Saint Francis of Assisi (1182-1226) October 4

When Franco Zeffirelli's Brother Sun, Sister Moon was released (1972), people were shocked by the movie's graphic nudity in the dramatic conversion scene. Son of a wealthy merchant, Francis' aimless adolescence ended when a failed military expedition led to his imprisonment and complete breakdown. Once home, Francis rediscovered God in the beauty of nature and the ugliness of human suffering, caring for lepers, praying in the little church of San Damiano, whose crucified Jesus he heard calling, "Repair my house, Francis, which is falling into ruins." Francis sold his possessions—and his father's—to fulfill this command. When his father objected, Francis disrobed: "I return the clothes, your name, and all you gave me: God alone is my Father now." Later, the pope would dream of a ragged friar stretching forth a single hand to prop up the crumbling papal Cathedral of Saint John Lateran. Francis indeed helped rebuild the universal Church, founding the Friars Minor (Franciscans), dying at a young forty-four, bearing the stigmata of the Christ whose living icon he remains—in the Church and far beyond it.

Senator Katrina Jackson noted: “This amendment makes sure there is no right to abortion or tax payer funding of abortion in our state constitution.” By voting “YES” to **Amendment #1** we can rest assured that, together with our state law, we will never become like New York, who recently legalized abortion up to the moment of conception.

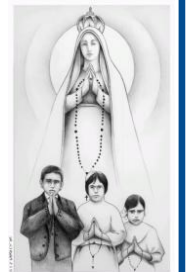

Catechetical Corner

Our Thursday Confirmation D Groups met for the third time on September 29. The theme of this session was the cost of discipleship. Sometimes, we Christians can fall into the mistake of equating Christianity with a life of ease. Yet in the Gospels, Jesus makes it clear that discipleship often means a life of suffering. He says, “Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross and follow me” (Matthew 16:24). These crosses can be things we willingly choose—like giving up sleep in order to get to Mass on time, risking being labeled a “holy roller,” or giving up some bad habits. Other times, it’s sufferings that we don’t choose like the death of a loved one, the loss of a job, or the pain of being overlooked. Whatever the case, we know that Jesus is close to us in our suffering. Also, it’s important to remember that the cross never has the final word. Just as Jesus triumphed by rising from the dead, we have hope in Him; hope that there is more than just this life to look forward to; hope in knowing that God wastes nothing, using every difficulty in our life for some good. PSR families, meanwhile, have been exploring Creation, what it means to have a human soul, the difference between Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition, and the four Gospel writers. In the process, students have examined classic artworks, have learned different forms of prayers such as *Lectio Divina* and songs of praise, have created posters and drawings, and have completed numerous learning activities. It’s been beautiful to see the children growing at home with their families, learning about God’s Word and the teachings of Mother Church together. Families will complete two more weeks of at home learning before coming on campus for our first Families in Faith gathering on Monday, October 19. **If you are interested in assisting with Parish School of Religion or would like more information about these programs, please contact Audrey Huck, Catechetical Director, at audrey@stangela.org.**

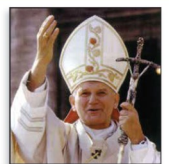
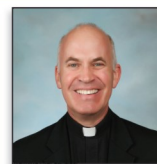

