, July 10th & 31st. Orders can be placed either online or by submitting order form and payment to the rectory or school office. Watch for more details in an upcoming August bulletin. In the meantime, further information on the Scrip program can be found on the school website (www.stangelaschool.org).

Through the **Boxtops** for Education program **General Mills** offers cash back to schools when boxtops are submitted. These include cereals, baking products and many frozen foods. Information and product lists can be found at www.boxtops4education.com. You are encouraged to clip and save labels for the school and bring them to the rectory or the school office. Reflection

We all have our disappointments in life. They can range from the inconsequential (the store is out of the brand of laundry soap that I have a coupon for) to the very significant (a diagnosis of cancer or another serious illness). And we all deal with disappointments in different ways. Young children are very good at "catastrophizing" a disappointment. Mom's refusal to get that wanted candy bar in the grocery checkout line can lead to a tantrum. But as any mother knows, not giving in to a child's tantrum is teaching a lesson on how to deal with the inevitable disappointments that are part of each person's life.

In this weekend's Gospel, James and John certainly weren't happy that a Samaritan village was not very welcoming to Jesus and his band of disciples. Recall that Samaritans believed that the place to worship God was on Mt. Gerizim, and because Jesus and his disciples were on the way to Jerusalem, the Samaritans were not interested in aiding his mission. Almost like five-year-olds at the candy display in the grocery checkout line, James and John were ready to call down fire from heaven to wipe out the Samaritans. Jesus did not hesitate to rebuke them for their outburst. On the other hand, even Jesus seemed to express his own sense of disappointment when he says in the Gospel to someone who wants to follow him, "The Son of Man has nowhere to rest his head" (Lk 9:58).

How we deal with disappointment is a sign of maturity. Jesus makes the point in the Gospel that we have to move forward. Letting go of regrets and looking to the future is wholesome everyday advice. But putting those ideas into the realm of faith means that we confess our sins and seek absolution (the letting go) and direct our lives to God's kingdom. It is looking toward our ultimate future, which is eternal life in heaven.