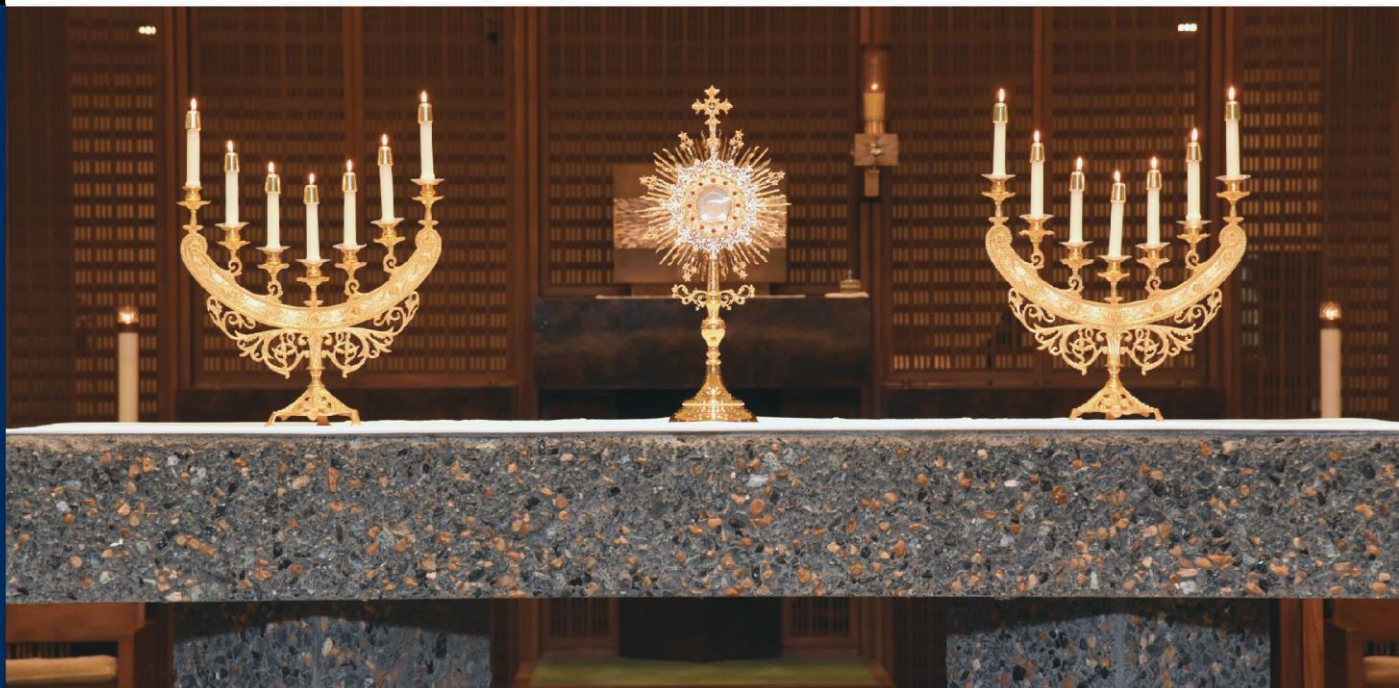

LETTER FROM FR. DAN

While perfect vision is 20/20, this year has been anything but clear. LETTER FROM FR. BEAU

Dear St. Angela Merici Family,

I would like to thank all of you for journeying together through these challenging times with an abundance of faith, hope and enduring love. With that in mind, I would like to take the opportunity to share some news with you.



One of our longtime and beloved parishioners, Dr. Mary Curry, passed away in April 2020, leaving St. Angela Merici as a beneficiary in her will. After her investment accounts and life insurance accounts were liquidated, St. Angela received an unrestricted bequest of \$1.4 million to be used as we see fit. As you can imagine, this is a tremendous blessing to our parish community, especially during these difficult times.

Our Finance Council, in a desire to be as transparent as possible, has asked me to share the following with you in regard to this generous gift:

- Of the \$1.4 million, \$202,000 was used to pay off the debt on 824 Melody Drive. Payment of the debt has been a stated priority of our parish for a very long time and so this decision was easy and prudent. Our parish is debt-free, thanks be to God!
- As for the remainder, many projects will be under consideration, including renovations, safety, and more. We may have an opportunity to do things that we have considered in the past, or God's providence may reveal new things for us to consider. We wish to be as conservative as possible and we will set aside a significant portion of the funds for emergency use. One thing we have learned through the pandemic is that we need to be prepared for the unexpected. Therefore, the Finance Council and Pastoral Council will work with me to develop a plan for the remaining funds over the next few months. As soon as that is finalized, I will share the details with you.
- Finally, this financial blessing serves as a reminder of what a gift it can be to remember St. Angela in your will. Hopefully this parish has been a blessing to you; in return, you can be a blessing to the future of St. Angela Merici.

Be assured of my prayers for you, and thank you for your love for St Angela!

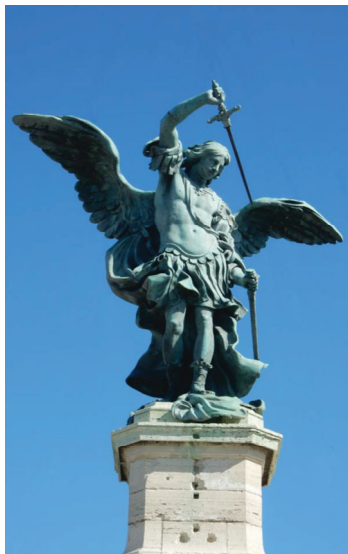

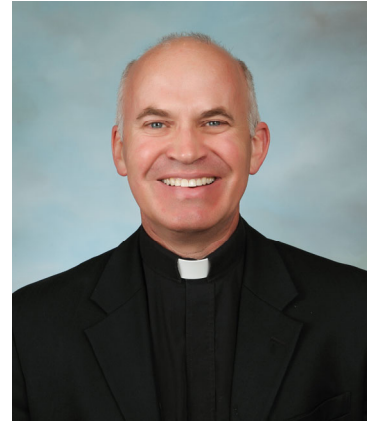

LETTER FROM FR. BEAU

Over the past 4 years, we have participated in the #iGiveCatholic Day of Giving in the Archdiocese of New Orleans and this year we will have yet another opportunity to participate.

Consider that on Thanksgiving evening, stores are now opening for sales. The next day is Black Friday, where the stores are flooded with shoppers. Black Friday flows into Cyber Monday where shoppers buy online. It's fast-paced and we can often get lost in the chaos of it all.

#iGiveCatholic Tuesday was established as an opportunity to give online the day after Cyber Monday. It helps us keep our hearts in the right place in the midst of a highly commercialized time of the year.



Over the past four years, because of your generosity, we have completed a number of special projects for St. Angela Merici.

- In 2016, we re-sealed our blacktop and restriped the parking lines
- In 2017, we raised money to plant 15 magnolia trees on the southern end of our campus
- In 2018, we renovated our Conference Room
- In 2019, we painted the exterior of our Church

For 2020, we are looking to build our ability to livestream our Masses to those who are homebound by establishing a permanent livestreaming camera system in the Church.

When the pandemic restrictions began, we started sharing our Masses online. This was new territory for me and Fr. Dan, but we stuck with the process. I think of all the homebound that have not been able to participate in our liturgies for years. They are now able to connect to our daily Masses. With Covid-19, the number of homebound has grown.

Currently, we are using a single camera that has a limited ability to capture the liturgy. We set up a camera that can cover the presider's chair, the altar and the ambo for preaching. Because we are covering three areas, we are unable to get close up angles at any one of them. Our new system would be permanently installed, and would allow us to get closer shots of the liturgical action. This would lead to more engagement from our homebound parishioners and a deeper sense of feeling connected to our parish.

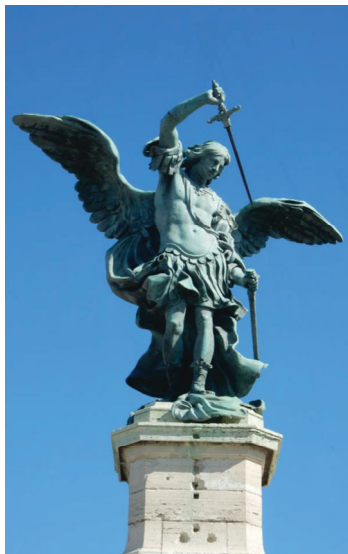

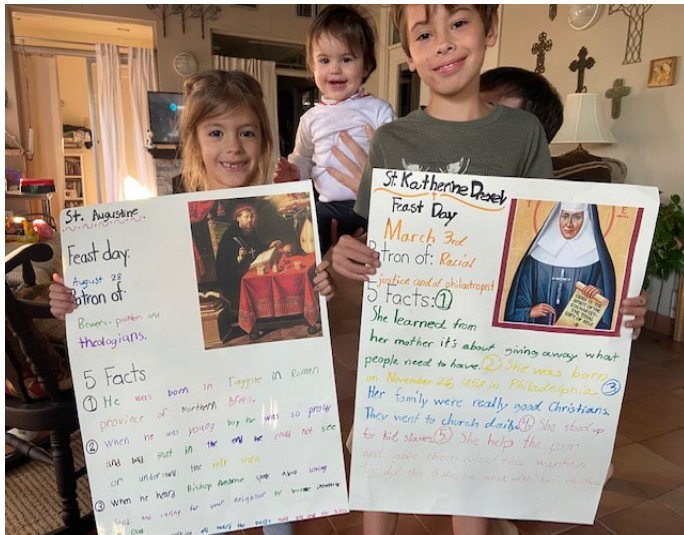

THIRD MONTH AFTER CONCEPTION

Baby is quite active in the womb, although the mother won't feel his or her movements for another couple months. If the mother's womb had a window, you could watch your spiritually adopted baby squint, swallow, and move his or her tongue. Vocal cords are now present, but sound can not be produced yet because of the watery environment. The baby can make a fist if you touch his or her palm, as the skin is very sensitive and reflexes are developing. It is also now distinguishable whether the baby is a boy or a girl, though it is usually a few more weeks before a doctor can determine this with an ultrasound image. The baby is breathing fluid, which will continue until birth. The needed oxygen is obtained through the umbilical cord. The baby now weighs about 1 ounce. What a miracle this baby is!!!
